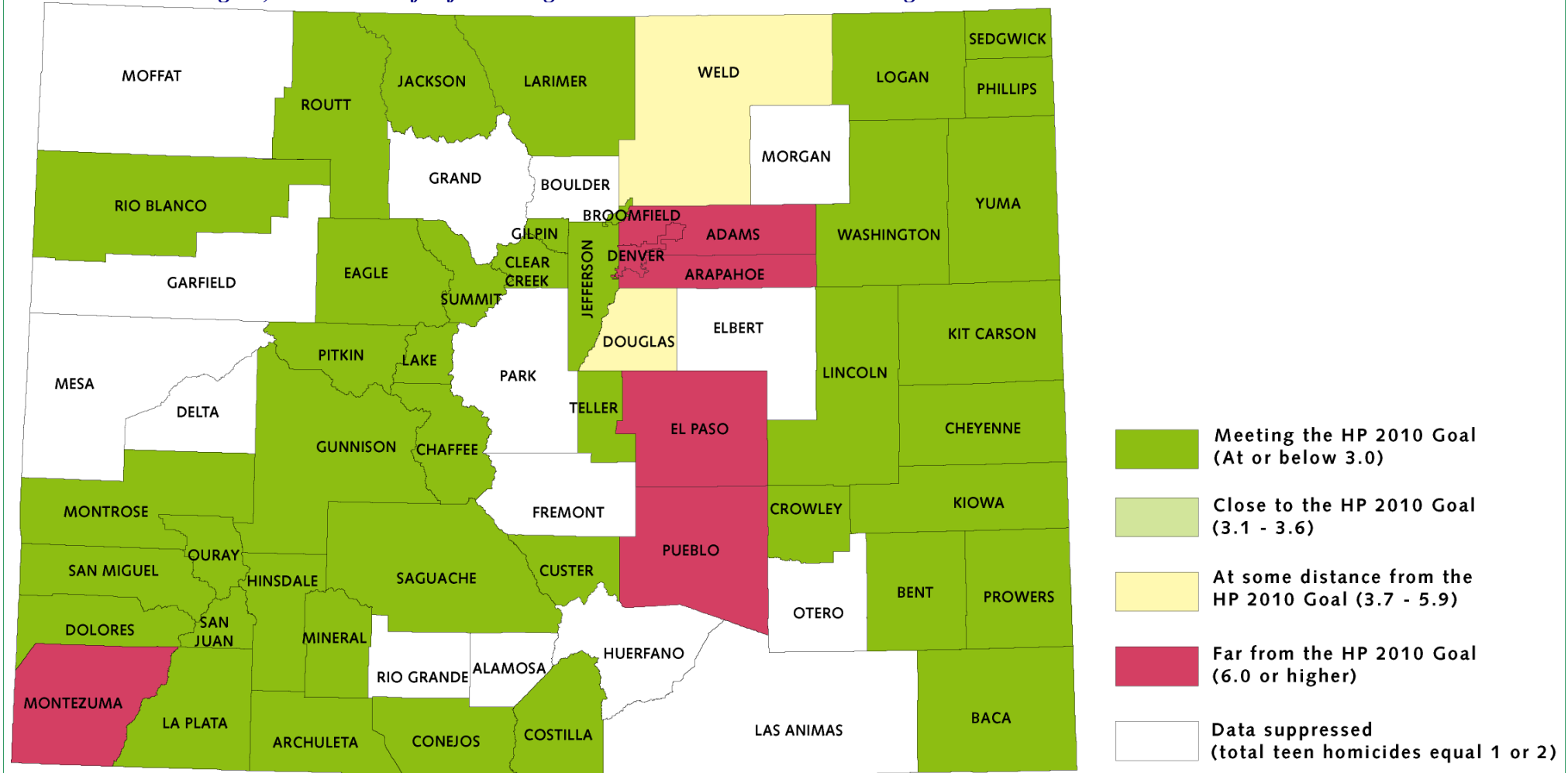

Healthy People 2010 Goal: *Reduce the homicide rate to no more than 3.0 per 100,000 teens.*

County rates are 2001-2005 five-year averages, except for Broomfield which is 2002-2005 only. The state rate is 6.0.
