Child and Family Services Review Program Improvement Plan Quarterly Report

**PIP Report of Progress
July 1, 2006 through September 30, 2006**

This is Colorado's twelfth quarterly report of progress on the State Program Improvement Plan (PIP). This report addresses the percentage goals that were out of compliance in the ninth, tenth and eleventh quarterly reports. Although all the actions steps have been completed, there are six items that continue to fall short of the goals submitted. The chart at the end of this report provides county specific information for the 21 of 64 counties required to submit a county-specific Program Improvement Plan. County departments are provided with their performance and they continue to do work to address the county specific areas out of compliance. The narrative provides information regarding the continued work to attain the goals.

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To help improve both practice and data regarding Colorado's seven Items that have been steadily out of compliance, counties joined the State in developing plans for two PIP Work Sessions that were held in early October 2006. Although all seven Items were discussed, Item 6 was one of principal focus. The planning included eliciting strategies from counties showing success and progress on particular Items. County representatives presented these strategies at the Work Sessions.

GOALS

Item 6 – Stability of Foster Care: This Item attempts to assure that the placement change children experience while in foster care is in line with their case plans. Colorado's goal is 76%. The statewide performance for this item for the period 3/31/06 through 9/30/06 was 58.2%. That is an improvement of .5% from the previous reporting period.

A request to the Regional Office to re-examine how this item is being measured was denied. As a result, Colorado will continue to evaluate this from the perspective of the child without providing credit to the county for efforts being made to address the child's changing issues and needs.

Although this item continues to be well below the baseline established, it is anticipated that by the next review period over half the county departments will have in place a procedure which plans children's moves through a team decision making process. This procedure addresses the reasons why the placement is necessary for the child as well as putting in place the services and supports for the child, parents, and foster parent.

Further activity in which Item 6 was a focus in the past quarter occurred in the work group composed of State Child Welfare staff, Administrative Review staff, and county department personnel. This work group continues to meet to refine the instrument measuring outcomes. Its goal is to more accurately reflect and assess practice across the state. It is planned for the recommendations for a new instrument to be completed in January 2007.

Item 9, action step 4 – Effectiveness of County Adoption Effort: This action step attempts to assure that an adoptive family has been identified for any child who is legally free for adoption and whose goal is adoption. Colorado's goal is 81%. The statewide performance for this item

for the period 3/31/06 through 9/30/06 was 81.7%. Since first coming into compliance in the sixth reporting period, Colorado has averaged 80.63% over the past 21 months. Colorado's baseline for this item was 76%. This is more than a 4% in improvement that has been maintained. **At this time Colorado would propose that this item has achieved.**

Efforts to maintain compliance include: Presentations at quarterly meetings of foster/kinship care and adoption supervisors and coordinators, with discussions of the importance of the Program Improvement Plan, diligent searches, the use of permanency planning meetings when adoption is being considered for a child's permanency goal, and reminders for foster parents to be invited to consider adoption of children in their care is discussed. Continued activities include the State's adoption recruitment advertising on public transportation and radio, this year's Heart Gallery on November 1, and the statewide celebration of national Adoption Awareness Month throughout November. The Change-A-Live-Forever website continues to grow as a resource for inquiring families. Collaborations continue between State Child Welfare, county departments of human/social services, and community faith-based organizations to recruit and support adoptive families in their communities.

Item 10 – Other Planned Permanent Living Arrangement: This Item attempts to assure that diligent efforts are made to prepare youth for emancipation. Colorado's goal was 93%. The statewide performance for this item for the period 3/31/06 through 9/30/06 is 90.5%. This is an improvement of .2% from the previous reporting period.

Noncompliance continues to be caused by Independent Living ("IL") plans not being done for youth who are sixteen years and older who do not have Emancipation as a permanency goal. Assistance to counties on this Item during the last quarter included discussions at the Adolescent Supervisors' Roundtable quarterly meetings by the Adolescent Services Administrator; training on the Family Services Plan Section 4D, Permanency and Independent Living Plan (ILP) for Youth Transitioning to Self-Sufficiency; and a training on Independent Living Planning Tools and Resources for Caseworkers held October 4-6, 2006. Future trainings include:

- Permanency and Independent Living Planning, including a one-day "Permanency Summit" on November 6-7, 2006;
- Indian Child Welfare Act: Permanency, and Independent Living Planning, planned for three days with the dates to be determined; and
- Ansell-Casey Life Skills Assessment Certification, planned for three days with the dates to be determined.

Item 14 – Preserving Connections: This Item attempts to assure that the Family Services Plan, and services provided, including foster placements, take into account the unique characteristics of the child and family. Colorado's goal is 96%. The statewide performance for this Item for the period 3/31/06 through 9/30/06 was 93%. This is a decrease in performance by 1.3%.

An analysis of the past year's performance on this item shows that youth in the Youth Corrections System have been a barrier to compliance on this item. Over the past year, 84.45% of the time the Youth's Discrete Case Plan, as well as services provided, take into account unique characteristics of youth, family and their primary connections. The Division of Youth Corrections has provided Denver County Human Services some funding to be used for the

implementation of a Family-to-Family Model in working with Youth and their families in the Denver region. Further discussion among Child Welfare, Youth Corrections and Administrative Review will occur to outline the expectations as Colorado moves into the next review period.

As in the recent past, State Child Welfare efforts to help counties improve their performance on this Item include the following:

- An emphasis on localized family foster care in Foster Care/Kinship Meetings;
- Training for county departments and CPAs regarding kinship and strategies to work with Latino/Hispanic families and their communities that include youth perspectives;
- Training and technical assistance provided to counties regarding outreach to fathers and the paternal side of the family; and
- The needs of visitation for appropriate developmental growth of children (also provided to judicial staff).
- Counties continue to review their kinship policies and practices
- Counties receiving PSSF funds have developed plans to improve the placement of siblings together when out-of-home placement is necessary
- Counties are making efforts to place children within their own neighborhoods, communities, and counties
- CDHS supports a focus for public and private agencies on strategies to work with, recruit, and establish supports for Latino families in their communities to achieve permanency for children who are placed in their homes.

Item 19 – Worker Visits with the Child: This item attempts to assure that when the county department has an open case, monthly face-to-face contacts occur with children in foster care as well as with children living in their homes. Colorado’s goal is 90%. The statewide performance for this item for the period 3/31/06 through 9/30/06 was 84.5%. This is an improvement of 1.6% from the previous reporting period.

In the last quarterly report, it was reported that counties are found to be out of compliance if they fail to have contact on a monthly basis. If a caseworker makes monthly contact with a child three out of three months, then the performance standard is met at 100%. If the same caseworker misses one month the compliance percentage is 0% rather than 66.7% (two out of three).

A request was made to the Regional Office to change the manner by which this item was evaluated to reflect the actual number and percentage of contacts that occur. Before agreeing to this, the Regional Office asked for further analysis that would reflect baselines and goals for the different manner of evaluation.

The Division of Child Welfare contracted with Data Analytics to provide a more in-depth look at face-to-face contacts that occurred between County staff and the child in question. The report from Data Analytics reflects data from 7/1/03 through 6/30/06. As was stated previously, the goal is that 90% of the time, monthly face to face contact is made with the child in question. The different method of calculation being proposed involved determining how many months the child in question should have had contact with a worker compared to how many months the contact occurred. The chart below is a synopsis of the findings.

Under this method, statewide compliance scores have been stable and consistently high from 7/01/03 through 6/30/06. Over the span of the eleven quarterly reporting periods completed to date, the total compliance has experienced a minimal range of only 0.8% difference between the highest compliance of 95.1% and the lowest of 94.3%. For children in out of home care, there has been a range of only 1.3% from a high of 97.2% to a low of 95.9%. For youth in the Division of Correction System, the range has also varied minimally from a high of 99.3% to a low of 97.4% (1.9%). A highly significant range can be seen when looking at Children living in their own homes. The range with this group is 5.3%, from a low of 83.1% to a high of 88.4%. In looking at the first 3 reporting periods 7/103 through 6/04, the average was 84.5%. The average for the last 3 reporting periods was 88.13%.

As can be seen, the population that has kept Colorado out of compliance has been the children living at home. However within that population, a significant improvement can also be seen.

Using this new information, Colorado requests that this item be evaluated for compliance in the following manner:

1. The percent of face-to-face contacts with children in out of home care will not fall below 95% 2.
2. The percent of face-to-face contacts with youth in the DYC system will not fall below 97%.
3. Using 84.5% as a baseline, that the percent of face-to-face contacts with children living at home will maintain at least 87.5%.

This request takes into consideration the minimal range for children in out of home care and youth in the Division of Youth Corrections and the significant improvement for face to face contacts occurring with children living at home.

Item 22a – Timely Initial Health Assessments: This Item attempts to assure that children with open cases receive timely initial health and dental assessments. Colorado's goal is 86%. The statewide performance for this item for the period 3/31/06 through 9/30/06 has increased to 83.2%. State Child Welfare continues to assess the systemic issue of lack of access to physicians and dentists taking Medicaid by working with Health Care Policy and Financing, and other program staff, divisions, and departments.

On October 6th, State Child Welfare and HCPF collaborated to present information on EPSDT at the Colorado State Foster Parent Association Conference. The response at the presentation was positive, with the written evaluations pending.

Further strategies to address this Item include quarterly updates on the State Child Welfare website of the current Medicaid physicians and dentists, including a direct link to the Medicaid medical and dental providers page, and updates on EPSDT information and health resources. This information is available to county departments, providers, community partners, and the general public.

The documentation requirements of 43 USC 1396a have increased county workloads and have brought about the need for numerous presentations by State Child Welfare to help clarify the requirements. On the positive side, this new awareness has presented many opportunities to discuss Item 22 with county and provider staff.

Finally, the Administrative Review Division will develop a baseline of the number of children receiving in-home services who have medical needs identified in Assessment, Safety Plan, or Family Service Plan that are having their physical needs addressed through identified services.

Item 22b – Health Needs Identified and Services Provided: This Item attempts to assure that children's health needs are identified, and that health services are provided on a regular basis. Colorado's goal is 94%. The statewide performance for this item for the period 3/31/06 through 9/30/06 was 90.5%.

An analysis of this item shows that for the past 4 quarters, regular health care, including immunizations and /or treatment for identified health needs have been successful 93.3% of the time. The primary issue that continues to keep this out of compliance is the regular dental care and treatment for identified dental needs. Over the past 4 quarters, this item has averaged 86.38% with a variance of .9%. Over the past year, dental services for youth in DYC have declined from 95% to 91.3%.

State Child Welfare and EPSDT continue to collaborate on a series of informing sessions at county human/social services departments to provide information on EPSDT to caseworkers, supervisors, and administrators.
