The list below applies to physicians and hospitals. Laboratories have separate reporting requirements. A case must be reported to the state or local health department following diagnosis within the number of days (d) or hours (h) indicated in parentheses after each disease.

The State Health Department recommends reporting all suspected cases, whether or not supporting laboratory data are available.

Group Outbreaks **(24h) -** all causes, including food poisoning Malaria (7d) Hepatitis C, acute (7d) SARS **(24h)**

Hepatitis, other viral (7d)

Kawasaki Syndrome (7d)

Legionellosis (7d)

Toxic Shock Syndrome (7d)

Tuberculosis (active disease) (24h)

Positive TB skin test in workers exposed

Leprosy (7d) to active disease (7d)

Environmental, Occupational, and Chronic Conditions

Autism spectrum disorders (30d)+ Fetal Alcohol Syndrome if <7 years old (30d)

Birth defects, developmental disabilities and medical Head injuries (hospitalized or fatal) (120d)+

risk factors for developmental delay diagnosed prenatally, at birth, or through the 3rd birthday (120d)+

Spinal cord injuries (120d)+

Any chemical or radioactive suspected terrorist incident

(+) only hospital required to report

~ Immediate reporting by phone is required of any illness suspected to be caused by a bioterrorism agent •

ALL REPORTS MUST INCLUDE:

1. The disease or condition being reported

Patient's name, date of birth, sex, race, ethnicity, address (including city, county, and phone number)

3. Physician's name, address and
