
Black/White Infant Mortality (Ratio) National Outcome Measure 2

Colorado 2010 Goal: Reduce the black/white infant mortality ratio to 1.8 or below.

The measure is a ratio of the black infant mortality rate to the white infant mortality rate. Values greater than 1.0 indicate relatively more black infant deaths than white infant deaths.

County ratios are based on 2001-2005 five-year averages for each racial group, except for Broomfield which is 2002-2005 only. The state ratio is 3.2.

Counties categorized as close to the goal are within 20 percent of the goal; counties at some distance from the goal are more than 20 percent away but less than double the goal; and counties far from the goal are at least double the desired goal.
