Fiscal Year (FY) 2023-2024 September 2023 Monthly Summary

Detention

- September 2023 statewide monthly detention Average Daily Population (ADP) was 184.3, a 0.4% increase compared to August (183.5). Year-to-date (YTD), detention ADP was 182.0, a 10.1% increase from September 2022 (165.3).
 - o September's ADP of 184.3 represents 85.7% of the statutory detention bed capacity limit of 215.
 - O The maximum count for September 2023 was 197, or 91.6% of the 215-bed capacity limit. YTD, the statewide maximum daily count was 198, an 8.8% increase compared to September 2022 (n = 182; 84.7%).
- YTD, 6 (27.3%) of 22 Judicial Districts (JDs) have operated over capacity, when examined by ADP:
 - o Central Region: 18th JD (101.9%; Cap. 36)
 - O Northeast Region: 13th JD (101.6%; Cap. 2)
 - Southern Region: 4th JD (122.5%; Cap: 27), 10th JD (140.5%; Cap: 9), 12th JD (102.3%; Cap: 2)
 - O Western Region: 21st JD (121.4%; Cap: 9)
- There were 235 youth admitted to detention in September, a 13.0% decrease compared to August (270). YTD, there were 742 youth admitted to detention, a 2.2% increase compared to September 2022 (726).
- When examined by maximum daily count data, seven of the eight youth centers (87.5%) have operated at or above 100% capacity during Fiscal Year (FY) 2023-24. Prairie Vista operated at 94.9% capacity.
- On average, youth released this FY have experienced a Detention Length of Stay of 21.0 days, which is 0.3 days longer compared to September 2022 (20.7 days).¹

Commitment


- September 2023 statewide monthly commitment ADP was 261.8, a 1.5% increase compared to August (257.8). YTD, commitment ADP was 262.1, a 2.1% decrease from September 2022 (267.8).
- State Secure YSCs have operated at 83.7% of capacity through September, a 1.4% decrease compared to September 2022 (85.1%). YTD, two out of eight youth centers (25.0%) operated over capacity: Golden Peak (111.5%, Cap: 20) and Grand Mesa (145.0%, Cap: 23).
- YTD, Community Residential ADP was 11.5, a 27.7% decrease compared to September 2022 (15.9).
- There were 9 new commitments in September, a 50% decrease compared to August (18). YTD, there were 47 new commitments, a 17.5% increase compared to September 2022 (40).
- On average, youth discharged this FY have experienced a Residential Length of Service (LOS) of 18.7 months, or roughly one month shorter than September 2022 (19.6 months).¹
 - O YTD, State Secure LOS was 16.9 months, roughly 3 days shorter compared to September 2022 (17.0 months).

Parole

- September 2023 statewide monthly parole ADP was 102.5, a 6.9% decrease from August (110.1). YTD, parole ADP was 103.7, a 6.2% decrease from September 2022 (110.5).
- There were 5 parole intakes in September, a 70.6% decrease from August (17). YTD, there were 37 parole intakes, a 27.5% decrease from September 2022 (51).
- Thirteen (13) youth discharged in September, a 30% increase from August (10). YTD, 42 youth discharged, a 2.4% increase compared to September 2022 (41).
- On average, youth discharged this FY have experienced a Parole LOS of 6.7 months, which remains unchanged compared to September 2022 (6.7 months).¹

¹ Length of Stay/Service figures should be cautiously interpreted during the first few months of a new fiscal year due to the small number of total releases/discharges. LOS figures become more reliable as the number of released/discharged youth accumulates over the course of the fiscal year.

Fiscal Year (FY) 2023-2024 September 2023 Monthly Summary




