* Following the initial announcement of positive cases of COVID-19 in Colorado on March 5th 2020, data presented in this report largely reflect COVID-19 response and Executive Order (EO) compliance across the detained, committed, and paroled populations. The statewide detention bed capacity was temporarily reduced to 200 on April 21st, 2020, then to 188 on October 25th, 2020; due to the temporary nature of the reduction, DYS continues to utilize statutory detention bed capacity and allocations for FY 2020-21 within this report (327). Commitment population reductions and Parole population increases are a direct result of the Division's EO response, releasing an unprecedented number of youth from residential placement to parole.

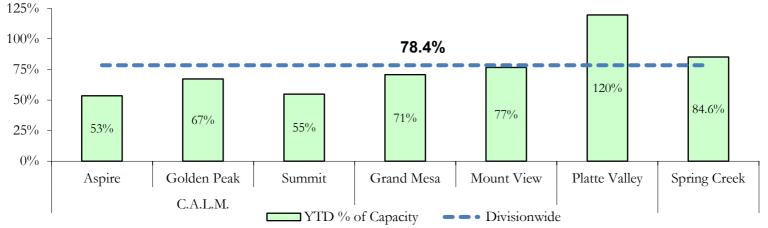
