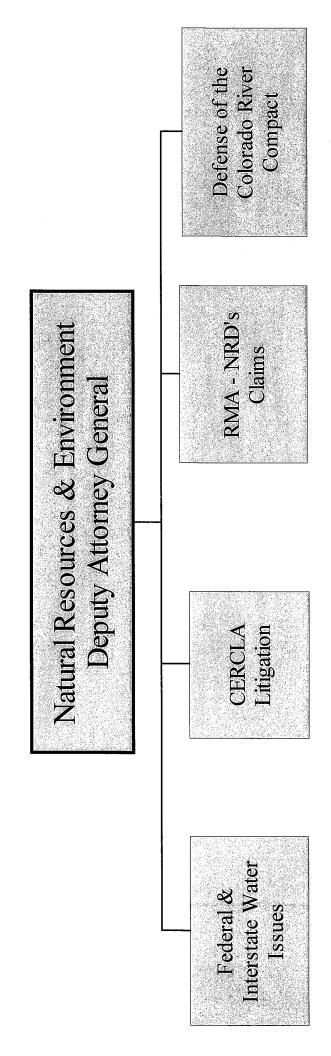

NATURAL RESOURCES AND ENVIRONMENT SECTION PROGRAM SUMMARY

Introduction to the Natural Resources and Environment Section

The Natural Resources and Environment (NRE) Section currently has **37** lawyers (37.5 FTE), 9 legal assistants (8.5 FTE), and four support staff. These dedicated employees protect and defend the interests of the State and its citizens in all areas of natural resources law and environmental law. We represent and advise state agencies and boards that regulate and oversee the use and conservation of Colorado's natural resources and the quality of Colorado's environment.

Federal and Interstate Water Unit:

This unit protects the State's interests in the waters of interstate rivers, with respect to both interstate water allocation and federal environmental requirements, including the Endangered Species Act. The unit also works with state water users to protect the state's interests in the timely and reasonable resolution of federal claims for water rights, including reserved water rights and claims for instream flows.

Defense of the Colorado River Compact:

This unit provides legal counsel and representation to the Department of Natural Resources, the Colorado Water Conservation Board, and the State Engineer on issues pertaining to the Colorado River and the Colorado River Compact. The unit's major tasks include researching issues relevant to potential litigation, preparing a litigation database of the voluminous documents relevant to the Colorado River, and assisting the State Engineer in preparing rules for any in-state curtailment of water rights resulting from a Colorado River Compact call. These activities also prepare the State of Colorado to fully participate in ongoing negotiations with the other Colorado River basin states that are signatories to the Colorado River Compact.

Natural Resources Damages (NRDs) at Rocky Mountain Arsenal:

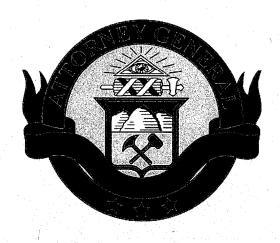
This unit pursues the state's claims against the United States Army and Shell Oil Company for damages due to injuries to the state's natural resources at the Rocky Mountain Arsenal. The Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation and Liability Act (CERCLA) provides states a cause of action for damage to the state's natural resources caused by the release of hazardous substances. Damage recoveries must be used to restore, replace, or acquire the equivalent of the injured resources. In 1983, the State sued the Army and Shell to obtain cleanup of the Arsenal and natural resource damages. The NRD claim has been on "administrative closure" (a long-term stay) while the cleanup of the Arsenal was being selected, designed and implemented. Although cleanup is still ongoing, enough is now known about the extent of cleanup activities to begin estimating the extent of injuries to natural resources. The claim at the Arsenal is potentially quite large – from several tens of millions of dollars to hundreds of

millions. The NRD case consists of two phases: assessment and litigation. We are currently in the assessment phase which should be complete in 2008.

CERCLA Litigation Unit/Hazardous and Solid Waste Unit:

This unit assists several environmental agencies and boards of CDPHE in regulating the storage, treatment and disposal of hazardous and solid wastes. The unit ensures that contaminated sites are promptly and thoroughly cleaned up by those responsible for the contamination, and pursues enforcement actions when appropriate. It also provides legal advice to the Petroleum Storage Tank Committee, which sets oversees reimbursement of cleanup costs that are covered under the Petroleum Storage Tank Fund (essentially a state insurance program). This unit also handles the legal work for ten seriously contaminated sites - known as Superfund sites - most of which are being cleaned up under consent decrees by those who contaminated them. The unit works to recover the state's costs for overseeing these cleanups from the responsible parties to the greatest extent possible. Damages for injury to natural resources (sometimes called NRDs) held by the state in trust for its citizens have been collected from the responsible parties at several sites. The unit assists the state's Natural Resource Trustees (of which the Attorney General is one) in determining how to spend the NRDs funds to restore or replace the injured natural resources such as ground water, wildlife habitat, and fish populations.

Trends and Other Baseline Information:

Continually increasing demands for water and six years of drought have insured that the unit's workload remains heavy. Successful settlements on the North Platte and Republican Rivers still require additional staff time for monitoring and implementation. The State of Kansas recently stated that it intends to initiate another case against Colorado and Nebraska for alleged violations of the Republican River Compact. Kansas likely will allege that Colorado has consumed more water in the Republican River Basin then allowed by the Compact. Similar claims will be made against Nebraska. We are anticipating additional expenses to pay for experts and consultants

for this litigation. Water short down-stream states will continue to covet Colorado's compact entitlements and monitor Colorado's actions closely.

The never-ending and ever-shifting endangered species negotiations on the Platte continue to consume significant time and resources. A trial on the validity of new welluse rules in the Rio Grande (tied to interstate compact compliance) was completed in spring of 2006. For the first time after a truly contested trial on State Engineer's Rules, the Rules were upheld as promulgated. That ruling is now on appeal to the Water Court. Further, cases concerning federal reserved rights for the Black Canyon of the Gunnison and the Great Sand Dunes National Park, additional conjunctive use issues in the Rio Grande Basin, tribal reserved rights from the Animas-La Plata Project, and "bypass flows" imposed by the Forest Service have all heated up with no end in sight. The unit also is taking over the issues on the Arkansas River Compact from outside counsel beginning in FY07, which will require significant attorney time. Issues related to the Colorado River are included in a separate crosswalk. See Defense of the Colorado River Compact. The trend towards open-ended collaborative stakeholder processes is continuing, particularly when it comes to endangered species. This results in the use of more and more resources in traveling to and from, preparing for, and attending meetings involving multiple parties (e.g. other states, federal agencies, Colorado water users, environmental groups), often at locations outside the state.

Assumptions and Calculations:

For Single Program Line items – the fiscal year 2009 (FY09) Personal Services and Operating Budget Request are calculated per Joint Budget Committee (JBC) policy.

- 1. Determine the FY08 base appropriation for personal services and operating by calculating the following:
 - From the program Schedule 3, identify the total personal services expenditures and operating expenditures in FY07. Then from the Personal Services total, subtract the following centrally allocated appropriations: Salary Survey, Performance Based Pay, Health Life Dental, Short Term Disability, AED and SAED. From the operating total subtract these centrally allocated appropriations: Worker's Compensation, Lease Space, Vehicle Lease payments, Communication service payments, Capital outlay and IT Asset Maintenance.
 - Add the above remaining two figures Personal Services and Operating (after the centrally appropriated appropriations have been removed) to determine the amount spent in each category from the program line item appropriation.
 - Calculate the percentage of the total that is personal service and the percentage that is operating. Take the percentage that is personal services and multiply it by

the FY08 line item appropriation. This number will be the FY08 base figure for Personal service. The remainder is the FY08 operating base.

- 2. To compute the FY09 Personal Services Budget Request:
 - Take the calculated FY08 personal services base figure from above and add in the program's FY08 salary survey allocation for both classified and non-classified employees.
 - Then add in 80% of the programs performance-based pay allocation for both classified & non-classified employees.
 - Finally take a 0.2% reduction to the above total and this will be the FY09 personal services request. However, on lines less than 5 FTE the Department did not take the .2 % reduction.
- 3. The FY09 operating request is the same amount as the calculated FY08 operating number. The Department allocates certain centrally appropriated expenditures (Capital Complex Lease Space, IT Asset Maintenance, Worker's Compensation and Vehicle Lease Payments) to the various line items where they are expended. The actual column expenditures (FY06 and FY07) in the Schedule 3 include these allocated appropriations. The Estimate column includes the projected allocation in the current fiscal year.

For the Federal & Interstate Water Unit the Personal Services Base for FY08 is \$450,390 which is 93.4% of the total FY08 Appropriation. The Operation base is \$32.036, which is 6.6% of the total.

Objectives 1.8

Assist as requested with educating legislators, stakeholders, and other interested parties on the practical and legal developments of managing the Colorado River.

Measure 1.8.1 Assist DNR in providing seminars, forums, panel discussions and public meetings as needed to educate the public on issues related to management and operation of the Colorado River and interpretation of the laws that govern the Colorado River.

Trends and Other Baseline Information:

The Defense of the Colorado River Compact Subunit is a newly-created unit established within the Office of the Attorney General for the specific purpose of preparing the State of Colorado for, and representing the State of Colorado in, existing and potential litigation over issues pertaining to the Colorado River and the Colorado River Compact. The Subunit's major tasks included researching issues relevant to potential litigation, preparing a litigation database of the voluminous documents that could prove relevant to such litigation, and assisting the State Engineer in preparing rules for any in-state curtailment of water rights resulting from a Colorado River Compact call. The Subunit's research and database preparation duties will also contribute to the State of Colorado's ongoing negotiations with the

other Colorado River basin states that are signatories to the Colorado River Compact.

Since the establishment of the Subunit, there has been increased activity with respect to Colorado River and Colorado River Compact related issues. In February 2006, the seven Colorado River basin states succeeded in negotiating a tentative agreement that may address some of the issues relevant to the management of the Colorado River. However, the agreement remains very tenuous, and recently has been jeopardized by positions taken by several of the lower basin states. As a result, the State of Colorado remains concerned that the issues intended to be resolved through the Seven Basin States Agreement will be resolved only through litigation. In addition, continued low flows in the Colorado River have again raised the spectre of shortage, increasing the possibility of litigation. Other issues, such as the lining of the All-American canal and proper operation of Glen Canyon Dam, remain contentious. The possibility of litigation over Colorado River environmental issues remains high. Finally, the low Colorado River flows have increased concerns of a possible Colorado River Compact Call.

In summary, the Colorado River situation remains very volatile, and the State's need to prepare itself for possible litigation over the Colorado River has if anything increased. The Subunit may wish to move more rapidly with respect to research certain issues, and with respect to preparing a litigation database. Thus, it is anticipated the demands on the Defense of the Colorado River Subunit will continue over the forthcoming Fiscal Year.

Assumptions and Calculations:

For Single Program Line items – the fiscal year 2009 (FY09) Personal Services and Operating Budget Request are calculated per Joint Budget Committee (JBC) policy.

- 1. Determine the FY08 base appropriation for personal services and operating by calculating the following:
 - From the program Schedule 3, identify the total personal services expenditures and operating expenditures in FY07. Then from the Personal Services total, subtract the following centrally allocated appropriations: Salary Survey, Performance Based Pay, Health Life Dental, Short Term Disability, AED and SAED. From the operating total subtract these centrally allocated appropriations: Worker's Compensation, Lease Space, Vehicle Lease payments, Communication service payments, Capital outlay and IT Asset Maintenance.

- Add the above remaining two figures Personal Services and Operating (after the centrally appropriated appropriations have been removed) to determine the amount spent in each category from the program line item appropriation.
- Calculate the percentage of the total that is personal service and the percentage that is operating. Take the percentage that is personal services and multiply it by the FY08 line item appropriation. This number will be the FY08 base figure for Personal service. The remainder is the FY08 operating base.
- 2. To compute the FY09 Personal Services Budget Request:
 - Take the calculated FY08 personal services base figure from above and add in the program's FY08 salary survey allocation for both classified and non-classified employees.
 - Then add in 80% of the programs performance-based pay allocation for both classified & non-classified employees.
 - Finally take a 0.2% reduction to the above total and this will be the FY09 personal services request. However, on lines less than 5 FTE the Department did not take the .2 % reduction.
- 3. The FY09 operating request is the same amount as the calculated FY08 operating number. The Department allocates certain centrally appropriated expenditures (Capital Complex Lease Space, IT Asset Maintenance, Worker's Compensation and Vehicle Lease Payments) to the various line items where they are expended. The actual column expenditures (FY06 and FY07) in the Schedule 3 include these allocated appropriations. The Estimate column includes the projected allocation in the current fiscal year.

For the Defense of the Colorado River Compact Line item appropriation the calculated Personal Services base number for FY08 is \$709,179 which is 93.5% of the total FY08 Appropriation of \$758,880. The Operation base figure for FY08 is \$49,701 which is 6.5% of the appropriated total.

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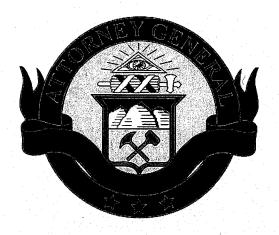

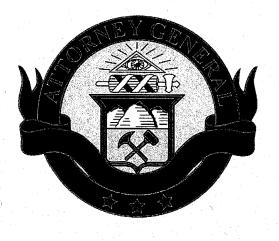

PROGRAM NARRATIVE

Program Title: CERCLA Litigation Unit (and Contracts Line)

Long Bill Line Item: Water & Natural Resources – CERCLA & CERCLA Contracts

Change Requests: No.

Federal and State Statutory Authority:

The Attorney General powers and duties, Sec. 24-31-101(1)(a) C.R.S., as implemented by Executive Order Nos. D-0038-83, D-0012-86, D-0060-86, D-0084-86, D-0004-96 and D-0007-97; the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation, and Liability Act (CERCLA) 42 U.S.C. §§. 9601 to 9675; the Colorado Hazardous Waste Act (CHWA) §§ 25-15-301 to 327; State Hazardous Waste Sites, §§ 25-16-101 to 201; other state and federal public health and environmental statutes.

Program Description:

The CERCLA Litigation Unit has two primary objectives. First, the Unit protects public health and the environment by assisting in the environmental cleanup of sites contaminated with hazardous substances. We provide legal advice to the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment (CDPHE) regarding the adequacy of proposed cleanup measures, and assist in negotiating or litigating appropriate cleanups. In cases where there are financially viable entities that are responsible for contamination, the Unit also negotiates or litigates to recover costs that the state has incurred in responding to releases of hazardous substances.

The Unit's second objective is to make the public whole by recovering damages for injuries to the state's natural resources, where such injuries were caused by the release of "hazardous substances," as defined under CERCLA. In fulfilling this objective, the Unit acts on behalf of the State's Natural Resource Trustees – the Executive Director of the Department of Public Health and Environment, the Executive Director of the Department of Natural Resources, and the Attorney General. Once damages have been recovered, the Unit works with staff from the other two trustees to oversee their appropriate distribution to restore, replace, or acquire the equivalent of the injured resources. In providing this NRDs assistance, the Unit represents the Attorney General on working groups of citizens from affected communities, and provides counsel to the three State Natural Resources Trustees.

Remedial activities have been completed at most of the sites in the above table. The main exceptions are the Rocky Mountain Arsenal, California Gulch, and the Vasquez Blvd./I-70 site. Generally, even where cleanup has been completed, some residual contamination remains. Under CERCLA, the state is primarily responsible for long-term monitoring and oversight of such facilities, and the unit assists CDPHE in executing these responsibilities. Remediated sites can also be "re-opened," which necessitates substantial additional legal work. An example of this is the Eagle Mine site, discussed in more detail below.

Trends and Other Baseline Information:

Since its inception in FY 1984-85, the CERCLA Litigation Unit has recovered over \$63.3 million dollars, of which \$27.8 million has been returned to the General Fund, \$10.5 million has been deposited in the Hazardous Substance Response Fund for future oversight, and \$10.8 million has been placed in the Natural Resources Damage Recovery Fund. In addition, \$11.7 million has been deposited in custodial funds accounts to pay for the ongoing clean up of the Summitville Mine, and \$2.5 million for natural resource damages at the same Site.

One item in the above table deserves mention – the difference between the projected and actual cost recovery totals for FY 08 (\$1 million projected vs. \$511,000 recovered). Several years ago, we won a cost recovery suit against the Army and Shell at the Arsenal. Since then, we have worked out a process with them for recovering our continuing costs, and there have been only minimal disputes over our ongoing expenditures. While that was also the case this past year, the Army's share of the payment (they split the total evenly) is overdue. We expect to receive it shortly.

As noted above, remedial activities at most of the CERCLA sites listed above have been completed, so the unit's workload has decreased over time. Commensurate FTE reductions have taken place as caseload related to site cleanup and cost recovery issues has diminished; CERCLA Unit staff level has been reduced from 26 FTE in FY 1984-85 to 9.3 FTE for FY 2002-03, and further reduced in FY 2003-04 to 4.8 FTE. Legal work related to cleanup of the Arsenal and California Gulch (the two largest remaining sites) is expected to remain reasonably steady over the next 2-3 years, if not longer. One site where cleanup was completed years ago is being proposed for redevelopment – the Eagle Mine, near Minturn. Consequently, additional cleanup will be required, and the unit has significantly increased its efforts at this site to assist CDPHE in resolving the many legal issues related to the proposed redevelopment.

While cleanup work has diminished over time, there is a countervailing trend toward significantly increased work related to natural resource damages. Cleanup has progressed sufficiently at two very large sites with remaining remedial work, the Rocky Mountain Arsenal and California Gulch, to allow the state to begin estimating the extent of its natural resource damages claims at those sites. Consequently, we have begun this process, and have initiated settlement discussion with the responsible parties at the two sites. This increased effort to recover damages for injuries to the state's natural resources will result in an increased workload for each site for the foreseeable future. At the California Gulch Site, we have reached an Agreement in Principal with the primary defendants precipitated by the bankruptcy of Asarco. The settlement includes cleanup, past response costs and natural resource damages. Terms for reimbursement of future oversight costs still need to be resolved. The bankruptcy court approved the Agreement in Principle but it is subject to appeal. See Program Narrative for Natural Resource Damage Claims at Rocky Mountain Arsenal for information about that site.

At the sites where we still have funds remaining from prior NRD recovery efforts (Eagle Mine and Summitville), we are working with staff from the other trustees, local governments, and interested citizens to determine the best restoration projects, and to award the remaining funds accordingly. These efforts represent a small part of the Unit's overall workload.

Legal work related to remaining cleanup activities, and to the distribution of past NRD recoveries, is expected to remain steady through FY 2009.

Similar or Cooperating Programs:

At the federal level, the United States Environmental Protection Agency is the agency primarily responsible for implementing the cleanup side of the CERCLA program. The United States Fish and Wildlife Service and the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration play major roles in implementing the natural resource damages provisions of CERCLA.

Assumptions and Calculations:

For Single Program Line items – the fiscal year 2009 (FY09) Personal Services and Operating Budget Request are calculated per Joint Budget Committee (JBC) policy.

- 1. Determine the FY08 base appropriation for personal services and operating by calculating the following:
 - From the program Schedule 3, identify the total personal services expenditures and operating expenditures in FY07. Then from the Personal Services total, subtract the following centrally allocated appropriations: Salary Survey, Performance Based Pay, Health Life Dental, Short Term Disability, AED and SAED. From the operating total subtract these centrally allocated

- appropriations: Worker's Compensation, Lease Space, Vehicle Lease payments, Communication service payments, Capital outlay and IT Asset Maintenance.
- Add the above remaining two figures Personal Services and Operating (after the centrally appropriated appropriations have been removed) to determine the amount spent in each category from the program line item appropriation.
- Calculate the percentage of the total that is personal service and the percentage that is operating. Take the percentage that is personal services and multiply it by the FY08 line item appropriation. This number will be the FY08 base figure for Personal service. The remainder is the FY08 operating base.
- 2. To compute the FY09 Personal Services Budget Request:
 - Take the calculated FY08 personal services base figure from above and add in the program's FY08 salary survey allocation for both classified and non-classified employees.
 - Then add in 80% of the programs performance-based pay allocation for both classified & non-classified employees.
 - Finally take a 0.2% reduction to the above total and this will be the FY09 personal services request. However, on lines less than 5 FTE the Department did not take the .2 % reduction.
- 3. The FY09 operating request is the same amount as the calculated FY08 operating number. The Department allocates certain centrally appropriated expenditures (Capital Complex Lease Space, IT Asset Maintenance, Worker's Compensation and Vehicle Lease Payments) to the various line items where they are expended. The actual column expenditures (FY06 and FY07) in the Schedule 3 include these allocated appropriations. The Estimate column includes the projected allocation in the current fiscal year.

For the CERCLA Program line item appropriation the calculated Personal Services base number for FY08 is \$426,327 which is 94.3% of the total FY08 Appropriation of \$452,001. The Operation base figure for FY08 is \$25,674 which is 5.7% of the appropriated total.

PROGRAM NARRATIVE

Program Title: Natural Resource Damage Claims at Rocky Mountain Arsenal

Long Bill Line Item: Natural Resource Damage Claims at Rocky Mountain Arsenal

Change Requests: No, just annualization of the 2008 change request.

Federal and State Statutory Authority:

The Attorney General powers and duties, Sec. 24-31-101(1), C.R.S., as implemented by Executive Order Nos. D-0038-83, D-0012-86, D-0060-86, D-0084-86, D-0004-96 and D-0007-97; the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation, and Liability Act (CERCLA) 42 U.S.C. §§. 9601 to 9675.

Program Description:

In the 2006 and 2007 legislative sessions, the legislature approved decision items to continue to fund activities supporting our Natural Resource Damage (NRD) claim at the Rocky Mountain Arsenal. The claim at the Arsenal is potentially quite large – from several tens of millions of dollars to hundreds of millions. The responsible parties, Shell and the Army, have thus far failed to offer a settlement acceptable to the state. To ensure the best bargaining position, and to prepare in the event the state is forced to litigate the claim, we request that funding be continued as set out in the original decision item. This decision item totaled \$742,312, and included 2.0 FTE positions. We anticipate that these positions will be needed through at least FY10. We have filled these positions, and have begun our formal Natural Resource Damage Assessment (pursuant to regulations adopted under CERCLA). The Assessment will form the bulk of our case at trial, and will also be used to support our position in any settlement negotiations.

In developing an estimate of FY 2009 expenditures, we have assumed that we would hire contract attorneys, rather than add additional state employees, because the increase in legal workload is only expected to last a year. Further, it is possible that defendants may attempt to delay the actual trial through various strategies. Hiring contract attorneys instead of state FTE's gives us more flexibility to adjust to such tactics, if they are pursued.

We are requesting annualization of our FY08 budget request to allow us to complete the assessment work and initiate litigation in FY09. The process of assessing natural resource damages relies heavily on a variety of scientific and economic experts, and is quite expensive. We expect that expenditures for the Assessment will peak in FY08 at about \$2.6 million, dropping to slightly over \$1.2 million in FY09. Nearly all of the increase in FY08 is for outside experts. In FY09, the Assessment will be complete, but we will need additional legal resources to conduct discovery and trial. We will also incur additional expert expenses revising the Assessment in response to defendants

critiques, preparing for and attending depositions and other discovery, expert reports, pretrial hearings and for trial and other court appearances.

Trends and Other Baseline Information:

For the last two years, the legislature approved a decision item to fund activities supporting our Natural Resource Damage claim at the Rocky Mountain Arsenal. The Arsenal NRD case consists of two phases: assessment and litigation. We have begun our formal Natural Resource Damage Assessment (pursuant to regulations adopted under CERCLA). The Assessment will form the bulk of our case at trial, and will also be used to support our position in settlement negotiations.

The initial step in the Assessment is a Preliminary Assessment Screen and Determination. This document was completed last winter, along with a draft Preliminary Estimate of Damages. These documents are required by the regulations to support a natural resource trustee's decision to pursue an assessment and to ensure that the costs of the assessment are reasonable and therefore recoverable under the law. The next step in the Assessment process is development of an Assessment Plan. We anticipate the public release of the Assessment Plan this fall and hope to complete the Assessment itself within 12–18 months.

At this point, we think that the cost estimates for completing the Assessment and initiating litigation are valid. However, some FY 2008 costs may not be incurred until FY 2009, and the trial phase may begin later than originally anticipated (assuming the case does not settle). In developing an estimate of FY 2009 expenditures, we have assumed that we would hire contract attorneys, rather than add additional state employees, because the increase in legal workload associated with pre-trial discovery and trial work is expected to last a short time - most likely one or two years. Predicting the exact course of a natural resource damage trial is difficult. It is typical for federal district court cases in this state to proceed through discovery and trial in less than a year. However, NRD cases are not typical by any means. No NRD cases have been litigated in federal district court in Colorado, and few have been litigated anywhere. Based on experience in other states, it is possible that defendants may attempt to stretch the state's resources and delay the actual trial through various strategies. Hiring contract attorneys instead of state FTEs gives us more flexibility to adjust to such tactics, if they are successfully pursued. The downside of hiring contract attorneys is that the cost is significantly greater (we have assumed \$150/hr.) than inhouse.

Similar or Cooperating Programs: None.

Assumptions and Calculations:

For Single Program Line items – the fiscal year 2009 (FY09) Personal Services and Operating Budget Request are calculated per Joint Budget Committee (JBC) policy.

1. Determine the FY08 base appropriation for personal services and operating by calculating the following:

- From the program Schedule 3, identify the total personal services expenditures and operating expenditures in FY07. Then from the Personal Services total, subtract the following centrally allocated appropriations: Salary Survey, Performance Based Pay, Health Life Dental, Short Term Disability, AED and SAED. From the operating total subtract these centrally allocated appropriations: Worker's Compensation, Lease Space, Vehicle Lease payments, Communication service payments, Capital outlay and IT Asset Maintenance.
- Add the above remaining two figures Personal Services and Operating (after the centrally appropriated appropriations have been removed) to determine the amount spent in each category from the program line item appropriation.
- Calculate the percentage of the total that is personal service and the percentage that is operating. Take the percentage that is personal services and multiply it by the FY08 line item appropriation. This number will be the FY08 base figure for Personal service. The remainder is the FY08 operating base.
- 2. To compute the FY09 Personal Services Budget Request:
 - Take the calculated FY08 personal services base figure from above and add in the program's FY08 salary survey allocation for both classified and non-classified employees.
 - Then add in 80% of the programs performance-based pay allocation for both classified & non-classified employees.
 - Finally take a 0.2% reduction to the above total and this will be the FY09 personal services request. However, on lines less than 5 FTE the Department did not take the .2 % reduction.
- 3. The FY09 operating request is the same amount as the calculated FY08 operating number. The Department allocates certain centrally appropriated expenditures (Capital Complex Lease Space, IT Asset Maintenance, Worker's Compensation and Vehicle Lease Payments) to the various line items where they are expended. The actual column expenditures (FY06 and FY07) in the Schedule 3 include these allocated appropriations. The Estimate column includes the projected allocation in the current fiscal year.

For the Rocky Mountain Arsenal Litigation Line item appropriation the calculated Personal Services base number for FY08 is \$2,607,001 which is 97.9% of the total FY08 Appropriation of \$2,661,667. The Operation base figure for FY08 is \$54,666 which is 2.1% of the appropriated total.

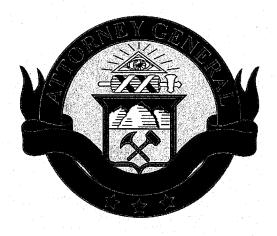

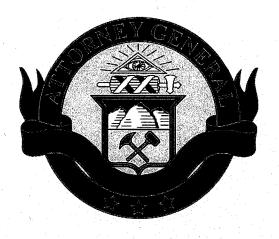
