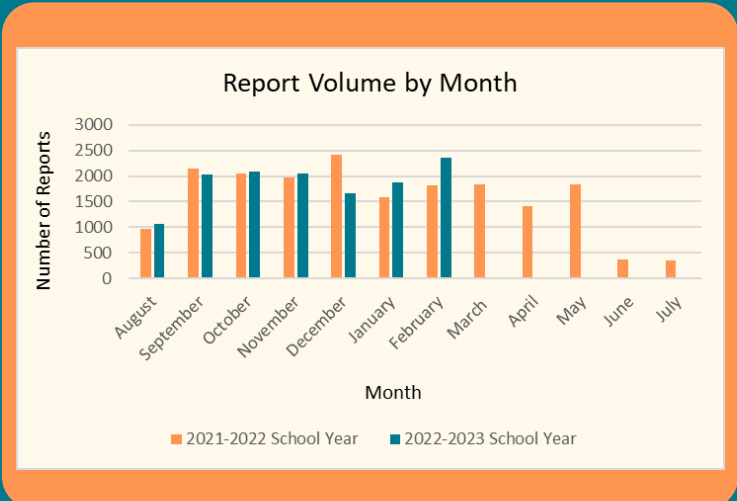

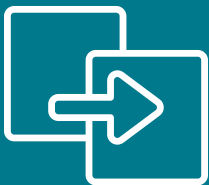

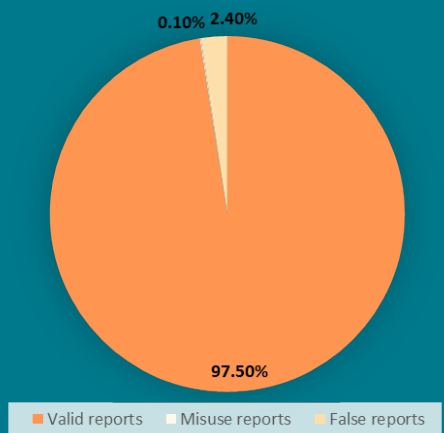
Duplicate reports



Duplicate reports are those regarding a concern or event that has already been reported, and they indicate a healthy culture of reporting safety concerns in a community. 1,256 duplicate reports have been reported during the current school year; 205 duplicates were reported in February alone—a 41% increase compared to January.

97.5% Valid reports



97.5% of reports received during the 2022-2023 school year, which began August 1, 2022, were determined to be valid. Valid reports are those requiring a response, and that are made with the intent to protect, prevent harm, or help.

Sample reports

Correct use of Safe2Tell

A person reported that a student threatened to harm another student at their school. School teams investigated and spoke with both students, and found the student was joking with their friend. School teams had a conversation with the student about the impact their words can have.

Correct use of Safe2Tell

A person reported that a student took an excessive number of pills because they were depressed. Local teams notified the parents, conducted a welfare check, and transported the student to the hospital.
