## DYS Population Report

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**Fiscal Year (FY) 2023-2024**  
**February 2024**  
**Monthly Summary**

**Detention**

- February 2024 statewide monthly detention Average Daily Population (ADP) was 185.0, a 6.2% decrease compared to January (197.2). Year-to-date (YTD), detention ADP was 190.5, an 8.9% increase from February 2023 (174.9).
  - February’s ADP of 185.0 represents 86.0% of the statutory detention bed capacity limit of 215.
  - The maximum count for February 2024 was 196, or 91.2% of the 215-bed capacity limit.
- YTD ADP indicates that six (27.3%) of 22 Judicial Districts (JDs) have consistently operated over capacity throughout the fiscal year to-date. JDs not listed below have operated over capacity during previous months, but not as consistently as the six listed below:
  - Central Region: 18<sup>th</sup> JD (111.3%. Cap: 36)
  - Northeast Region: 19<sup>th</sup> JD (100.4%; Cap: 16)
  - Southern Region: 4<sup>th</sup> JD (116.2%; Cap: 27), 10<sup>th</sup> JD (136.8%; Cap: 9), 12<sup>th</sup> JD (152.0%; Cap: 2)
  - Western Region: 21<sup>st</sup> JD (109.9%; Cap: 9)
- There were 231 youth admitted to detention in February, a 7.6% decrease compared to January (250). YTD, there were 1,928 youth admitted to detention, a 5.6% increase compared to February 2023 (1,825).
- Detention Youth Centers continue to experience capacity strain statewide. When examined by maximum daily count data, twenty-one of twenty-two Judicial Districts (95.5%) have operated at or above 100% capacity this Fiscal Year.
- On average, youth released this FY have experienced a Detention Length of Stay of 23.7 days, which is 2.5 days longer compared to February 2023 (21.2 days).

**Commitment**

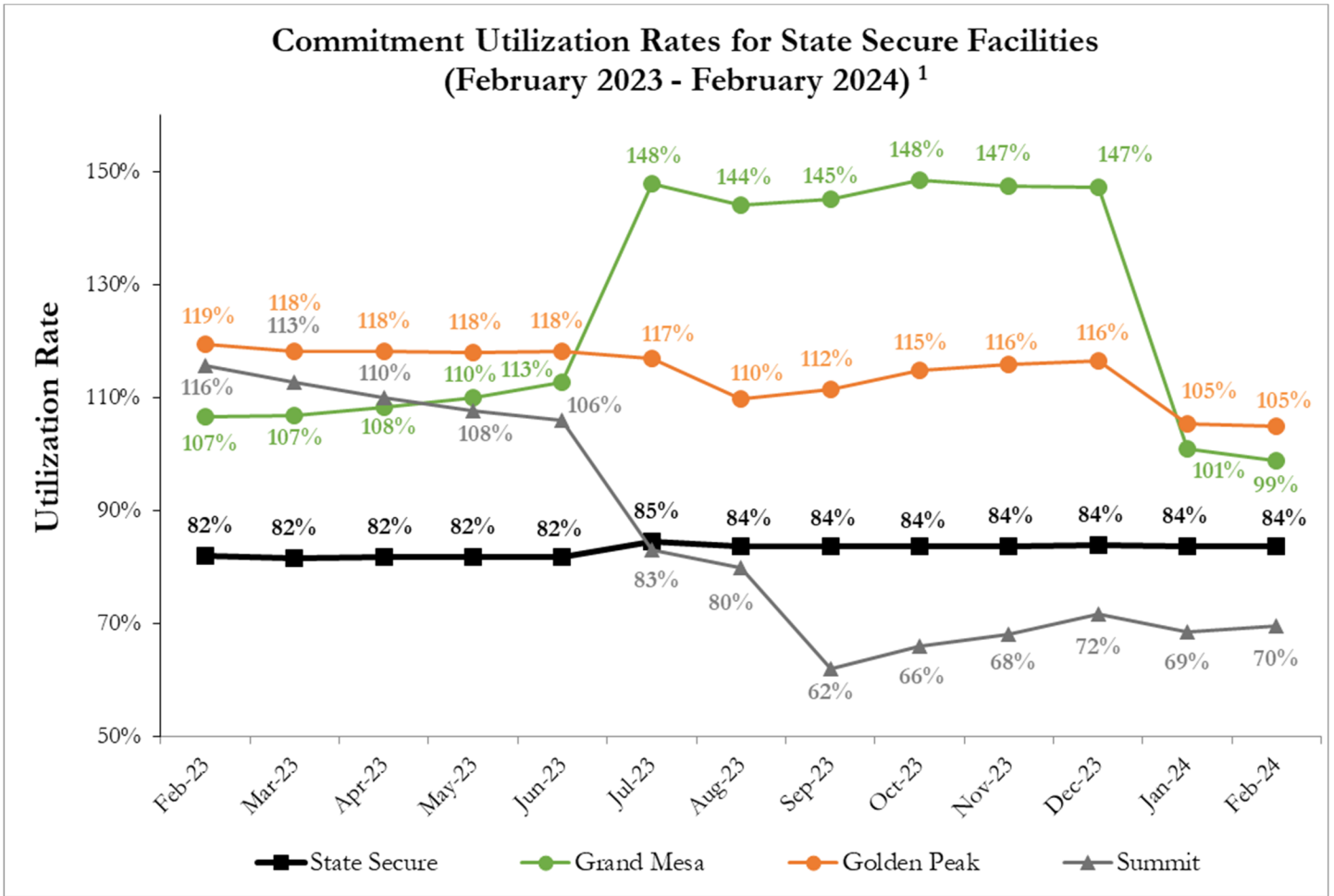
- February 2024 statewide monthly commitment ADP was 261.4, unchanged when compared to January (261.4). YTD, commitment ADP was 263.4, a 0.9% increase from February 2023 (260.9).
- State Secure YSCs have operated at 83.6% of capacity<sup>1</sup> through February, a 1.6% increase compared to February 2023 (82.0%). YTD, two of the eight youth centers (25.0%) operated over capacity: Golden Peak (104.9%, Cap: 22) and Betty K. Marler (102.3%, Cap: 33).
- YTD, Staff Supervised ADP was 17.6, and Community Residential ADP was 10 (a 38.6% increase and a 28.1% decrease, respectively, compared to February 2023).
- There were 12 new commitments in February, a 20% decrease compared to January (15). YTD, there were 128 new commitments, a 15.3% increase compared to February 2023 (111).
- On average, youth discharged this FY have experienced a Residential Length of Service (LOS) of 19.6 months, or roughly 1.6 months longer than February 2023 (18.0 months).
  - YTD, State Secure LOS was 17.3 months, roughly 2.5 months longer compared to February 2023 (14.8 months).

**Parole**

- February 2024 statewide monthly parole ADP was 95.6, a 6.5% decrease from January (102.3). YTD, parole ADP was 99.1, an 8.7% decrease from February 2023 (108.6).
- There were 12 parole intakes in February, a 7.7% decrease from January (13). YTD, there were 107 parole intakes, a 3.6% decrease from February 2023 (111).
- Twenty (20) youth discharged in February, a 33.3% increase from January (15). YTD, 135 youth discharged, a 3.1% increase compared to February 2023 (131).
- On average, youth discharged this FY have experienced a Parole LOS of 6.9 months, which is approximately three days shorter compared to February 2023 (7.0 months).

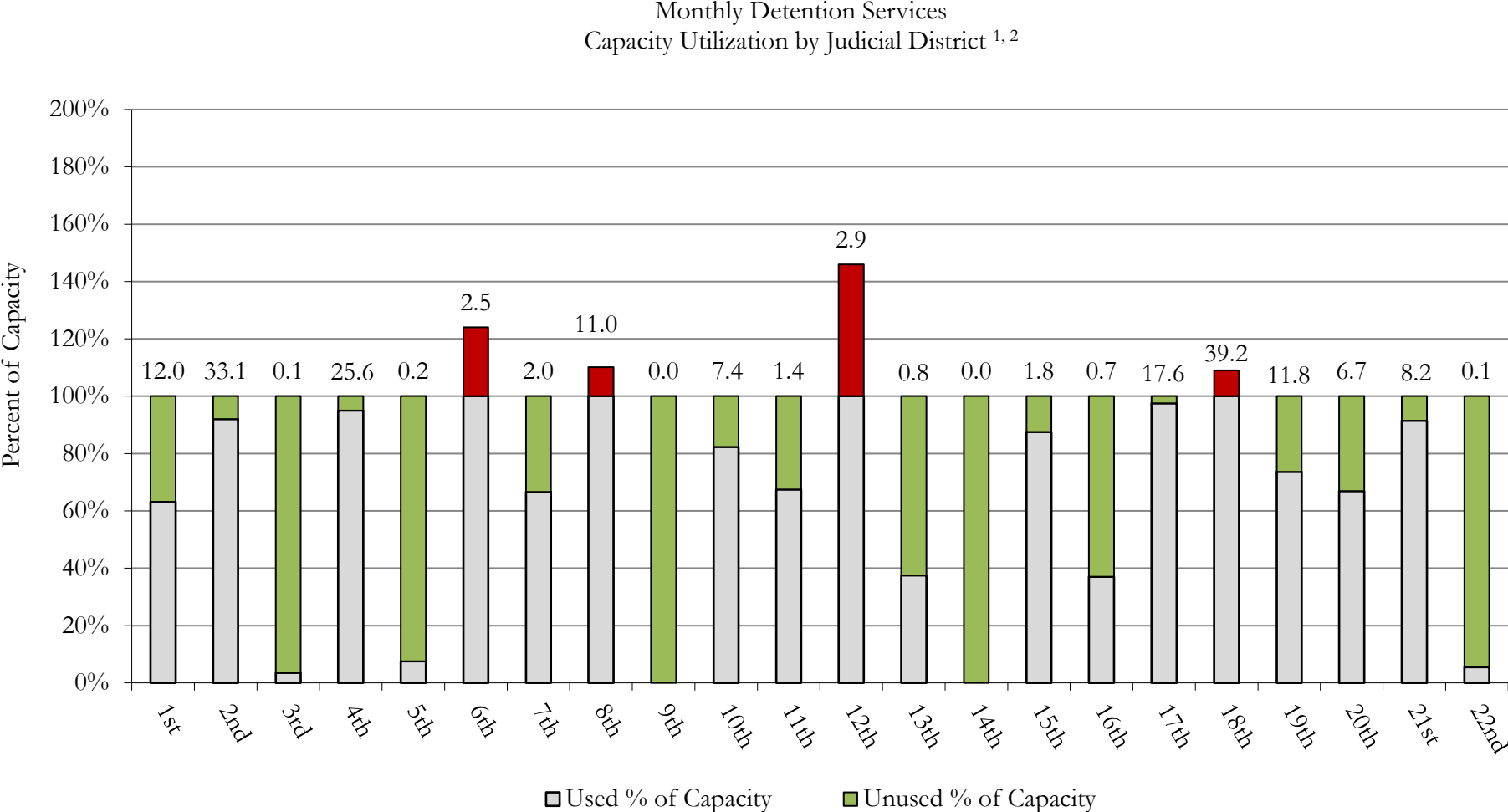
