SNOW TIRES OR CHAINS frequently are required for use during winter storms or when roads are icy or snow covered. **FOUR-WHEEL DRIVE VEHICLES** with adequate tires for the existing conditions also are acceptable. Colorado State Patrol troopers, highway official maintenance persons or regulatory signs may inform motorists when these requirements are in effect. A snow tire must have a tread with sufficient abrasive or siped resistant design of composition and depth to provide adequate traction under the existing driving conditions.

COUNTY ROADS often provide access to communities, and to scenic and recreation areas. When planning travel in remote areas, particularly on unimproved roads like the one over Cottonwood Pass west of Buena Vista, are advised to make local inquiry concerning road conditions. On the state highway system, U.S. 34 (Trail Ridge Road) in Rocky Mountain National Park is closed in winter as is S-14 (22 east of Aspen over Independence Pass).

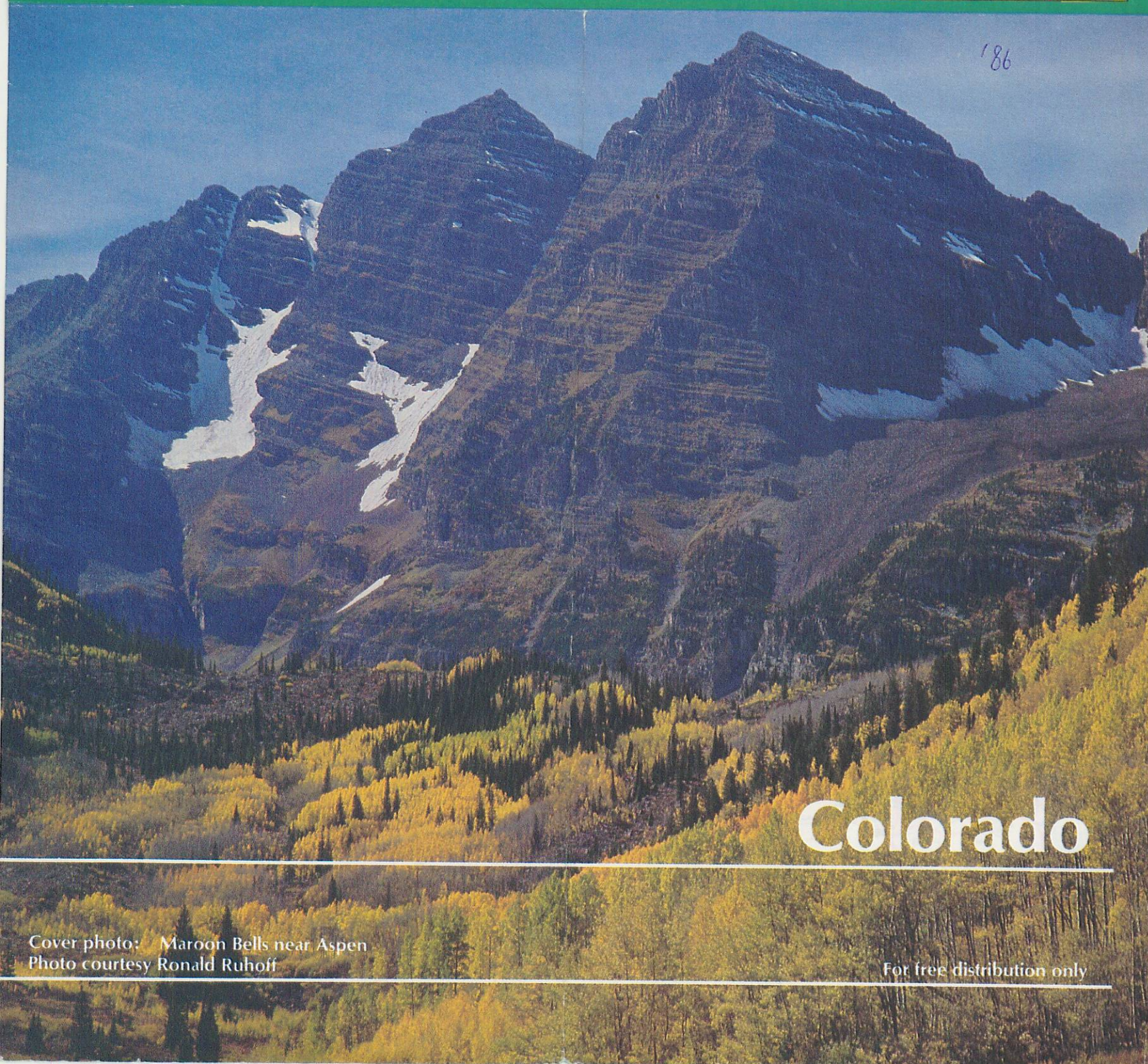

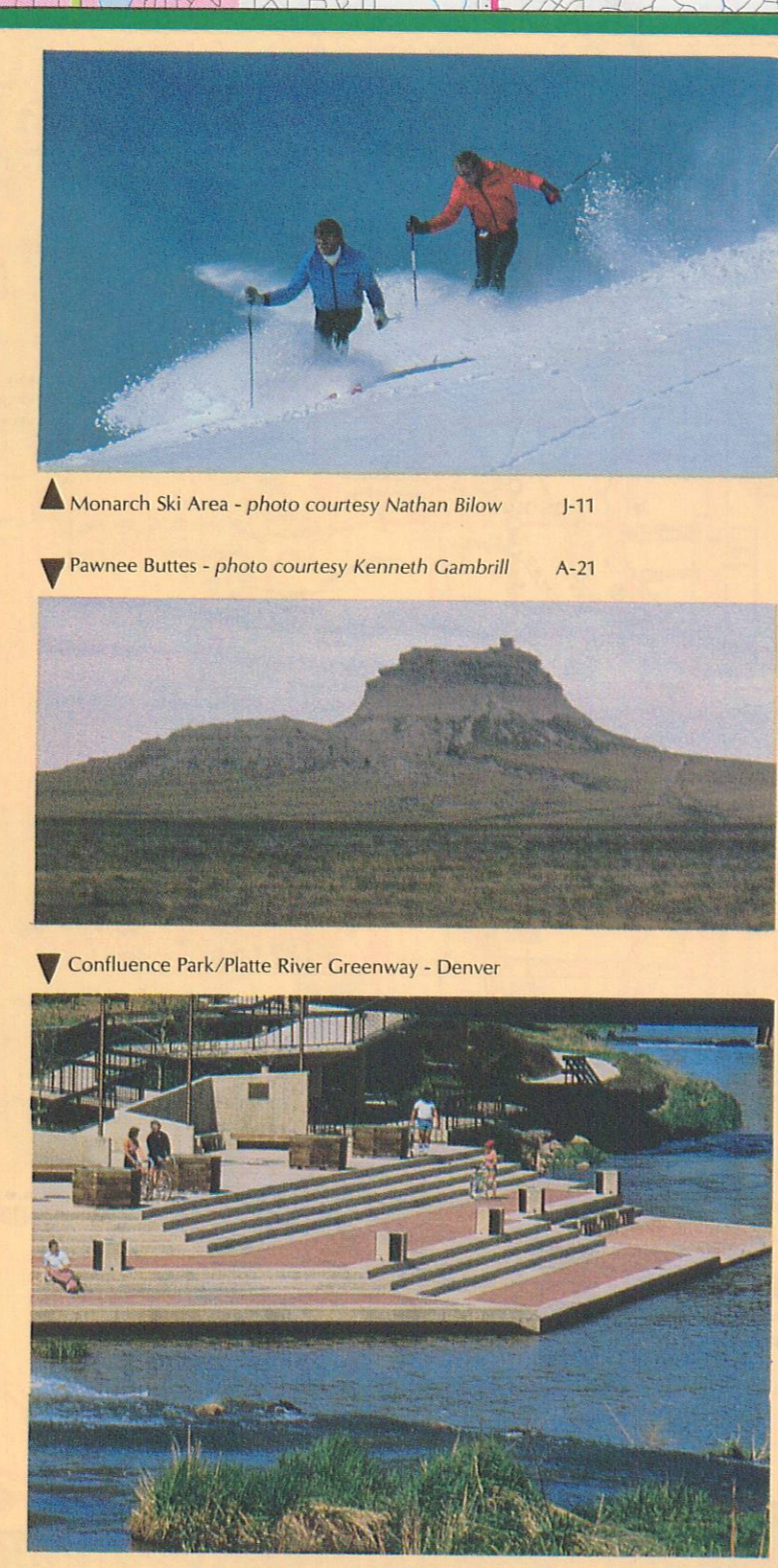
