

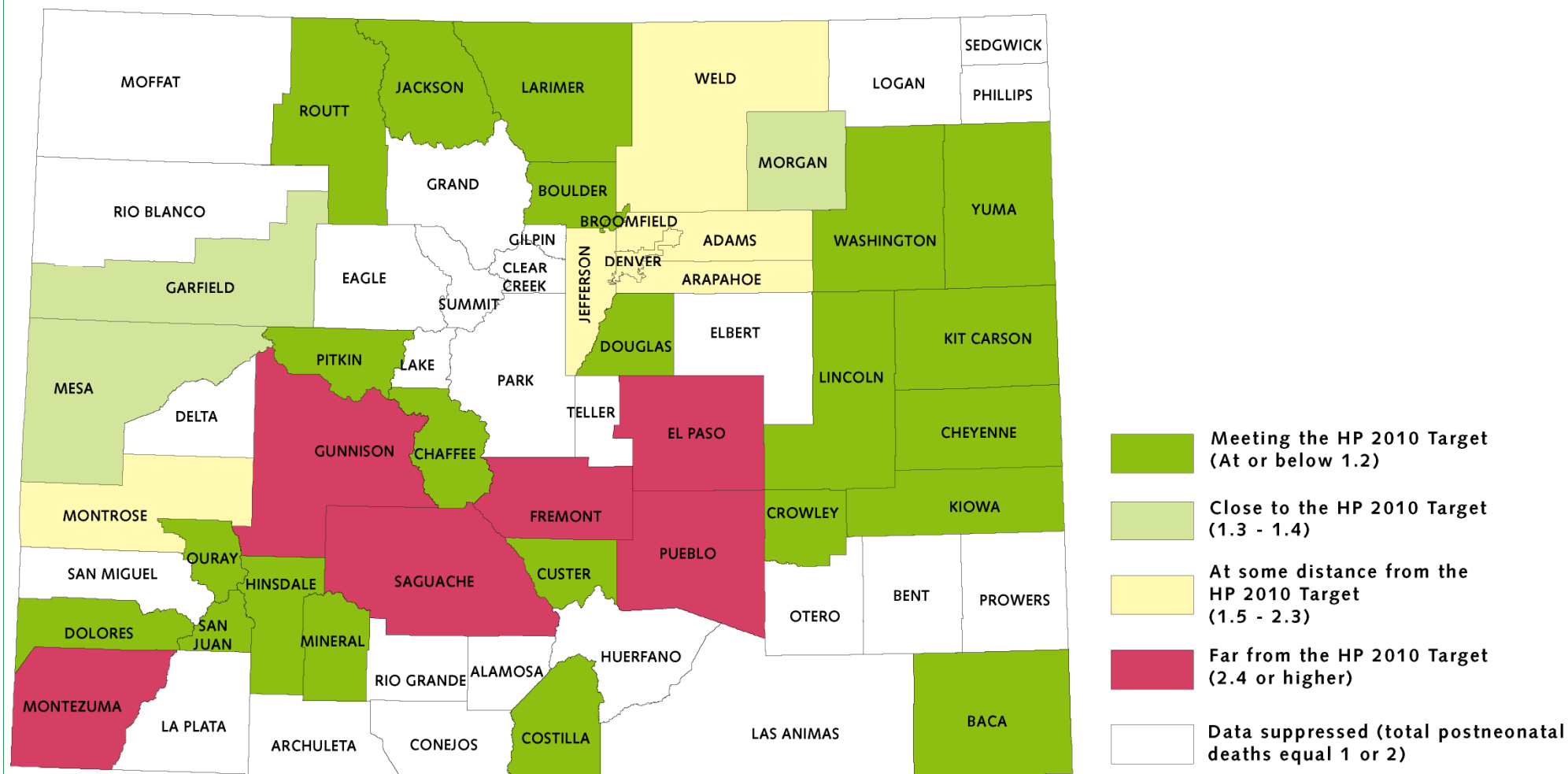
Postneonatal Mortality

(Rate per 1,000)

National Outcome Measure 4

Healthy People 2010 Objective: Reduce the postneonatal mortality rate to 1.2 per 1,000.

Data are 2004-2008 five-year averages. The Colorado rate is 1.7 per 1,000.



Counties categorized as close to the target are within 90 percent of the target; counties at some distance from the target are between 51 percent and 89 percent of the target; and counties far from the target are 50 percent or less of the desired target.
