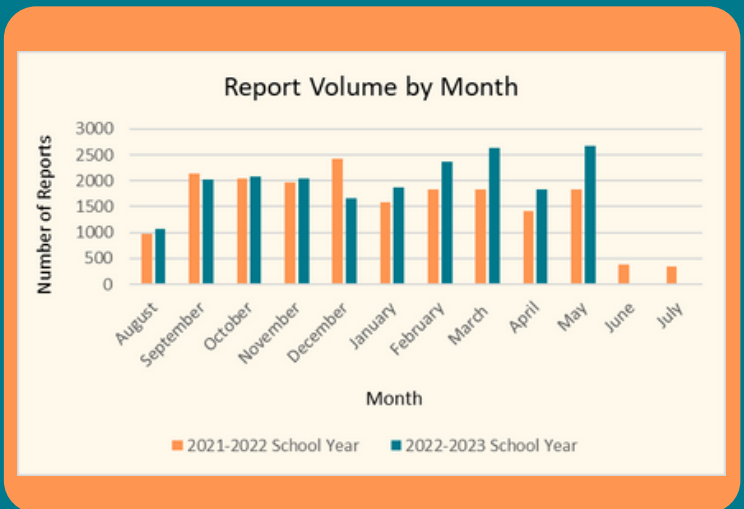

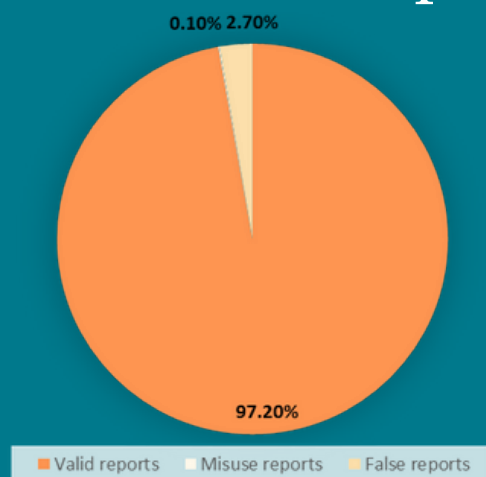
Duplicate reports



Duplicate reports are those regarding a concern or event that has already been reported, and they indicate a healthy culture of reporting safety concerns in a community. 2,075 duplicate reports have been reported during the current school year; 241 duplicates were reported in May alone—a 33% decrease compared to April.

97.2% Valid reports



97.2% of reports received during the 2022-2023 school year, which began August 1, 2022, were determined to be valid. Valid reports are those requiring a response, and that are made with the intent to protect, prevent harm, or help.

Sample reports

Correct use of Safe2Tell

A person reported that a student was verbally aggressive towards their peers. School teams investigated and contacted the student's parents. Additionally, the school counselor had a restorative conversation with each student involved, and all students agreed to keep their distance from each other.

Correct use of Safe2Tell

A person reported that a student expressed feeling afraid to go to their parent's house, because their parent has been violent towards them. School teams investigated and the school counselor spoke with the student, which led to DHS involvement.
