Subject: Anticipated Revisions to the Colorado State Implementation Plan for Air

Quality for Calendar Year 2021

Pursuant to C.R.S. § 25-7-133(4)(b), the Colorado Air Quality Control Commission (AQCC) is directed to provide Legislative Council with a list of anticipated changes to Colorado's federally-approved State Implementation Plan(s) (SIP) for the upcoming year. Based on its current Long Term Calendar, the AQCC will consider the following SIP change during calendar year 2021:

Regional Haze State Implementation Plan and Regulation Number 23
Revisions related to the control of NOx/SO2/PM emissions from the remaining
Reasonable Progress sources identified as impacting Class I areas.

## Regulation Number 7

Revisions to Regulation Number 7 Reasonably Available Control Technology requirements for incorporation into the 2008 Ozone NAAQS State Implementation Plan to address EPA comments, and make necessary SIP revisions.

## Regulation Number 20 and Air Quality Standards, Designations and Emissions Budgets Regulation

Revisions to reduce emissions from the transportation sector, update existing provisions as necessary, and propose establishing an Energy Intensive Manufacturing Audit Program in response to HB19-1261.

## **Regulation Number 7**

Revisions to Regulation Number 7 to establish oil and gas reduction strategies, monitoring, reductions, recordkeeping and reporting in response to SB19-096, HB19-1261 and SB19-181. The Division may also propose SIP Fix revisions necessary for EPA approval of Colorado's Ozone SIP.



These and any other SIP revisions adopted by the AQCC in 2021 will be provided to the Legislative Council for consideration in January 2022, prior to submittal to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency. These scheduled SIP revisions, along with the AQCC's other anticipated air quality-related regulatory activity not intended to become part of the federally-approved SIP, have been included in the AQCC's Long Term Calendar and CDPHE's 2021 Regulatory Agenda at:
