Gift cards are a popular and convenient way to give someone a gift. They're also a **popular** way for scammers to steal money from you. That's because gift cards are like cash: if you buy a gift card and someone uses it, you probably cannot get your money back. Gift cards are for gifts, not payments. Anyone who demands payment by gift card is very likely a scammer.

News from Colorado Attorney General Phil Weiser

Colorado travel company will reimburse Colorado high schoolers and families nearly \$800,000 for trips canceled due to the pandemic

Attorney General Phil Weiser reached agreement with a Wheat Ridge-based travel company, Voyageurs International, to provide refunds to about 400 Coloradans after withholding fees for music trips to Europe that it canceled due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Colorado Attorney General, law enforcement officials and Department of Labor launch statewide task force to investigate and prosecute unprecedented unemployment insurance fraud and identity theft Together with law enforcement agencies and the Colorado Department of Labor and Employment (CDLE), Colorado Attorney General Phil Weiser announced the creation of the Colorado Unemployment Fraud Task Force. The joint task force will investigate and prosecute those who have committed identity theft, and used that information to commit fraud against the state of Colorado and the unemployment insurance system.

Attorney General Phil Weiser announced that his office secured more than \$9.5 million in refunds for Colorado borrowers who were charged unnecessary GAP insurance fees. Through a multistate effort, Colorado discovered that Wells Fargo historically had not been refunding unearned GAP fees owed to consumers in Colorado and other states.
