Short Summary of Request: The request is to access \$594,492 in federal funds awarded from the Administration on Aging for federal fiscal year (FFY) 2009 for Community Services for the Elderly programs. This will increase the Older American's Act Program by \$573,065 and administration of these funds by \$21,427. To match these funds an additional \$33,759 in General Fund (5%) is needed. This request increases the budget for the Community Services for Elderly Programs lines in FY 2010-11 by \$628,251 total funds, \$33,759 General Fund and \$594,492 federal funds. The Department proposes to reallocate exiting General Fund within the State Funding for Senior Services appropriation to meet matching requirements, resulting in a net zero General Fund request and a federal funds increase of \$594,492.

<u>Background and Appropriation History</u>: Title III of the Older Americans Act provides grants for community-based programs to foster the development and implementation of comprehensive and coordinated systems to serve older individuals in their communities. Title III Programs fund numerous community-based programs such as congregate meals, home-delivered meals, transportation, information and assistance and in-home services. In FY 2006-07, the

General Description of Request:

SB 09-259 Long Bill FY 2009-10 Appropriation

The State Unit on Aging receives funding from the United States Administration on Aging to administer the Older Americans Act programs in Colorado. Each year, the Administration on Aging sends the State Unit on Aging a Notice of Award identifying the total funding for a particular Federal fiscal year. In FFY 2009, the funding amounts

received from the Administration on Aging that comprise the Older Americans Act Programs and the Area Agencies on Aging Administration lines of the Long Bill were increased beyond the amount identified in the Long Bill (SB 09-259). The Older Americans Act funding for FFY 2009 provides for \$573,065 in additional Federal funds for Older Americans Act Programs line and \$21,427 toward the Area Agencies on Aging Administration line. The increased federal funding requires a state match of 5%. The Department is requesting to reallocate General Fund within the Division to provide the required matching funds and adjust the federal funds appropriation as needed.

Provider agencies deliver a variety of services to older persons. Services provided include:

- Supportive services and senior centers Functions include case management, client representation, shopping assistance, transportation, chore services, personal care services, adult day care, health screening, legal services, and an ombudsman;
- Nutrition services such as congregate meals, nutrition screening and education;
- In-home services for persons who are either not eligible for, or needs cannot be completely met through Medicaid, Home Care Allowance and Adult Foster Care (homemaker services, personal care services, home repair services, visiting services); and,
- Disease prevention and health promotion services (e.g., health risk assessments, programs regarding physical fitness, education regarding diagnosis, prevention and treatment of age related diseases and chronic disabling conditions).

In general, services are available to individuals age 60 and over, regardless of income or assets. While the federal government does not allow a means test, it does require that priority be given to those with the greatest social and economic need, with particular attention to minority individuals and those who are frail, homebound, or otherwise isolated. Provider agencies often request donations or fees on a sliding scale for services such as transportation and congregate meals.

<u>Consequences if Not Funded:</u> The request will allow Colorado to increase services delivered to older Coloradans in need. If the additional match requested is not approved, the State will lose the ability to

Impact on Other Government Agencies:

There is no impact to other agencies.

Cost Benefit Analysis:

The Administration on Aging requires that Federal participation cannot exceed 85% of the Title III-B, C-1 and C-2 service costs (these funding streams are the equivalent of the Older Americans Act Programs line of the Long Bill). Of the remaining 15% matching share, one third (5%) must come from State sources. By increasing the General Fund by \$33,759, an additional \$573,065 of Federal funds and \$67,518* in local funds (totaling \$640,583) can be leveraged to provide additional services to older Coloradans. Although the request includes a funding source for the General Fund needed to match the federal fund from State Funding for Senior Services, the analysis is based on the appropriation without that funding source identified.

Cost Benefit Analysis

The cost benefit analysis show potential annual net benefit of \$33,759 in General Fund for providing additional services through the Older Americans Act
program. This net benefit is the difference between the amount of services for consumers and the number of services that can be provided with State
