Department of Human Services	120	38	Department of Human Services, Office of Self Sufficiency, Colorado Works Program, County Block Grants -- Pursuant to Sections 26-2-714 (7) and 26-2-714 6 (9), C.R.S., under certain conditions, a county may transfer federal Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) funds within its Colorado Works Program Block Grant to the federal child care development fund or to programs funded by Title XX of the federal Social Security Act. One of the conditions specified is that the amount a county transfers must be specified by the Department of Human Services as being available for transfer within the limitation imposed by federal law. This amount is calculated based on the assumption that the Colorado-based community foundation will receive up to 5.0 percent of the total allocation for costs associated with program administration and that entities receiving funds will use no more than 10.0 percent of these funds for indirect costs associated with the purchase of Colorado grown foods including, but not limited to, transportation, refrigeration, and storage.	Comply to the extent feasible	This footnote was added as an amendment to the Long Bill during the 2018 session. The Department indicated that it could not absorb the required costs to manage this \$500,000 within the existing federal Food Distribution Programs grants. As such, the Department was granted its request to be allowed to withhold 5.0 percent of the total for State-level administrative costs.
