LETTER OF TRANSMITTAL

STATEMENT

Under the laws of this state the Industrial Commission is given charge of the administration of the Workmen's Compensation Act, the State Compensation Insurance Fund, the Industrial Relations Act, and the Colorado Minimum Wage law.

During the last year the Attorney General rendered an opinion to the effect that it was the duty of the Industrial Commission to license and regulate private employment agencies, and question was raised as to the validity of this opinion; a friendly suit has been brought to raise and determine the question. The case is now pending in the Supreme Court.

Under the opinion of the Attorney General above mentioned there appears in the law to be a divided responsibility as to the administration of certain other of the state activities. Under the Attorney General's opinion, it would seem that some responsibility rests upon the Industrial Commission for the administration of such act, so far as it affects the relations between employers and employes; however, inasmuch as the legislature has given the appropriations for the enforcement of the such acts mentioned in the Attorney General's opinion to another department, the Commission has felt it wise to leave the responsibility of the enforcement of such acts in the hands of such other department.

The last legislature realized the handicap under which the Commission was operating by lack of sufficient referees and reporters to even fairly handle the work, and granted to this Commission appropriations for two referees and two reporters; however, this appropriation was not available until after the session of the legislature. The wisdom of this provision is beginning to show in the amount of work handled by the referees. The number of awards entered by referees this year is more than fifty per cent greater than the number of awards rendered last year. This service will certainly be of benefit to the claimants, and undoubtedly will speed up the handling of compensation matters, of which speed is a primary fundamental.

The last legislature passed certain amendments to the compensation law, which were also designed to assist in making speed for the handling of matters before the Commission. These amendments became effective Angust first, and, although the details of working out the new system of procedure have not been entirely perfected in so short a time, yet the general feeling seems to prevail that a great improvement has been made that would be of particular benefit to the elaimants under the law.

COLORADO INDUSTRIAL COMMISSION

Inasmuch as there is a steady and continual growth in the industrial enterprises of the state, we find a steady increase in the amount of work coming to and to be handled by this Commission. It is almost impossible to realize the accmunilation of records and files, and the detail in properly indexing and cross-indexing the various matters in the department. When it is realized that there have been over 110,000 accidents in this state since the inception of this law, and approximately 30,000 claims growing out of such accidents, and that the data and information contained in each file must be readily accessible at all times, the difficulties encountered become readily apparent. When it is stated that with a name no more common than Anderson there should appear eards for approximately fifty Andersons whose christian names commence with "J," probably some idea of the necessity of accurate indexing and cross-indexing can be obtained.

To meet the exigencies of such a situation, it has become necessary to install, and we are installing, an index system with a thousand alphabetical divisions, each division sub-divided ten times, giving a total of ten thousand alphabetical divisions, the main divisions being used on the surnames, which are vocalized down to the last letter in the name, and the sub-divisions dividing each main division for the christian names, which are also vocalized to the last letter. This indexing refers entirely to the names of the injured employes.

WORKMEN'S COMPENSATION LAW

The original Workmen's Compensation Law was enacted in 1915, amended in 1917, and in 1919 the prior laws were repealed and an entirely new act passed, to which there were no amendments until 1923, at which time four amendments were passed, the three principal ones effective August 1, 1923. The complete law as amended has been compiled by the Commission and copies thereof may be obtained by those interested upon request. No attempt will be made to set forth in detail the effect of each amendment, but the following gives a summary of some of the more important.

The maximum compensation to be paid was raised from \$10.00 to \$12.00 per week. This increased the death benefits from a maximum of \$3,125.00 to a maximum of \$3,750.00. Other increases were necessarily made as to total permanent and permanent partial amounts, corresponding to the weekly rate.

The funeral benefits were increased from \$75.00 to \$125.00.

Provision was made to assist in the collection of compensation from employers who failed to insure according to the Act.

Authority was given the Commission to make payments of small amounts of compensation due and unpaid at the death of the claimant to persons designated by the Commission, and also gave anthority to the Commission to make payment of compensation due an insane elaimant.

The compensation payable to a foreign claimant was reduced from one-third to one-fourth of the amount payable to resident claimants.

Provisions were made:

Making the law clear that amounts paid for a specific loss under the schedule be in addition to temporary disability, the Commission to fix the time of the termination of such temporary disability;

Eliminating the special operating fee in hernia cases and providing that in ease of hernia the sixty-day limit on medical benefits be eliminated;

Providing a limitation of six months instead of one year for an injured employe to make elaim;

Providing for eight per cent interest to claimants on deferred payments.

In suits to set aside awards of the Commission the answer by the Commission was dispensed with, files of the Commission being taken as answer to such suits, and providing for the return to the Commission by the court of the records of the Commission after decision in the case.

COLORADO INDUSTRIAL COMMISSION

Quite extensive changes were also made in the procedure in handling compensation cases before the Commission and its referces, all of which were designed for the purpose of speeding up the handling of claims.

Agreements between the insurer or employer and the injured employe were eliminated, a provision made that the insurance carrier or employer must within fifteen days either admit or deny liability, and if liability is admitted to any extent whatever the payments shall immediately commence.

Permission was given the referee to enter summary award without specific finding of facts, requiring a petition to the referee for a rehearing and opportunity to the referee to correct his own award before submission of the matter to the Commission for a final decision, and requiring the Commission to make specific findings of facts on all cases reviewed by it.

Inasmuch as the new procedure did not become effective until August 1st, it is entirely too early to pass final judgment thereon; however, from the small experience already had, it would appear that the new procedure will greatly simplify the details of handling claims and will result in a material speeding up of compensation matters.

WORKMEN'S COMPENSATION INSURANCE PREMIUM INCOME AND LOSSES, COLORADO

The distribution of premium income and losses paid for Workmen's Compensation Insurance in Colorado since the passage of the law in 1915 is shown in the table on page 8, which divides the total business handled into three groups, namely: Stock companies, mutual companies and the State Compensation Insurance Fund.

An analysis of this table reveals a decrease of \$451,163.05 in premium income for 1922, which may be distributed on a percentage loss basis to the three groups as follows: Stock companies 75%, mutual companies 19\%, State Compensation Insurance Fund 6%. A total increase of only \$16,865.32 is to be noted in the amount of losses paid during 1922, the stock companies showing a decrease in the amount paid on claims while the mutual companies and the State Compensation Insurance Fund show approximately an equal increase in amount of losses paid.

Figures for the year 1923 (*) are not available at the present time. However, the business of the State Compensation Insurance Fund for the first eleven months is included for comparative purposes.

One of the above self-insurers carries catastrophy insurance covering liability for any accident from \$25,000.00 to \$150,000.00.

Since the Sixth Report (November 30, 1923) the Commission has denied one application for self-insurance permit, one selfinsurer has withdrawn its election to be subject to the provisions of the Workmen's Compensation Act, and five self-insurers have taken out policies with insurance earriers.

Every self-insurer is required not only to furnish satisfactory financial statement showing financial ability to protect its employes against loss, but is also required to set up reserves, not only to protect incurred loss but to set up contingent reserves to protect possible unforseen contingencies. Bonds are also required, the amount of such bonds being determined by the Commission according to the hazard of the employment, number of employes, and with particular reference to the catastrophy contingent.

BENEFICIARIES' TRUST DEPOSITS

The Commission, under its power to safeguard compensation payments due dependents, is requiring deposits to be made to two hundred and three individual dependents to whose accounts there is now standing a credit of \$61,295.24. During the year fifty-seven new accounts were opened. The Commission ordered, during the year, nineteen withdrawals from some of these accounts, totaling \$1,260.78. From one of said accounts there is now being paid to the gnardian for the benefit of the minor dependent a \$15.00 per month allowance.

The moncy so deposited draws four per cent interest and is fully protected by surety bond held by the Commission. The above deposits are a gnarantee against distress among those for whose benefit they are held in trust.

STATE COMPENSATION INSURANCE FUND

Statement of income and disbursements of the State Compensation Insurance Fund, for the period from December 1, 1922, to November 30, 1923, and admitted assets and liabilities as of November 30, 1923, together with a statistical table of comparisons of the principal items with similar items in statements of previous years.

For the past two years one of the most interesting items of the statement of an insurance company writing Workmen's Compensation Insurance is the item of premiums written, which is an indication of the trend of business in general. It is interesting to note that the premium income of the State Compensation Insurance Fund, for the year ending November 30, 1923, amounts to \$399,218.98, as compared with \$331,313.44 for the year ending November 30, 1922, an increase of approximately 21 per cent. The percentage of increase of the public premium portion of this total is considerably greater than that of the premiums collected from private employers. This is due to the fact that the Fund has increased the payroll auditing force sufficiently to obtain audits of payrolls of all of its policyholders. This has resulted in the collection of many thousands of dollars of premiums from counties, cities, and towns, which would otherwise not have been determined.

The outstanding event during the past year of economic importance to the state was the decision of the Supreme Court of the United States validating the Moffat Tunnel Legislation with the subsequent prompt letting of the contract for the construction of the Moffat Tunnel by the Moffat Tunnel Commission. The Fund was successful in writing the Workmen's Compensation Insurance, covering employes both of the Moffat Tunnel Commission and of the contractors, Hitchcock & Tinkler, Inc. This was undoubtedly the largest workmen's compensation insurance contract written in this state for the past seven years. The insurance under this risk has only recently gone into effect, so that the premium income of the Fund does not show the effect of this increase in the volume of its business in the present statement.

The statistical system of the Fund is now in such shape that the report to the Insurance Commissioner this year will be practically as complete as that of any insurance company writing business in the state.

COLORADO INDUSTRIAL COMMISSION

It will be noticed from the attached financial statements that the total assets of the Fund are now \$1,541,428.84, and that the surplus over every conceivable hability is \$523,872.89. These figures amply demonstrate the financial stability of the Fund. More than that—they demonstrate the success of the Fund in competition with private interests in a remarkably graphic manner. Surely, when the volume of Workmen's Compensation Insurance in this state is considered, and the fact that the Fund started with nothing in 1915 but an efficient management and high hopes for the future, the success of these eight years and a half is phenomenal.

The management of the Fund has pressed forward in a serious effort to build up the business of the Fund through legitimate competition, and to provide adequate service to the Fund's policyholders, in the handling of their interests, whether from an underwriting standpoint or from the standpoint of prompt payment of compensation to their injured employes.

The Fund is self-supporting, not only that, but according to the Supreme Court of the state, the money in the Fund docs not belong to the people of the State of Colorado, but to the policyholders of the Fund.

Above was mentioned the fact that the premium income of the Fund has increased 21% during the past year. With the addition of the Moffat Tunnel contract alone, there will be a further increase of 10% during the next year, without considering the normal expansion for the year. In spite of all this, which naturally means an increase in the volume of work in all of the departments of the Fund, there is no provision for the appointment of even one additional elerk when needed.

The average operating expense of a stock company in this country is 40% of the premium income. The average expense of mutual companies writing Workmen's Compensation Insurance is $22\frac{1}{2}\%$. The average expense of State Funds is $12\frac{1}{2}\%$. The expense of the Colorado State Fund during the period covered by this report is 7%. Colorado is one of the smallest states in the volume of workmen's compensation premiums.

Every business man knows that there is a certain minimum percentage of operating expenses to income in any business, below which the business cannot be operated without overtaxing the employes or jeopardizing the service.

There is no doubt but that the policyholders of the Fund will get behind the Industrial Commission in any move for legislation working towards the improvement of the efficiency of the Fund. It has been amply demonstrated that the policyholders of the Fund appreciate the conscientiousness and efficient administration of the Fund by the Commission and have confidence in the Commission's judgment.

SUMMARY OF INDUSTRIAL CASES

The following is a list of the cases handled by the Commission during the year, with an epitomized statement of facts relating thereto:

Case No. 1011. Typographical Union No. 175, vs. Employers, Pueblo, November 29, 1922. 30 employes. 3 employers. Notice of an increase in wages. Case set for hearing and wage increase granted, which was accepted by employers and employes.

Case No. 1012. Leadville Miners vs. Employers, Leadville, December 10, 1922. 300 employes, four employers. Notice of increase in wages. Case set for hearing and wage increase granted, which was accepted, after some delay, by both employers and employes. Strike resulted at some of the mines which refused to pay the award of the Commission, but was only of short duration.

Case No. 1013. Bridge, Structural and Ornamental Iron Workers vs. Employers, Denver, December 29, 1922. 140 employes, 20 employers. Notice of increase in wages. Case set for hearing and wage increase granted, same being accepted by both employers and employes.

Case No. 1014. Complaint was made to this office by an employe of The American Beet Sugar Company, Rocky Ford, Dccember 29, 1922, in regard to the new employes, or the casual employes, receiving a bonus, or a higher scale than the employes working regularly for the company. Upon investigation it was found that there was no change in conditions, that it had always been customary to pay the employes who had only casual employment a higher wage than those employed regularly.

Case No. 1015. Wood, Wire and Metal Lathers vs. Employers, Denver, December 30, 1922. 60 employes, 25 employers. Notice of increase in wages. Case set for hearing. Before the hearing date Commission was notified that a mutual agreement was reached.

Case No. 1016. Typographical Union No. 708 vs. Employers. Boulder, December 30, 1922. 14 employes, 3 employers. Notice of increase in wages. Case was set for hearing and continued until a later date at the request of the employes and before said hearing date another continuance was asked for. After making an investigation, the Commission decided to terminate jurisdiction.

Case No. 1017. Plumbers and Steam Fitters Union No. 20 vs. Master Plumbers, Pueblo, January 17, 1923. 19 employes, 13 employers. Notice of an increase in wages. After several conferences between employes and employers, controversy was settled by mutual agreemnet.

Case No. 1018. Liberty Coal Company vs. Employes, Trinidad, January 19, 1923. Notice of reduction in wages. After an unsuccessful endeavor to gct information, the Commission wrote the company not to make any change until it had complied with the law, and the case was closed. The Commission later received the information that the property had changed hands, and no change in conditions of employment.

Case No. 1019. Cigar Makers Union No. 306 vs. Fred L. Mullett, Pueblo, January 20, 1923. Notice of a reduction in wages. Upon investigation it was found that there were three girls involved, that they were put on a different brand of cigar that did not bring as much money to the employer and was said to be an easier cigar to make, consequently, with the same energy as on the former cigars, the employes could make as much money during a day's work. After a conference with those involved the notice was withdrawn.

Case No. 1020. Griffin Wheel Company vs. Employes, Denver, January 24, 1923. 200 employes, one employer. Letter was received by the Commission to the effect that a meeting was held between the employes and the employer, at which an agreement was reached that was satisfactory to all to change the hours of work per day. The Commission upon investigation found that there was no protest and the case was closed. At the same time an increase was voluntarily granted by the Company to a portion of its employes.

Case No. 1021. Glass and Glaziers Union No. 930 vs. Employers, Denver, January 24, 1923. 50 employers, 4 employers. Notice of a new contract regarding working conditions and an increase in wages. After investigation the case was set for hearing and an increase in wages was granted.

Case No. 1022. Wood, Wire and Metal Lathers Union No. 507 vs. Employers, Boulder, January 25, 1923. 10 employes, 8 employers. Notice of an increase in wages. The Commission was notified during the thirty days that a settlement was mutually agreed upon.

Case No. 1023. Cement Finishers Union No. 577 vs. Employers, Denver, February 8, 1923. 56 employes, 20 employers. Notice of an increase in wages. Case was set for hearing and upon the hearing date the representatives of the Union appeared. No appearance by employers. The Commission terminated jurisdiction.

Case No. 1024. Granite Cutters vs. Employer, Salida, February 9, 1923. 25 employes, one employer, Complaint was received from the employes that the employer did not furnish dust protectors. The Commission immediately wrote the employer and received an answer that the complaint was justified and that he would immediately remedy conditions by purchasing said protectors.

Case No. 1025. Sheet Metal Workers vs. Employers, Denver, February 15, 1923. 131 employes, 39 employers Notice of an increase in wages. Case was set for hearing and increase granted.

Case No. 1026. Geo. S. Tunnell, employe, vs. Employer, Dyke, February 19, 1923. Complaint was received in regard to a wage contract. The Commission had no jurisdiction in this case, but wrote the employer setting forth the complaint and requested that an attempt be made to settle it satisfactorily.

Case No. 1027. Steamfitters and Helpers Union No. 208 vs. Employers, Denver, February 26, 1923. 180 employes, 50 employers. Notice of increase in wages. The Commission set case for hearing and increase was granted. This award was binding, as an agreement was made between employees and employers to the effect that they would accept the award of the Commission.

Case No. 1028. Drainlayers Union No. 331 vs. Master Plumbers, Denver, February 26, 1923. 100 employers, 50 employers. Notice of increase in wages. An agreement signed by employers and employes was filed with the Commission for an increase in wages from \$5.80 to \$6.50 for an eight-hour day. Commission terminated jurisdiction.

Case No. 1029. Plumbers and Gasfitters Union No. 3 vs. Master Plumbers, Denver, February 26, 1923. 216 employes, 50 employers. Notice of increase in wages. An agreement signed by employers and employes was filed with the Commission for an increase in wages from \$8.50 to \$9.50 for an eight-hour day. Commission terminated jurisdiction.

Case No. 1030. Plumbers and Steamfitters Union No. 8 vs. Master Plumbers, Colorado Springs, February 26, 1923. 26 employes, 10 employers. Notice of increase in wages. Case was set for hearing and an increase granted.

Case No. 1031. Asbestos Workers Union No. 28 vs. Employers, Denver, February 26, 1923. 12 employes, 6 employers. Notice of increase in wages. Case set for hearing and increase granted.

Case No. 1032. Carpenters District Council vs. Master Builders, Denver, February 27, 1923. 1,300 employes, 50 employers. Notice of increase in wages. Case set for hearing. No appearance was made by employers. Increase granted.

Case No. 1033. Sign and Pictorial Painters Union No. 1045 vs. Employers, Denver, February 28, 1923. 30 employes, 6 employers. Notice of a reduction in wages. Commission set the case for hearing, upon request of both parties same was continued twice. After evidence was submitted, the Commission denied a reduction.

Case No. 1034. Hoisting Engineers vs. Employers, Denver, March 2, 1923. Notice of an increase in wages. Case set for hearing and increase granted.

Case No. 1035. International Fuel Corporation vs. Employes, Frederic, March 5, 1923. 150 employes, one employer. Complaint was received from employer that it was necessary to reduce the force, and when some of the men were laid off they would not let the other men continue to work. The Commission immediatelly investigated and found that there was an attempt by the employer to reduce the wages by circulating a petition among the employes. The Commission was successful in keeping the men at work, and a hearing was held. The Commission found that the complaint made by the men in regard to the circulating of a petition was just and that some of the men had refused to sign said petition and were laid off. The Commission ordered the employer to reinstate the men who were unfairly dealt with and to reimburse them for the time that they had lost and required the company, if they desired to make a decrease, to give the thirty-day notice.

Case No. 1036. Griffin Wheel Company vs. Employes, Denver, March 6, 1923. 220 employes, one employer. Notice was received from the company that it was voluntarily granting an increase to the employes. No protest was received.

Case No. 1037. Electrical Workers Union No. 68 vs. Electrical Contractors, Denver, March 9, 1923. 160 employes, 30 employers. Notice of an increase in wages. An agreement signed by employers and employes was filed with the Commission for an increase in wages from \$8.00 to \$9.00 for an eight-hour day. The Commission terminated jurisdiction.

Case No. 1038. Operative Plasterers' International Union No. 32 vs. Master Builders, Denver, March 12, 1923. 150 employes, 25 employers. Notice of increase in wages. Employers and cmployes reached a satisfactory agreement to increase the wages from \$10.00 to \$12.00 for an eight-hour day, and so notified the Commission.

Case No. 1039. Frank Newhouse Advertising Service vs. Employes. Complaint was received from Mr. Newhouse that the Union refused to supply him with the help demanded. Upon investigation it was found according to the members of the Union that Mr. Newhouse was not complying with their working rules. The Commission had no jurisdiction for the reason that it cannot compel an employer to employ members of the Union or the employes to go to work for any employer.

Case No. 1040. Painters and Decorators No. 171 vs. Employers, Colorado Springs, March 15, 1923. 90 employes, 10 employers. Notice of an increase in wages. After investigation case was set for hearing. Before date of hearing the Commission was notified by both parties that a satisfactory agreement was reached.

Case No. 1041. Elevator Constructors Union No. 25 vs. Employers, Denver, March 17, 1923. 18 employers, 4 employers. Notice of a new contract and increase in wages. Case set for hearing and parties were successful in reaching a satisfactory agreement, upon the basis of the award, with slight changes.

Case No. 1042. Wellington Mines Company vs. Employes, Breckenridge, March 21, 1923. 100 employes, one employer. Company notified the Commission that they wished to increase the wages and had so notified the employes. No protest from employes.

Case No. 1043. Window Washers vs. Employers, Denver, March 21, 1923. 27 employes, one employer. Notice of new contract. After investigation, the Commission terminated jurisdiction.

Case No. 1044. Troy Laundry vs. Employes. Glenwood Springs, March 21, 1923. 16 employes, one employer. Complaint was received of a reduction in wages without the required notice. The Commission investigated and found that the complaint was justified and ordered the employer to reinstate conditions as they were prior to complaint and set the case for hearing. On the date of the hearing the Commission was successful in getting the employer and the cmployes satisfied with an agreement and the hearing was not necessary.

Case No. 1045. Plumbers and Steamfitters No. 20 vs. Master Plumbers, Pueblo, March 26, 1923. 22 employes, 13 employers. Notice of increase in wages. Settled within the thirty days by mutual agreement.

Case No. 1046. Plumbers and Steamfitters No. 195 vs. Master Plumbers, Boulder, March 27, 1923. 20 employes, 5 employers. Notice of increase in wages. Settled within the thirty days by mutual agreement.

Case No. 1047. Typographical Union No. 425 vs. Newspaper Employers, Canon City, March 30, 1923. 14 employers, 3 employers. Notice of increase in wages. Case set for hearing. Before hearing date, Commission was notified by both parties that a mutual agreement had been reached.

Case No. 1648. American Smelting and Refining Company vs. Employes. Durango, March 31, 1923. 230 employes, one employer. Notice was received that the Company wished to make a voluntary increase and had posted notices to that effect. No protest from employes.

Case No. 1049. Painters and Paperhangers vs. Employers, Denver, April 2, 1923, 500 employes, 60 employers. Notice of increase in wages. Case set for hearing and testimony was taken. Although some employers claimed that the increase was not justified, they said that as long as other building crafts were receiving an increase they felt that the painters were as deserving as other crafts. Award entered granting increase.

Case No. 1050. Electrical Workers No. 12 vs. Employers, Pueblo. April 2, 1923. 14 employes, 5 employers. Notice of increase in wages. Settled by mutual agreement.

Case No. 1051. Roofers Union No. 55 vs. Employers, Denver, April 5, 1923, 14 employes, 10 employers. Notice of increase in wages. Case set for hearing. Award entered denying increase.

Case No. 1052. United Brotherhood of Carpenters and Joiners No. 362, vs. Employers, Pueblo, April 6, 1923. 175 employers, 15 employers. Notice of increase in wages. Agreement, signed by employers and employes, showing satisfactory agreement, received by the Commission.

Case No. 1053. Liggitt Brothers (Bell Mining Company)vs. Employes, Frederick, April 6. 1923. 12 employes, one employer. Complaint was received of a lock-out of employes. Case was set for hearing and the evidence disclosed the fact that the complaint was not justified, for the reason that the employes who claimed to have been discharged had some difference with a former employer, which had nothing to do with the present employer.

Case No. 1054. Bakers and Confectionery Workers vs. Employers, Denver, April 17, 1923. 25 employers, 200 employes. Notice of increase in wages. Commission investigated and found that all employers, with one exception, had signed agreements and jurisdiction was terminated.

Case No. 1055. Denver Gas and Electric Light Company vs. Employes, Denver, April 18, 1923. Commission was notified that employer had called a meeting of the employes and explained its desire to increase the wages, same being satisfactory to the employes.

Case No 1056 Black Canon Coal Company vs. Employes, Huerfano County, April 18, 1923. 16 cmployes, one employer. Notice of wage reduction. By investigation it was found that the employer was paying more than the usual wage, and at a meeting of the employes and the employer they were successful in reaching a mutual agreement.

Case No. 1057. Painters and Paperhangers No. 302 vs. Master Painters, Pueblo, April 18, 1923. Notice of increase in wages. Commission was notified later of a satisfactory settlement.

Case No. 1058. Armour and Company vs. Employes, Denver, April 24, 1923. 347 employes, one employer. Commission was notified that an agreement had been reached through their Plant Conference Board for an increase in wages. On investigation it was found that those interested were satisfied with said settlement.

Case No. 1059 Denver Sewer Pipe and Clay Company vs. Employes, Denver, April 25, 1923. Notices received that a voluntary increase was put into effect. No protest from employes.

Case No. 1060. Swift and Company vs. Employes, Denver, April 26, 1923, 325 employes, one employer. See Case No. 1058.

Case No. 1061. Blayney-Murphy Packing Company vs. Employes, Denver, April 26, 1923. 105 employes, one employer. See Case No. 1058.

Case No. 1062. Carpenters and Jointers, Local No. 418, vs. Employers, Greeley, April 28, 1923. 30 employes, 8 employers. Notice of increase in wages. Commission was notified of mutual agreement.

Case No. 1063. Colorado Fuel and Iron Company vs. Employes, Pueblo, April 28, 1923. 6,000 employes, one employer. Notice was received that employer had called the representatives of the employes together and notified them that the steel works in the East had increased wages, and that they wished to grant a similar increase to their employes. After the representatives had talked to the employes they were satisfied with said increase, and the employer was so notified.

Case No. 1064. Pueblo Gas Company vs. Employes, Pueblo, May 3, 1923. 23 employes, 1 employer. Notice of increase in wages. Commission was later notified that employer and employes had held a conference and had reached a mutual agreement.

Case No. 1065. Cooks and Waiters No. 43 vs. Employers, Pueblo, May 3, 1923. Notice of increase of wages. After investigation the Commission terminated jurisdiction.

Case No. 1066. Denver Cooks Association No. 18 vs. Employers, Denver, May 3, 1923. 177 employes, 38 employers. Commission received notice from the Union that they wished to renew their old contract, conditions to remain the same. The employers had no objection.

Case No. 1067. Hotel and Restaurant Employes vs. Employers, Denver, May 4, 1923. Notice of increase of wages. After thirty days had elapsed and no protest was received, the Commission terminated jurisdiction.

Case No. 1068. Smuggler Leasing Company vs. Employes, Aspen, May 7, 1923. Some time prior to this date a controversy arose between said employer and employes and the Commission sent a representative to Aspen. The employes in this case claimed that the miners of Leadville were going to demand an increase in wages and if their employer would give the same settlement given the Leadville miners that they would go back to work, and the case was settled on this basis. The Commission held a hearing in the Leadville case and ignated an increase. This employer then called the men together and reached a satisfactory agreement on the basis of the increase granted the miners of Leadville.

Case No. 1069. Painters and Paperhangers, Locai No. 974, vs. Master Painters, Greeley, May 7, 1923. Notice of increase in wages. After a conference between the employers and employes the Union withdrew their demand for an increase.

Case No. 1070. Waiters and Waitresses No. 14 vs. Employers, Denver, May 9, 1923. Notice was received of renewal of contract on the same basis as former contract, with one exception, whereby the employee employed for a shift of three hours during the busy time of the day should receive \$1.50 instead of \$1.25. No protest from employers. Commission terminated jurisdiction.

Case No. 1071. Moiders' Union No. 188 vs. Employers, Denver, May 11, 1923. 115 employes, 14 employers. Notice of increase in wages. Commission set case for hearing and granted an increase, which was refused by employers, and strike resulted.

Case No. 1072. E. I. duPont de Nemours and Company vs. Employes, Louviers, May 11, 1923. 110 employes, 1 employer. Notice received that the employer wished to put into effect a voluntary increase in wages. No protest from employes.

Case No. 1073. Crown Fuel Company vs. Employes, Superior, May 14. 1923. 59 employes, 1 employer. Petition signed by most of the employes to the effect that they were not satisfied with the doctor selected by the employer, whose duty was to give medical and surgical aid to the employes and their families. The Commission set the case for hearing and found that the employer had changed doctors on account of some difference he had with the doctor then in his employ. It was further found that the doctor that he employed at this time was the doctor that he had previously and that this doctor had given satisfactory service, according to the testimony of the employes. In fact, both doctors seemed to be satisfactory to all the employe. The Commission found that it was for the best interests of all that the company make arrangements with the doctor, so long as these arrangements would comply with the medical plan that the company had on file with the Commission.

Case No. 1074. Alpine Rose Cafe vs. Employes, Denver, May 17, 1923. 18 employes, 1 employer. Complaint was received from employes that a wage reduction was contemplated and no notice had been received by this Commission. After the employers had been advised in regard to the law, a thirtyday notice was posted and the Commission notified at the expiration of thirty days that the union help had all quit and there was no further protest and employer put reduction into effect.

Case No. 1075. Bricklayers' Union No. 4 vs. Employers, Colorado Springs, May 17, 1923. Notice of a demand for an increase in wages. Communication was later received from the Union that contractors had granted increase.

Case No. 1076. Street Railway Employes vs. Employer, Pueblo, May 18, 1923. Notice of increase in wages. After several conferences the Commission was advised that employes had decided not to press their demands. After several weeks the case was closed and the parties notified that if they wished to further press their demands that the Commission required a new notice.

Case No. 1077. Plasterers' Union vs. J. H. Leonhauser, Denver, May 23, 1923. Three employes, one employer. Complaint was received that the employes had walked out, and upon investigation it was found that the employer had violated a union rule by employing workmen who were not members of the organization. At a conference where all interested parties were present an agreement was reached which was mutually satisfactory.

Case No. 1078. Bell Mining Company vs. Employes, Eureka Mine, June 2, 1923. 12 employes, 1 employer. Complaint was received of a reduction of wages. After investigation it was found that there was no justification for complaint as wages had not been reduced.

Case No. 1079. Cigar Makers' Union No. 129 vs. Employers, Denver, June 13, 1923. 322 employes, 5 employers. Notice of increase in wages. Letter was later received from the secretary of the Union asking that the case be dismissed as they had reached an agreement.

Case No. 1030. Griffin Wheel Company vs. Employes, Denver, June 15, 1923. Letter was received from the company advising of a voluntary increase to all employes. No protest from employes.

Case No. 1081. Cooks' and Waiters' Union No. 43 vs. Employers, Pueblo, May 31, 1923. 67 employes, 15 employers. Notice of increase in wages. Commission set case for hearing. Increase not granted.

Case No. 1082. Stereotypers' Union No. 13 vs. Employers, Denver, June 21, 1923 Notice of increase in wages After several conferences case was set for hearing, at which hearing it was agreed to abide by the award of the Commission, thereby making the decision binding. Small increase was granted

Case No. 1083. Typographical Union No. 49 vs. Employers, Denver, July 5, 1923. 180 employes, 3 employers. Notice of increase in wages. This case was submitted to arbitration and then an appeal was taken from the decision of the local arbitration to Indianapolis. Case was not finished at the time this report was printed.

Case No. 1084. Stereotypers' Union No. 67 vs. Employers, Pueblo and Colorado Springs, July 7, 1923. 10 employes, 3 employers. Notice of increase in wages. Case was settled by mutual agreement.

Case No. 1085. Employes of Deaver Tramway Company vs. Employer, Denver, July 19, 1923. 200 employes, 1 employer. Notice of increase in wages. After a conference it was found that the company had a plan whereby the employes were represented by a man selected by the employes from each department, whereby all employes (numbering about 1,100) were represented. The officials of the company held that any demand for a change in wages or any other change in conditions should be submitted to this committee for adjustment. It appeared that this demand was submitted to this committee and they voted on it, rejecting the demand, and asked the employes to withdraw their demand from the Commission. After a vote taken by the men at the shops as to whether or not they would withdraw the notice from the Commission, the vote stood about three to one not to withdraw the notice and to ask the Commission for a formal hearing. The Commission set the case for hearing and, from the evidence presented, granted an increase, with which the company refused to comply.

Case No. 1086. Electrical Workers' Union No. 113 vs. Employers, Colorado Springs, July 25, 1923. Notice of increase in wages. Settled by mutual agreement.

Case No. 1087. Canon-Reliance Coal Company vs. Employes, Canon City, July 25, 1923. 65 employes, 1 employer. Notice was received of a demand for an increase in wages. After investigation it was found that this company was not paying the going wage for pick miners that was being paid by other mines in the district, but that they had never paid the wage of the other mines for that class of work, consequently had not made any change in the wage scale. The Commission had no jurisdiction.

Case No. 1088. Theatrical Employes' Union No. 62 vs. Employers, Colorado Springs, July 25, 1923. Notice of demand for increase in wages and other changes in new contract. Controversy was settled satisfactorily by mutual agreement.

Case No. 1089. Moving Picture Operators' Union No. 230 vs. Employers, Denver, July 25, 1923. 90 employes, 9 employers. Notice of increase in wages and new contract. After several conferences the case was set for hearing and during said hearing all parties interested agreed to abide by the decision of the Commission, making same binding. The Commission granted an increase and other slight changes in contract.

Case No. 1090, Bill Posters' Union No. 59 vs. Employers, Denver. July 31, 1923. Notice of increase in wages. Case was set for hearing and the evidence showed that the employes demanded a full day's wages for any part of a day worked. The Commission found that this demand was not justified.

Case No. 1091. Theatrical and Stage Employes' Union No. 7 vs. Employers, Denver, August 2, 1923. 120 employes, 6 employers. Notice of increase in wages. Case was set for hearing and parties notified. Before date of hearing letter was received from employes that same was settled satisfactorily with a 7½ per cent. increase.

Case No. 1092. Typographical Union No. 82 vs. Employers, Colorado Springs, August 16, 1923. 100 employes, 8 employers. Notice of increase in wages. After several conferences the case was settled by mutual agreement.

Case No. 1093. Web Pressmen's Union No. 22 vs. Employers, Denver, August 17, 1923. 60 employes, 3 employers. Notice of wage increase and new contract. Parties decided to arbitrate and selected Commissioner Annear and agreed to abide by his decision. Increase and slight changes in contract were granted.

Case No. 1094. Crown Coal Mine vs. Employes, Louisville, August 21, 1923. Complaint was received from an employe that a change was made that caused a reduction in wages and that when he protested he lost his

position. The Commission set case for hearing and ealled in the employers and several employes. After the case was gone into thoroughly the Commission terminated jurisdiction.

Case No. 1095. Typographical Union No. 175 vs. Employers, Pueblo, September 20, 1923. 65 employees, 2 employers. Notice of wage increase and new contract. After obtaining all the information possible by mail and telephone the Commission terminated jurisdiction.

Case No. 1096. Canon-Reliance Coal Company vs. Employes, Canon City, October 19, 1923. New wage scale was submitted to the Commission, which was mutually agreed to by employer and employes.

Case No. 1097. North Park Coal Company vs. Employes, Fort Collins, October 23, 1923. 37 employes, 1 employer. Notice was received for a slight change in the wage scale. No protest from employes.

Case No. 1098. Colorado Fuel and Iron Company vs. Employes, Pueblo, October 26, 1923. 4,667 employes, 1 employer. Notice was received that a voluntary increase was to be put into effect, after a conference with the representatives of the employes. No protest.

Case No. 1099. Colorado Fuel and Iron Company vs Employes, Lime, October 29, 1923. 57 employes, 1 employer. Notice was received that a voluntary increase was to be put into effect, after a conference with the representatives of the employes. No protest.

Case No. 1100. Alamo Coal Company vs. Employes, Huerfano County, November 30, 1923. Opening a new mine and submitted a wage scale.

Case No. 1101. Steam Engineers' No. 1 vs. Employers, Denver, November 30, 1923. 270 employes. Notice received for a demand to change from a seven-day week to a six-day week with the same scale as existed for the seven-day week. This case was not disposed of.

CHANGES IN THE COST OF LIVING DENVER, COLORADO

Detailed information covering the original investigation as to the minimum or comfort level budget necessary for the theoretical family of five, consisting of the so-called "wage earner," the mother and three children of school age, has been given in former reports of this Commission.

The index level as given in this report has been maintained by totaling the current prices of the individual items composing the budget, the retail prices of which have been gathered from the same source at weekly or monthly intervals. The charts and tables have been continued to include December, 1923, comparing prices of that date with those of January, 1914, and with the data given it is possible to make comparisons of changes between any given dates.

Table I, "Comparative Yearly Totals," is more readily interpreted by graphic chart "A", which shows the rise and fall of prices at semi-annual periods, while the curve as shown in graphic chart "B" pictures more readily to the eye the changes in cost of the family budget, and the trend in the cost of the food budget, than do the index numbers given in Table II.

It will be noted, that from the beginning of the studies in 1914 there was, with an occasional exception, a steady increase in prices until June-July, 1920, when the so-called "peak" was reached. Reductions in the prices of food commodities and clothing had a tendency to decrease the total cost of living gradually until June, 1921, since which date the index level has, with slight upward or downward fluctuations, remained practically the same.




CHART "A"-COMPARATIVE YEARLY TOTALS, CHANGES IN COST OF LIVINP, DENVER, COLO.


MINIMUM WAGE


