



LETTER OF TRANSMITTAL.

DENVER, COLO., December 21, 1892.

TO HIS EXCELLENCY,

HON. JOHN L. ROUTT,

Governor of the State of Colorado.

SIR—I have the honor to enclose reports of the Colorado Soldiers' and Sailors' Home for the year ending November 30, 1892, showing roster of members admitted, discharged, died, absent, on leave and present; also cash received and expended by Major John A. Lennon, Commandant of the Home.

Also statement showing all donations received at the Home during the past year.

Also statement, with estimate of money required to pay bills due and unpaid, November 30, 1892.

Also statement showing funds for maintenance of Home for years 1893 and 1894.

Estimate of funds required for the completion of the Home which will have a capacity of from 200 to 250 men.

Also a list of improvements made, giving cost of same since the fourth day of June, 1891.

As you are well aware, the Colorado Soldiers' and Sailors' Home has not received from the State of Colorado *one cent* for the care and maintenance of the inmates of the Home from its opening up to the present time. We believe this State can, and will, make ample appropriations to take care of all old soldiers who served their country in its hour of peril. Inmates are not admitted to the Home except on physician's certificate that they are unable to perform manual labor and are destitute.

Major John A. Lennon, Commandant of the Home, deserves the thanks of the people of this State for the able and efficient manner in which he has so successfully and economically managed the Home. The records will show that the inmates of the Home are better provided for and at less cost *per diem* than any other of the State institutions.

Commissioners George H. Moulton, H. C. Watson, Olando Bonner, John A. Coulter and Colonel P. Stanley have been most efficient in giving their services without charge in the interest of the Home.

Fully appreciating, Governor, your interest and friendship for all old soldiers, I beg that you will recommend sufficient appropriations for the Colorado Soldiers' and Sailors' Home, believing the incoming Legislature will be governed by your recommendation.




