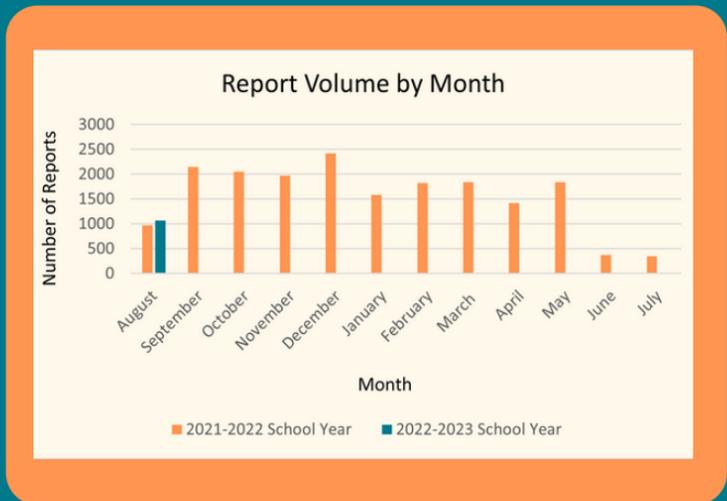

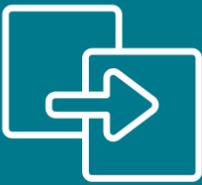

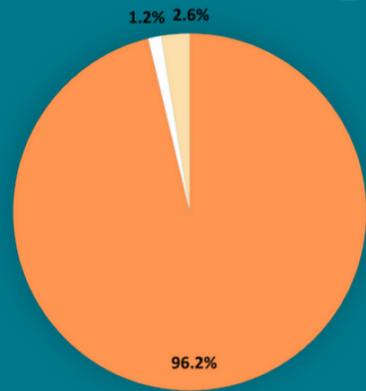
Duplicate reports



Duplicate reports are those regarding a concern or event that has already been reported, and they indicate a healthy culture of reporting safety concerns in a community. 85 duplicate reports have been reported during the current school year; 85 duplicates were reported in August alone—a 267% increase compared to July.

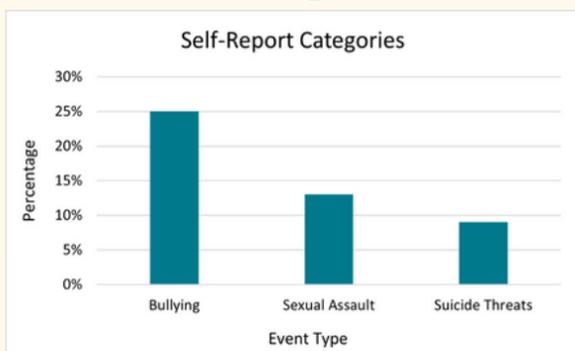
Valid reports are those requiring a response, and that are those made with the intent to protect, prevent harm, or help.

Sample reports

- Correct use of Safe2Tell** — A person reported that they were feeling suicidal and needed someone to check on them. Local law enforcement conducted a welfare check and transferred the individual to the hospital and the individual was placed on a mental health hold.
- Correct use of Safe2Tell** — A student reported that another student was threatening to harm students at their school. Local team investigated and found the student to have possession of guns. The student was arrested and the Crisis Response Team will conduct a threat assessment.
- Misuse of Safe2Tell** — A person reported their concerns about the drop off and pick up areas being unsafe at their students' school. They were encouraged to contact their school or district in the future.
