
Perinatal Mortality (Number per 1,000) National Outcome Measure 5

Healthy People 2010 Goal: Reduce the perinatal (neonatal plus fetal) mortality rate to no more than 4.5 deaths per 1,000 births.

County rates are 2001-2005 five-year averages, except for Broomfield which is 2002-2005 only. The state rate is 6.5.

Counties categorized as close to the goal are within 20 percent of the goal; counties at some distance from the goal are more than 20 percent away but less than double the goal; and counties far from the goal are at least double the desired goal.
