

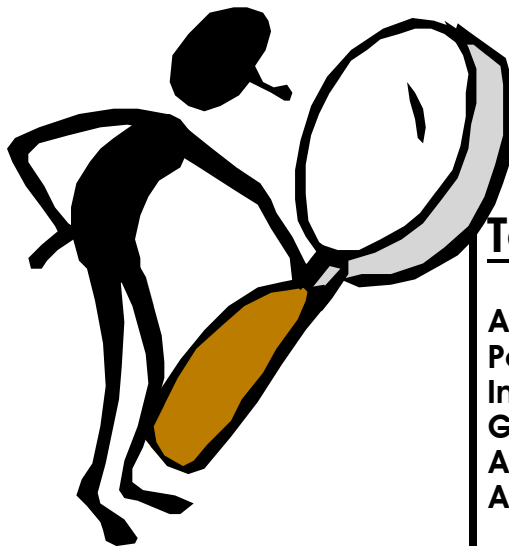

<i><b>Program Description:</b></i>	Clebrando la Familia is a comprehensive, substance abuse prevention program designed for Latino/Chicano/Mexicano youth (ages 7-17) and their families. This program seeks to promote optimal health, strengthen families, and reduce problem behaviors associated with ATOD use by providing activities that will educate and enhance the knowledge of the Chicanco/Mexicano/Latino population. The programs will increase the awareness of effects of the use of ATOD. In addition, this program provides activities such as Youth/ Adult Leadership activities, Peer Leadership/Helper Programs, small group sessions, Education Services for Youth Group, ATOD free social and recreational events, community services, community drop-in activities, and parenting support groups, for our youth and their families; to keep them engaged in activities to prevent ATOD use; the increase self-esteem, and resistance to negative peer pressure; and to decrease the use and intake of ATOD.

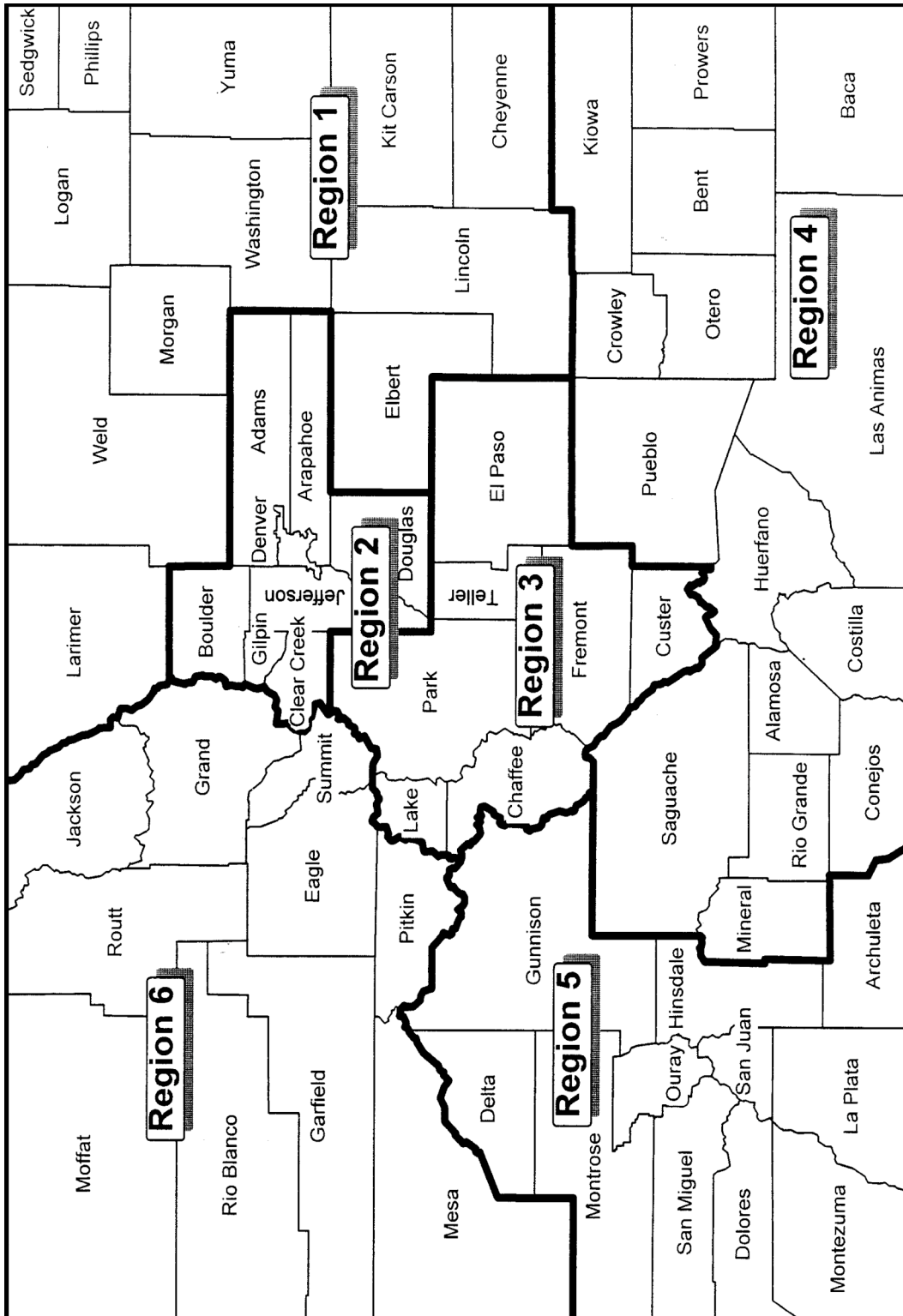

In northern Teller County (Woodland Park) the Healthy Beliefs Task Force studied school risk data and enlisted focus groups of area youth to assess the messages before

they were released to the public. In southern Teller County (Cripple Creek), the BAG research and monitoring committee evaluated and developed the messages with the assistance of area youth.
