
Sample reports

Correct use of Safe2Tell A person reported concerns about a student who may attempt suicide. Local teams conducted a welfare check and spoke with the student and their parents. The student expressed not feeling suicidal but depressed. School teams are aware, and the school counselor will check in with the student.

Correct use of Safe2Tell

A person reported a student was sharing explicit photos of another student with their peers. School teams investigated and spoke with the student, which resulted in their phone being factory reset. The student's parents were notified, and the student was referred to a sexting prevention education course in their county.
