

# **COLORADO EMPLOYMENT AND WAGES**

**ANNUAL AVERAGE 1999**

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This report, which is published annually, is a compilation of employment and wage data from the Colorado ES-202 Program. The information is compiled from reports submitted to the Colorado Department of Labor & Employment by employers subject to unemployment insurance law under the Colorado Employment Security Act. Employment and wage data for civilian federal government employees in Colorado are also included in this report.

Employment and wage information are compiled by county and industry for private business and government. Some data items are not available for public disclosure in accordance with U.S. Department of Labor guidelines. Because every attempt is made to use actual instead of imputed data, this report is not published until seven months after the end of the reporting period to allow for the verification of questionable data and the inclusion of late reports.

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## Colorado in 1999

The growth rate in both employment and wages decreased slightly in 1999. Employment growth slipped from 3.98 to 3.67 percent and total wage growth slipped from 11.6 to 9.9 percent. Average annual wages continued to increase faster than the Denver-Boulder-Greeley CPI at 6.0 percent versus 2.9 percent. Private industry wages increased by 6.5 percent, versus 2.9 percent for establishments classified under government ownership.

Several themes continue to dominate the employment scenario in Colorado. An increasing population has stretched the Construction industry to capacity resulting in higher prices. Anti-government sentiment and the TABOR amendment have severely limited growth in local and state government employment. Large increases in technology-oriented employment have supplied both high paying jobs in basic industries and begun to crowd out labor-intensive industries that tend to be price sensitive.

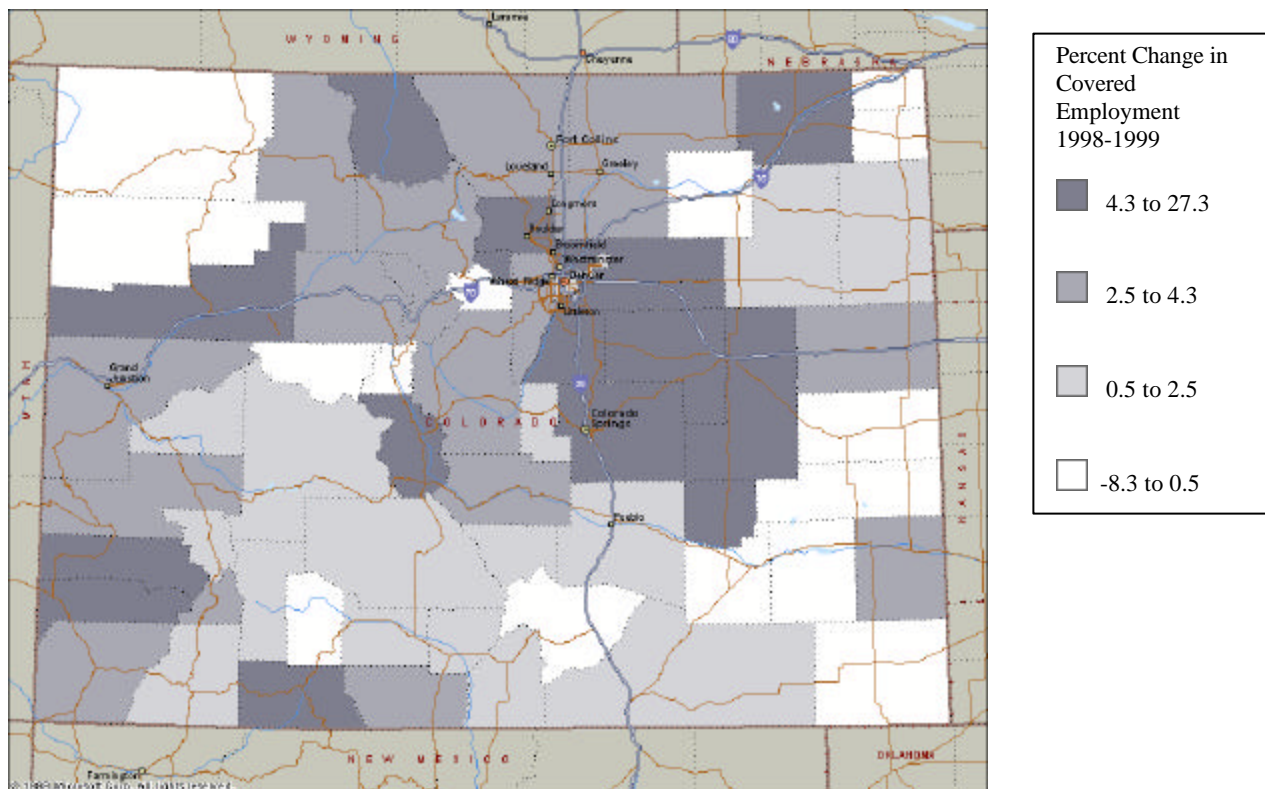
The Construction industry hit bottom in 1989 with 60,138 jobs. In 1999 there were 146,810 jobs classified under Construction. Employment in several Construction related industries have doubled since 1992, the earliest year that four digit data was easily accessible. Landscape and Horticultural Services employment increased from 5,580 to 11,537. Construction Sand and Gravel employment

increased from 527 to 1,076. Mobile Homes employment increased from 130 to 557. Lumber and other Building Materials employment increased from 6,341 to 13,054. These are just some examples of the Construction boom causing increases in non-construction industries. There are many more.

Like Construction, the technology sector has created high paying job opportunities in several major employment divisions that may not be apparent to a casual observer. Since 1992, Programming Services employment increased from 4762 to 14,819 with an average annual salary of \$70,139. Computer Related Services, NEC increased from 1,982 to 13,606. In Wholesaling, Computers, Peripherals & Software increased from 6,742 to 8,818 with an average salary of \$87,796. Telephone Communications employment increased from 22,185 to 35,347 with an average salary of \$66,274. Technology related establishments appear to be behind the widespread increases in average salaries, population increases, and the subsequent construction boom.

Growth within government-classified establishments was primarily limited to Educational Services and Justice, Public Order, and Safety. Of the 6,655 additional jobs classified in government, 3,369 were in Educational Services and 1,030 were in Justice, Public Order, and Safety.

Employment growth slowed slightly in 1999 with an addition of 74,590 jobs. This increase was typical of what Colorado has experienced over the last seven years. Forty-nine of sixty-three counties reported an increase in employment while 14 reported a decrease. Last year, six counties reported a decrease. The combined job loss, in the fourteen counties that reported a decrease, was 844 jobs.

Arapahoe County added more jobs than any other with an increase of 13,470 jobs to average 274,430. Other counties adding over eight thousand jobs included El Paso up 9,535 to 229,845, Denver up 9,278 to 455,642, Adams up 8,467 to 138,758 and Boulder up 7,883 to 166,736.

On a one-year percentage basis, Crowley County increased the fastest at 27.3 percent. The second fastest growing county was Elbert at 15.3 percent. Other counties with growth rates in excess of ten percent in 1999 were Dolores at 14.5, Douglas at 11.5, and Archuleta at 10.6.

On a five-year percentage basis, Douglas County continued to be the growth leader at 128.7 percent. The second fastest growing county was Elbert at 80.6. Elbert appears ready to take over the five-year percentage growth lead in the next couple of years. Other rapidly

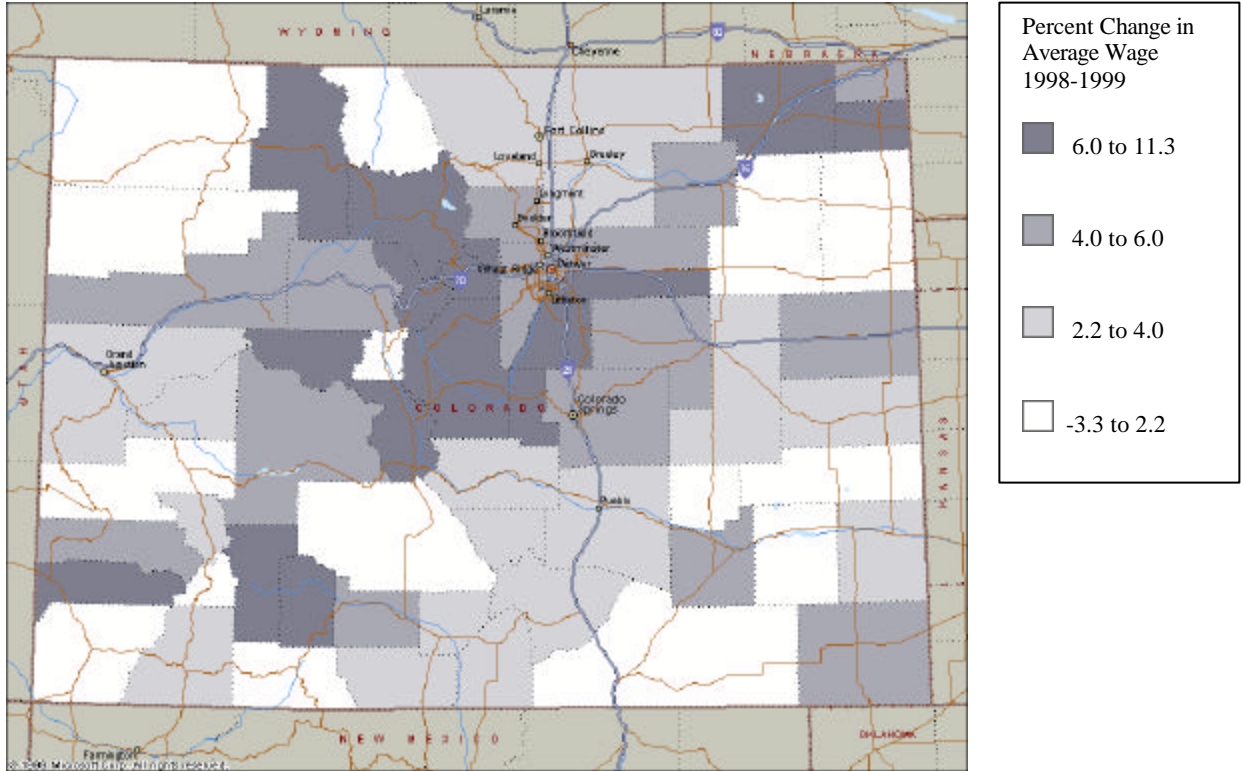
growing, yet small, counties include Archuleta up 58.7 percent, Custer up 46 percent and Eagle up 39 percent. Four counties experienced a decline in covered employment over five-years including Rio Blanco down 201, Kiowa down 123, Costillo down 29 and Jackson down 5.

On a five-year actual basis, Arapahoe County added the most jobs at 64,310. Other counties adding over 25k jobs in the five-year period were Denver at 50,444, El Paso at 46,321, Douglas at 27,684, Adams at 25,700 and Boulder at 25,248.

Growth slowed in counties associated with the skiing industry. Eagle slowed from 6.3 percent to 3.9 percent, Pitkin from 1.6 to negative 1.5 percent, Summit from 3.6 to 3.4 percent, Routt from 6.8 to 3.2 percent and Gunnison from 5.2 to 0.9 percent. San Miguel defied the trend with growth increasing from 3.1 to 8.1 percent.

Growth slowed in the Northern Front Range. Weld County employment growth decreased from 5.3 to 3.9 percent, while Larimer County employment growth slowed from 5.1 to 2.6 percent.

Counties in the eastern plains continued to experience either anemic growth or declines in employment.



**Average Wages** The average annual wage increased 6.0 percent to \$34,189. Colorado's average wage increased by 30.7 percent over five years. All but six of Colorado's sixty-three counties had an increase in their average wage. Las Animas, Costilla and Jackson counties are the only Colorado counties to experience a decline in their average wage over a five-year period.

Average private ownership wages continued to increase much faster than government wages. The average private wage increased by 6.5 percent to \$34,316 while federal wages increased by 3.1 percent to \$44,177, state wages increased by 3.1 percent to \$36,423 and local government wages increased by 3.4 percent to \$29,509.

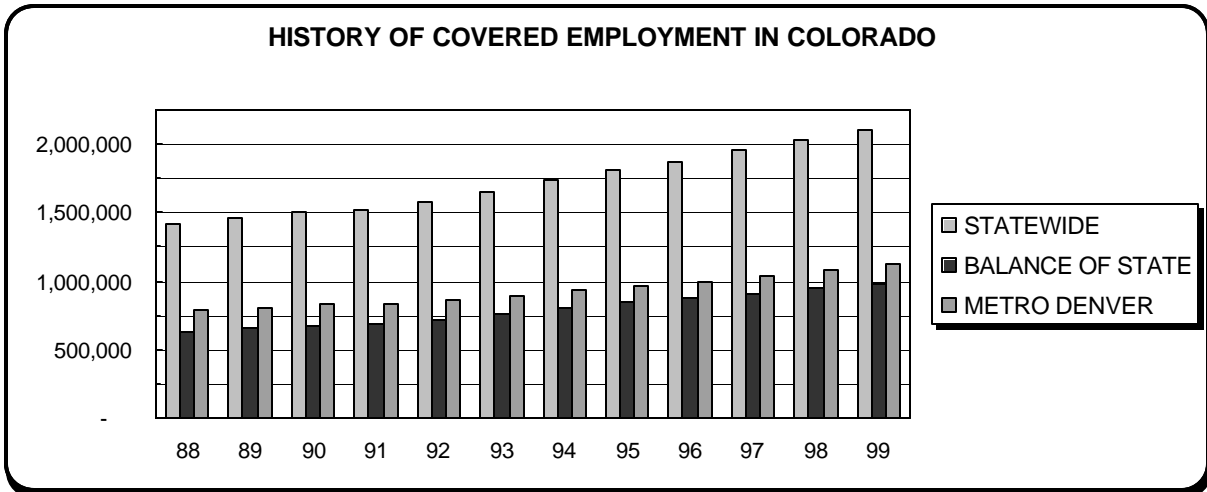
Arapahoe County had the highest average wage at \$42,899. This was an 11.3 percent rise from the previous year. The only other county with an average wage over \$40k was Boulder at \$40,001. Denver's average wage increased by 5.9 percent to \$39,730. Hinsdale County had the lowest average at \$16,151.

The only county to experience an average wage increase in excess of ten percent was Arapahoe at 11.3 percent. The runners up were Park at 9.9 percent and Lake at 9.5 percent.

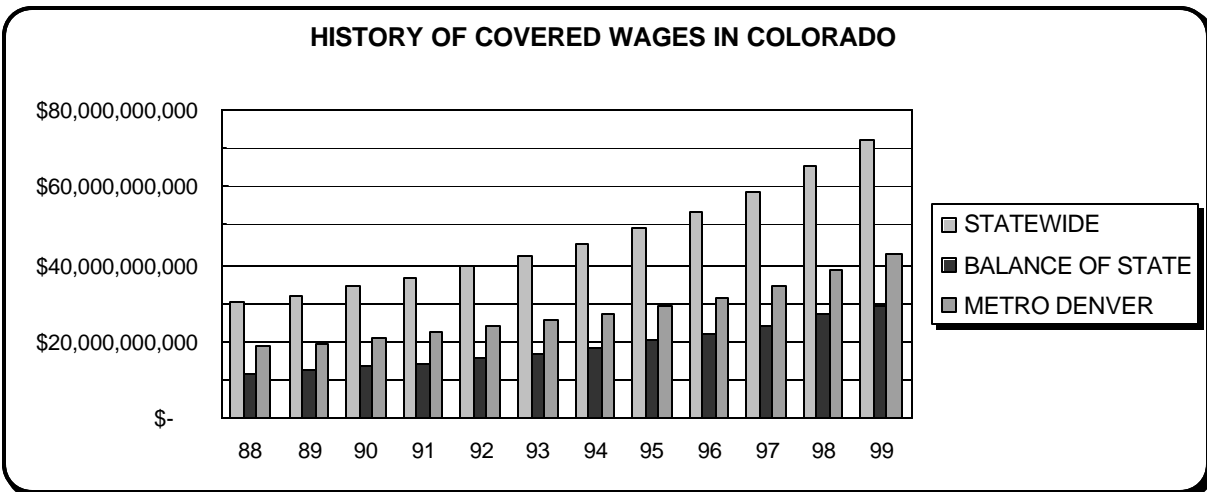
**Total Wages** Growth in total wages slowed slightly in 1999. Total wages increased by \$6.74 billion to \$71.98 billion. This was a 9.9 percent increase. Total wages have increased by 54.2 percent over five years. The county with the highest total wage figure in 1999 was Denver. Aggregate wages in Denver increased by \$1.36 billion to \$18.1 billion. The only other county with over \$10 billion in wages was Arapahoe at \$11.8 billion.

On a percentage basis, Crowley County experienced the greatest total wage growth. Crowley's wages increased by 28 percent to \$27.3 million. Elbert and Dolores Counties were the only others with a wage growth rate in excess of twenty percent. Elbert increased by 21.8 percent to \$65 million and Dolores increased by 21.4 percent to \$8 million. Seven counties experienced a decline in total wages in 1999.

On a five-year percentage basis, Douglas County had the greatest increase at 194.3 percent. Denver County had the largest five-year actual increase at \$5.8 billion. Four counties had a decline in total wages over five years. They were Kiowa down 13.8 percent, Costilla down 7 percent, Rio Blanco down 4 percent and Jackson down 3.3 percent.



**Employment** Annual average covered employment increased by 74,590 jobs to 2,105,286 in 1999. This increase was similar to the increases that Colorado experienced during the last six years. Employment growth slowed from the previous year on a percentage basis from 4.0 to 3.7 percent. The five-county Denver MSA accounted for 55 percent of the increase or 41,367 jobs. Fifteen of Colorado's 63 counties did not experience an increase in average annual employment. The sector with the largest increase was Services, which added 25,474 jobs. The second largest increase occurred within Construction at 14,267 jobs. The county with the largest employment increase was Arapahoe at 13,470 followed by El Paso at 9,535 and Denver at 9,278. Manufacturing recorded the largest decrease in annual average employment at 3,208 jobs. The only other sector to decline was Mining, which was down 985 jobs.



**Wages** Total annual covered wages continued to increase at a rapid pace in 1999, although not as fast as in the previous year. Wages increased by \$6.47 billion to \$71.98 billion. The largest increase occurred within Services, which rose by \$1.91 billion or 10.2 percent to \$6.33 billion. On a percentage basis, the largest increase was in T.C.P.U. with a 20.5 percent rise to \$6.95 billion. This was the largest annual increase in total wages for any sector in at least 15 years. Other sectors with double-digit percentage increases were Construction up 14.6 percent, F.I.R.E. up 13.6 percent and Agriculture up 13.3 percent. None of the major sectors experienced a decline in total wages. Seven out of 63 counties recorded a decrease in total covered wages in 1999. Two counties had increases over \$1 billion. Denver County wages increased by \$1.6 billion to \$18.1 billion and Arapahoe County increased by \$1.2 billion to \$11.8 billion. The Denver-Boulder Greeley CPI-U increased from 161.9 to 166.6 from the second half of 1998 to the second half of 1999. This was a 2.9 percent increase.

## Agriculture, Forestry and Fishing

Agriculture, Forestry and Fishing employment continued to grow faster than the state as a whole at 6.5 percent. Average Annual employment increased by 1,910 jobs, the most ever. The average annual wage increased from \$20,249 to \$21,360. This was the second lowest average wage next to Retail Trade.

The largest and fastest growing sector within Agriculture, Forestry and Fishing is Agriculture Services. This sector added 1,396 jobs to average 11,537 in 1999. The average wage increased by 6.6 percent to \$23,138. Landscape and Horticultural Services employment increased by 1,396 jobs to 11,537 with an average annual salary of \$23,118. The increased employment in Landscape and Horticultural Services is a direct result of the Construction boom. Veterinary Services employment continued to expand with an additional 310 jobs to 4,251. Forty-nine percent of these Veterinary Services jobs were in the Denver MSA. Crop Preparation Services for Market employment increased from 876 to 957. Animal Specialty Services experienced an increase of 39 jobs to average 882 in 1999. The very seasonal Farm Labor Contractors sectors employment increased by an annual average 72 jobs to 588.

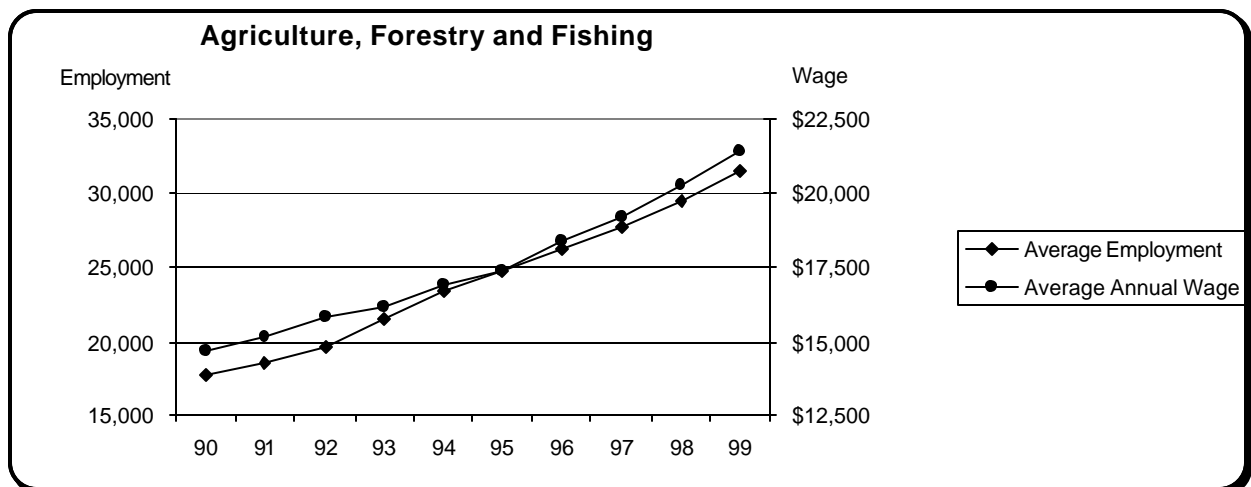
Agriculture Production-Crops reversed a growth trend with a decline of 129 jobs to 6,979. Seventy-three percent of these jobs were

outside of the Denver MSA. The average wage was \$20,323. Ornamental Nursery Products is the largest sector within Agriculture Production-Crops with 2,591 employees. This was a decline of 16 jobs. Vegetables and Melons employment increased from 1,444 to 1,495 while Irish Potatoes employment increase from 757 to 807. The largest drop occurred in Deciduous Tree Fruits with a decline of 100 jobs to 152.

Employment within Agriculture Production-Livestock and Animal Specialties increased by 68 jobs to 5,432 with an average annual wage of \$22,051. Beef Cattle Feedlots employment declined from 1,516 to 1,484. The largest increase was in Dairy Farms at 95 jobs. Dairy Farms employed an average of 1,311 people at an average annual wage of \$19,622. Hogs employment growth slowed after significant increases throughout the decade. There were 1,212 jobs classified in Hogs, an increase of 21. In 1992 there were only 322 jobs classified in Hogs.

Forestry employment increased from 88 to 101 jobs over the year. The increase is attributable to the 14-job increase in Timber Tracts. Timber tracts employed 73 people at an average annual wage of \$21,272.

Fishing, Hunting, and Trapping employment increased from 14 to 17 jobs. There were only three establishments in this sector.

## Mining

Employment within Mining continued to decline after an unexpected increase the previous year. Despite there being 979 less jobs classified under Mining, total wages increased by \$54 million dollars due to very large bonuses within Metal Mining. The strength of Colorado's Mining industry continues to be related to Construction while the weakest area continues to be Oil and Gas Extraction. On a pro forma basis, Mining employment and wages have never been less significant to the economy of Colorado.

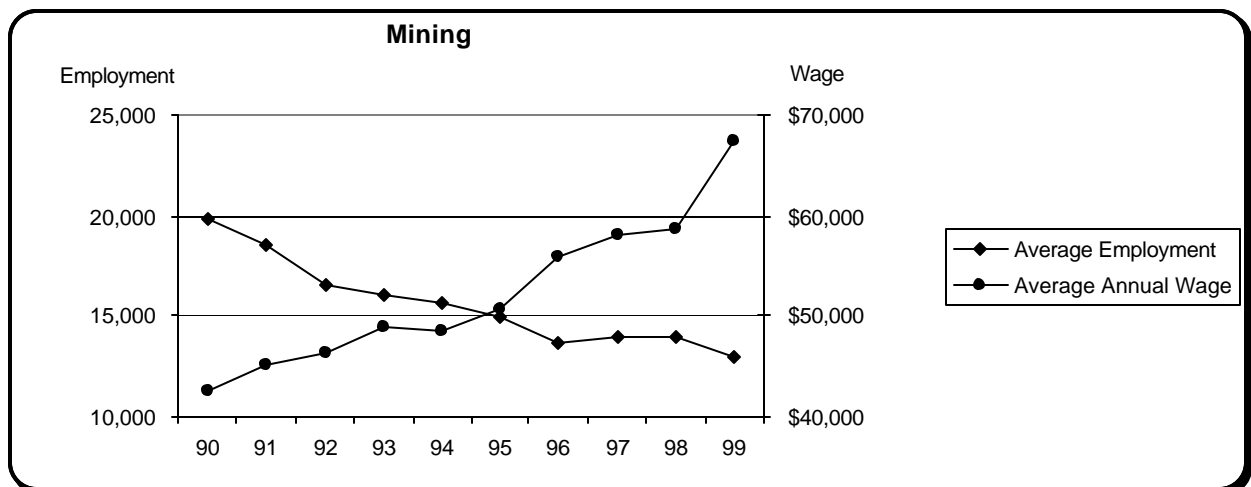
Despite an 11.6 percent decrease in the number of jobs recorded in 1999, Oil and Gas Extraction is still the largest sector within Mining with an average of 6,938 jobs. The average wage within Oil and Gas Extraction increased from \$58,009 to \$63,997. Crude Petroleum and Natural Gas recorded the largest decline at 409 jobs to 4,227. Oil and Gas Field Services, NEC employment declined by 16.7 percent to 1,612. Drilling Oil and Gas Wells employment declined by 17.5 percent to 346 jobs. The brightest sector within Oil and Gas Extraction was Natural Gas Liquids, which added one job to average 55 in 1999.

Mining and Quarrying of Non-Metallic Minerals, Except Fuels average annual employment increased for the third consecutive year. The increase was due to an additional 158 jobs in Construction Sand and Gravel, which

averaged 1,076 jobs, and a 73-job increase in Crushed and Broken Stone, NEC, which averaged 121 jobs. The increase in Crushed and Broken Stone, NEC was a result of a SIC reclassification from Wholesale Trade. The average wage in Mining and Quarrying of Non-Metallic Minerals, Except Fuels, only increased by 1.2 percent to \$38,910 in 1999.

Metal Mining experienced a broad decline in covered employment in 1999. Although Metal Mining employment declined from 2,265 to 2,021, the average wage increased from \$74,155 to \$112,965 due to corporate bonuses. Gold Ore employment declined from 851 to 753. Over half of the Gold Ore Employment is in the five-county Denver MSA. Ferroalloy Ores, Except Vanadium employment declined from 665 to 634. The only Metal Mining codes that had increased employment levels were Iron Ores up three jobs to 28 and Metal Ores, NEC up a job to seven.

Coal Mining employment continued to decline, posting a 1.3 percent drop to 2,148. Bituminous Coal and Lignite Surface Mining employment declined by 8.0 percent to 727 while Bituminous Coal Underground Mining increased by 1.4 percent to 1,312. Coal Mining Services employment increased from 9 to 109 jobs. The average wage within Coal Mining was \$52,091.

## Construction

Covered employment classified in Construction increased by 10.8 percent over the year. This is the second consecutive year that Construction recorded the largest percentage increase in total employment of any sector. Employment in Construction has increased by 144.1 percent since 1989, the year that it bottomed out. This represented 6.97 percent of all jobs versus 4.11 percent in 1989. The average wage increased from \$33,409 to \$34,567. The average wage increase was less than half of the previous years'.

Fifty-eight percent of all Construction jobs were within the Denver Boulder MSA. These jobs had an average annual salary of \$36,896.

Special Trades was the largest and fastest growing sub-sector within Construction. Special Trades added 10,085 jobs or 10.3 percent to average 99,373 jobs in 1999. Within Special Trades, every four digit SIC code added jobs in 1999 from Water Well Drilling, which was up by 34 jobs to 502 to Electrical Work, which was up by 2,210 jobs to 17,204. Two other categories experienced four-digit gains including Plumbing, Heating, Air-Conditioning, up 1,793 jobs to 20,279 and Concrete Work up 1,394 jobs to 12,418.

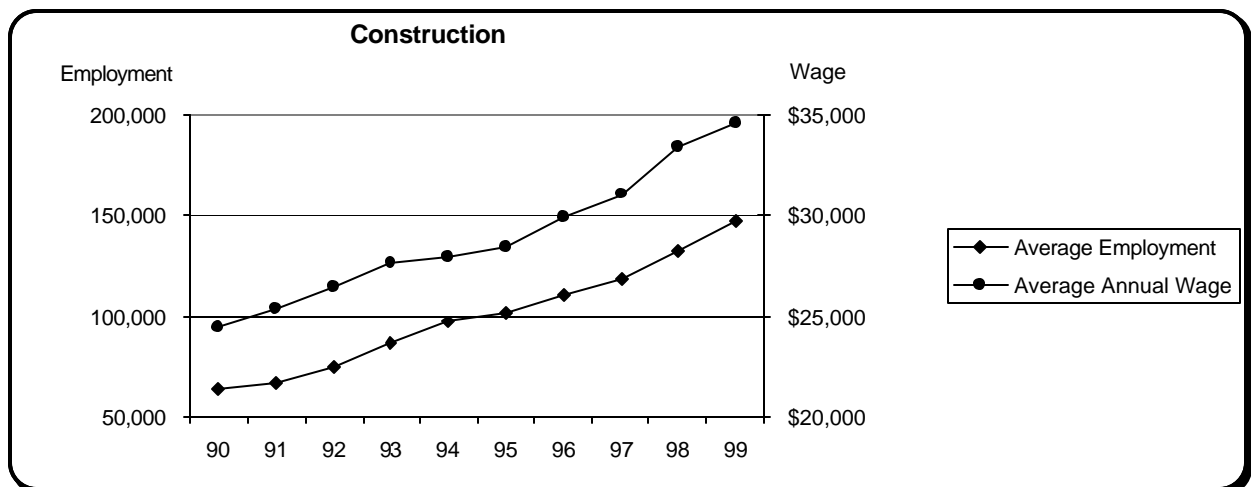
General Building Contractors of Residential Buildings, both operative and non-operative, recorded an increase of 2,007 jobs to 17,899 in 1999. Industrial Buildings and Warehouses

employment unexpectedly declined from 2,555 to 2,411 jobs. Nonresidential Construction, NEC, employment increased by 8.1 percent to 9,551. The average annual wage for General Building increased by 5.7 percent to \$39,613.

Employment within Heavy Construction increased by 10.0 percent to 17,573 jobs. Water, Sewer, and Utility Lines, the largest classification within Heavy Construction, added 1,048 jobs to average 7,063 in 1999. Employment classified in Highway and Street Construction increased by 10.7 percent to 5,831. Bridge, Tunnel, and Elevated Highway Construction was up 14 percent to 708. The only sub-category within Heavy Construction to record a decline in employment was Heavy Construction, NEC, declining 2.3 percent to 3,971. The annual average wage within Heavy Construction declined from \$40,988 to \$39,912.

An additional 3,105 Construction jobs were classified under government ownership. The construction boom has caused large increases in employment that are not classified in this sector including related Mining, Trade, Finance Insurance and Real Estate and Manufacturing

## Manufacturing

Manufacturing experienced a broad decline in employment with 213 four digit SIC's experiencing a decline while only 173 recorded an increase. Employment in nineteen Manufacturing SIC's were unchanged. The average wage in Manufacturing increased by 6.2 percent to \$43,630. The stronger sectors within Manufacturing were related to the construction boom while the weaker sectors tended to be labor intensive and cost sensitive.

The largest sector within Manufacturing is Industrial and Commercial Machinery and Computer Equipment. The sector also recorded the greatest decline in employment with a drop of 2,113 jobs to 31,889. Most of the decline occurred in Electronic Computers, which was down from 7,727 to 6,134. Some of this decline was due to a reclassification into Instruments to Measure Electricity.

The second largest sector in Manufacturing is Printing, Publishing, and Allied Industries at 28,815 jobs. This was an increase of 1.0 percent. Declines in Printing were offset by gains in Newspapers, Greeting Cards, and Miscellaneous Publishing.

Food and Kindred Products employment continued last years' slide with a decline of 1.0 percent to 25,009. Meat Products employment declined to 7,381 from 7,898. Malt Beverages employment declined for a seventh consecutive year to average 3,907. Malt Beverage

employment was 4,036 in '98 and 5,674 in '92.

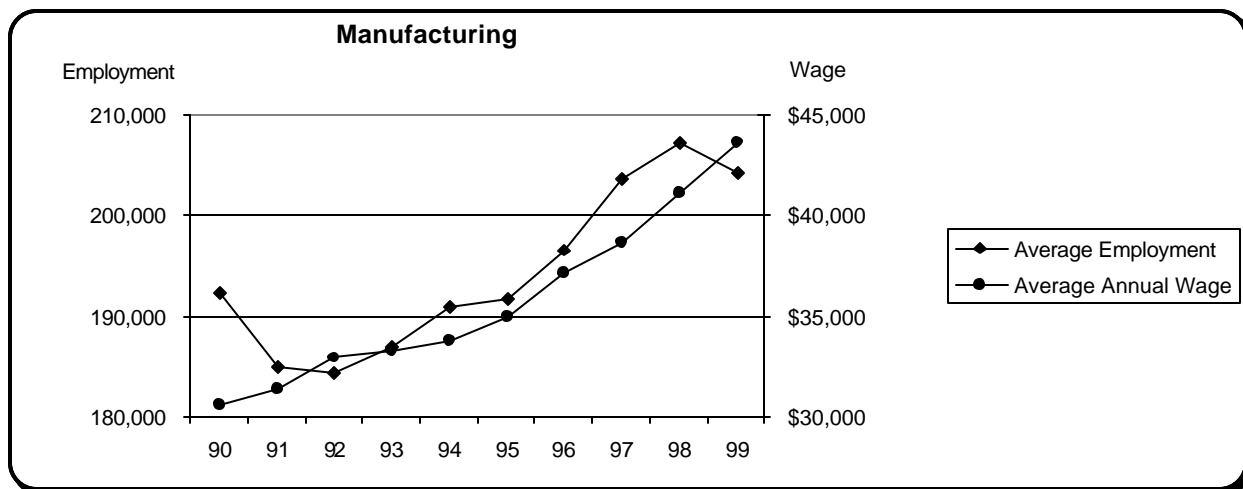
Lumber and Wood Products, Except Furniture employment continued to expand with an addition of 318 jobs to 6,352. The majority of the increase was in Millwork, Veneer, Plywood, and Structural Steel Members.

Furniture and Fixture employment increased to 5,886 from 5,642 in 1998 and 3,309 in 1992. The average wage was \$30,702.

Chemicals and Allied Products employment increased by 7.4 percent to 5,313 jobs. The increase was due to an additional 384 jobs in Drugs. Drugs employment increased from 1,528 to 1,913 with an average annual wage of \$52,704.

The two-digit Manufacturing SIC with the largest percentage and actual gain was Stone, Clay, Glass, and Concrete Products. The sector increased from 10,061 to 10,743. The largest increase within this sector was in Concrete, Gypsum, and Plaster products with an 11.8 percent increase to 5,488.

Electronic and other Electrical Equipment and Components, except Computer Equipment reversed a growth trend with a 4.2 percent decline to 20,206 jobs. The average wage increased from \$44,262 to \$51,598. Large declines occurred in Printed Circuit Boards down 592 to 2,529, Telephone and Telegraph Apparatus down 428 to 3,541, and Electronic Components, NEC down 299 to 2,168.

## Transportation, Communication and Public Utilities

Transportation, Communication and Public Utilities (TCPU) recorded its largest gain in employment and wages ever, with an increase of 11,423 jobs and \$1.18 billion in wages from the previous year. The average annual wage increased by 10.4 percent to \$50,950 due to increased bonuses and additional employment at relatively higher paying companies.

Seventy-nine percent of the employment increase within TCPU occurred within Communications. Telephone Communications employment increased by 5,621 jobs to 35,347 with an annual average salary of \$66,274. The largest percentage increase within Communications occurred within Telegraph & other Communications, up 198 percent to 2,425, with an average annual salary of \$99,080. Radiotelephone Communications continued to grow rapidly, increasing by 51.7 percent to 4,226. Decreases in employment occurred in Communication Services, NEC, down 67 jobs to 1,313 and Radio Broadcasting Stations down 29 jobs to 2,040.

The second largest category within TCPU is Transportation by Air with 25,243 jobs, an increase of 1,462. The majority of the increase in employment occurred in Air Transportation, Scheduled, up 1,232 to 14,019. Airports, Flying Fields, & Services employment increased by 7.7 percent to 2,912 jobs. Air Courier Services

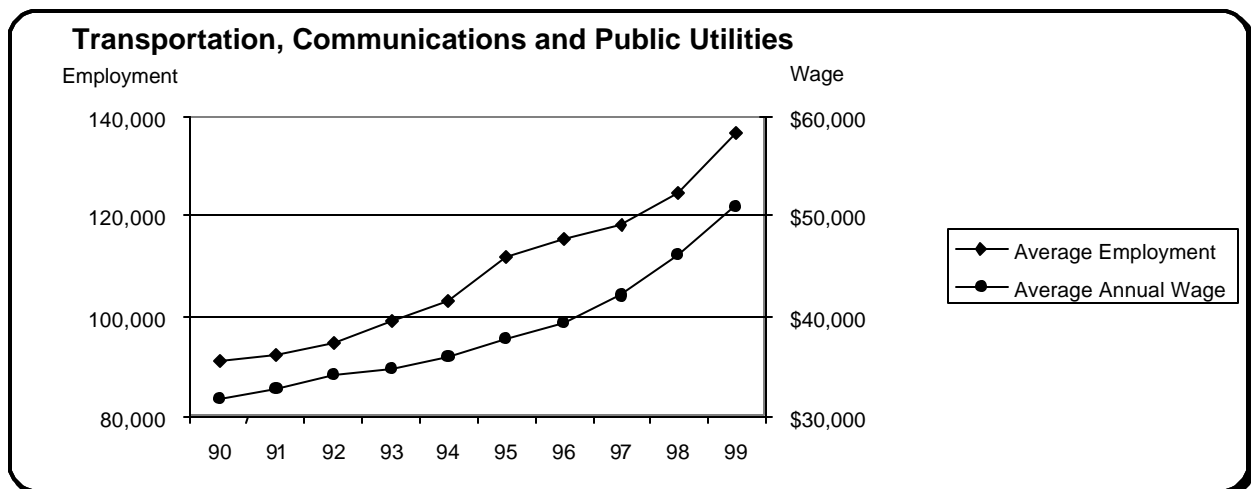
employment declined by 12 jobs to 7,664. Transportation by Air employment increased by 1,503 jobs to 14,348 in Denver County.

Motor Freight Transportation and Warehousing employment remained flat with an increase of only 1.8 percent to 24,132. The biggest gainer within Trucking was Local Trucking, Without Storage up 396 jobs to 7,409 while the largest decline was in Trucking, Except Local down 390 jobs to 9,629.

Electric, Gas, and Sanitary Services employment declined by a quarter of a percent to 15,236 jobs. The largest increase occurred in Sanitary Services NEC, up 76 jobs to 450. The largest percentage increase was in Sewerage Systems, up 25.4 percent to 242 jobs.

Local and Suburban Transit employment unexpectedly declined by 2.6 percent to 5,465 jobs. Six of the eight, four digit SIC codes within transit recorded a decline. The largest increase was in Intercity & Rural Bus Transportation with an increase of 66 jobs to 613. The only other increase was in Bus Charter Service, Except Local with an increase of 13 jobs to 259.

Employment in Transportation Services experienced a large increase due to approximately 550 employees being reclassified from Business Services to Packing and Crating. Transportation Services employment increased by 688 jobs to 8,232.

## Wholesale Trade

Growth in Wholesale Trade employment slowed in 1999 to 0.8 percent. Wholesale Trade lost approximately 2,200 employees due to SIC reclassifications. The average wage increased from \$43,236 to \$46,137. The strength of the Wholesale Trade division continues to be in codes that are related to construction and technology. It should be noted that Wholesale Trade tends to experience a disproportionate share of SIC code changes.

Durable Goods employment increased by 804 jobs to 65,836 in 1999. The average wage increased by 7.6 percent to \$50,228.

Employment in Professional and Commercial Equipment and Supplies increased by 719 jobs to 17,319. The majority of the increase occurred within Computers, Peripherals & Software with an increase of 655 jobs to 8,818. Computers, Peripherals & Software Trade has become one of the most lucrative technology sectors with an average wage of \$87,796. Medical and Hospital Equipment reversed a four year slide with a gain of 119 jobs to 2,781. Office Equipment declined from 3,436 to 3,339 jobs while Photographic Equipment and Supplies declined from 734 to 664 jobs.

The second largest sector within Durable Goods Wholesale Trade is Machinery, Equipment, and Supplies with a decline of 113 jobs to 11,517. Large declines included Service Establishment Equipment, down 178 jobs to

1,022 and Industrial Machinery and Equipment down 68 jobs to 4,526.

Lumber and other Construction Materials employment continued to expand with an additional 428 jobs to average 6,363 in 1999. The average wage increased by 7.6 percent to \$43,370. Large increases occurred in Lumber, Plywood, and Millwork, up 216 to 3,467 and Brick, Stone, & Related Materials, up 246 to 1,287.

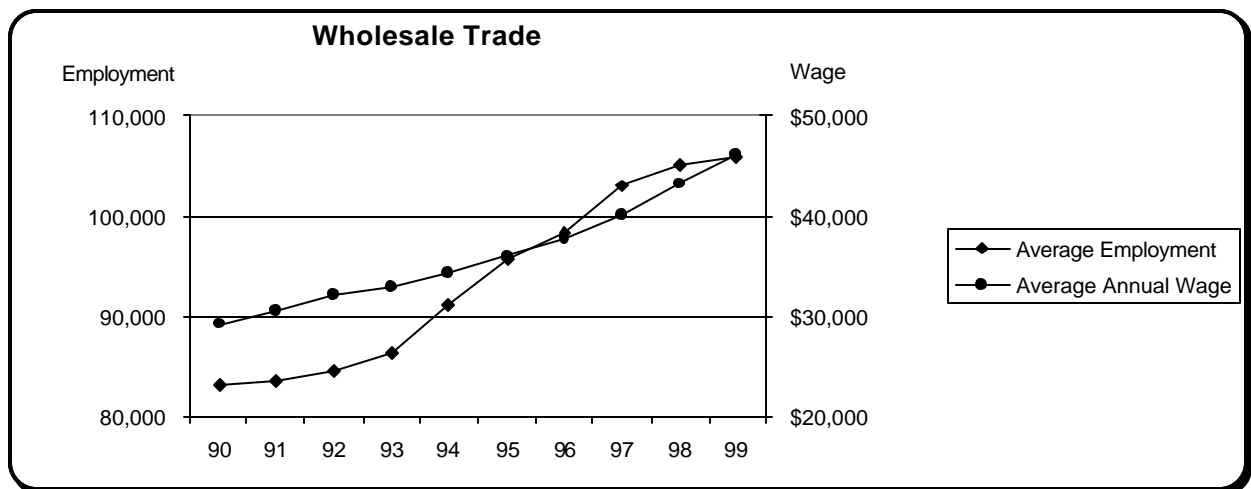
Establishments coded under the Wholesale Trade of Non-Durable Goods barely eked out a gain in employment with an increase of only 34 jobs to 40,113. The average wage increased from \$37,636 to \$39,423.

Drugs, Proprietaries, and Sundries had the largest annual employment gain among Non-Durable goods at 469 jobs to average 4,319 in 1999. The average wage was \$54,487.

The second largest employment gain in Non-Durable Goods occurred in Miscellaneous Non-Durable Goods with an increase of 279 jobs to 8,443. Specifically, the gains occurred in Flowers & Florists' Supplies up 142 to 1,064 and Non-Durable goods, NEC up 132 to 2,517.

The largest sub-sector within Non-Durable Wholesale Trade is Grocery and Related Products, which declined by 125 jobs to 13,042. The average was \$37,114.

Beer Wine, and Distilled Alcoholic Beverages employment increased to 3,232.

## Retail Trade

Employment in Retail Trade increased by 3.5 percent over the year while the average wage rose 5.5 percent to \$18,141. Over the last seven years, employment in the Retail Trade sector has increased by 4.2 percent per year. The trend toward larger corporate owned establishments continued.

On average, there were 134 more Eating and Drinking establishments in 1999 than the previous year. These 8,507 establishments employed an average of 157,251 people.

The Building Materials, Hardware, Garden Supplies, and Mobile Home Dealers sector continued to increase at the fastest rate among Retail categories. It added 1,668 jobs to 19,353. Establishments classified in Lumber and other Building Materials, saw employment increases of 11.9 percent over the year and almost 50 percent over five years. Hardware Stores increased by 4 establishments to 201 with employment increasing from 2,918 to 3,091. Mobile Home Dealers increased from 76 to 91 with average employment of 649 people. There were five less Retail Nurseries and Garden Stores in 1999 at 130. Employment in Retail Nurseries and Garden Stores declined by 45 jobs to 1,185.

Food Store employment increased by 797 jobs to 51,423. The increase can be attributed to 53 additional Grocery Stores. Grocery Store employment rose by 927 jobs to 45,537.

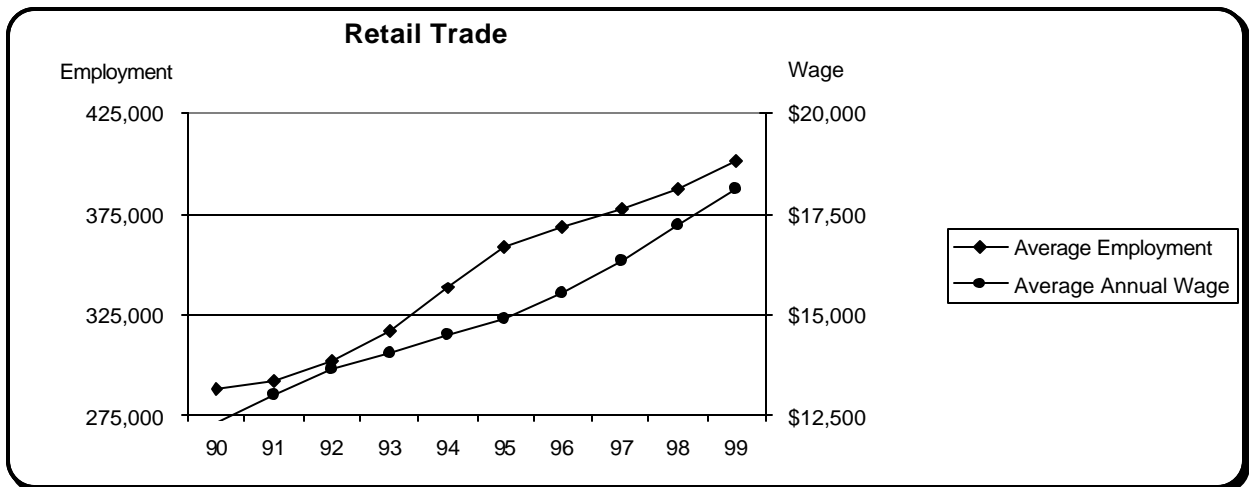
Miscellaneous Food Stores employment continued to increase rapidly with an addition of 256 jobs to average 1,840 in 1999. Employment at Retail Bakeries decreased by 590 jobs to 2,429.

Automotive Dealers and Gasoline Service Stations employment increased by 5 percent to 41,184 jobs. New and Used Car Dealers employment increased by 14 jobs to 11,706 in 1999. Used Car Dealers recorded a much larger increase at 23.4 percent to 2,183 jobs. Motorcycle Dealers recorded an increase of 13.4 percent to 963, while Recreational Vehicle Dealers employment increased from 616 to 682.

Home Furniture, Furnishing, and Equipment Stores, the second fastest growing sector within Retail Trade, added 1,231 jobs to average 20,121 in 1999. There were 2,192 establishments in this sector. Drapery and Upholstery Stores employment grew by 24.3 percent in 1999 to 198 jobs. Radio, TV, & Electronic Stores employment increased by 398 jobs to 4,066. Misc. Home-Furnishings Stores added 416 jobs to 3,367.

General Merchandise Stores, which are dominated by the sub category of Department Stores, added 1,506 jobs to 43,019. All but 2,409 of these jobs were in Department Stores.

There were 6,997 establishments classified under Miscellaneous Retail in 1999 with average annual employment of 52,824.

## Finance, Insurance and Real Estate

Employment in Finance Insurance and Real Estate increased by 4,653 jobs to 136,333, while the average wage increased by 9.7 percent to \$46,448.

Employment growth in Real Estate slowed considerably in 1999, adding only 630 jobs to average 32,431. Real Estate Agents and Managers employment increased by 491 jobs to 18,954. Mobile Home Site Operators experienced an increase of 116 jobs to average 923 in 1999, due to a SIC change from Real Estate Agents and Managers. The largest decline in employment occurred in Title Abstract Offices, down 41 employees to 558.

Depository Institutions employment continued to expand with an addition of 1,055 employees to 28,989. The average wage increased by 1.7 percent to \$31,713. The fastest growing sector within Depository Institutions is State Commercial Banks, which added 737 jobs to average 6,505. State Credit Union employment increased by 6.2 percent to 1,544.

Although employment in Non-Depository Credit Institutions increased by 2.1 percent to 15,956, the average wage declined by 1.7 percent to \$49,439. On an annual average basis, the largest employment gain occurred in Loan Brokers with an increase of 10.1 percent to 3,569. Loan Broker employment increased by 40.2 percent the previous year. Mortgage

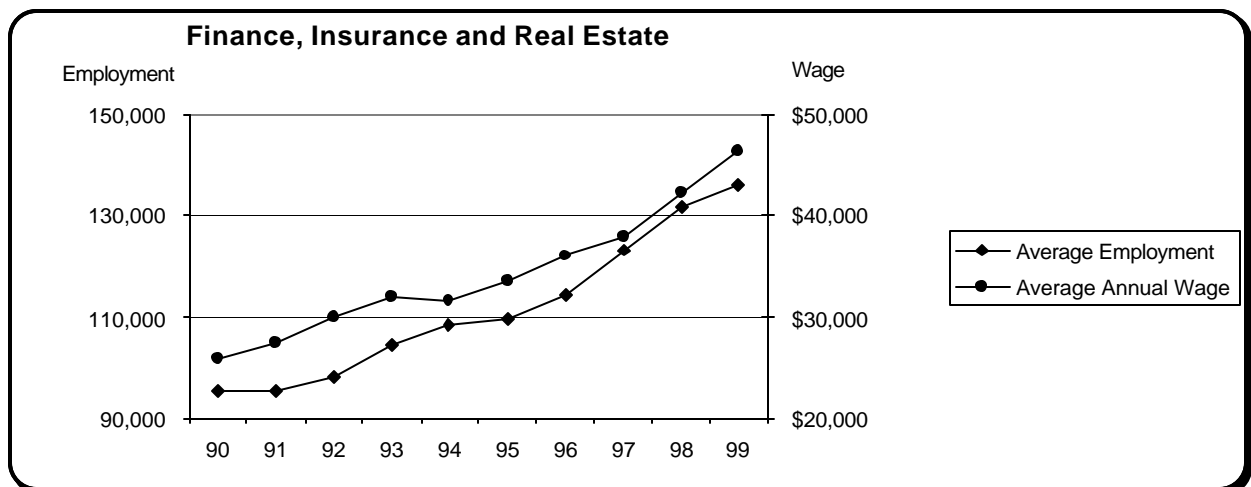
Bankers and Correspondents employment increased by 180 jobs to 6,083 while the associated annual wage declined from \$59,245 to \$55,178.

Security and Commodity Brokers, Dealers, Exchanges, and Services recorded a 13.7 percent gain in employment to 12,309 and a 12.1 percent increase in the average annual wage to \$87,731. Security Brokers and Dealers employment increased by 10.7 percent to 8,538 with an annual average wage of \$77,022. Establishments classified under Investment Advice experienced an increase from 1,899 jobs to 2,236 with an average salary of \$153,325.

Insurance Carrier employment increased by 1,037 jobs to 27,525 in 1999. About a quarter of the increase was from a SIC reclassification from Insurance Agents. The average wage in this industry was \$44,701. The largest gain occurred in Pension, Health, and Welfare Funds, which were up by 446 jobs to 2,131. The largest decrease was in Hospital and Medical Service Plans with a decline of 245 jobs to 5,035.

Insurance Agents, Brokers, & Service employment declined by 530 jobs to 11,219. Commissioned salespeople are not included in this report.

Holding and other Investment Offices added 654 jobs to 6,861 with an average annual salary of \$79,705.

## Services

Employment within Services continued to expand rapidly with an addition of 25,474 jobs. On a percentage basis, at 4.3 percent, the increase was the smallest since 1991. Average wage growth slowed with an increase of only 5.7 percent to \$33,268.

As usual, more jobs were added in Business Services than any other 2-digit SIC with an addition of 11,421 jobs to 190,577. The majority of this increase occurred in Computer Programming, Data Processing, and other Computer Related Services with an addition of 10,851 jobs to 62,586 with an average annual wage of \$66,384. Help Supply Services employment increased by 2,260 to 47,784.

Health Services employment stagnated in 1999, adding only 416 jobs to average 129,440. The largest increase occurred in Offices and Clinics of Dentists with 520 additional jobs leading to an average of 11,805. Offices & Clinics of Medical Doctors employment increased from 28,138 to 28,609. The largest decrease was in General Medical & Surgical Hospitals with a decline of 526 jobs to 38,426.

Professional Services added 5,444 jobs to average 67,390 in 1999. Engineering Services employment increased from 21,057 to 22,839 with an average salary of \$58,252. Accounting, Auditing, & Bookkeeping recorded the second largest increase at 1,168 jobs to average

10,821. Facilities Support Services employment increased by 768 jobs to 3,080.

Hotels, Rooming Houses, Camps and Other Lodging Places experienced an increase in employment of 2.3 percent to average 41,296. Hotel and Motel employment increased from 38,634 to 39,354.

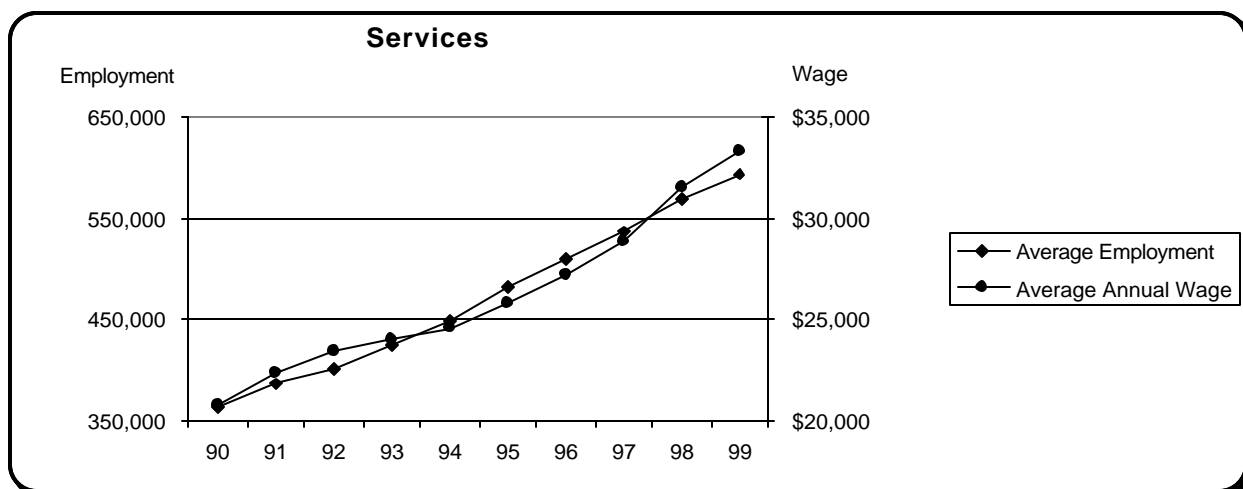
Personal Service employment continued to expand along with the population adding 600 jobs to 20,170. The largest percentage gain occurred in Tax Preparation Services at 11.1 percent to 1,017. The largest actual increase was in Beauty Shops, up 207 to 6,840 jobs.

Automotive Repair, Services and Parking added 1,218 jobs to average 22,887. The largest increase was in Automobile Parking with an increase of 257 to 1,229. Top & Body Repair & Paint Shops added 244 jobs to 4,145 and General Automotive Repair Shops added 235 jobs to average 5,303.

Social Services employment increased by 1,657 jobs to 37,769. The gain was equally distributed between three categories including Individual and Family Services up 656 to 11,939, Child Day Care Services up 555 to 11,199 and Residential Care up 546 to 9,778.

Legal Services employment increased by 188 jobs to 14,115 with an average salary of \$54,922.

Repair Service employment increased by only 31 jobs to 6,525.

## Government

Employment classified within Government ownership increased by 2.2 percent or 6,665 jobs. Since 1991, Government employment has decreased every year on a pro forma basis. In 1991, Government accounted for 17.8 percent of all covered employment. In 1999, Government accounted for 14.8 percent. Growing industries within Government ownership continue to include Educational Services and Justice, Public Order and Safety. The annual average wage classified in Government increased by 2.9 percent to \$33,463. The average annual wage classified under private industry increased by 6.5 percent to \$34,318 during the same period.

### State Government

Employment growth in State Government accelerated in 1999 to 3.4 percent. There were an average of 63,437 jobs classified under State Government with an average wage of \$36,424. The average wage increased by 3.1 percent. Thirty percent of State employment was in Denver County with an average wage of \$41,530.

Just over half of all additional jobs classified under State ownership were classified in Educational Services. Educational Services employment increased from 31,374 to 32,432 in 1999. Colleges and Universities employment increased by 713 jobs to 25,155 with an average wage of \$34,192. Junior colleges added 310

jobs to average 7,034. Elementary and secondary schools employment increased from 208 to 243.

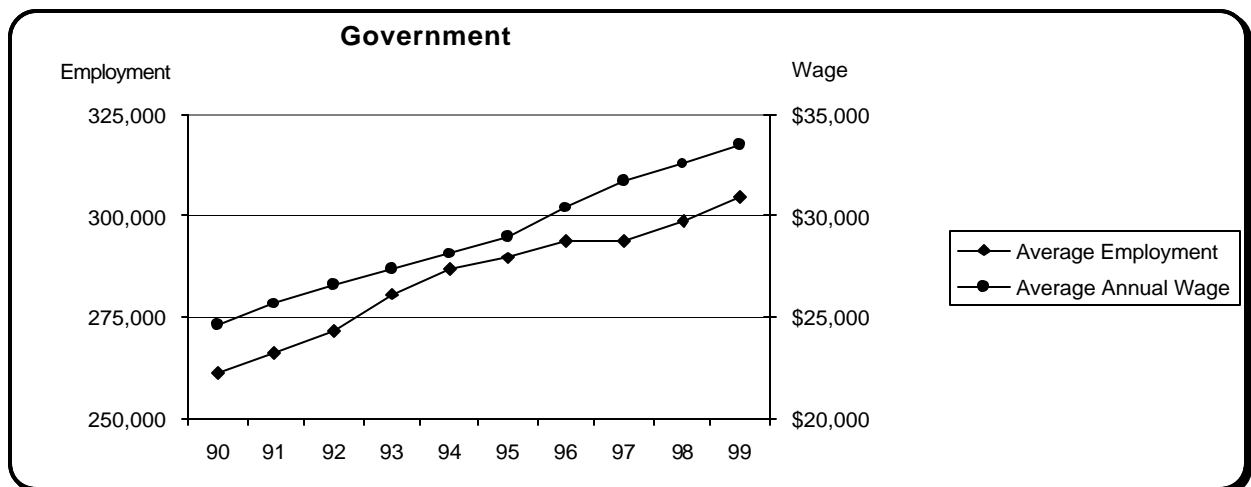
Employment in Justice, Public Order and Safety grew at an even faster rate than the previous year at 8.6 percent, compared to 7.7 percent in 1998. Correctional Institutions employment recorded the largest gain with an additional 610 jobs to average 5,667. Courts employment increased by 172 jobs to 2,638. These increases occurred despite the trend toward privately owned Correctional Institutions.

Health Service employment increased by 220 jobs to 5,967. General, Medical & Surgical Hospitals employment accounted for almost all of the increase with an additional 213 jobs to average 4,058. Seventy-six percent of State Health Services Jobs were in Denver County.

Heavy Construction employment unexpectedly declined from 3,109 to 3,069. The average wage increased by 3.5 percent to \$40,956.

Administration of Human Resource Programs employment was virtually unchanged in 1999 with a gain of 11 jobs to 4,843. Administration of Social & Manpower Programs employment declined by 12 jobs to 2,485. Administration of Public Health Programs employment increased by 18 jobs to 1,105.

Administration of Environmental Quality and Housing Programs added 34 jobs to 1,808.

## Local Government

Local Government added 4,487 jobs in 1999. This was a 2.6 percent growth rate. The average wage increased by 3.4 percent to \$29,509. Local Government employment increases were a direct result of an increasing population.

The largest sector within Local Government is Educational Services at 102,007 jobs. This was an increase of 2,310 jobs. The average wage rose 2.5 percent to \$27,201. Elementary and Secondary Schools accounted for almost all of the additional jobs with an increase from 96,353 to 98,626. Library employment rose by 6.2 percent to 1,268 and Junior College employment declined from 1,796 to 1,743.

Executive, Legislative, and General Government, Except Finance employment grew by 2.9 percent to 51,887. This is the category where city and county governments are coded when they do not break out the employment reports by function. The average wage increased from \$31,063 to \$32,311.

Health Services employment experienced an increase similar to the previous years' at 670 verses 669 in 1998. There were 8,432 jobs classified under Health Services with an average wage of \$30,913.

Amusement and Recreation, NEC was nearly unchanged with only 14 more jobs in 1999. The sector employed an average of 2,645 people. These establishments are mostly Park and Recreation districts that are not included in a general government classification.

Electric, Gas, and Sanitary Service employment decreased by 47 jobs to 5,144. Combination Utilities, NEC employment declined by 286 jobs 2,059 while Water Supply employment increased by 286 jobs to 1,851.

Local and Suburban Transit employment increased by 3.3 percent to 2,375. Almost all of these jobs were with RTD.

## Federal Government

Federal Government employment resumed its downward trend with a loss of 261 jobs to average 53,708 in 1999. On average, Federal jobs pay substantially more than other Governments. The average Federal job paid \$44,179 in 1999, an increase of 3.1 percent.

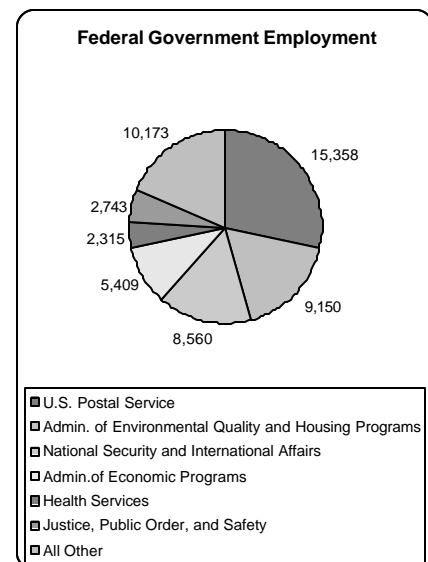
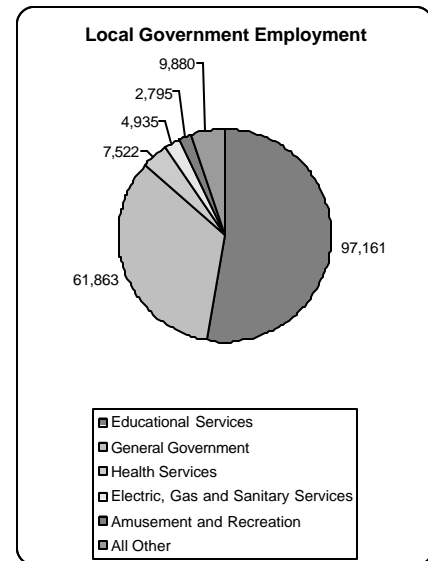
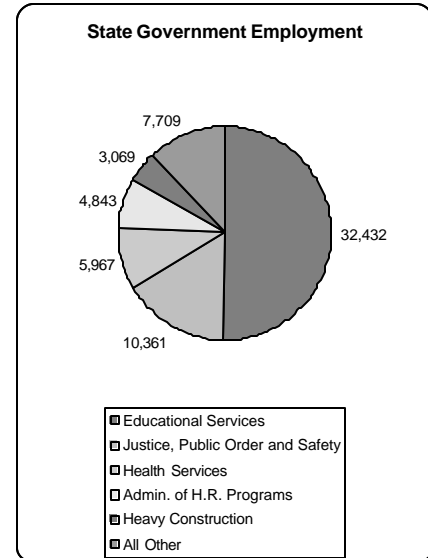
U.S. Postal Service employment increased by 287 jobs to 15,358. Postal Employees earned an average of \$40,269.

Administration of Environmental Quality and Housing Programs employment declined by 145 jobs to 9,150. This was due to a 151- job loss in Land, Mineral, and Wildlife Conservation.

National Security and International Affairs was the third largest category under Federal Government with 8,560 employees. This was a decline of 184 jobs. Only civilian military employment is counted by the ES202 Program.

Justice, Public Order, and Safety employment increased by a mere five jobs to 2,743. Correctional Institutions employment increased by 76 jobs to 1,453 while Legal Counsel and Prosecution employment declined by 73 jobs to 242.

About 575 jobs at the Department of Commerce were reclassified from Services, NEC to Non-Commercial Research.

# COLORADO EMPLOYMENT AND WAGES BY STANDARD INDUSTRIAL CLASSIFICATION FOR 1999

## **Definitions**

**AVERAGE EMPLOYMENT.** Average Employment is the mean value of the reported employment figures for the 12 reporting months of the year.

**AVERAGE WAGE.** The Average Wage is the Total Wages paid divided by the Average Employment.

**BALANCE OF STATE.** Balance of State is all counties in Colorado outside the five county, Metro Denver Area.

**COVERED EMPLOYER.** A covered employer is an employer who is required to pay unemployment insurance because they meet any of the following criteria:

1. Employs one worker at any time.
2. Acquires all or a substantial portion of a covered employer.
3. Is subject to Federal Unemployment Tax Act.
4. Is a non-profit organization and has four or more employees for 20 weeks during the calendar year.
5. Is a State agency, State operated hospital, or school of higher education, or a political subdivision of the State.
6. Is an employer of agricultural labor and pays \$20,000 or more in any one quarter of a calendar year, or employs 10 workers for 20 weeks during the year.
7. Pays cash wages of \$1,000 or more in any calendar year for domestic help in a private home.

The following are specific exclusions from the coverage:

1. Agricultural employment not defined above.
2. Sole proprietors.
3. Railroad workers.
4. Children under 21 in the employ of a parent.
5. Elected officials.
6. Students or inmate workers.
7. Commissioned real estate, insurance and direct seller salespeople.
8. Church employees.
9. Work relief program participants.

**DISCLOSURE RESTRICTIONS.** Publication of employment and wage data is withheld for any 2-digit subsection which consists of fewer than three reporting units or in which a single establishment accounts for 80 percent or more of an industry's employment. In the event that only one 2-digit subsection is restricted, the next smallest 2-digit subsection (by number of establishments) will also be restricted to allow disclosure of total industry information.

**EMPLOYMENT.** The number of covered workers who earned wages during the pay period that includes the 12th of the month. Workers on the payroll of more than one firm during the period are counted each time they are reported.

**ENTERPRISE.** An enterprise is the employer and legal entity of the Unemployment Insurance tax account. An enterprise may consist of one or more units.

**ESTABLISHMENTS.** A unit is an establishment, generally at a single physical location, where business is conducted or where services or industrial operations are performed.

**ES202.** The ES202 is a statistical report summarizing employment, total wages, taxable wages and contribution information for employers subject to State unemployment insurance laws under the Colorado Employment Security Act. The report also includes employment and wage information for federal civilian workers covered by UCFE.

## COLORADO EMPLOYMENT AND WAGES BY STANDARD INDUSTRIAL CLASSIFICATION FOR 1999

FIPS. Federal Information Processing Standards. Standards for information processing issued by the National Bureau of Standards in the US Department of Commerce. Includes a numeric designation for geographic areas such as States, counties, and MA's.

GROSS WAGES. As reported on the Unemployment Insurance Tax Report, gross wages are the total amount of compensation paid by the employer during the quarter.

METRO DENVER. The Metropolitan Denver Area consists of the following counties: Adams, Arapahoe, Denver, Douglas and Jefferson.

SIC (STANDARD INDUSTRIAL CLASSIFICATION). Each business is assigned a 4 digit SIC code that describes the nature of the business in accordance with the Standard Industrial Classification Manual, 1987.

SIZE CLASS. Establishments and enterprises are categorized by the number of employees working in the month of March.

TOTAL WAGES. Total Wages are the sum of wages for the four quarters of the year.
