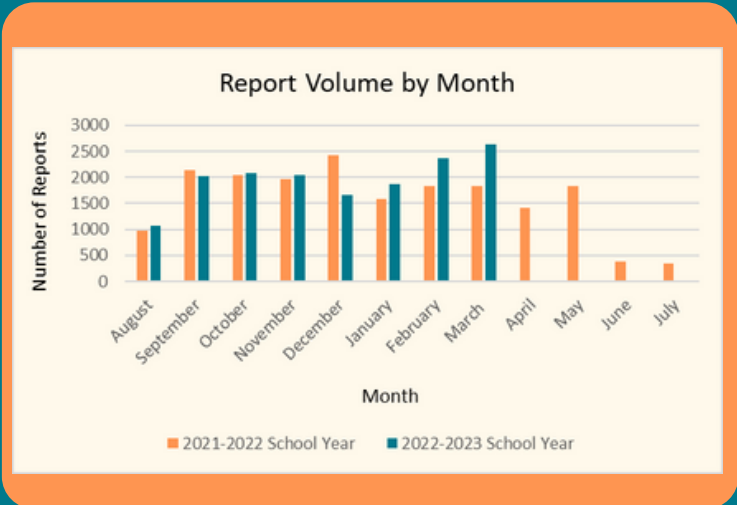


# March 2023 data report

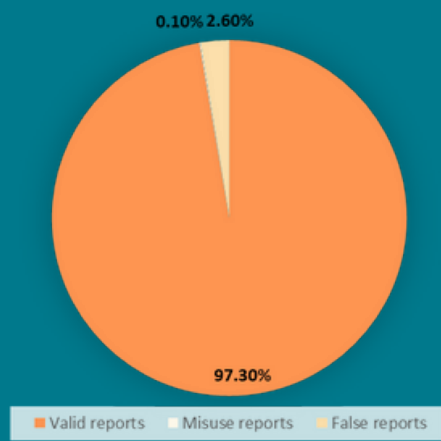
## Duplicate reports



Duplicate reports are those regarding a concern or event that has already been reported, and they indicate a healthy culture of reporting safety concerns in a community. 1,471 duplicate reports have been reported during the current school year; 215 duplicates were reported in March alone—a 5% increase compared to February.

## 97.3% Valid reports



97.3% of reports received during the 2022-2023 school year, which began August 1, 2022, were determined to be valid. Valid reports are those requiring a response, and that are made with the intent to protect, prevent harm, or help.

## Sample reports

Correct use of Safe2Tell

A person reported that a student sent a message to them that made them concerned about the student's wellbeing. Local teams conducted a welfare check and spoke with the student who stated they were not suicidal but wanted to talk to someone. The student's parents were notified, and the student is receiving therapy.

Correct use of Safe2Tell

A person reported that a student was inappropriately touching other students at their school. School teams investigated and the allegations were confirmed, leading to school disciplinary action, the student's parents being notified, and counseling services being offered to the student.
