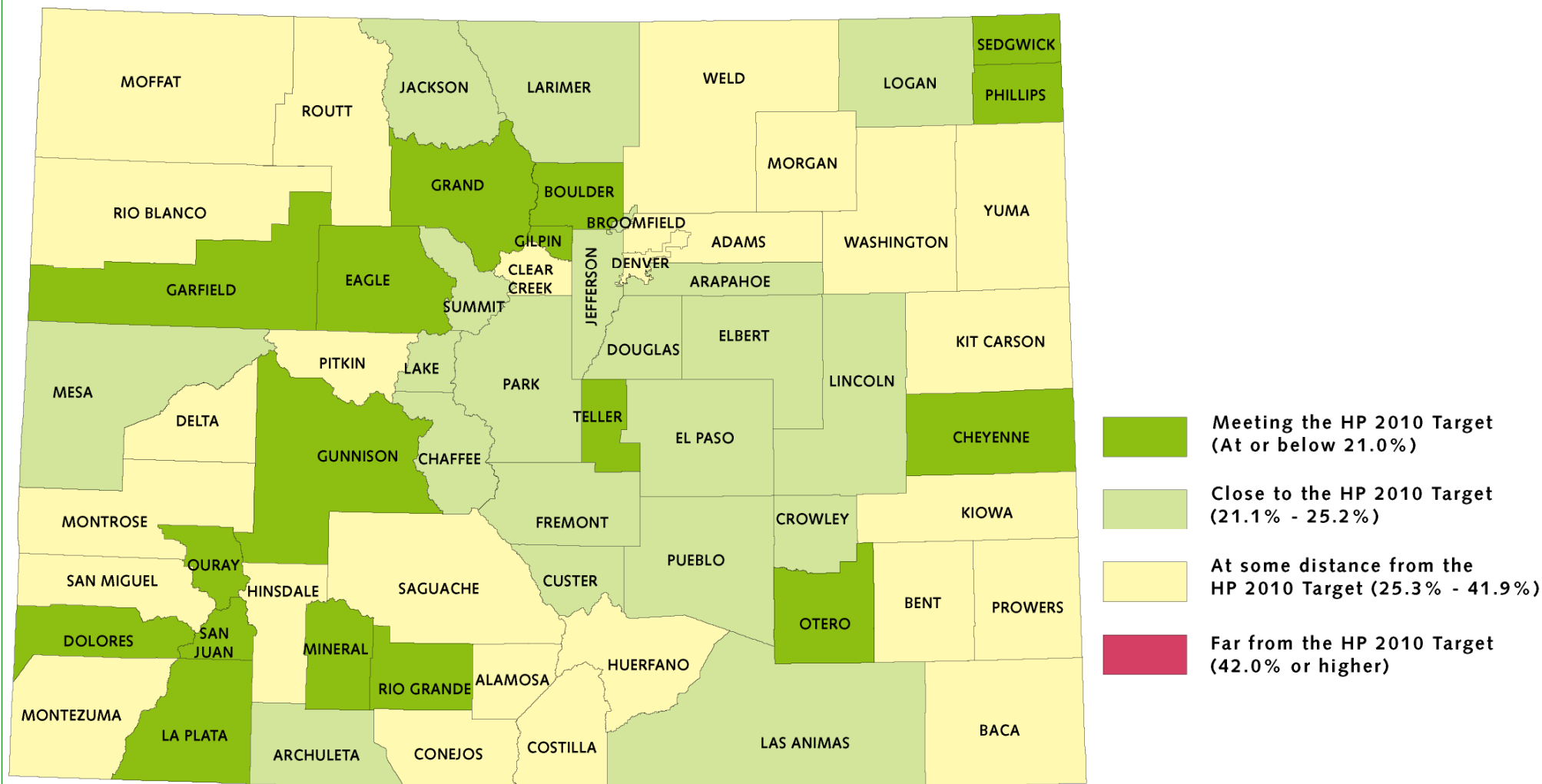


Untreated Decay

Healthy People 2010 Objective: Reduce the prevalence of children with untreated dental decay in primary and permanent teeth to 21.0 percent.

Data are for the 2006 - 2007 school year. The Colorado prevalence is 24.5 percent.



Counties categorized as close to the target are within 80 percent of the target; counties at some distance from the target are between 51 percent and 79 percent of the target; and counties far from the target are 50 percent or less of the desired target.
