
First Trimester Prenatal Care (Percent) National Performance Measure 18

Healthy People 2010 Goal: Increase the percent of infants born to pregnant women receiving prenatal care beginning in the first trimester to 90.0 percent.

County rates are for the year 2005. The state rate is 80.1 percent.
