## Sample Description

School Level - All regular public schools containing grades 9, 10, 11, and 12 were included in the sampling frame. Schools were selected systematically with probability proportional to enrollment in grades 9 through 12 using a random start. 39 schools were sampled.

Class Level - All classes in a required subject or all classes meeting during a particular period of the day, depending on the school, were included in the sampling frame. Systematic equal probability sampling with a random start was used to select classes from each school that participated in the survey.

## Response Rates

Schools - $\quad 49 \% \quad 19$ of the 39 sampled schools participated.
Students - $\quad 60 \% \quad 734$ of the 1,223 sampled students submitted questionnaires.
734 questionnaires were usable after data editing.
Overall response rate - $\quad 49 \% * 60 \%=29 \%{ }^{1}$

## Weighting

In probability sampling, associating a weight with each questionnaire is intended to reflect the likelihood of sampling each student and to reduce bias by compensating for differing patterns of nonresponse. The low overall response rate precludes weighting of the data.

## Use of the Unweighted Results

The unweighted results provide a description of the priority health-risk behaviors of the survey participants. These results cannot be generalized to other students.
