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This report, which is published annually, is a compilation of employment and wage data from the Colorado ES-202 Program. The information is compiled from reports submitted to the Colorado Department of Labor & Employment by employers subject to unemployment insurance law under the Colorado Employment Security Act. Employment and wage data for civilian federal government employees in Colorado are also included in this report.

Employment and wage information are compiled by county and industry for private business and government. Some data items are not available for public disclosure in accordance with U.S. Department of Labor guidelines. Because every attempt is made to use actual instead of imputed data, this report is not published until seven months after the end of the reporting period to allow for the verification of questionable data and the inclusion of late reports.

Colorado in 1998

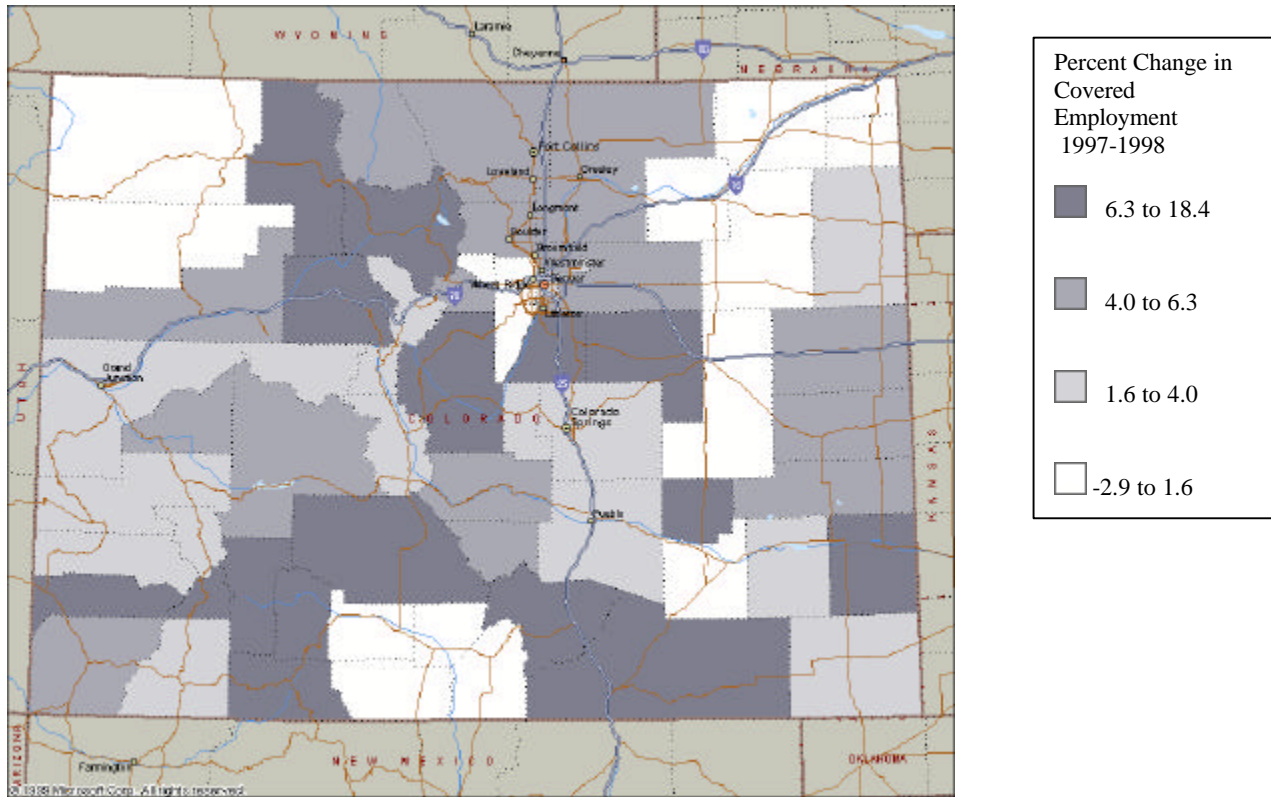
Covered employment and wages in Colorado increased for the twelfth consecutive year in 1998 with an increase of 77,710 jobs. This was similar to recent increases, which have average 74,670 jobs over the previous five years. The increase in total wages was the largest ever recorded at \$6.8 billion. The previous year's record increase of \$5.3 billion was 9.9 percent while '98's increase was 11.6 percent. The average annual wage increased by 7.3 percent to \$32,257 despite an average increase of only 2.6 percent within Government employment. This was the fourth consecutive year that the annual average wage increased by a larger percentage than the previous year.

The single greatest strength of the Colorado economy was in construction. Not only did employment in the Construction division increase by a larger percentage than any other division, but much of the growth within other divisions can be attributed to the boom. Industries with related increases included mortgage loan brokerages, construction material manufacturers and wholesalers, mining of construction sand, gravel and dimension stone, real estate agencies, and landscape and horticulture services. The growth in the Construction division could reverse rapidly if immigration ceases as happened during the eighties.

Government employment has decreased as a percentage of total employment for seven consecutive years for two reasons. The Taxpayers Bill of Rights (TABOR) limits growth to the combined rate of inflation and population growth and private sector employment has increased at an accelerated rate. Mandatory sentencing and the drug war have shifted government resources toward corrections in an unprecedented manner. Population growth has increased demand for educational services. TABOR and the increases in correction and educational services employment have dramatically reduced the ability of other government agencies to compete for resources.

Colorado's competitive advantage position has decreased significantly over the past several years, which should lead to a decreased growth rate in the future. The median prices of homes have doubled in many communities over the last decade, and the Denver-Boulder-Greeley consumer price index has closed the gap with the national index and appears to be poised to overtake it. Roads have become more congested, leading to longer commutes. The availability of workers at all skill levels has decreased, and wages have risen significantly faster than in other states.

Covered employment increased for the twelfth consecutive year with an increase of 77,710 jobs. Annual average employment increased in fifty-seven counties and only declined in six. The loss in employment in the six declining counties totaled 345 jobs. The largest gains in employment were in counties along the I-25 and I-70 corridors and the largest percent gains were in adjacent rural counties. Counties that did not participate in the rapid expansion were generally in the northwest, southwest and east of the state without interstate highway access.

Douglas County had the largest one-year percentage increase at 18.4 percent. Little San Juan and Saguache Counties were the only two other counties to grow in excess of ten percent at 16.1 and 13.0 respectively. The counties experiencing an annual growth rate between nine and ten percent were Elbert at 9.9, Archuleta at 9.8 and Huerfano at 9.0.

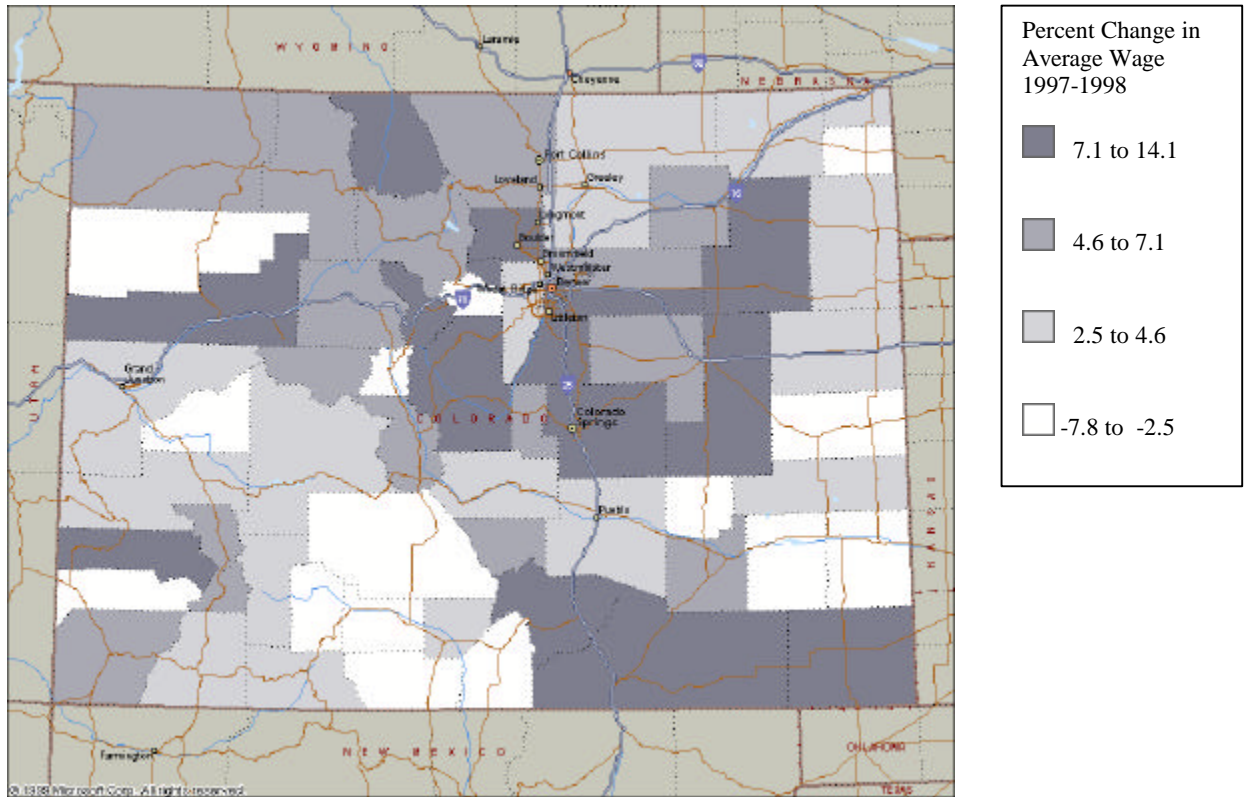
Denver and Arapahoe were the only counties to add over ten thousand jobs in 1998 at 15,135 and 10,850 respectively. The next largest gain was in El Paso County with an addition of 7,544 jobs. The other counties adding over five thousand jobs were Douglas at

6,855, Boulder at 6,060, Adams at 5,825 and Larimer at 5,368.

The northern Front Range counties of Larimer and Weld added jobs faster on a percentage basis than the Denver MSA. Larimer increased by 5.1 percent to 110,447 and Weld grew by 5.3 percent to 64,282. The Denver MSA increased by 3.9 percent to 1.08 million.

The county that added the most jobs over a five-year period was Arapahoe at 64,169 followed by El Paso at 49,311 and Denver at 48,188. Douglas was a distant fourth at 25,922 followed by Larimer at 25,022. Jefferson County, which has the state's largest workforce, added 24,733 jobs since 1993. Three counties experienced a decrease in employment over the five-year period. Jackson County's employment declined by 105 jobs, Costilla's by 107 and Rio Blanco's by 122.

Employment growth slowed in many of the ski counties. Summit County employment increased by 3.6 percent compared to 4.3 percent the previous year. Eagle County increased by 6.3 percent in '98 versus 9.4 in '97 and Pitkin increased by 1.6 in '98 and 4.3. Bucking the trend was Routt County with an increase of 6.8 percent versus 2.5 percent in '97.



Average Wages For the second year, fifty-nine of Colorado's sixty-three counties registered an increase in their average annual wage. The only counties to experience a decline were Clear Creek, Phillips, Mineral and Costilla. Only Jackson County experienced a decline over a five-year period.

Boulder County had the largest increase in average wage at 14.1 percent or \$4,668, to average \$37,825 in 1998. The average wage in Boulder County has increased by 33.0 percent over three years. The increases were due to additional high wage technology jobs and the elimination of low wage work-study jobs from the ES202 report in 1997. Boulder edged out Denver for the second highest average wage in the state in 1998.

Arapahoe County had the highest average wage again in 1998 at \$38,528. This was a 9.2 percent increase. The average wage in Arapahoe County has increased by 34.1 percent in five years. The lowest average wage was in Hinsdale County at \$15,229.

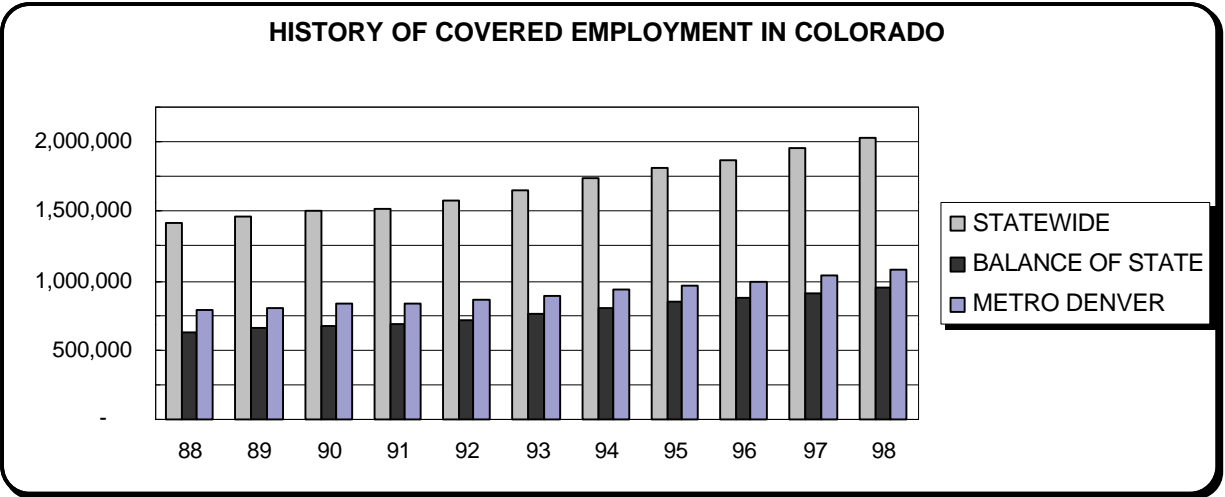
Average wages, as calculated by the ES202 program, can be misleading due to the way that jobs are counted. The ES202 does not collect data on the number of hours worked nor does it adjust for multiple jobholders.

Total Wages Colorado recorded its largest ever increase in total covered wages in 1998 at \$6.8 billion. This was an 11.6 percent increase to \$65.5 billion. All of the major divisions recorded an increase in total wages. The division with the highest total was Services at \$18.7 billion. Sixty-one out of sixty-three counties experienced an increase in total wages in 1998. Only Rio Blanco and Costilla declined.

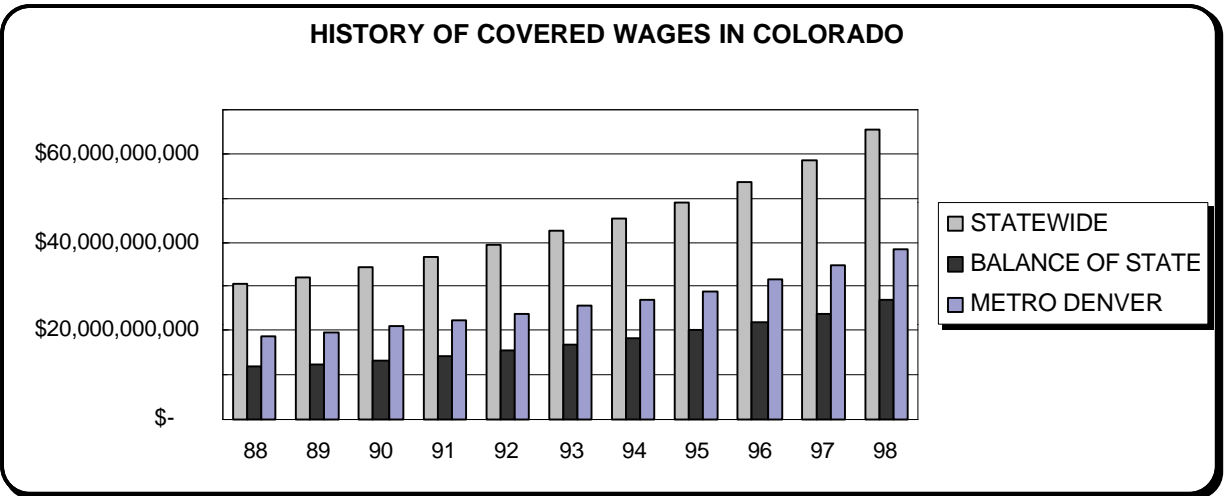
The largest increase was in Denver County at \$1.6 billion to \$16.7 billion. The second largest increase was in Arapahoe County at \$1.2 billion to \$10.1 billion. Other increases in excess of \$500 million were in Boulder, up \$942 million to \$6.0 billion, and El Paso, up \$672 million to \$6.5 billion.

Once again, the largest one-year percentage increase was in Douglas County at 29.9 percent. The second largest increase occurred in tiny San Juan County at 21.9 percent.

Total wages in Douglas County have increased by 195.8 percent over five years. Two other counties have recorded five-year increases in excess of 100 percent. Custer County's total wages have risen 121.3 percent to \$14.3 million and Elbert County's total wages have risen 114.3 percent to \$53.4 million.



Employment Annual average covered employment in Colorado increased by 77,710 jobs to 2,030,696 over the year. This was an increase of 3.98 percent. The increase was 1,551 jobs less than the previous year. As usual, the largest increase occurred in Services, representing 32.4 percent of the total increase. The second largest increase was in Construction at 13,599 jobs or 17.5 percent of the additional jobs. The three largest counties based on total employment also added the largest number of jobs. These were Denver up 15,135, Arapahoe up 10,850 and El Paso up 7,554 jobs. Employment in the Denver MSA increased by 40,874 jobs or 3.93 percent. Employment in the balance of the state increased by 36,836 jobs or 4.04 percent. There were fifty-seven counties that recorded an increase in employment and only six that experienced a decline.



Wages Total covered wages increased by an unprecedented \$6.8 billion to \$65.5 billion in 1998. This was an 11.6 percent increase from the previous year. Covered wages in the five county Denver MSA increased by \$3.8 billion or 11.0 percent to \$38.5 billion compared to the balance of the state where total wages increased by \$3.0 billion or 12.4 percent to \$27.0 billion. The major division with the highest total wage increase was Services at \$2.3 billion while the division with smallest increase was Mining at \$14.7 million. Total wages have risen 115.3 percent in the ten years since 1988. The Denver-Boulder-Greeley consumer price index for all urban consumers increased by 2.4 percent on an annual average basis from 1997 to 1998. Since 1988, the CPI-U has increased by 42.3 percent. When adjusted with the CPI-U, total wages have risen 51.2 percent over ten years. In 1988, the national CPI-U was 118.3 and the Denver-Boulder-Greeley CPI-U was 113.7. In 1998 these values were 163.0 and 161.9 respectively.

Agriculture, Forestry and Fishing

Since 1985, no division has grown faster than Agriculture, Forestry and Fishing. The division has increase by 99.1 percent since 1985. The division added 1,766 jobs over the year. Thirty-four percent of the jobs were classified in the Denver MSA. The Bureau of Labor Statistics estimates that 44 percent of agricultural employment is covered under the ES202 report on a national basis.

Once again Agricultural Services represented both the majority of the division's employment and employment growth. Employment increased by 8.2 percent to 16,678 and the average wage increased by 6.9 percent to \$20,255. The largest portion of Agricultural Services is Landscape and Horticultural Services with 10,141 jobs in 1998 compared to 9,271 in 1997. A large portion of the increased employment in Landscape and Horticultural Services is associated with the construction boom that Colorado has experienced during the nineties. The second largest sector within Agricultural Services is Veterinary Services with 3,941 jobs, an increase of 9.4 percent. The Colorado Department of Labor does not keep separate statistics for domestic Veterinary Services and Veterinary Services for Livestock. Animal Specialty Services employment increased by 66 jobs to 843 and Farm Labor

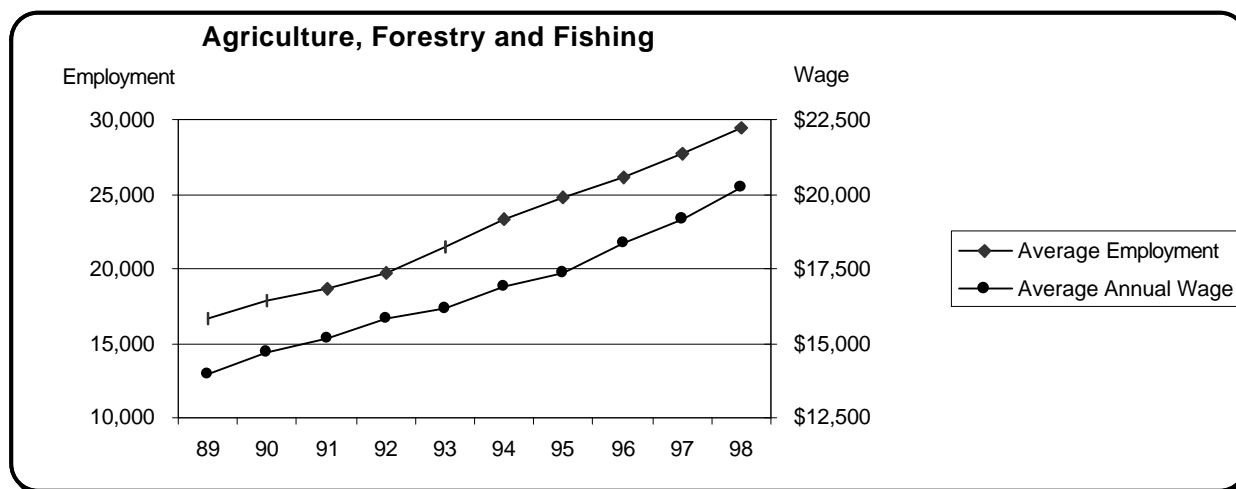
Contractors employment increased by 17 jobs to 515.

The second largest sector within Agriculture, Forestry and Fishing is Agricultural Production Crops with 7,109 jobs, an increase of 180 jobs. The largest sector within Agricultural Production Crops is Ornamental Nursery Products with 2,607 jobs, an increase of 1.4 percent. The average wage within Ornamental Nursery Products was 21,860.

Average annual employment in Agricultural Production Livestock and Animal Specialties was 5,364 in 1998 compared to 5,056 in 1997. The largest increase was in Hogs, up 143 to 1,190. The second largest increase was in Dairy Farms with an increase of 99 jobs to 1,216. Other increases included Beef Cattle Feedlots expanding from 1,453 to 1,516 jobs and Beef Cattle, Except Feedlots expanding from 682 to 728 jobs.

Employment classified under Forestry remained very slight in 1998. However, it did increase by 26 jobs because of a SIC reclassification from Landscape and Horticultural Services. Logging is classified under manufacturing and averaged 161 jobs in 1998.

Covered employment classified in Fishing, Hunting and Trapping was almost nonexistent in 1998. There was an average of 14 jobs compared to 27 in 1997.

Mining

In aggregate, covered employment and wages classified in Mining increased for the second consecutive year. On a pro-forma basis, Mining employment and wages continue to decline as they have every year since the oil bust of the early eighties. The Mining Division added 86 jobs and total wages increased by \$14.7 million.

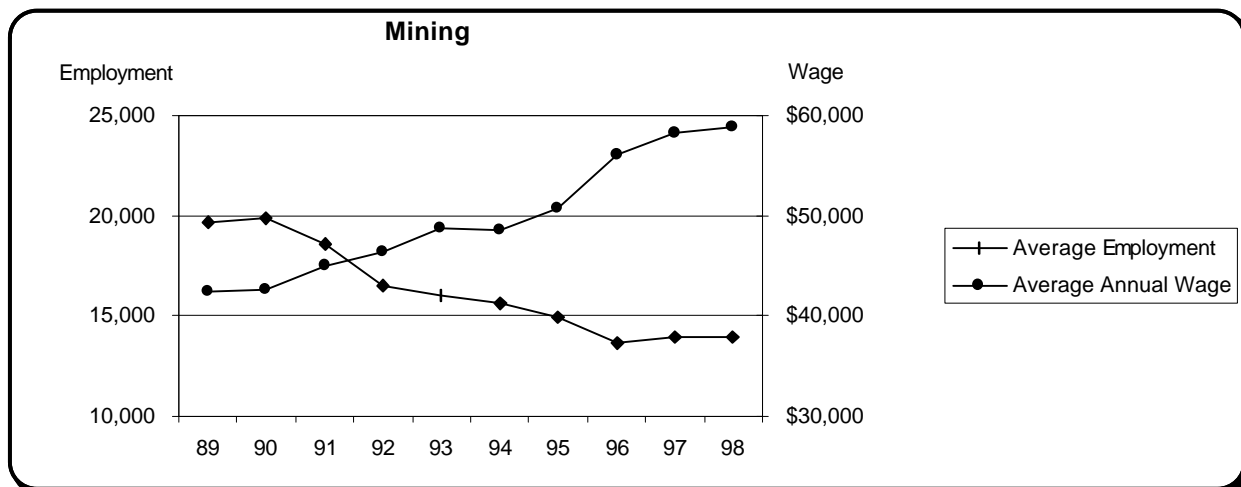
The largest sector within Mining is Oil and Gas Extraction, which had 7,852 jobs on an annual average basis in 1998. The increase of 70 jobs was the first in a number of years. Employment classified in Oil and Gas Extraction would have declined if not for an increase of 126 jobs in Denver County. Within Oil and Gas Extraction, the largest segment is Crude Petroleum and Natural Gas with 4,635 employees, which is a decrease of 22 jobs. Over seventy percent of these jobs are in Denver County with an average annual wage of \$73,085. The remaining 1,310 jobs that were not in Denver County had an average annual wage of \$55,333. The second largest sector is Oil and gas field services, NEC with 1,934 jobs. Eighty-one percent of these jobs were outside of the Denver MSA with an average annual salary of \$38,119. The 19 percent that were within the Denver MSA had an average salary of 53,494.

For the second consecutive year, the fastest growing sector within the Mining division is Mining and Quarrying of Nonmetallic Minerals,

Except Fuels. This disproportionate increase is attributable to the drastic increase in construction activity in Colorado. The increase was 10.7 percent to 1,694 jobs. The majority of the increase was in Construction Sand and Gravel, which was up by 132 jobs to 918. The second largest increase was classified in Miscellaneous Nonmetallic Minerals with an increase of 27 jobs to 219. One hundred of these jobs were in Arapahoe County. Dimension Stone employment increased by 26 jobs to 169 and Crushed and Broken Granite employment increased by 10 jobs to 47.

Employment classified in Coal Mining decreased by 51 jobs after increasing by 53 the previous year. There were 2,177 jobs with an average annual wage of \$61,901 in 1998. The Denver MSA contained 9.4 percent of the employment and 21.2 of the wages classified in Coal Mining.

Metal Mining employment declined by 95 jobs to average 2,265 in 1998. The largest decline occurred in Gold Ores, which was down by 111 jobs to 851. Only 309 of these jobs were outside of the Denver MSA. The average salary outside of the Denver MSA was \$41,562 versus \$131,232 within the MSA. The second largest sector within Metal mining was Ferroalloy Ores, except Vanadium with 665 jobs. The second largest decline was in Metal Mining Services with a decline of 57 jobs to average 217 in 1998.

Construction

Covered employment classified under Construction increased for the ninth consecutive year. The Division added 13,599 jobs or 11.4 percent, making this the fifth consecutive year of record high total covered construction employment. The average wage increased by 7.4 percent to \$33,409. Construction employment has increased by 120.4 percent since 1989. The Division accounted for the highest percentage of employment since 1984 when it registered 6.64 percent of all jobs. In the five years following 1984, construction employment decreased by about a third.

Of the twenty-six categories within construction, only one increased by less than five percent. Water Well drilling increased by 3.6 percent to 468 jobs.

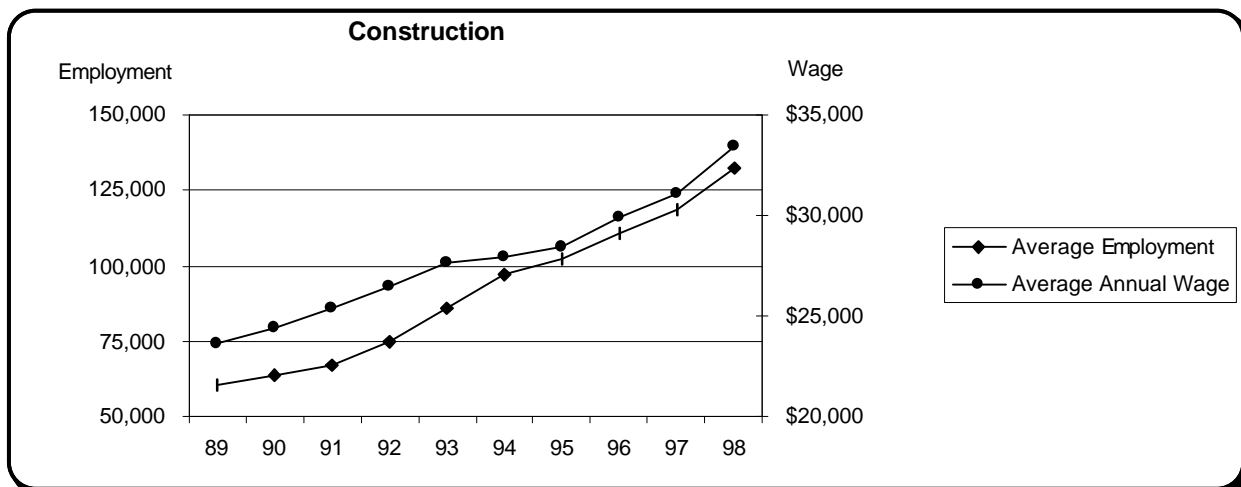
Building Construction - General Contractors and Operative Builders employment increased by 2,415 over the year to 27,282. The average wage increased by 8.1 percent to \$37,466. The largest percentage increase occurred within Industrial Buildings and Warehouses with a 22.5 percent increase to 2,555. The largest actual increase occurred in Single Family Housing Construction with an increase of 843 jobs to 12,950. Nonresidential Construction, NEC, added 766 jobs to average 8,834.

Heavy Construction experienced an unusually strong year adding 1,992 jobs due to work on the Trans-Colorado Pipeline and

increased infrastructure construction. This was a 14.25 percent increase. The majority of the increase was classified in Water Sewer and Utility Lines with an increase of 1,196 jobs to 6,015. The average wage increased by 8.5 percent to \$40,988.

Over two-thirds of all growth in construction employment and total construction jobs were classified within Special Trades. Special Trades had the lowest average annual salary within Construction at \$30,813. Electrical Work added more jobs than any other sector within Special Trades at 1,863. Electrical Work averaged 14,994 jobs in 1998. Plumbing Heating and Air Conditioning employment increased by 1,721 to 18,485. Concrete work employment increased by 1,358 to 11,024. Wrecking and Demolition Work recorded the largest percentage increase at 19.9 to average 259 jobs. Installing Building Equipment, NEC reversed a two-year downward trend by adding 61 jobs to average 876 in 1998. Carpentry Work increased by 12.6 percent over the year and 141 percent since 1992. Excavation Work (other than Heavy Construction) increased by 424 jobs to average 5,026 in 1998.

Note: Establishments are classified by the location of their administrative office if no permanent work site exists, which may skew county aggregation toward established counties and away from rapidly growing counties.

Manufacturing

Growth in Manufacturing slowed in 1998, adding only 3,691 jobs compared to 7,092 the previous year. This was the tenth straight year that Manufacturing's share of covered employment declined. The strongest growth areas within Manufacturing are industries associated with construction and high technology. The industries that have shown the greatest decreases are those that are labor intensive and commodity oriented. The average wage increased slower than the aggregate average private wage with an increase of 6.2 percent to \$41,077. It is difficult to accurately assess growth trends in the Manufacturing Division because of extensive use of Help Supply Services and SIC code changes

Electronic and other Electrical Equipment and Components, Except Computer Equipment registered the largest increase at 1,207 to average 21,097 jobs in 1998.

Industrial and Commercial Machinery and Computer Equipment added 1,055 jobs to average 34,002 resulting from an increase of 1,022 jobs within Electronic Computers. This is the largest sector within Manufacturing. Computer Peripheral Equipment, NEC increased by 248 jobs to 3,964 and Industrial Machinery, NEC increased by 178 jobs to 4,227.

Printing, Publishing, and Allied Industries experienced a broad increase totaling 1,023 jobs to average 28,528 in 1998. Industries

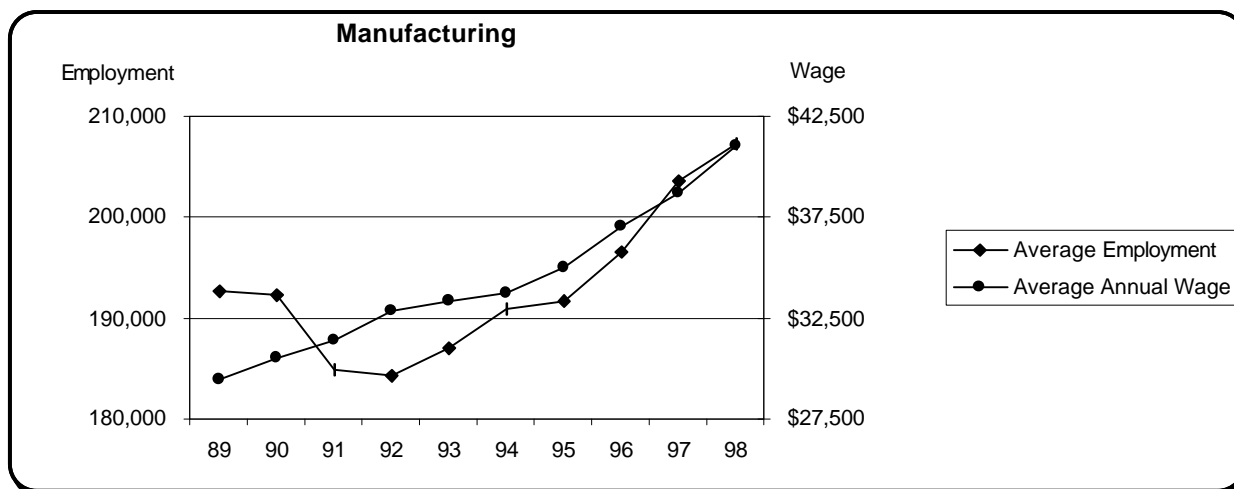
registering a gain of 100 jobs or more included Newspapers up 242 to 8,055, Miscellaneous Publishing up 210 to 3,725, Greeting Cards up 179 to 3,268, Periodical up 168 to 2,645, and Commercial Printing, Lithographic up 123 to 6,745.

The largest decline in employment was in Food and Kindred Products, which declined by 639 jobs to 25,253. Of the forty-one categories within this sector, twenty-seven declined. The average wage increased by 8.9 percent to \$36,021.

Measuring Analyzing and Controlling Instruments employment remained steady with a decline of .5 percent to 20,550. The biggest movers within this sector were Instruments to Measure Electricity with a decline of 347 to 2,998 and Search and Navigation Equipment, which increased by 244 jobs to 3,178.

Lumber and Wood Products, Except Furniture increased by 296 jobs to average 6,035 in 1998. The largest increases were in Structural Wood Members, NEC up 174 to 1,193, Wood Kitchen Cabinets up 48 to 928 and Prefabricated Wood Buildings up 47 to 270 jobs.

Increases related to the construction boom included Furniture and Fixtures, adding 341 jobs to 5,642 and Stone Clay, Glass, and Concrete Products, adding 485 jobs to 10,061.

Transportation, Communication and Public Utilities

Employment in the Transportation, Communication and Public Utilities (TCPU) division increased faster than employment in Colorado as a whole at 5.7 percent or 6,785 jobs. Average wages increased by 9.8 percent to \$46,154. The majority of the increase can be attributed to increases in Communications employment in Arapahoe and Denver Counties.

The largest and fastest growing sector within TCPU is Communications. Communications added 6,702 jobs to average 48,783 in 1998. About 1,500 of the additional jobs were related to SIC reclassifications. It also boasted by far the highest average annual salary at \$62,367. This was an increase of \$6,444, following an increase of \$5,281 from 1996 to 1997. Radiotelephone Communications had the highest percentage increase at 51.4 percent to average 2,786 jobs. There were 960 jobs classified in Radiotelephone Communications in 1993. Telephone Communications, Except Radio added the most jobs with an increase of 2,954 to average 29,726 in 1998. Cable and Other Pay TV Services experienced the second largest increase at 2,280 to average 10,360 jobs. Sixty-six percent of Communications jobs were either in Denver or Arapahoe Counties.

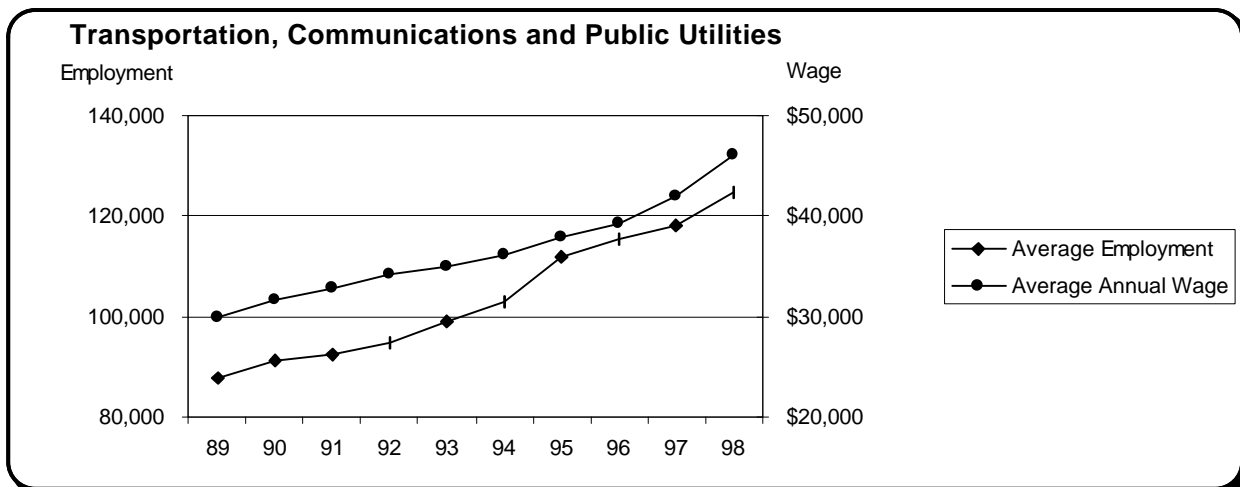
Transportation by Air employment decreased by 425 jobs to 23,781 after

increasing by 1,488 the previous year. The largest decreases were in Scheduled Air Transportation with a decline of 462 to 2,788 jobs and in Airports, Flying Fields, & Services with a decline of 253 jobs to 2,704. The average wage within Transportation by Air increased by 6.8 percent to \$36,366.

Motor Freight Transportation and Warehousing reversed a downward trend and added 400 jobs to average 23,715 in 1998. The largest increase was in Courier Services, Except by Air, which increased by 245 jobs to 2,951. Other notable increases were in Local Trucking With Storage up 154 to 2,109 and Local Trucking, Without Storage up 140 to 7,013. These gains were offset by a loss of 274 jobs in Trucking, Except Local, which averaged 10,019 jobs in 1998.

Electric, Gas, and Sanitary Services employment declined for the third straight year, declining by 250 jobs to 15,273. The two largest declines were in Refuse systems with a decline of 207 jobs to 5,043 and Electric and Other Services Combined with a decline of 143 to 3,883.

The steady increase in Local and Suburban Transit and Interurban Highway Passenger Transportation employment continued with an addition of 321 jobs to 5,611. The increase was attributed to an additional 319 jobs in Local Passenger Transportation, NEC.

Wholesale Trade

Growth in the reported employment and wages in the Wholesale Trade Division slowed considerably due to large SIC reclassifications. However, employment still increased by 2,173 jobs. The average wage increased by 7.5 percent to \$43,226.

Employment within Durable Goods increased by 286 jobs to 65,032 on an annual average basis. The average wage was \$46,688. The largest gain was in the lucrative Computers, Peripherals & Software sector which added 309 jobs to average 8,162. The average wage within Computers, Peripherals & Software increased by \$7,502 to \$78,068.

Increased employment within Lumber and Other Construction Materials has shown increases similar to employment in Construction over the last several years. The sector only increased by 2.4 percent to 5,935 with Lumber, Plywood, and Millwork expanding by 114 jobs to 3,251 and Brick, Stone, & Related Materials rising by 90 jobs to 1,041 over the year. Since 1992, the sector has increased by 68 percent with Lumber, Plywood, and Millwork rising by 93.4 percent and Brick, Stone, & Related Materials rising by 145.1 percent. In a related sector, Furniture and Home Furnishings employment increased by 151 to 2,763.

Hardware, and Plumbing and Heating Equipment and Supplies reported a widespread increase. Hardware increased by 165 jobs to

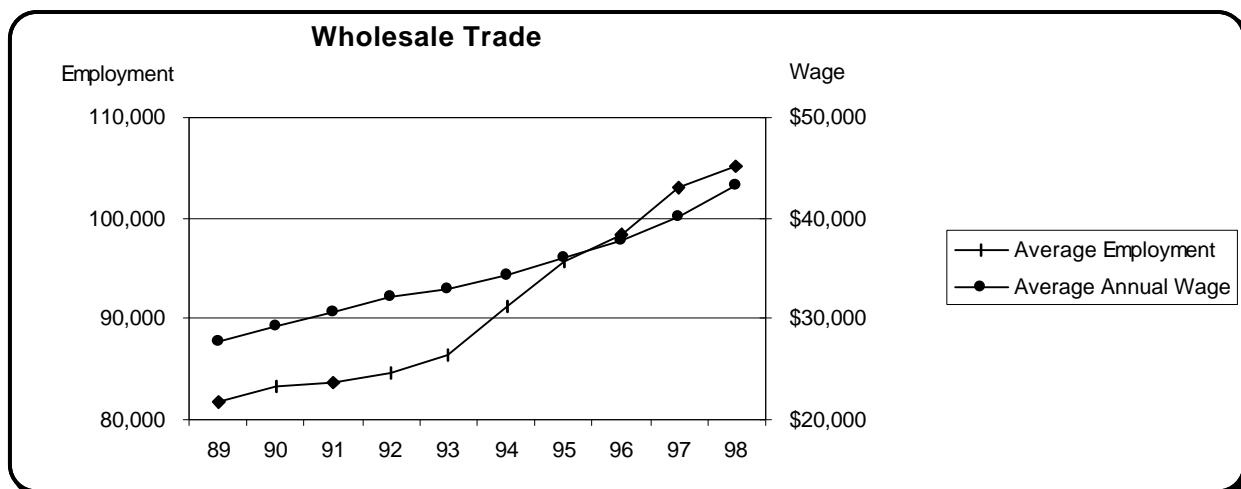
1,835, Plumbing & Hydronic Heating Supplies increased by 102 jobs to 2,246 and Refrigeration Equipment and Supplies increased by 47 to 438. Warm Air Heating & Air-Conditioning employment has only increased by 24 jobs over the last four years to 1,026.

Machinery, Equipment and Supplies employment increased by 485 jobs to 11,630. The largest increase was in Industrial Machinery and Equipment, which increased by 225 jobs to 4,594.

In aggregate, Professional and Commercial Equipment and Supplies remained steady, increasing by only 0.4 percent to 16,609 jobs. Within the sector, Office equipment employment declined by 245 jobs to 3,436 and Computers, Peripherals & Software increasing by 309 jobs to 8,162 as previously mentioned.

Non-Durable Goods employment increased by 5.0 percent to 40,079. The average wage rose 6.0 percent to \$37,612. Groceries and Related Products increased by 805 jobs to 13,167, but the average wage increased by a meager \$623 to \$35,784.

The fastest growing sector within Non-Durable goods is Beer, Wine and Distilled Alcoholic Beverages with a growth rate of 15.9 percent over the year. Beer and Ales wholesaling employment increased by 97 jobs 1,556. Wine and Distilled Alcoholic Beverage employment increased by 27.8 percent to 1,443.

Retail Trade

The Retail Trade Division added an additional 9,428 jobs and \$476.7 million in wages in 1998. The average wage increased slower than aggregated private wages in Colorado at only 5.1 percent to \$17,191.

The largest sector of the Retail Trade division based on the number of jobs is Eating and Drinking Places with 152,861, an increase of 2,461 from 1997. Surprisingly, there were only 36 more establishments on average than there were during the previous year because several large chains ceased operation in Colorado. There were 8,381 establishments on average in 1998.

The second largest sector under Retail Trade is Food Stores with 50,631 jobs and 2,002 establishments. Eighty-eight percent of these jobs were in the State's 1,176 Grocery Stores. Employment in Miscellaneous Food Stores has more than doubled to 1,585 jobs over the past five years. Miscellaneous Food Stores include Coffee, Vitamin, and Health Food Stores.

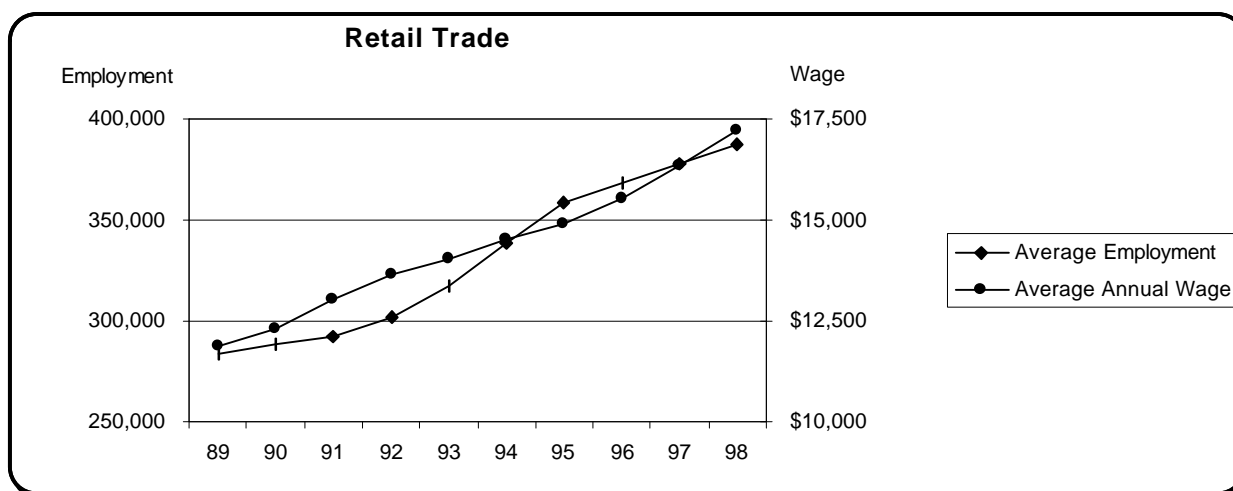
Automotive Dealers and Gasoline Service Stations employment increased by 891 jobs and 40 establishments to 39,219 and 2,946 respectively. The majority of the rise occurred within Gasoline Service Stations, which added 459 jobs and 26 establishments. New and Used Car Dealers added 256 jobs to average 16,840. The average wage at New and Used Car Dealers increased by 5.2 percent to \$40,740.

General Merchandise Stores registered an increase of 996 jobs to average 41,511 in 1998 because of an increase of 1,058 jobs in Department Stores. This gain was partially offset by a decline of 108 jobs in Variety Stores to 865.

Growth in the Building Materials, Hardware, Garden Supply, and Mobile Home Dealers sector declined dramatically in 1998. The sector only added 325 jobs to average 17,685. This sector increased by an average of 1,350 jobs over the previous 5 years. The largest increase in jobs was in Lumber and Other Building Materials, which added 347 to average 11,663. Hardware stores employment increased by 47 to 2,918.

Growth within Home Furniture, Furnishing, and Equipment Stores was due to a 487 job increase at Furniture Stores and a 401 job increase at Miscellaneous Home Furnishings stores.

The Miscellaneous Retail sector added 1,740 jobs and 98 establishments to average 50,931 and 6,764 respectively. The largest increase in the Miscellaneous Retail sector occurred in Miscellaneous Retail, NEC which added 334 jobs to average 6,802. Other gains included Sporting Goods and Bicycle Shops, up 272 to 6,785 and Used Merchandise Stores, up 257 to 3,632.

Finance, Insurance and Real Estate

Employment in Finance, Insurance and Real Estate (FIRE) increased by 6.9 percent, which was second only to Construction. On an actual basis, employment within FIRE increased by 8,543, slightly less than the previous year's gain of 8,576. FIRE's average wage increased faster than in any other division at 11.3 percent.

The largest section within FIRE is Real Estate, which increased by 1,284 jobs to 31,801. The average wage increased by \$2,963 to \$29,379, the lowest annual wage within FIRE. Real Estate Agents and Managers accounted for the majority of the increase with an addition of 798 jobs to average 18,463 in 1998. . It should be noted that Real Estate and Insurance sales people are exempted from unemployment insurance coverage.

Depository Institutions is the second largest and slowest growing sector within FIRE. It increased by 2.8 percent 27,934. The average wage increased by 7.4 percent to \$32,387. The majority of the increase occurred within State Commercial Banks with an addition of 474 jobs to 5,768.

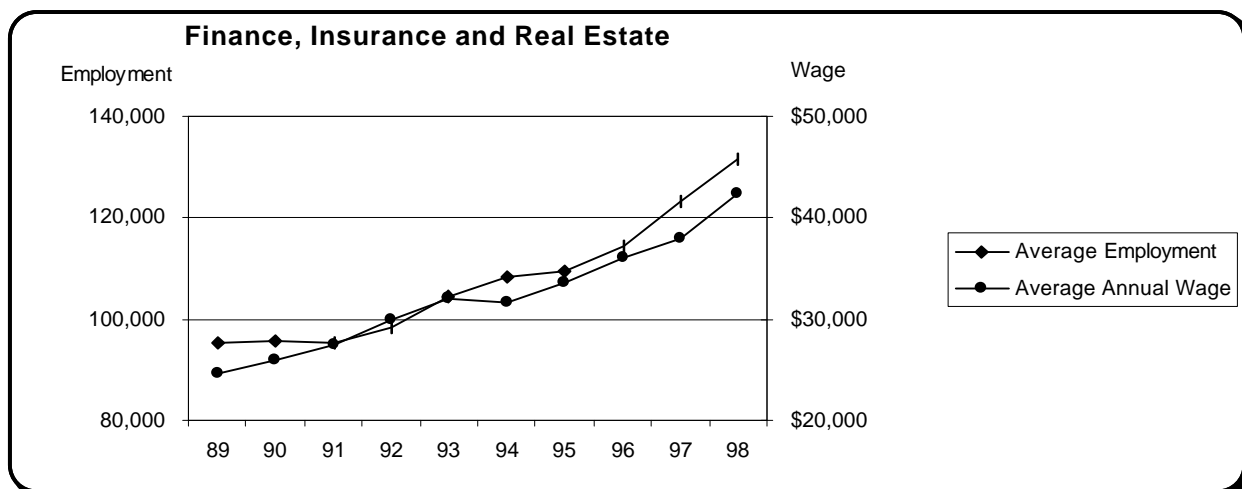
Employment by Insurance Carriers increased by 2,530 to 27,525. The largest increase was in Fire, Marine, and Casualty Insurance, which was up by 774 jobs to 10,768. The largest percentage increase was Surety

Insurance with a 30 percent increase to 558. Title Insurance, and Pension, Health, and Welfare funds experienced significant increases of 623 and 318 respectively to average 3,386 and 1,685. The average wage for Insurance Carriers increased by a below average 5.3 percent to \$42,874.

Non-Deposit Credit Institution employment increased by 18.1 percent to 15,625. The average annual wage increased by 16.7 percent to \$50,244. Most of the growth occurred within Mortgage Bankers and Brokers, which added 2,095 jobs to average 9,144 in 1998.

Holding and Other Investment Offices experienced a banner year with the average wage increasing to \$79,695 from \$63,697. The largest subsection within Holding and Investment Offices is Management Investment Offices, which added 211 jobs to average 2,492 in 1998. The average wage increased from \$42,224 to \$47,709. The second largest sector was Holding Companies, NEC which added 106 jobs to average 1,964. Holding Companies NEC had an average wage of \$133,217, an increase of \$40,371.

Employment within Insurance Agents, Brokers, & Service increased by 3.0 percent to 11,749. The average wage increased to \$36,545 from \$34,409.

Services

The Services Division continued to expand in 1998, adding 25,234 jobs and \$2.33 billion in wages to what was already the largest division. The average wage within Services increased by 9.4 percent to \$31,483.

The largest increase within Services occurred within Business Services with an increase of 12,719 jobs to 179,155. The increase in Business Services was lessened by the reclassification of Several Professional Service Organizations (PEO), which had been classified as Help Supply Services, into the SIC codes that described their clients' activities. Help Supply Services employment declined by 753 to 45,524. Large gains within Business Services included Prepackaged Software up 3,762 to 13,676, Business Services, NEC up 3,481 to 31,058, and Computer Related Services, NEC up 3,231 to 11,751.

Employment growth within Health Services slowed considerably in 1998, registering a 1.0 percent gain to 129,026. The largest increases were in Offices & Clinics of Medical Doctors, up 1,248 to 28,138 and Offices and Clinics of Dentists, up 429 to 11,285. The largest declines were in Skilled Nursing Care Facilities down 504 to 17,726 jobs and General Medical & Surgical Hospitals down 467 to 38,952 jobs.

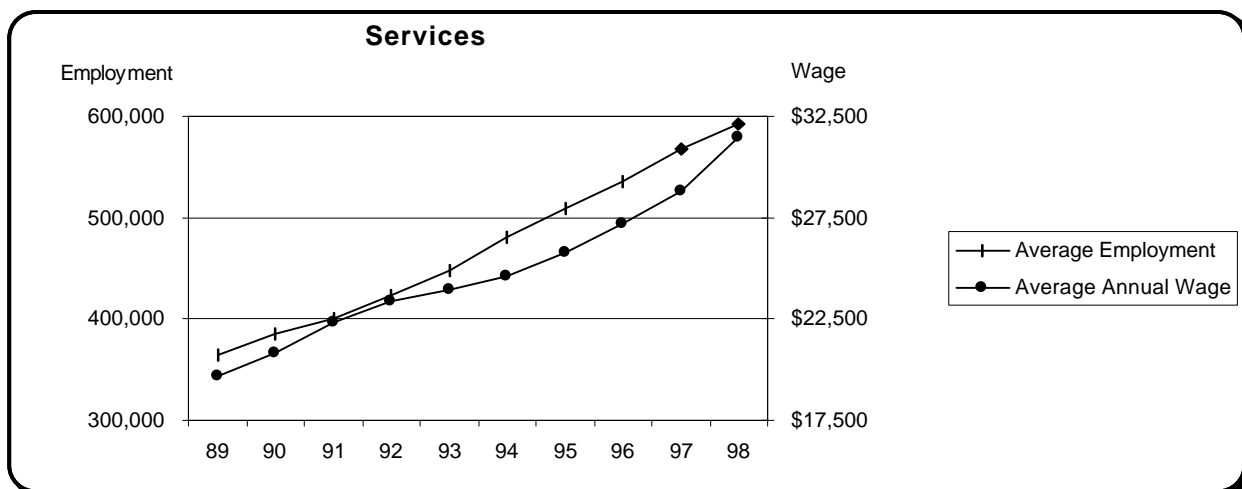
Engineering, Accounting, Research, Management, and Related Services

employment increased by 3,760 jobs to 61,950. Engineering Services employment increased by 1,127 to 21,057 while the associated annual average wage increased by 10.8 percent to \$58,237. Accounting, Auditing, & Bookkeeping employment increased by 8.0 percent to 9,653. Business Consulting, NEC increased by 13.7 percent to 5,514 jobs.

Hotels and Motels employment, which may contain Restaurants of the same establishment, recorded a gain of 956 jobs to 38,634 in 1998. Hotels and Motels make up 95.7 percent of the Hotels, Rooming Houses, Camps, and Other Lodging Places Sector.

Educational Services classified under private industry recorded a gain of 888 jobs to average 16,128 in 1998. Thirty-four percent were classified in Colleges and Universities, 25 percent were in Schools & Educational Services, NEC, and 22 percent were in Elementary and Secondary Schools.

Amusement and Recreation Services employment increased by 1,067 to 18,849. The average salaries varied enormously within the sector with the Sports Clubs, Managers, & Promoters average salary increasing by \$15,808 to \$145,983 and Dance Studios, Schools, and Halls average salary increasing by \$277 to \$8,854.

Government

Government employment increased slower than private employment for the seventh straight year with most of the increase occurring within Educational Services. Average Government wages increased at less than one third the rate of private wages. It should be noted when reviewing Government employment by industry that most employers do not provide breakouts by department, and instead combine all employment for an entity such as a county, city or department in one SIC code.

State Government

State Government employment increased by a modest 2.3 percent from 1997 to 61,344 employees after increasing only 0.3 percent the previous year. The average annual wage increased by \$1,137 to \$35,339, a 3.3 percent increase. Forty-five percent of State employment was in the Denver MSA with an average wage that exceeded the BOS by \$4,756 at \$37,946.

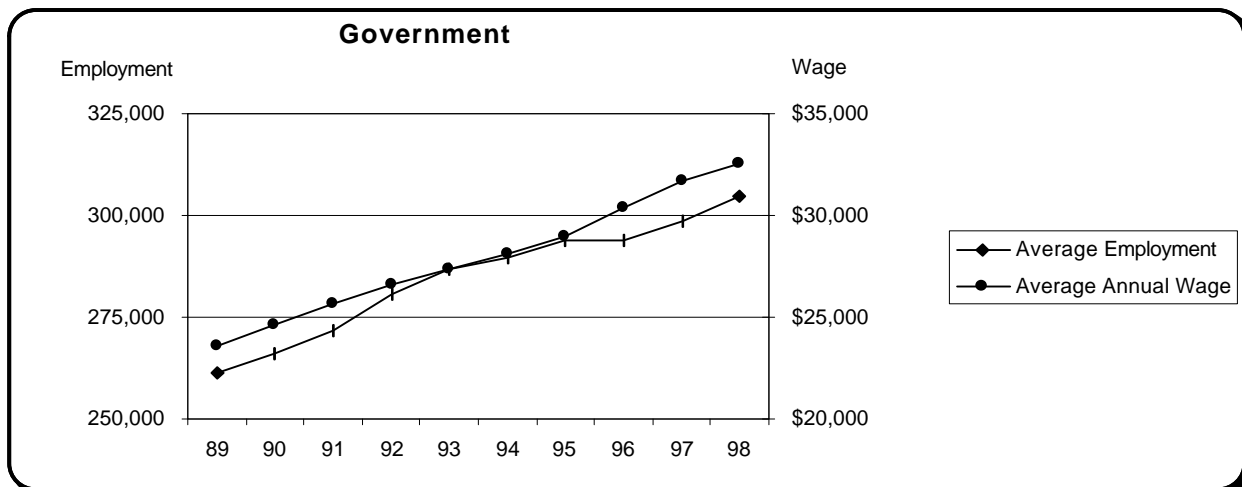
Justice Public Order and Safety recorded the largest gain in employment on a percentage and actual basis adding 683 jobs or 7.7 percent. The majority of this increase was within Correctional Institutions, which added 472 jobs to average 5,057. Employment classified in State Correctional Institutions increased by 46 percent from 1992 though 1998. Educational Services employment increased by 672 jobs or

2.2 percent in 1998, to average 31,374. Junior Colleges added 209 jobs to average 6,516 employees while Colleges and Universities added 459 jobs to average 24,441. State operated Elementary and Secondary School employment increased by 4 to average 208 in 1998.

The third largest sector within State Government is Health Services with 5,747 employees in 1998, an increase of 53. Forty-four of the additional jobs were classified in General Medical and Surgical Hospitals. Skilled Nursing Care Facilities increased by 20 jobs to 416 while, Psychiatric Hospitals declined by 10 to 1,486 jobs.

There were 3,109 jobs classified in Heavy Construction in 1997, a decrease of 10 jobs from the previous year. All of this employment was with the Colorado Department of Transportation with 47 percent classified in the Denver MSA.

Employment within Social Services decreased for the fifth straight year with a decline of 32 jobs to 1,045. The largest decrease in State Government Employment occurred within Regulation of Agricultural Marketing, which declined by 62 jobs to 410. The largest percentage increase within State government occurred within National Security at 17.7 percent to 125 jobs.

Local Government

Local Government was once again the fastest growing government sector at 2.7 percent or 4,978 jobs. Nearly one out of every eleven jobs was in Local Government in 1998. The average wage increased by 3.5 percent to \$28,525. The average private industry wage increased 8.2 percent during this period. The General Government category contained one third of all local Government employment or 62,968 jobs.

The majority of Local Government employment was classified in Educational Services. Average annualized employment in Educational Services increased by 2,536 to 99,697 in 1998. The average annual wage increased 2.6 percent to \$26,534. Within this sector, 96.6 percent of the jobs were in Elementary and Secondary Schools.

The second largest sector within Local Government was the catchall category of Executive, Legislative, and General Government, except Finance, which averaged 62,968 jobs in 1998.

Most City and County employees are counted in this section regardless of their function. The average wage in this sector increased by \$1,461 to \$31,063.

Health Services employed 8,191 people on an annual average basis in 1998. This was an increase of 669 jobs. The annual average wage increased by 2.4 percent to \$28,111. Thirty-five percent of this employment was at Memorial Hospital in Colorado Springs. Denver Health and Hospital Authority employed an average of 1,650 at an annual average wage of \$39,354.

There were 5,191 jobs classified under Electric, Gas, and Sanitary Services in 1998 compared to 4,935 in 1997. The largest employer was the City of Colorado Spring's Department of Public Utilities with about 1,850 employees. The second largest employer is the Denver Water Department with 1,081 employees.

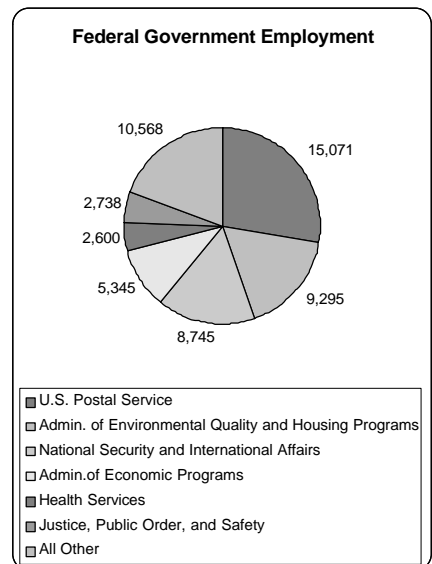
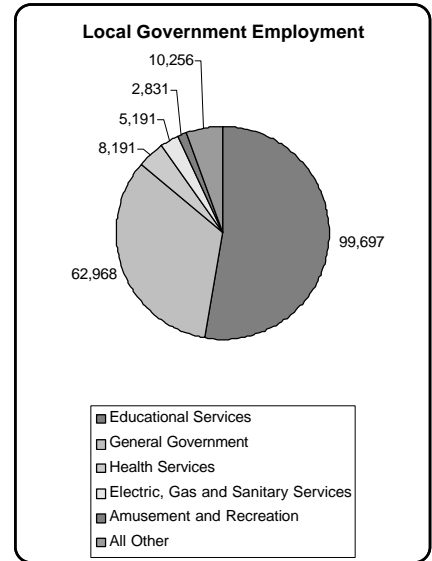
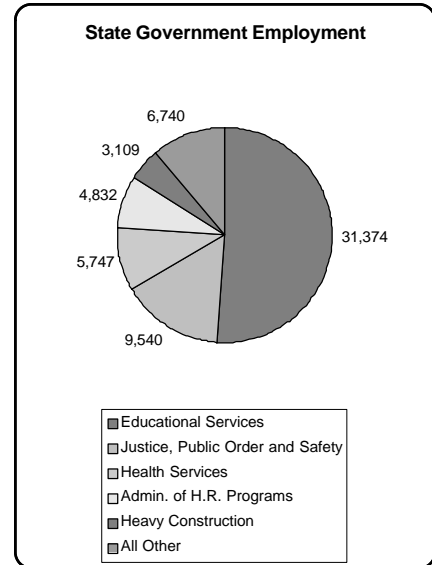
Other large discernible sectors within Local Government include Amusement and Recreation Services with 2,831 employees, Fire Protection with 1,653 and Local and Suburban Transit (RTD) with 2,234 employees. Amusement and Recreation primarily consists of municipal parks departments.

Federal Government

Employment by the Federal Government reversed a four-year downward trend by adding 51 jobs because of an increase of 733 Postal Workers. Though the average annual Federal wage increased by only \$293 to \$43,240, it still exceeded the average State Government wage by \$7,901 and the average Local Government wage by \$14,715.

The second largest sector within Federal Government is Administration of Environmental Quality and Housing Programs at 9,295, which declined by 204 jobs. The decline was due to a 207 job decline in Land, Mineral, Wildlife Conservation, which has declined by 2,859 over five years to 8,136.

National Security and International Affairs employment decreased by 336 jobs to 8,745. Forty-seven percent of these jobs were in El Paso County.

COLORADO EMPLOYMENT AND WAGES BY STANDARD INDUSTRIAL CLASSIFICATION FOR 1998

Definitions

AVERAGE EMPLOYMENT. Average Employment is the mean value of the reported employment figures for the 12 reporting months of the year.

TOTAL WAGES. Total Wages are the sum of wages for the four quarters of the year.

AVERAGE WAGE. The Average Wage is the Total Wages paid divided by the Average Employment.

BALANCE OF STATE. Balance of State is all counties in Colorado outside the five county Metro Denver Area.

COVERED EMPLOYER. A covered employer is an employer who is required to pay unemployment insurance because they meet any of the following criteria:

1. Employs one worker at any time.
2. Acquires all or a substantial portion of a covered employer.
3. Is subject to Federal Unemployment Tax Act.
4. Is a non-profit organization and has four or more employees for 20 weeks during the calendar year.
5. Is a State agency, State operated hospital, or school of higher education, or a political subdivision of the State.
6. Is an employer of agricultural labor and pays \$20,000 or more in any one quarter of a calendar year, or employs 10 workers for 20 weeks during the year.
7. Pays cash wages of \$1,000 or more in any calendar year for domestic help in a private home.

The following are specific exclusions from the coverage:

1. Agricultural employment not defined above.
2. Sole proprietors.
3. Railroad workers.
4. Children under 21 in the employ of a parent.
5. Elected officials.
6. Students or inmate workers.
7. Commissioned real estate, insurance and direct seller salespeople.
8. Church employees.
9. Work relief program participants.

DISCLOSURE RESTRICTIONS. Publication of employment and wage data is withheld for any 2-digit subsection which consists of fewer than three reporting units or in which a single establishment accounts for 80 percent or more of an industry's employment. In the event that only one 2-digit subsection is restricted, the next smallest 2-digit subsection (by number of establishments) will also be restricted to allow disclosure of total industry information.

EMPLOYMENT. The number of covered workers who earned wages during the pay period that includes the 12th of the month. Workers on the payroll of more than one firm during the period are counted each time they are reported.

ENTERPRISE. An enterprise is the employer and legal entity of the Unemployment Insurance tax account. An enterprise may consist of one or more units.

ES202. The ES202 is a statistical report summarizing employment, total wages, taxable wages and contribution information for employers subject to State unemployment insurance laws under the Colorado Employment Security Act. The report also includes employment and wage information for federal civilian workers covered by UCFE.

FIPS. Federal Information Processing Standards. Standards for information processing issued by the National Bureau of Standards in the US Department of Commerce. Includes a numeric designation for geographic areas such as States, counties, and MA's.

GROSS WAGES. As reported on the Unemployment Insurance Tax Report, gross wages are the total amount of compensation paid by the employer during the quarter.

METRO DENVER. The Metropolitan Denver Area consists of the following counties: Adams, Arapahoe, Denver, Douglas and Jefferson.

SIC (STANDARD INDUSTRIAL CLASSIFICATION). Each business is assigned a 4 digit SIC code that describes the nature of the business in accordance with the Standard Industrial Classification Manual, 1987.

SIZE CLASS. Establishments and enterprises are categorized by the number of employees working in the month of March.

ESTABLISHMENTS. A unit is an establishment, generally at a single physical location, where business is conducted or where services or industrial operations are performed.
