

INFORMATION FOR MOTORISTS

COLORADO, Gateway to the Rocky Mountain West, was admitted to the Union in 1876 and is known as the Centennial State. Colorado is the eighth largest state in area and is the highest in average elevation except Alaska.

The highest altitude reached by Mount Elbert's 14,431 feet and the peak is one of 54 which soar to 14,000 feet or more. The Nation's highest paved auto road climbs 14,264 feet to the top of Mount Evans near Denver. Lowest elevation is 3,350 feet near Holy.

The Continental Divide, running from north to south, separates the plains on the east from the mountains to the west. SPECTACULAR SCENERY provides backdrops for National and State Parks and their summer and winter playgrounds which afford boating, camping, fishing, hunting or relaxation. More than a score of ski areas have won the State the title of "Ski Country U.S.A."

POPULATION of Colorado in 1966 is estimated at 2,000,000. That of Denver, the capital, is estimated at 528,000, and that of the Denver metropolitan area at 1,100,000.

SPEED LIMITS are posted for the benefit of the motorist on practically all State Highways. The driving speeds are displayed on black-and-white signs. Advisory speeds for road curves or other locations where extra driving care is needed are shown on black-and-yellow signs. In the absence of posted speeds the following limits established by statute are applicable: 20 miles per hour on narrow, winding mountain highways and blind curves; 40 miles per hour on open mountain highways; and 60 miles per hour on other open, surfaced highways. A speed limit of 70 miles per hour is permitted on surfaced, four-lane highways and certain other highways where so posted.

ACCIDENTS outside incorporated cities and towns are to be reported immediately to the Colorado State Patrol or to the office of the County Sheriff having jurisdiction. Within an incorporated city or town the local police are to be notified at once. Drivers involved in traffic accidents are required by law to exchange information with respect to license and registration and also to render reasonable assistance to any person injured.

SCHOOL BUSES are equipped to display flashing red lights when stopping to receive or discharge school children. A motorist traveling in either direction on a two-way roadway is required to stop before reaching a school bus whenever the flashing lights are in operation. On a four-lane highway with separate roadways for each direction of travel a driver is required to stop for the flashing lights only when traveling in the same direction as the school bus.

COLORADO has many miles of important connecting county roads that in numerous cases are the only access to communities, to scenic areas and recreational areas. Motorists planning travel to remote areas, particularly on unimproved roads, are advised to make local inquiry concerning road conditions. During the winter months when traveling in remote areas it is advisable to carry an emergency supply of food, water and blankets as well as the chains.

CONSERVATION STICKER or permit is required for use of most National Forest Campgrounds and National Parks. There is also a permit required for the State Recreational Areas.

PUBLIC ACCOMMODATIONS LAW in Colorado requires that places of public accommodation shall be open to all persons alike, regardless of race, creed, or ancestry.

KEEP COLORADO BEAUTIFUL by using litterbags and the trash cans that are provided along the Highways. \$100.00 fine for littering on Highways is enforced.

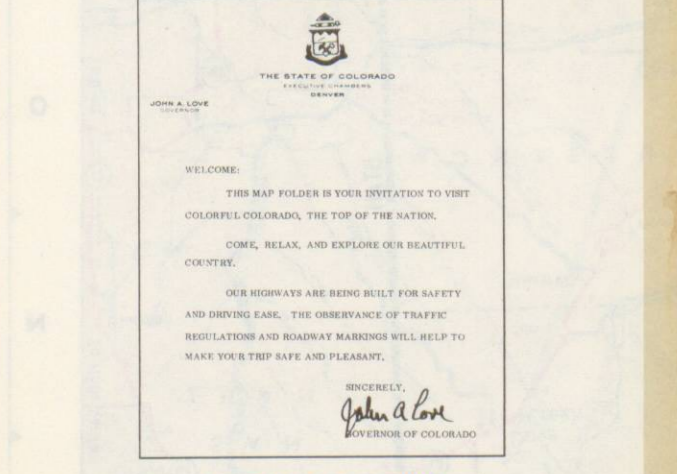

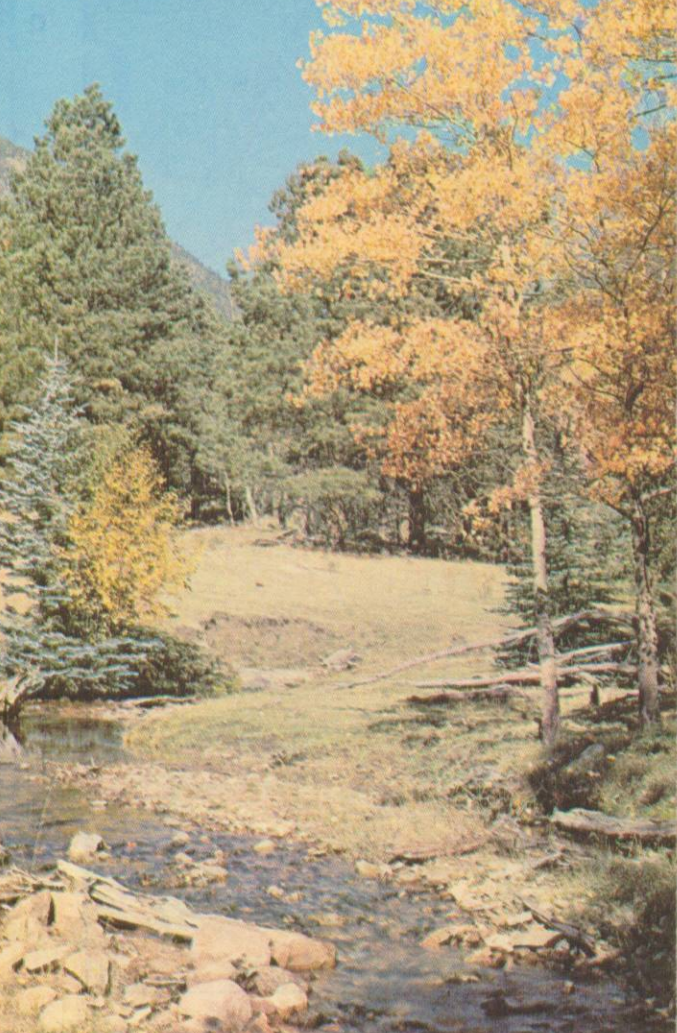
