

On the east tract there are several cottages which can be advantageously used in carrying on the work of the asylum.

#### NEEDS.

We need more ground. On the east side our grounds should, by all means, extend to the street car line.

2. We should have a much larger tract for farming purposes, near enough to the present grounds, as to be worked largely by the inmates. This would be a blessing to many of the patients and diminish the necessity for large annual appropriations from the State to carry on the work.

3. We need three additional cottages with capacity to accommodate one hundred patients each. The distressing cry comes from every county in the State for a place where their unfortunates can be properly cared for. There are at present

two hundred patients waiting admission.

4. We need at least two artesian wells on the grounds. This will give us much more healthful supply of water for household purposes, and will also lessen the annual cost of water from the city of Pueblo, which furnishes us water that is sometimes barely fit for household purposes.

#### HEALTH.

The general health in the institution for the past two years has been remarkably good.

#### FIXANCES.

The finances of the institution are in a healthful condition. We have no deficits and need no emergency appropriation.

#### SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT.

To the Board of Lunacy Commissioners of the Colorado State Insane Asylum:

Gentlemen—Again it becomes my duty and pleasure to report the affairs of the institution for a period of two years ending November 30, 1908.

The changes in population will be observed by the following:

Remaining at the end of last report, November 30, 1906, 517 men, 271 women, total 788. Admitted during the period ending November 30, 1908, 170 men, 142 women, total 312. Whole number under treatment 687 men, 413 women, total 1,100. Discharged during the period as recovered, 43 men, 9 women, total 52. Improved, 26 men, 6 women, total 32. Unimproved, 11 men, 1 woman, total 12. Not insane, 3 men, no women, total 3. Died during the period, 79 men, 20 women, total 99. Remaining in the institution November 30, 1908, 525 men, 377 women, total 902.

The population of over nine hundred insane that are now under treatment will show that the larger per cent, of them are chronic and incurable. This condition has been brought about in a measure by not having room to receive these cases when they first became insane. They were compelled to await admission until the State provided more room, and while waiting in almshouses, hospitals and other places, their cases have become chronic and hopeless.

The new cottage for women was finished and opened August 12, 1908; it was filled almost at once, increasing our population from 800 to over 900. The one hundred new admissions are practically all chronic, increable cases.

The recovery rate from a chronic class in every institution of this character is never very large, while the death rate is usually great; but I am glad to say that the death rate for this period has not been as great as the preceding period, and is smaller than that of the average institution of a similar kind. We continue to parole cases that are sent ont as receovered and keep in correspondence with them from time to time for a period of at least three months, and if they continue well at the end of this time they are discharged. This method results in good in two ways; the patient realizing he is still under control of the institution exerts more self control to remain out, and again, if the patient should relapse during the probationary period he can be returned to the institution without the expense of a new trial.

The health of the patients has been good with exception of an epidemic of scarlet fever that visited the institution June, 1907, when about 25 cases occurred, divided about equally between employes and patients, but by prompt action in isolating these cases and free fumigation, the spread of the disease was limited to twenty-five cases. All recovered without any serious after complications.

Measles occurred in the institution during the period, being introduced by a nurse. The nurse was immediately removed to a hospital, his room thoroughly fumigated, and only six cases among the patients occurred. These were promptly isolated and treated and there was no further spread of the disease, and there were no fatalities from it.

So, altogether, we have much to be thankful for in so successfully keeping good the health of so large a population.

We have had no suicides, and but one serious or fatal accident of any kind in our household. One man hit another with a teacup and death resulted soon afterwards, but we were unfortunate in having a negro man while in a psychic epileptic state make his escape from the grounds, and although while being pursued by six employes of the institution—four of whom were nurses of long experience, and who had been in the employ of the asylum ranging from four to eight years—the negro eluded them, obtained a hatchet from the back yard of a resident of the city, and in his flight struck down a most estimable lady, who, after lingering two months, died. This unavoidable and deplorable accident was most distressing to the management. The Superintendent was the first physician to reach the unfortunate lady and conveyed her in a carriage, by instructions of her husband, to the Pueblo hospital. The family physician and Dr. Corwin were summoned, and an operation was immediately performed for her relief. After lingering for about two months with promise of recovery, she suddenly died, much to the regret of all concerned. The negro is an ex-convict, and during the four-months residence in the institution prior to this accident, had never made an attempt to escape or harm anyone; he, however, has never had the privileges of the grounds at any time either before or since the accident except when accompanied by a nurse, and was sitting near the nurse who had him in charge when he made his escape.

The number of escapes for the two years was sixteea; twelve of these were captured and returned to the institution. This record will compare favorably with that of any other institution of the kind wherever located, because all institutions that extend privileges to patients have escapes, and an institution that does not extend as much freedom as possible consistent with safety to all concerned is not conducted as it should be. The modern method of caring for the insane is to give them all the freedom possible consistent with safety, make the surroundings as cheerful and homelike as can be, and to remove all restraint possible. Many institutions in the East have removed all window screens or guards, so as to relieve the jail-

like appearance of the buildings, and while this method may result in some inconvenience, the benefits derived are many, and the plan is constantly growing in favor. One of the most tiresome and pernicions conditions that affects the welfare and happiness of the insane is close confinement, and no occupation, under which conditions they become restless, fretful, irritable, homesick and everything that goes with it, all of which has a tendency to prolong their mental trouble and render them chronic and incurable. Diversion, freedom, open air, exercise by work or walking, have much to do in restoring the insane, even though complete restoration is not possible; also ont-door exercise and plenty of fresh air make the insane much more healthy, comfortable and quiet, and render them less dangerons and troublesome to manage.

Patients should be amused and humored as much as possible. We are better prepared for amusement than formerly, since we have a building for the purpose. Weekly dances are indulged in, and music in the wards by phonograph and other instruments, cards and other games occupy their time.

Divine services every Sunday are enjoyed by all those who

are able and wish to attend.

The State fair was visited by many of our patients, due to the courtesy of the management in admitting them, and they derived much pleasure from it.

Proper care and treatment of the insane is a great study, and it requires many years of experience and close association with them to enable one to be qualified to devise ways and means that may benefit and improve them.

An institution should be so designed and constructed as to admit of a complete classification, separating the acute violent from the chronic incurables, the epileptic and feeble minded

and the criminal insane.

I have advocated for years past a removal of the criminal insane to the penitentiary and provision of suitable quarters there for this class, where they could be under the care of the prison physician, who, if he required expert help in the treatment, could always obtain it without cost to the State.

The removal of the criminal class would give more room for the civil class and at the same time relieve the latter from the injurious effects of association with them. Well regulated

institutions no longer associate these two classes.

The epileptic and feeble minded constitute another class that should be separated from the other insane, with the result of, benefit to all.

Psychopatic wards or hospitals in connection with general hospitals, equipped with all modern appliances, including hydrotherapeutic measures for treatment, are becoming popular and appeal to one as being a step forward in the treatment of the insane, and if the treatment is faithfully and scientifically carried out will doubtless result in great benefit and restore many that otherwise would become hopeless.

A psychopathic department could and should be established in connection with this institution, as a great many asylums are adopting such a plan, and it is not only popular, but a move in the right direction, and if we get the appropriation asked for in this report by the Board, we will be able to have this much desired addition.

### AFTER CARE OF THE INSANE.

In some of the eastern states they have associations known as "After Care Associations," for the benefit of the insane, especially those who have recovered and are friendless. Great good may be accomplished by such an organization; positions are obtained for them and assistance in many ways rendered. I wish some of the good people of Colorado would organize such an association and lend a helping hand to those who go forth as friendless after their restoration. One can imagine how discouraging and depressing it must be to these unfortunates who have recovered, and who are without means or friends to go forth in the world to battle for a living and fail. Is it any wonder that many cases relapse under these circumstances, with no one to help them and with little hope for their future?

### LABORATORY WORK.

The Board of Lunacy Commissioners in its last report asked for an appropriation with which to equip a laboratory for research and other work, but it was not granted. In a modest way we have equipment for examinations of urine, blood, sputum, etc., by microscopic and other appliances. The urine of all new admissions is chemically examined upon their arrival, and any cases that manifest symptoms requiring it are frequently examined. Blood pressure examinations are also made from time to time when required.

#### REPAIRS AND IMPROVEMENTS.

More work in this line has been done during the present period than in any preceding period for many years. An appropriation of \$50,000.00 was made for the erection of one cottage for 100 women, whereas three times this amount was asked for with which to build three cottages to house all the insane in the State unprovided with State care. The contract was let to Mr. Frank Taylor by the Board of Lunacy Commissioners in September, 1907, and the cottage was furnished and opened for the reception of patients August 12, 1908.

Thirteen wards, ten in men's building and three in women's building, were plastered where necessary, and painted throughout, both plastering and wood work, rendering them sanitary, besides greatly improving the appearance of the premises.

Ward "D," men's department, was provided with new window guards throughout, the old ones being worn and broken to such an extent as to be no longer safe or useful.

A new ice box was contracted for by the Board of Lunacy Commissioners for the sum of \$825.00, and has been in use for

several months.

The boiler plant has ben completely overhauled, three of the old boiler settings were entirely removed and replaced by new work, and all old pipe connections made new under the supervision of our engineer. One new boiler was put in by contract with Mr. D. E. Burke, another new boiler was bought by the Board and set up under the supervision of the asylum engineer. This gives the institution a battery of six one hundred horse power boilers, and practically gives us a new plant. Also, all water tubes in the old boilers that were leaking were removed and properly welded and replaced.

All the metal roofs on the premises were painted by the L. Florman Mercantile Co., who was given a contract by the

Board of Lunacy Commissioners.

The old water system in both men and women departments that were very old and dangerons were removed and new pipe put in above ground, which has resulted in stopping all leaks about the foot walls of the buildings, as the old system was underground. The work was done under contract let by the Board of Lunacy Commissioners to Forbes, Casey & Co., of Pueblo.

To make room for the new cottage foundation it was necessary to move water mains and electric light poles, etc., which was done at moderate cost.

Four 220 feet and two 90 feet radiators were placed in wards "I" and "K," to furnish heat at night for the sick.

The blow-off pipe for the boilers that extended to a well far beyond the coal bonse became worn out and useless. Two hundred feet of four-inch new cast iron pipe was purchased, and

it was put in place by our engineer.

The water supply from the city mains, coming in through a four-inch main at Thirteenth and Fifteenth streets, not giving sufficient pressure for fire purposes, the Board of Lunacy Commissioners contracted with Mr. D. E. Burke to install one thousand feet of eight-inch pipe, tapping the main at Tenth street. This will give the asylum a supply from a source not drawn from by other consumers, and should always furnish a steady and sufficient pressure for all purposes.

Two hundred feet of tiling, to drain the water from the down spouts of the new cottage, was put in place by the asylum help, and protects the building from damage by water.

The adjacent lots east and west of present grounds, for which an appropriation of fifteen thousand dollars was made, has been acquired by the Board of Lunacy Commissioners instituting condemnation proceedings; the total cost of 188 lots, with improvements thereon, including court costs, abstract, surveys, etc., was \$14,803.55. This will add nearly twenty acres to the present domain and will be of great benefit and help to the institution.

A wire fence ten feet high, enclosing the grounds of the asylum, has recently been built at a cost of \$1,329.36.

General repairs to keep property in good order were made by the carpenter and engineer.

#### FARM AND GARDEN.

Owing to the unusual drouth and scarcity of water the products from the farm and garden were not as abundant as usual, but nevertheless we raised quite a variety of vegetables for winter use, and it will supply the patients for quite a while. For further information I refer you to the tabulated statement of the amount, kind, etc., of the various vegetables produced. Of course the patients have ben very busy all summer helping to raise the produce and the work has benefited them very much.

#### NEEDS.

The financial condition so far as maintenance is concerned was never better. The institution has never had such a balance to its credit since it was founded. There is \$63,918.27 in the treasury to its credit, or nearly double the amount that was credited to it at the end of last biennial period. The institution was never more prosperous than at present, and the buildings never in better repair or the property in better shape. The Board of Lunacy Commissioners in its part of the report will set forth fully the financial condition and the money required to properly operate it for the next, two years. Owing to the splendid financial condition of the institution and the amount of money it has to its credit in the treasury, it will not be necessary for a very large maintenance appropriation to be made outside of the regular one-fifth mill levy.

One of the greatest needs of the institution is additional accommodations for at least two hundred insane that are not provided with State care, and are waiting for aid. It is to be hoped that the Seventeenth General Assembly, in its wisdom, will look after the welfare of those unprovided for. The State is rapidly becoming more thickly populated, and on this account, and for other reasons, the insane population is constantly increasing and must have proper provision made for their care and treatment. The Board has asked for three additional cottages and the purchase of adjacent land and lots.

## BUILDING WITH HYDRO-THERAPEUTIC EQUIPMENT.

Ten thousand dollars should be appropriated for the erection of a suitable building for hydro-therapeutic purposes and

equipment. Nearly all institutions for the insane have such accommodations for the proper treatment of the inmates, and I would like to see this improvement made here.

# BUILDING FOR STOREROOM, DINING ROOM, SLEEPING APARTMENTS, ETC.

This building is very essential and has been asked for a number of times before, but an appropriation has never been made. It is badly needed for storeroom purposes and dining rooms for officers and employes. At present we have to store goods in basement of the old building, which is not only dark and dingy, but totally inadequate for the purpose.

We have no suitable dining room for officers and employes and need such very much. I should think twenty thousand dollars would be required to erect such a building.

#### COLD STORAGE AND ICE PLANT.

Ice has become quite an item of expense to the institution, and a plant for manufacturing ice and furnishing cold storage is very much needed. An appropriation for this important improvement has been asked for several times before, but has been passed over. I hope to see ten thousand dollars appropriated with which to install the plant, as this amount will be required for the purpose.

#### REPAIR FUND.

Ten thousand dollars should be appropriated for repairs, in order to properly maintain the State property. The buildings should be kept properly repaired and painted inside and out. Steel ceilings would greatly improve the appearance of the wards and should be put in where needed. New floors will be needed in some of the wards.

#### ARTESIAN WELL.

An appropriation has been asked for before for an artesian well, which is very much needed to furnish water for drinking purposes for the patients, but it was not granted. I would respectfully repeat the request, and believe ten thousand dollars should be sufficient for the purpose.

#### ADDITIONS AND ALTERATIONS TO HEATING PLANT.

In the event of more cottages being creeted for the accommodation of the insane now unprovided for, at least twenty thousand dollars should be appropriated for additional boilers and necessary alterations in the present heating system to make it efficient.

#### LIBRARY AND AMUSEMENTS.

A fund of one thousand dollars should be appropriated for library purposes and musical instruments, so the patients may have books and periodicals, pictures and music to help them while away idle moments and lighten the dullness of an asylum life. We now depend wholly upon the charity of the public for all the literature received for the patients.

#### OFFICIAL CHANGES.

The unexpired term that was filled by Mr. M. Studzinski expired July 17, 1907, and the Rev. J. W. Finkbiner, of Colorado Springs, was appointed for a term of six years, and it is a pleasure to record the fact that Mr. Finkbiner has made a most efficient and faithful member; takes a great interest in the advancement of the institution and the welfare of its inmates. Mr. M. A. Vigil resigned his membership of the Board in October, 1908, and Mr. W. L. Hartman, a very distinguished lawyer of Pueblo, was appointed to fill the unexpired term. It is a pleasure to be associated with Mr. Hartman, and his services will be very valuable to the institution. He will be a great help in carrying on the good work.

Dr. B. T. Williams, after a year's service as assistant physician, resigned to return East to engage in private pratice. Dr. E. H. Cohoon was appointed to fill the place, but quit after short service. Dr. W. H. Osborn, formerly superintendent of the Inebriate Asylum at Knoxville, Iowa, was appointed assistant, and during nearly a year's service has proven himself a very faithful, capable physician, and in every way a desirable

man.

When the new cottage for women was opened in August, 1908, Dr. Emma Lucas was appointed assistant, and has been very capable and conscientious in the discharge of her duties.

It is with regret and sorrow that we record the death of the chief engineer and that of his assistant, E. J. Lawrence, both of whom died during the period from pneumonia.

#### ACKNOWLEDGMENTS.

The institution has been visited and inspected a number of times during the period by His Excellency, Governor H. A. Buchtel. The President of Board of Charities and Correction, Rev. Rabbi Friedman, also visited and closely inspected the institution. The Secretary, Mr. Hagar, has frenquently visited us; likewise other members of the Board of Charities and Correction. We are always glad to have these people visit us and suggest anything they think would improve the condition or add to the comfort of the patients.

The consulting staff has continued to place us under obli-

gations by rendering aid whenever asked to do so.

The instituion has continued to depend upon the charity of the public for reading matter for the inmates. Mrs. Stoiber, of Denver, has continued the subscriptions of magazines and periodicals started by the late Mr. E. G. Stoiber several years ago. The list is as fellows, and amounts to about \$127.00 each

year. It is indeed a very gratifying contribution:
