

# **COLORADO EMPLOYMENT AND WAGES**

**ANNUAL AVERAGE 2000**

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This report, which is published annually, is a compilation of employment and wage data from the Colorado ES-202 Program. The information is compiled from reports submitted to the Colorado Department of Labor & Employment by employers subject to unemployment insurance law under the Colorado Employment Security Act. Employment and wage data for civilian federal government employees in Colorado are also included in this report.

Employment and wage information are compiled by county and industry for private business and government. Some data items are not available for public disclosure in accordance with U.S. Department of Labor guidelines. Because every attempt is made to use actual instead of imputed data, this report is not published until seven months after the end of the reporting period to allow for the verification of questionable data and the inclusion of late reports.

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**Colorado in 2000**

Covered employment and wage growth continued at a rapid pace in 2000. The primary factors driving this growth have been an increasing population and the lottery mentality of equity investors. Colorado's rapidly increasing population, which was consistently under estimated by the United States Census throughout the nineties, has increased demand for all types of real estate and services. This increased demand for real estate has in turn raised the wealth of Coloradoans.

The increased demand for real estate has had a positive affect on all major divisions, not just FIRE and Construction. Declines in the traditional areas of Agriculture have been offset by increases in demand for Landscaping Services. The same can be said of the Mining division. Declines in Metal Mining have been offset by increased demand for construction related mined commodities. Declines in cost sensitive manufacturing sectors have been mitigated by increases in locally manufactured construction products. The construction boom has created related jobs in Wholesale and Retail Trade and every other division.

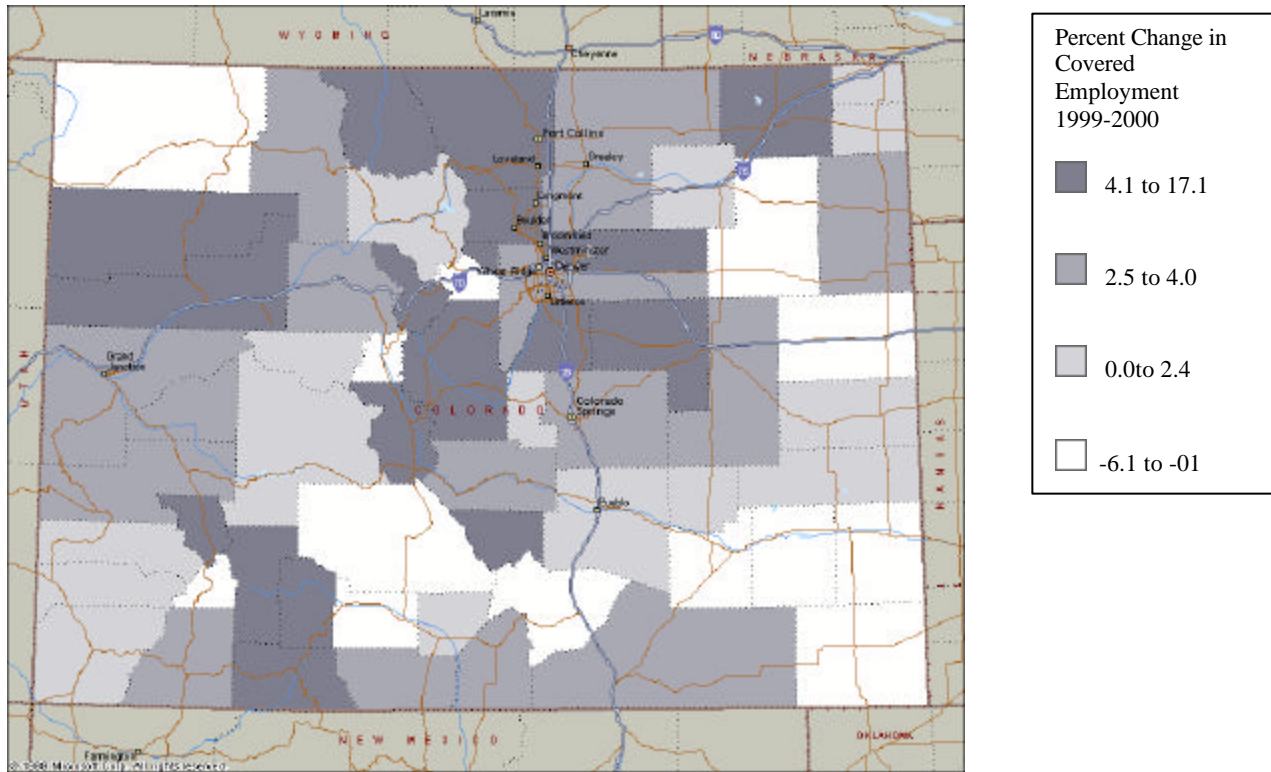
In 2000, private industry employment and average wages continued to expand much more

rapidly than government employment and average wages. Private industry employment increased by 4.1 percent versus 2.45 percent for government employment. The average government wage increased slightly faster than inflation at 4.1 percent. The average private industry wage increased by 9.4 percent.

The disparity between the wealthy and poor counties continued to widen. In 1995, the highest average county wage divided by the lowest average county wage was 2.48. In 1999 and 2000, the figures were 2.66 and 2.87 respectively.

Some of the competitive advantages that Colorado has enjoyed continued to deteriorate in 2000 at the same time that its susceptibility to business cycles has increased. Unemployment has decreased, wages have risen relative to other states and the cost of living moved above the national average based on the CPI-U. The business cycle mitigating government sector, has decreased as a percentage of total employment every year since 1991. In addition, the Colorado economy has increased its exposure to companies that raise capital through either the highly volatile NASDAQ or the junk bond market.

Covered employment continued to increase at a rate that is significantly faster than the United States average in 2000. Forty-nine of Colorado's 63 counties recorded an increase in annual average employment. The most populated counties along the interstate highways accounted for the most additional jobs. The outskirts of the major population centers recorded the fastest percentage increases.

The Northern Front Range counties of Weld and Larimer continued to grow at a fast pace. Larimer County added 5,802 jobs and Weld County added 2,582 jobs. Both figures were records. These counties enjoyed cost advantages over their southern neighbors.

Growth slowed in the Southern Front Range. El Paso County growth slowed from 4.3 percent to 3.4 percent. Pueblo did much worse. Employment growth reversed an eight-year growth trend with a 1.1 percent decline. These Southern Front Range counties also enjoyed a cost advantage in attracting businesses over their northern neighbors.

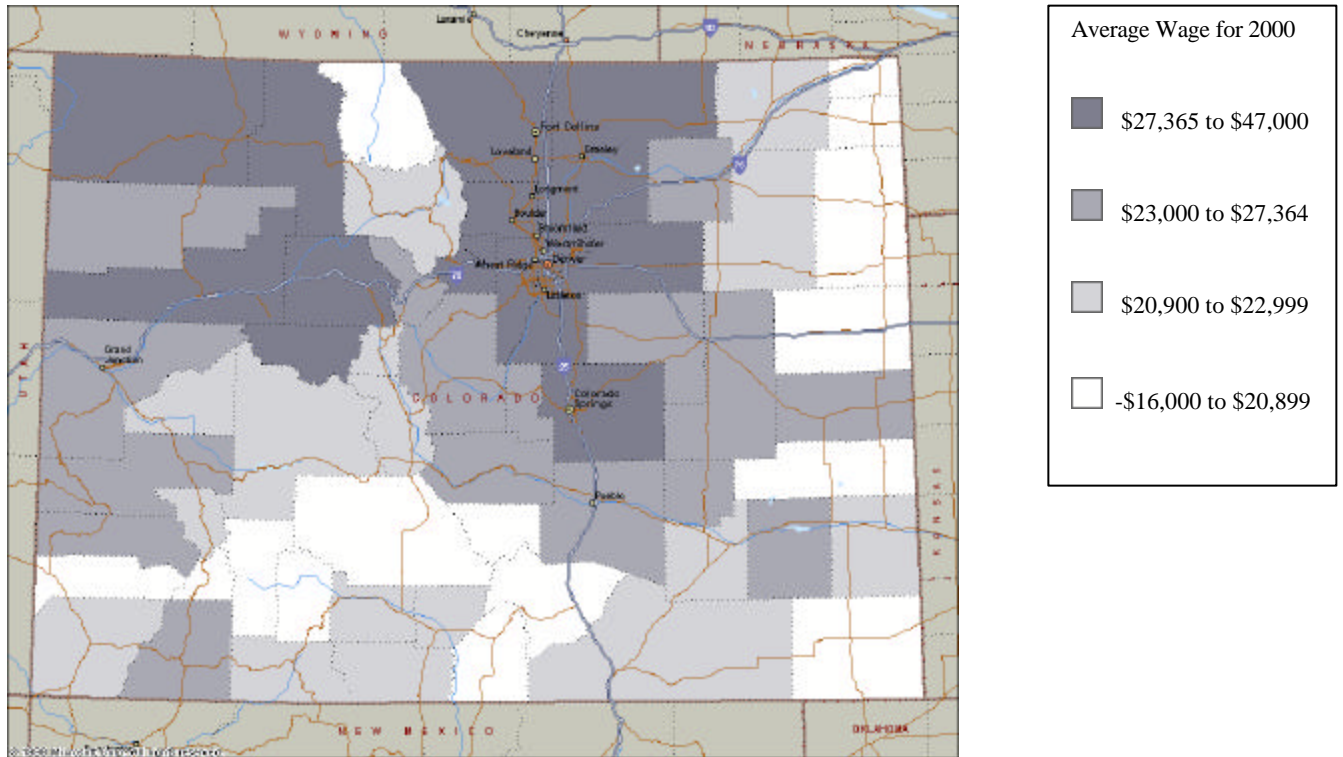
It was an uneventful year for employment statistics at the ski counties. The largest increase occurred in Summit County at 4.2 percent. Growth in San Miguel decreased from 8.1 percent to 1.5 percent. Employees in ski

counties have a much higher incidence of dual job holding, which can be difficult to interpret when comparing ES202 employment with workforce data.

Employment growth slowed in Mesa County. The county added 1,227 jobs in 2000. Over the previous six years, Mesa County added an average of 1,896 jobs per year. In contrast, the neighboring county of Garfield added 1,167 jobs compared to an average of 868 in the previous six years.

In Southwestern Colorado, La Plata County grew at a faster rate than in the previous three years with an additional 703 jobs. Growth in neighboring Montezuma County slowed from 296 jobs added in 1999 to 73 jobs added in 2000. Employment growth also slowed in Archuleta County from 283 additional jobs in 1999 to 131 additional jobs in 2000.

On a five-year basis, the three largest counties based on the number of jobs in 2000, also were the three counties that added the most jobs. Denver County added 57,434 jobs. Arapahoe County added 62,141 jobs. El Paso County added 44,454. The most significant five-year loser was Lake County with a loss of 125 jobs over five years.



**Average Wages** Sixty of Colorado's 63 counties recorded an increase in average wages in 2000. The only counties to record a decrease were Hinsdale, Kiowa and Dolores. Jackson, Las Animas and Costilla Counties have all seen their average wages decline since 1995.

The largest average wage increase occurred in Pitkin County with a \$9,743 rise to \$40,728. The second highest single year increase was in Boulder County at \$5,561 or 13.9 percent. The average ES202 wage in Boulder County has increased by 70.6 percent over five years to \$45,562.

Although Boulder County has narrowed the gap considerably, Arapahoe County still had the highest annual average wage in Colorado. The average wage in Arapahoe County increased by 7.8 percent to \$46,254. The average wage in Denver County increased by 11.6 percent to \$44,343. The lowest average wage is still in Hinsdale County at \$16,116.

Average ES202 wages can be difficult to interpret, since the program does not adjust for the number of hours worked or the propensity to hold multiple jobs, which varies widely by county. In addition, the program does not produce any inferences about the variance of the wage distribution.

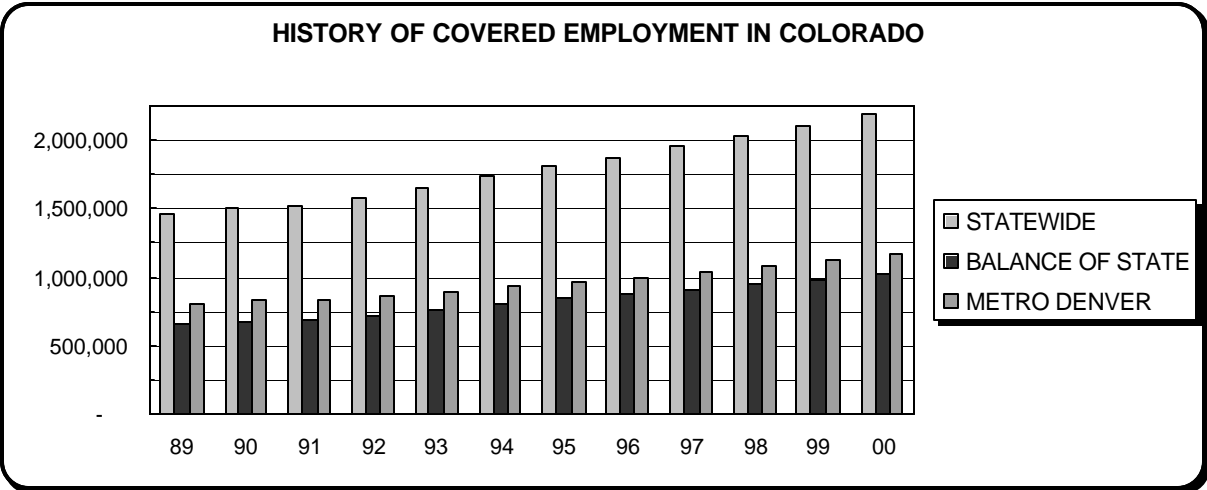
**Total Wages** Total wages in Colorado increased at an increasing rate in 2000. The \$9.29 billion increase to \$81.27 billion, was the largest ever recorded. The second largest increase occurred in 1999 at \$6.47 billion.

Denver County accounted for 29 percent of all of the total statewide wage increase. Wages in Denver County increased by \$2.7 billion to \$20.8 billion. The other counties that recorded increases in excess of a billion dollars were Boulder and Arapahoe. Total wages in Boulder County were up 22.8 percent to \$8.2 billion. Total wages in Arapahoe County were up 11.7 percent to \$13.15 billion.

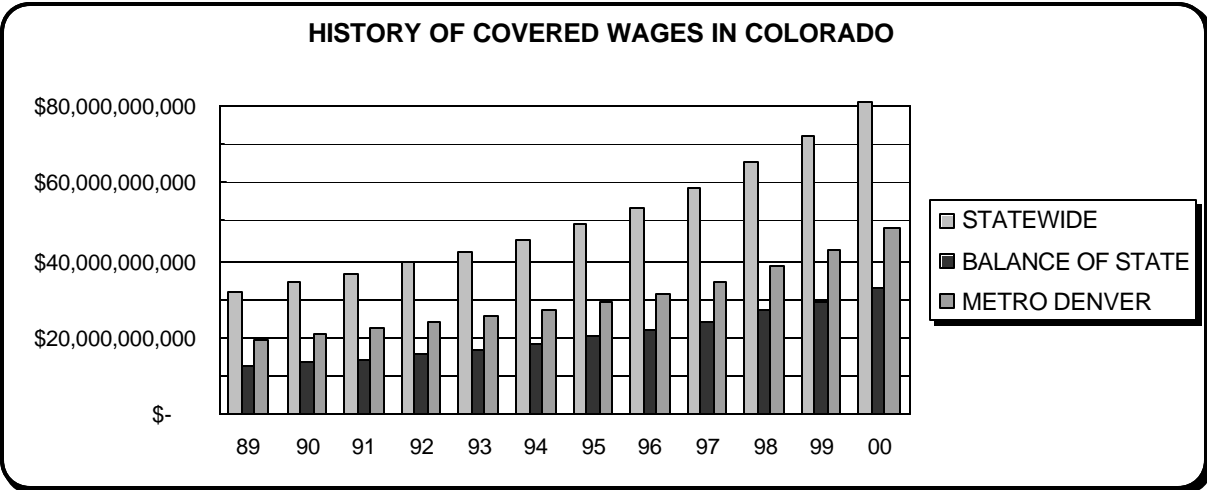
The largest one-year percentage increase was not in Douglas County this year. It was in Pitkin County at 34.3 percent. The second largest increase was in Douglas County at 25.9 percent.

The largest five-year percentage increase again was in Douglas County at 198.4. Elbert County was a distant second at 123.5 percent. The third largest increase was in Boulder County at 97.3 percent.

Only twelve of Colorado's 63 counties saw their total covered wages increase faster than the state average of 12.9 percent.



**Employment** Covered employment in Colorado increased by 3.87 percent or 81,479 jobs. This was the largest number of additional jobs since 1994 when Colorado added 84,377 jobs. The Denver MSA expanded by 3.79 percent or 42,544 jobs. Employment in the Balance of State increased by 3.96 percent to 1,021,391. Every division expanded except Mining. As usual, Services added the most jobs at 31,597. On a percentage basis, tiny Hinsdale County edged out Douglas County for the distinction of being the fastest growing county in Colorado. Many of the lesser-developed counties along the Front Range experienced very rapid rates of employment growth. In sharp contrast, many counties that are removed from the interstate highway system continue to be in a recessionary environment. Forty-nine of Colorado's counties recorded an increase in employment. The fourteen counties that lost employment lost a total of 787 jobs.



**Wages** Colorado experienced its largest ever increase in covered wages in 2000. Total wages increased by \$9.3 billion or 12.9 percent to \$81.27 billion. The increase was not distributed equally between the counties. The wealthy counties got richer while the poor stagnated. Total wages in the Denver MSA increased by \$5.45 billion to total \$48.26 billion. Wages in the Balance of State increased by \$3.85 billion to \$33.0 billion. Only four sparsely populated counties experienced a decline in total covered wages. Mining was the only division to record a drop in total wages. The largest increase was in Services with a \$3.66 billion increase to \$81.27 billion. The Denver-Boulder-Greeley CPI-U has exceeded the national CPI-U for nine consecutive years. In 2000, the Denver-Boulder-Greeley CPI-U increased by 3.96 percent versus 3.36 for the comparable national index. This was the first year since 1984 that the Denver-Boulder-Greeley CPI-U exceeded the national index. (173.2 versus 172.2)

## Agriculture, Forestry and Fishing

Covered employment in Agriculture, Forestry and Fishing grew at the slowest percentage pace since 1991. The division added 1,594 jobs, which was a 5.1 percent increase. In contrast, the average annual wage increased at the fastest percentage rate in at least fifteen years. The average wage increased from \$21,360 to \$22,646, a 6.0 percent increase. The division has increased its percent of total employment in Colorado every year since at least 1986.

Agricultural Services employment has continued to grow along with the population of Colorado and its continued urbanization. Agricultural Services added 1,403 jobs in 2000 after adding 1,950 in 1999. There were 20,231 jobs with an annual average wage of \$22,985 in 2000. Landscape and Horticultural Services employment increased 1,095 jobs to 12,632. Veterinary Services employment has increased by an increasing number of jobs five years in a row. In 2000, Veterinary Services added 474 jobs to average 4,773. Animal Specialty Services' employment increased by 8.8 percent to 960 jobs. Crop Preparation Services for Market employment declined by 94 jobs to 863. Farm Labor Contractors employment declined by 23.3 percent to average 463 jobs. Fifty-eight percent of Agricultural Services employment is in the Denver-Boulder MSA.

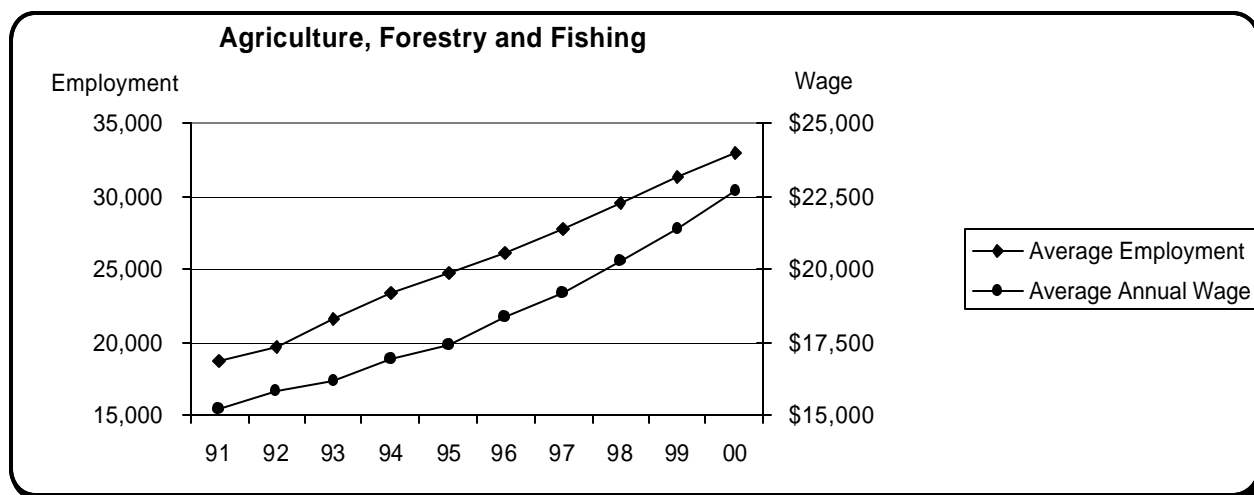
Agriculture Production Crops reversed a decline of 129 jobs in 1999 with a 131-job gain in 2000. There were 7,110 jobs in Agriculture Production Crops with an average annual wage of \$21,033 in 2000. Ornamental Nursery Products' employment increased by 84 jobs to 2,674. Vegetables and Melons' employment decreased by 79 jobs to 1,415.

Agricultural Production – Livestock and Animal Specialties' employment increased by 1.2 percent to 5,496. The increase was attributed to a 60-job increase in Dairy Farms and a 56-job increase in Beef Cattle, Except Feedlots. The gains were offset by a 46-job loss in Hogs. Only 3.1 percent of this sector is in the Denver MSA. The average wage was \$22,532 in 2000.

Forestry employment declined by five jobs to 96 in 2000. There was a 29-job loss in Timber Tracts and a 26-job gain in Forestry Services. The average wage increased by 8.0 percent to \$22,438.

Fishing Hunting and Trapping added a job to average eighteen. Hunting, Trapping, Game Propagation employment increased for the second year with a gain of two jobs to average fourteen.

## Mining

The decline in Mining employment slowed in 2000. The division lost 127 jobs to average 12,880. The average wage declined by 4.1 percent to \$64,716. The average wage decline was caused by unusually large bonuses being paid in 1999 and not a trend toward lower wages. The strength within this weak sector was related to higher fuel prices and the construction boom.

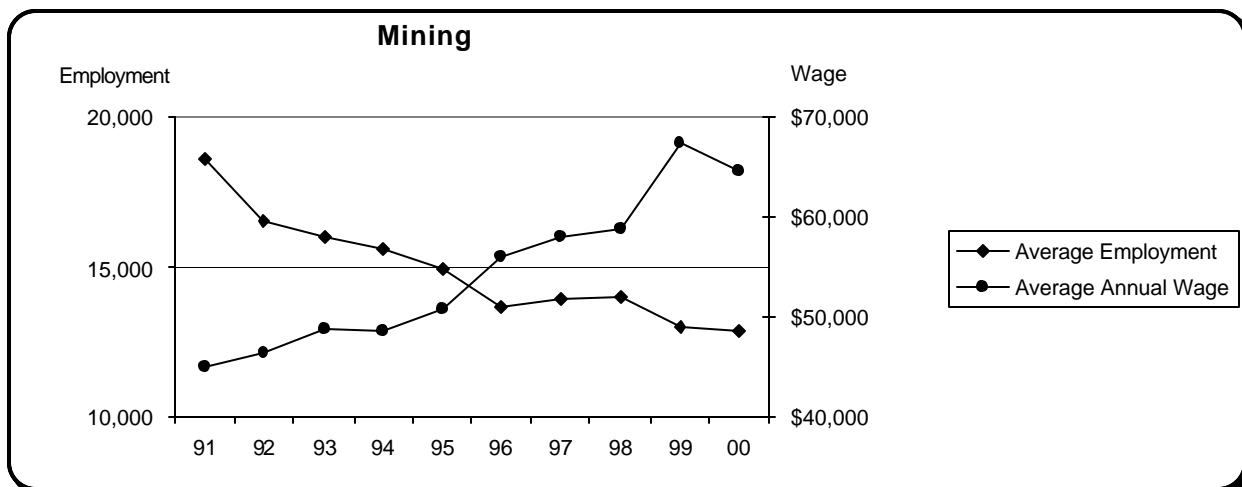
Oil and Gas Extraction had a very strong year with a gain of 347 jobs to average 7,285. In 1999, Oil and Gas Extraction employment declined by 913 jobs. The average wage bucked the overall Mining trend and increased from \$63,997 to \$69,180. Oil and Gas Field Services', NEC employment increased by 393 jobs to average 2,005. This was the highest average employment in Oil and Gas Field Services, NEC since 1994. Drilling Oil and Gas Wells' employment reversed a two-year decline with an increase of 173 jobs to average 520 jobs in 2000. Oil and Gas Exploration Services added 156 jobs to average 542. The long running decline in employment in Crude Petroleum and Natural Gas continued in 2000 with a decrease of 64 jobs to 4,162. Natural Gas Liquids' employment remained steady with an increase from 55 jobs to 57.

Mining and Quarrying of Non-Metallic Minerals, Except Fuels' employment continued to increase in 2000. The sector added 118 jobs

to average 2,018. Construction Sand and Gravel employment increased by 19 jobs to 1,095 in 2000. In 1992, there were only 527 jobs in Construction Sand and Gravel. Dimension Stone employment continued to steadily increase with an additional 27 jobs to average 201. There were 73 jobs in Dimension Stone in 1992. Crushed and Broken Stone, Including Riprap employment increased by 17 jobs to 372.

Coal Mining employment declined for the third consecutive year with a drop of 132 jobs to average 2,016. The average wage classified in Coal Mining declined from \$61,035 to \$58,759. Bituminous Coal Underground Mining employment declined by 47 jobs to 1,265. The second largest sector within Coal Mining is Bituminous Coal and Lignite Surface Mining, which saw employment drop by 62 jobs to 665. Coal Mining Services' employment decreased from 109 employees to 86.

Metal Mining employment experienced its largest drop since 1992 when 539 jobs were lost. Metal Mining employment declined by 462 jobs to 1,558. The average wage declined from \$112,965 to \$83,681. Thirty-six percent of jobs classified in Metal Mining are in the five-county Denver MSA. Gold Ore employment declined from 753 to 668. Ferroalloy Ores, Except Vanadium declined by 192 jobs to 442.

## Construction

Construction was the fastest growing division on a percentage basis with an increase of 10.8 percent to average 162,604 jobs in 2000. The one-year increase of 15,794 jobs was the largest ever recorded. The last time Colorado had a larger percentage of jobs in the Construction division was in 1974 at 8.1 percent.

Total wages increased by the largest percentage of any division at 18.4 percent. The average annual wage increased from \$34,567 to \$36,995.

Special Trades employment registered the largest increase within Construction at 12,376 jobs. The Electrical Work sector added more jobs than any other sector within Special Trades with an increase of 3,393 to average 20,597. Plumbing, Heating, Air-Conditioning is the largest segment within Special Trades at 22,709. This was an increase of 12 percent. Concrete Work employment increased from 12,418 to 13,769 while Plastering, Drywall, and Insulation employment increased from 8,760 to 10,105. The only sector within Special Trades to decline was Water Well Drilling with a decline of 13 jobs to average 489. Excavation Work employment was up by 15 percent to 6,759 and Masonry and other Stonework was up by 19.7 percent to 4,836. The average annual wage increased by 7.2 percent to \$34,399.

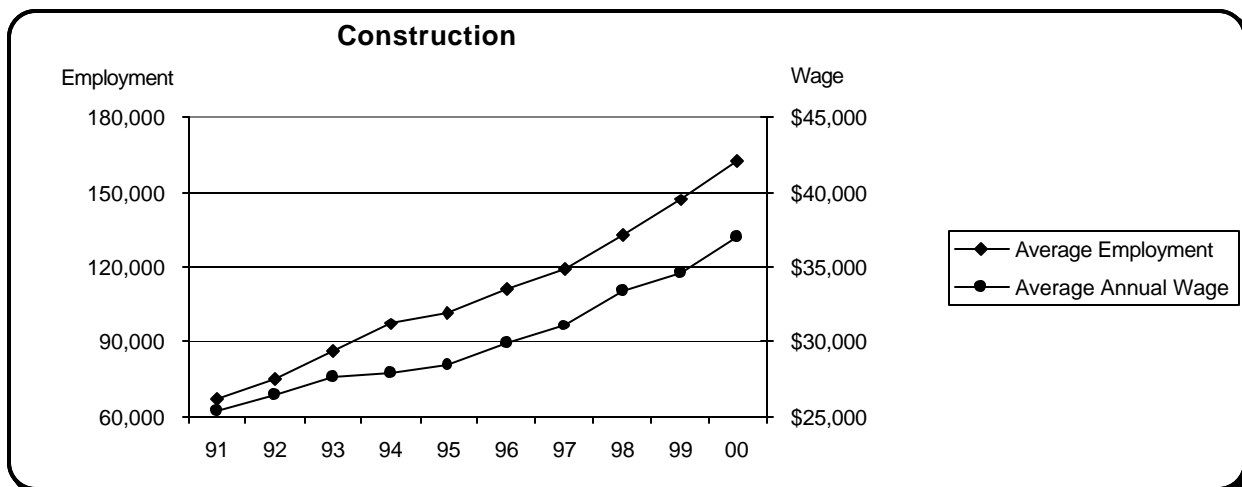
Employment in Building Construction increased at the slowest percentage rate in four

years at 7.1 percent. The three previous years' employment increases were over nine percent. General Building Contractors of Residential Buildings experienced an increase of 9.5 percent to average 17,207 jobs. Employment with General Building Contractors of Non-Residential Buildings increased at a much slower rate, adding only 404 jobs to average 12,366 in 2000. The average wage within Building Construction increased from \$39,612 to \$43,345, or 9.4 percent.

Employment growth slowed in Heavy Construction from 10.0 percent to 8.0 percent. The average wage was up by only 3.5 percent to \$41,332. The largest and fastest growing sector within Heavy Construction was Water, Sewer, and Utility Lines, which increased by 1,057 jobs to 8,120. Heavy Construction, NEC increased by 363 jobs to 4,334 and Highway and Street Construction increased by 144 jobs to 5,975. The only sector within Heavy Construction to record a decline was Bridge, Tunnel, and Elevated Highway construction with a loss of 160 jobs to 548.

An additional 3,140 Heavy Construction jobs were classified under Government entities.

## Manufacturing

Manufacturing employment etched out a meager gain of 0.7 percent in 2000. The average wage did much better with an 8.8 percent gain to \$47,446.

The largest two-digit sector within Manufacturing is Industrial and Commercial Machinery and Computer Equipment with 31,124 jobs. This represented a 766-job decline compared to a 2,113 loss in 1999. The average wage increased by 14.5 percent to \$65,064.

Employment growth in Printing, Publishing, and Allied Industries nearly ceased in 2000. The sector only added 94 jobs to average 28,909. The average wage increased by 10.1 percent to \$38,967.

The third largest Manufacturing sector is Electronic and other Electrical Equipment and Components, Except Computer Equipment. Growth resumed in this sector after a one-year hiatus with 1,684 additional jobs to average 21,890. The average salary increased from \$51,598 to \$59,368.

Measuring, Analyzing, and Controlling Instruments employment held steady with a gain of 0.5 percent to 21,315. The average wage increased at the same rate as the state as a whole at 8.7 percent. Instruments to Measure Electricity's employment increased by 548 jobs to 4,573, while Electromedical Equipment employment increased by 364 to 1,549.

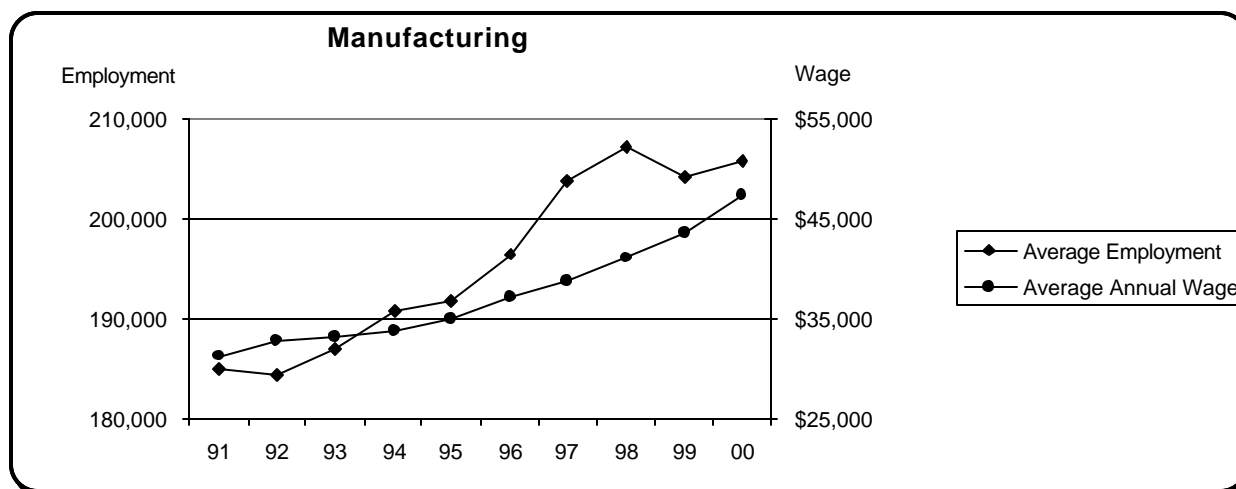
Growth resumed in Fabricated Metal Products with a gain of 696 jobs to 14,696. The gain was widespread with 25 of 35 four-digit codes reporting greater employment.

Food and Kindred Products employment reversed a downward trend with a 1.0 percent gain to 24,273. Within Food and Kindred Products, the results were mixed with 22 of 42 four-digit codes showing an increase. The largest increase was in Food Preparations, NEC with an increase of 265 jobs to 1,856 and the biggest loss was in Meat Packing Plants with a loss of 199 jobs to 5,620.

Stone, Clay, Glass, and Concrete Products' employment continued its steady construction related ascent with a gain of 504 jobs to 11,247. Leading the sector was Ready-Mixed Concrete with an addition of 171 jobs to average 2,929 and Concrete Block and Brick, up 101 to 772.

Employment in Apparel Manufacturing declined for the fourth straight year with a loss of 403 jobs to 3,568. Wages in this sector were considerably below average at \$24,140 per annum.

Lumber and Wood Products, Except Furniture continued to see increased employment levels. The sector went from 6,352 jobs to 6,436 due to an increase of 199 jobs in Millwork. This gain was offset by an 80-job loss in Mobile homes and a 62-job loss in Structural Wood Members, NEC.

## Transportation, Communication and Public Utilities

Employment in TCPU increased for the fifteenth consecutive year. The increase was 4,352 jobs. The average wage increased at the slowest rate since 1997, up a mere 7.4 percent to \$54,698. Seventy percent of TCPU employment is within the Denver MSA.

Overall growth in the Communications industry slowed in 2000. Employment increased by 3.4 percent to 59,775. Telephone Communications, Except Radio, which is the largest sector within Communications, reversed a long-standing growth trend with a loss of 943 jobs to average 34,404. The average wage in Communications increased by 12.0 percent to \$79,493. Cable and Other Pay TV Services increased by 5.6 percent from the previous year and 318 percent since 1992. Cable and Other Pay TV Services employment averaged 11,384 with an average wage of \$65,186. Telegraph & other Communications is the fastest growing sector within Communications going from 2,425 to 4,089. Radiotelephone Communications is the second fastest sector with a 24.7 percent increase to 5,268.

Air Transportation recorded another strong year with an increase of 1,980 jobs to 27,133. Air Transportation, Scheduled accounted for most of the gain with an increase of 1,391 to 15,410. Air Courier Services experienced a typical year with an additional 349 jobs to average 8,013. Airports, Flying Fields, &

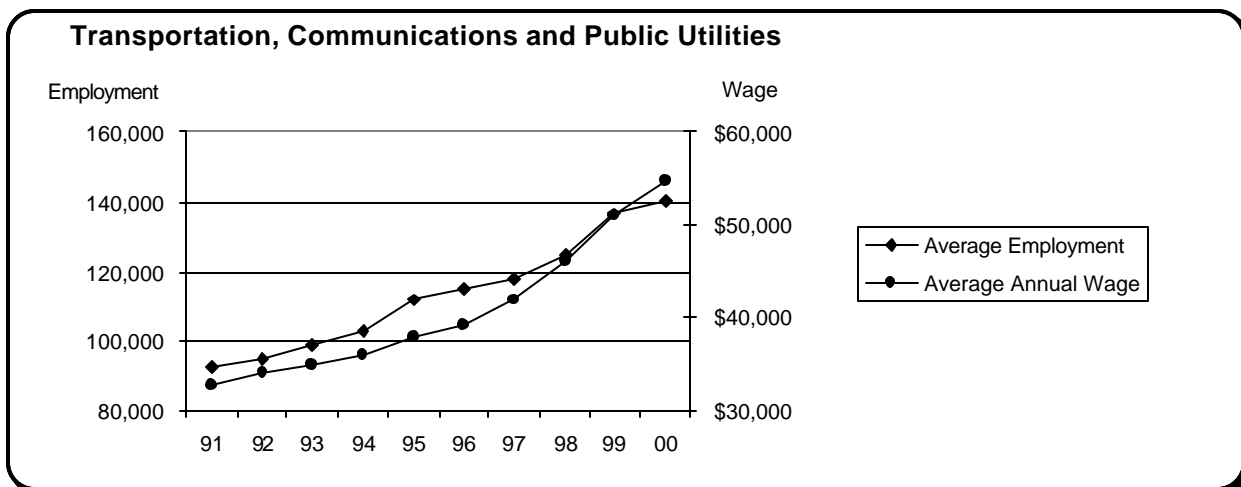
Services' employment increased from 2,912 to 3,050.

Motor Freight Transportation and Warehousing added 861 jobs to average 24,993. The average wage stagnated with an increase of 2.4 percent to \$30,902. Local Trucking, Without Storage increased by 405 jobs to 7,814. Local trucking with storage increased by 264 jobs to 2,443. Trucking, Except Local reversed a downward trend by adding 3 jobs to average 9,632 in 2000.

Electric, Gas, and Sanitary Services experienced a widespread decline of 807 jobs to average 14,430. The average wage increased by 5.2 percent to \$58,992. Employment in Electric and other Services Combined declined by 150 jobs to 3,661. Electric and other Services Combined has declined every year since 1993 when it had 6,113 employees. The largest decline occurred in Gas Transmission and Distribution at 309 to average 1,264.

Local and Suburban Transit and Interurban Passenger Transportation reversed a slight downward trend to record a 1.0 percent increase to average 5,521 jobs. Local and Suburban Transit was down by 135 jobs to 1,186. Local Passenger Transportation, NEC increased by 209 jobs to 2,668.

Transportation Services' employment increased by 370 to 8,601 with an average wage of \$32,284.

## Wholesale Trade

For the first time in three years, employment in the Wholesale Trade division increased at a faster rate than the state as a whole. Employment increased by 4.2 percent or 4,457 jobs. The annual average wage within Wholesale Trade increased by a greater percent than in any other division. The wage increased by 12.67 percent to \$51,980. The massive wage increase was driven by increases in technology oriented durable goods.

Employment within Durable Goods increased by 3,898 to 69,731. Electronic Parts and Equipment employment increased by 1,442 jobs to 6,853. The average wage in Electronic Parts and Equipment increased from \$67,789 to \$81,882. The second fastest growing sector was Computers, Peripherals & Software with an increase of 846 to 9,682 with an average annual wage of \$112,110.

Employment in Lumber and other Construction Materials continued to expand in 2000. Employment increased by 4.8 percent to 6,668 and the average wage increased by 5.4 percent to \$41,620.

Employment in Motor Vehicles and Motor Vehicle Parts and Supplies reversed a downward trend with an increase of 12 jobs to 6,497. The average wage was \$37,423.

In contrast to Durable Goods, Non-Durable Wholesale Trade employment stagnated with an

increase of only 559 jobs to 40,672. The average wage made a respectable increase of 7.2 percent to \$42,266.

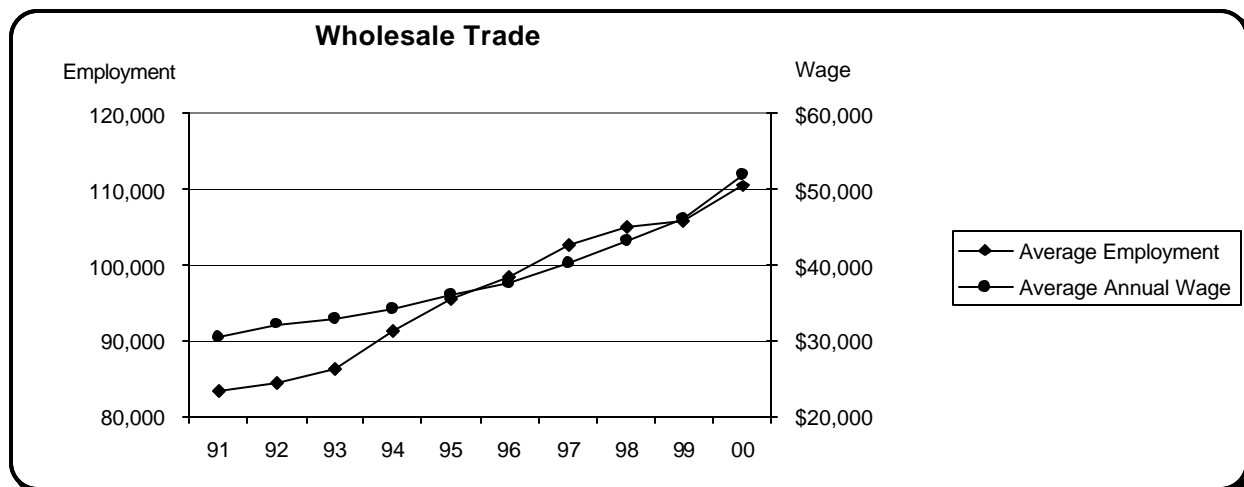
The largest sector within Non-Durable Wholesale Trade is Drugs, Proprietarys, and Sundries. This sector also added the most jobs at 348. The 4,667 jobs paid an average of \$57,089.

The three-digit sector of Groceries and Related Products experienced a small increase of 91 jobs to average 13,134. Within Groceries and related products, Groceries, General Line declined by 248 to 4,149, Fresh Fruits and Vegetables increased by 91 to 1,643.

Petroleum Bulk Stations & Terminals employment declined for the third straight year. The decline was 73 jobs, bringing the average to 704 in 2000. Petroleum Products, NEC also declined for three straight years to an average of 973 in 2000.

The three-digit sector of Farm-Product Raw Materials' employment declined for the fourth consecutive year. There were 1,793 jobs in 2000 compared to 1,794 in 1999.

The largest percentage increase of any sector within wholesale trade was in Footwear. Footwear employment increased by 48 percent to 154 jobs. The average wage increased from \$50,590 to \$60,116.

## Retail Trade

Growth in Retail trade employment was similar to recent years with the addition of 13,357 jobs. The average wage increased by 5.1 percent to \$19,073. The percentage of all jobs that are classified in Retail Trade has decreased for five straight years.

The number of restaurants increased by 182 to average 8,688. Their employment increased by 3.6 percent to 163,192. The average covered wage increased by 5.3 percent to \$12,481.

The second largest and second fastest growing sector within Retail Trade is Miscellaneous Retail, with 2,690 additional jobs and an average of 55,514 jobs in 2000. More jobs were added at Sporting Goods and Bicycle Shops than any other miscellaneous sector. In 2000, there were 21 more establishments with 652 more employees. The average employment was 7,860. On a percentage basis, Tobacco Stores and Stands were the fastest growing miscellaneous sector, up 42 percent to 500 jobs.

Food Stores' employment reversed a long-standing growth trend with a loss of 203 jobs to 51,220. Grocery Stores' employment declined by 219 jobs to 45,318. The fastest growing sector within Food Stores is Meat and Fish Markets, which expanded by 9.4 percent to 784.

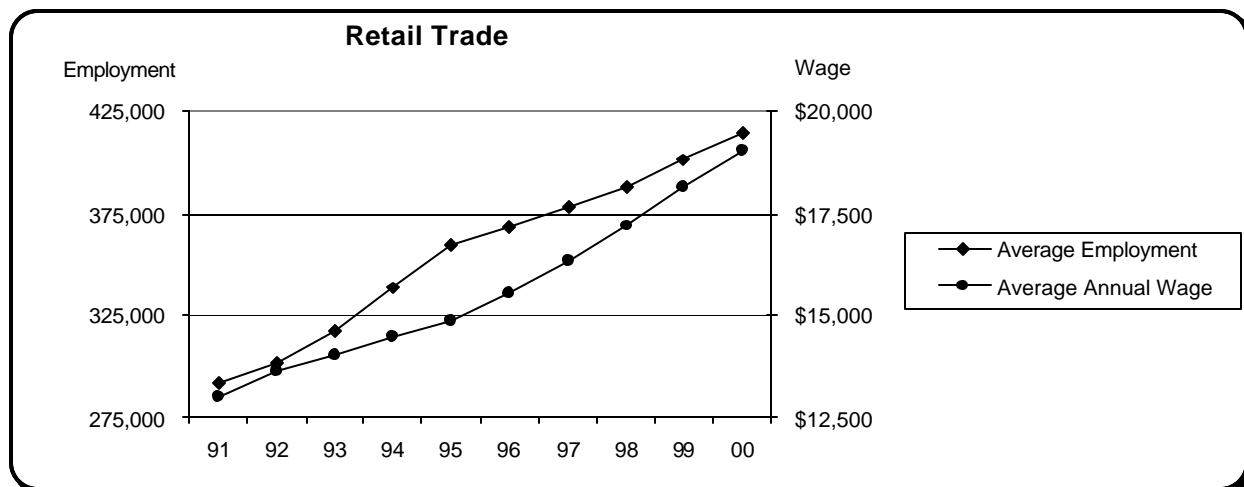
Automotive Dealers and Gasoline Service Stations employment continued to grow with an additional 1,262 jobs to average 42,446 in 2000.

New and Used Car Dealers added 7,830 jobs to average 18,189. Auto and Home Supply Stores added 201 jobs to average 7,885. Gasoline Service Stations' employment declined by 111 jobs to 11,595 with 45 fewer establishments.

General Merchandise Stores added 2,000 jobs and 19 establishments to average 45,018 and 455 respectively. The number of Department Stores increased by 5 to 232 with 42,451 jobs.

Home Furniture, Furnishings, and Equipment Stores' employment increased from 20,121 to 21,256. Radio, TV, & Electronic Stores increased from 315 to 358 with employment increasing by 10.9 percent to 4,509. Furniture Stores employment increased by 2.5 percent to 1,973 after declining the previous year. Miscellaneous home furnishings stores increased by 37 establishments to 325 with an employment increase of 9.2 percent to 3,678.

Building Materials, Hardware, Garden Supply, and Mobile Home Dealers employment increased by 826 jobs to 20,179. The majority of the increase was in Lumber and Other Building Materials, which added 491 jobs to average 13,545. Hardware Stores increased from 201 to 204 establishments and their employment increased by 5.2 percent to 3,250. Retail nurseries and garden stores employment increased by 12.3 percent to 1,331.

## Finance, Insurance and Real Estate

Although FIRE employment increased by the smallest amount since 1995 at 0.9 percent, the average wage increased by a phenomenal 12.6 percent. Since 1997, the average FIRE wage has increased by 37.6 percent.

The largest sector within FIRE is Real Estate with 33,573 jobs, an increase of 1,142 over the year. The diverse sector of Real Estate Agents and Managers added 835 jobs to average 19,790. Nonresidential Building Operators' employment increased by 5.8 percent and its' wages by 7.7 percent to 2,549 and \$35,430, respectively. Apartment Building Operators' employment levels remained steady with an increase from 7,132 to 7,153. Subdividers and Developers, NEC employment increased from 1,434 to 1,508 jobs.

Four years of steady increases in employment with Insurance Carriers ended in 2000 with a 955-job loss to 27,618. The average wage increased by 5.1 percent to \$46,997. The only significant gain within Insurance carriers occurred in Pension, Health, and Welfare Funds with a gain of 228 jobs to 2,359. The largest decline was in Title Insurance with a loss of 14 percent to 3,098.

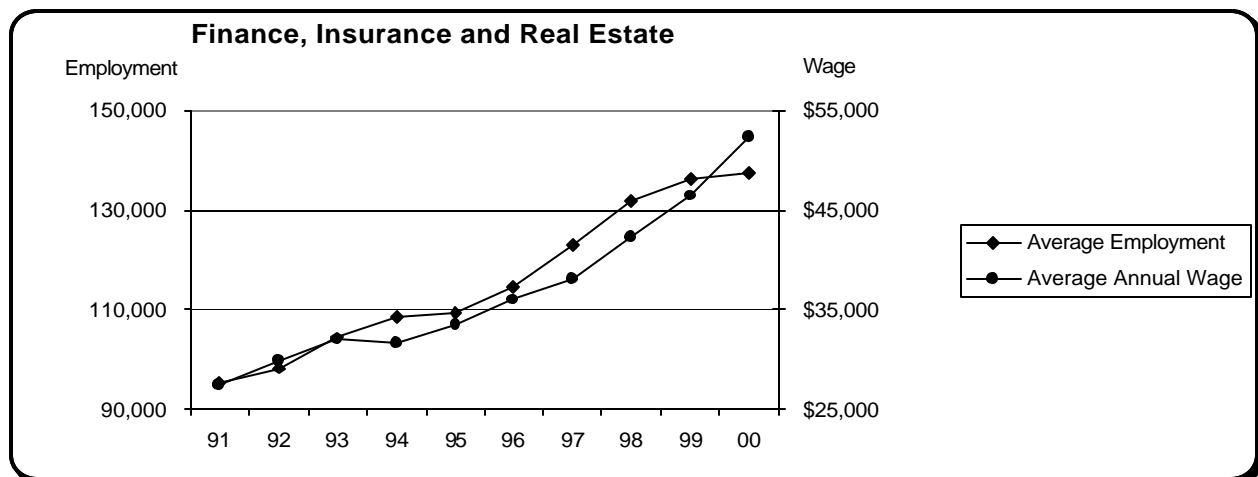
Insurance Agents, Brokers, & Service recorded a second consecutive annual employment decline from 11,219 to 11,042.

Non-Depository Credit Institutions employment reversed a growth trend in

response to rising interest rates with a 1,773 job loss to average 14,183. The net loss can be entirely accounted for within Mortgage Bankers and Brokers, which saw a loss of 2,032 jobs to average 7,619. Personal Credit Institutions reversed a two-year slide by gaining 195 jobs to average 2,698.

Depository Institutions' employment continued to rise slowly with a 2.4 percent increase to 29,694. The increase is attributed to a 619-job increase at Commercial Banks. There were 20,417 jobs with an annual average wage of \$34,570 at Commercial Banks. The decline in employment at Savings Institutions continued with a 56-job loss to 1,432. Job growth at Credit Unions slowed slightly from 3.9 to 3.6 percent. Credit Union employment averaged 3,961 with an average wage of \$28,777.

Security and Commodity Brokers, Dealers, Exchanges, and Services continued to grow at a rapid pace. Security Brokers and Dealers added 1,288 jobs to average 9,826 with an annual salary of \$85,596. Employment in Services Allied with the Exchange of Securities or Commodities expanded by 26.9 percent to 4,642. This industry has increased by 290 percent since 1992. Security Brokers and Dealers' employment increased at faster rate than previous years with a 15.1 percent increase to 9,826.

## Services

Services added 31,597 jobs in 2000. This was the highest number since 1994, when 31,814 jobs were added. The average wage increased by 12.1 percent to \$37,281.

The strongest sector within Services continues to be Business Services, which added 17,878 jobs to average 208,455. The average Business Services wage increased by 18.4 percent to \$43,961. The primary driving force behind the increases is Computer Programming, Data Processing, and other Computer Related Services, which has increased at an increasing rate for seven straight years. The sector added 13,633 jobs to average 76,218 with an average wage of \$76,503. Help Supply Services employment increased from 51,617 to 55,375 with an average wage of \$22,383.

The second largest Services Sector is Health Services at 131,789 jobs. This was a 1.8 percent increase. The majority of this increase was in Offices & Clinics of Medical Doctors with 1,215 additional jobs. Offices & Clinics of Medical Doctors employed 29,817 with an average wage of \$57,893. General Medical & Surgical Hospitals is the largest sector within Health Services with 38,471 jobs. General Medical & Surgical Hospitals added only 45 jobs in 2000. The average wage increased 9.1 percent to \$33,182.

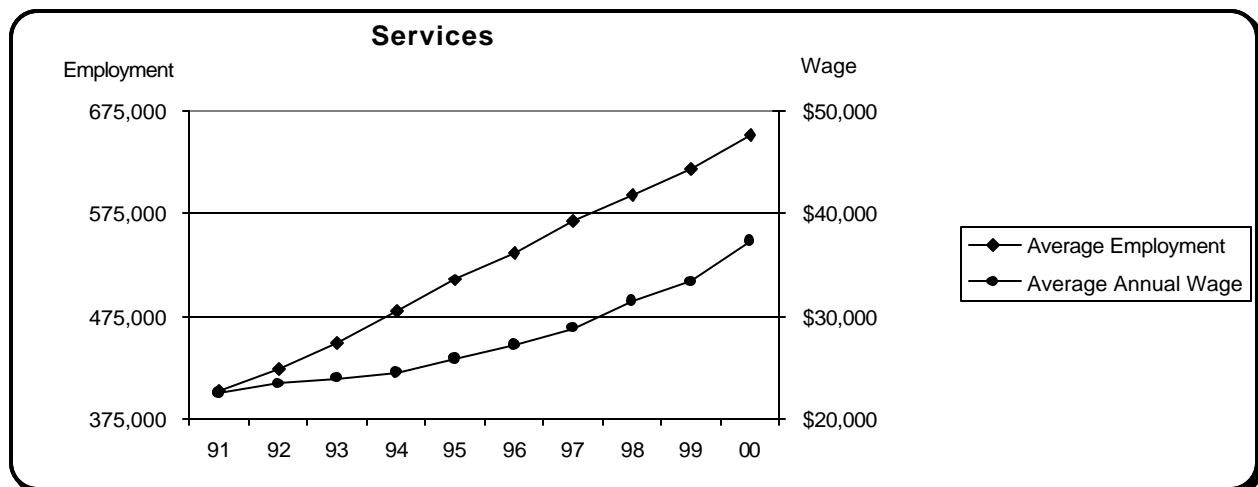
Employment growth in Hotels, Rooming Houses, Camps, and other Lodging places

slowed again in 2000. The sector added 441 jobs to average 41,738 with an average wage of \$18,571. There were 1,350 establishments classified as Hotels and Motels in 2000 versus 1,348 in 1999. Hotels and Motels employed 39,682 with an average wage of \$18,734 in 2000.

Engineering, Accounting, Research, Management, and Related Services recorded a 6.0 percent increase in average employment to 71,436. Engineering Services employment increased by 1,793 to 24,632 with an average wage of \$60,561. Accounting, Auditing, & Bookkeeping employment stabilized with only a 0.1 percent boost to 10,831 after a 12.1 percent advance in 1999. Management Consulting Services employment increased by 22.4 percent in 2000 and 12.4 percent in 1999 to average 6,260 with an average wage of \$65,039.

Employment and Recreational Services increased by 4.4 percent in 2000 with an average wage of \$25,274. The largest sector within Recreational Services is Amusement and Recreation, NEC with 15,296 employees in 2000 compared to 14,759 in 1999. Coin-Operated Amusement Devices' employment increased by 8.6 percent to 7,265. Physical Fitness Facilities' employment increased from 4,748 to 5,008 jobs.

Social Services' employment increased by 2,075 jobs to 39,845 with an annual average wage of \$18,979.

## Government

Government employment recorded its greatest increase since 1992 with an additional 7,641 jobs. On an annual average basis, the United States Census contributed 1,350 of these jobs. The average government wage increased by 4.3 percent to \$34,910. The average private industry wage increased by 9.4 percent to \$37,554. The primary force behind the increase in Government employment is an increasing populations' demand for all levels of Educational Services.

### State Government

State Government employment increased by 1,431 jobs to average 64,868. The average wage increased by 5.0 percent to \$38,257.

On a percentage basis, the fastest growing sector of State Government is Justice, Public Order, and Safety. This sector expanded 6.7 percent to 11,053 jobs. Correctional Institutions employment added 551 jobs to average 6,218. Courts' employment increased by 71 jobs to average 2,709. Police employment increased from 1,164 to 1,203.

The largest sector of State Government is Educational Services, which also added the largest number of jobs. Educational Services added 769 jobs to average 33,201. Colleges and Universities' employment increased by 449 jobs to 25,603. Junior Colleges employment increased at a faster percentage rate. Their

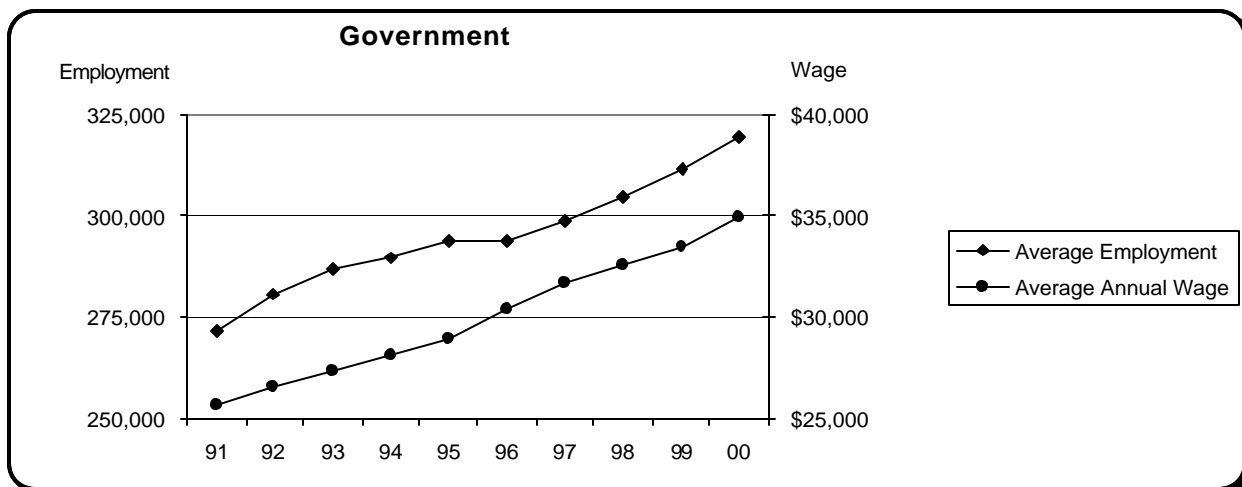
growth rate was 4.7 percent with an average of 7,366 jobs in 2000. The average Colleges and Universities wage increased from \$38,492 to \$40,844 while the average Junior Colleges' wage increased from \$18,957 to \$19,508.

State employment in Health Services declined for the first time since 1997 with a drop of 0.9 percent to 5,911. General Medical & Surgical Hospitals' employment remained steady with a decline of only ten jobs to 4,047. Psychiatric Hospitals' employment declined by 3.0 percent to 1,447. Skilled Nursing Care Facilities employment also remained stable at 416 jobs compared to 417 in 1999. Psychiatric Hospitals recorded the largest job loss in State Government with a 45-job loss to average 1,447.

Highway and Street Construction reversed a four-year decline with a gain of 29 jobs to average 3,098. The average wage increased by 4.9 percent to \$42,953.

Employment in Administration of Human Resource Programs only grew slightly with an additional 31 jobs to average 4,874. Administration of Educational Programs increased by 27 jobs to 1,280. Administration of Social & Manpower Programs added 7 jobs to average 2,492.

Land, Mineral, and Wildlife Conservation employment expanded by 35 jobs to average 1,842.

## Local Government

Local Government employment continued to steadily increase with an additional 5,584 jobs to average 199,562. Local Government wages continued to lag all other sectors with an increase of only 3.2 percent to average \$30,462.

Educational Services' employment continued its steady ascent with an increase of 2,643 jobs to 104,649. Elementary and Secondary Schools employment increased by 2,645 to average 101,271 with an average annual salary of \$28,197. Junior Colleges' employment decreased by 79 jobs to 1,663. Libraries' employment increased by 52 jobs to 1,320.

Executive, Legislative and, and General Government, except Finance added 1,876 jobs to average 66,341. The average salary increased by 3.2 percent to \$33,335. Executive Offices' employment added 1,667 jobs to average 53,554. General Government, NEC added 175 jobs to average 12,521 in 2000. This is the sector that city and county governments are coded in when they do not submit separate unemployment insurance tax reports for their various functional departments.

Employment growth within Health Services slowed considerably in 2000 from over eight percent in each of the past three years to 4.0 percent. There were 9,213 jobs with an average salary of \$32,877.

Local and Suburban Transit employment increased by 7.1 percent to 2,544 jobs. The average wage increased by 5.9 percent to \$37,908. Almost all of these jobs were with the Regional Transportation District.

Electric, Gas, and Sanitary Services employment increased by 231 jobs to 5,375. Water Supply employment increased by 368 jobs to 2,220.

Park and recreational districts are primarily coded under Amusement and Recreation. Amusement and Recreation employment increased by 1.3 percent to 2,912.

Social Services employment declined for the first time since 1996. Social Services' employment declined by 8 to 1,066. The average wage increased from \$28,404 to \$29,774.

## Federal Government

Federal employment recorded its largest increase in employment since 1993. The increase was entirely due to the 2000 census, which added 1,350 jobs on an annual average basis. Federal employment increased by 540 jobs to 54,705. The average Federal wage increased by 6.9 percent to \$47,170.

The U.S. Postal Service reversed a long running growth trend with a 69-job loss to average 15,289. The average Postal wage increased by 4.7 percent to \$42,291.

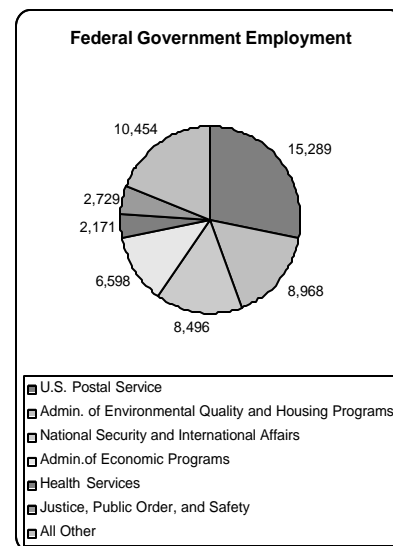
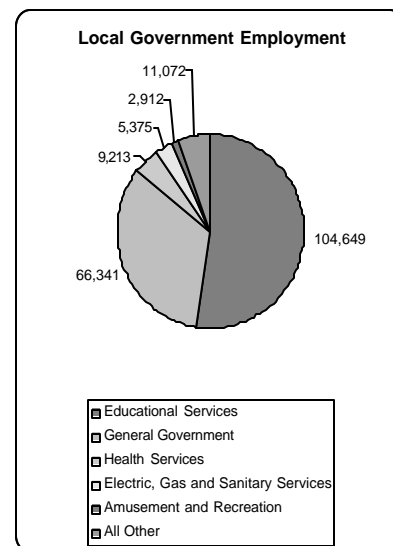
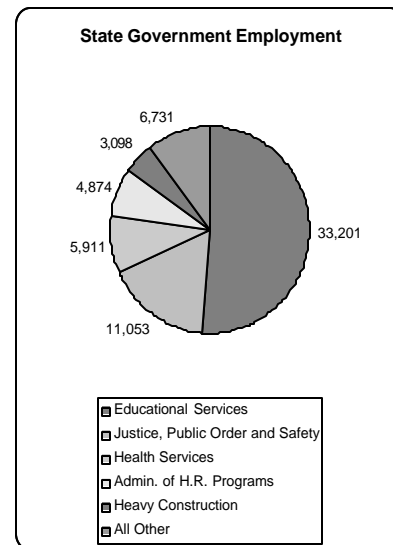
Land, Mineral, Wildlife and Forest Conservation, which includes parts of the Interior and Agriculture Departments, recorded a 182-job loss to average 8,968.

General Medical & Surgical Hospitals' employment dropped by the smallest amount since 1995. The sector lost 144 jobs to average 2,171.

National Security employment decreased by 66 jobs to average 8,351. About half of these jobs are in El Paso County. Only civilian military personnel are included in the ES202.

The Federal Government operates eleven Retail Trade establishments in Colorado with an average of 1,623 employees. This was a decrease of 69 employees from the previous year. Nine of the eleven establishments and 1,439 of the employees are in El Paso County.

Employment in Administration of Human Resource Programs declined by 119 jobs to 1,510. Employment in Administration of Educational programs declined by 140 jobs to average 146 in 2000.

## COLORADO EMPLOYMENT AND WAGES BY STANDARD INDUSTRIAL CLASSIFICATION FOR 2000

### **Definitions**

**AVERAGE EMPLOYMENT.** Average Employment is the mean value of the reported employment figures for the 12 reporting months of the year.

**AVERAGE WAGE.** The Average Wage is the Total Wages paid divided by the Average Employment.

**BALANCE OF STATE.** Balance of State is all counties in Colorado outside the five county, Metro Denver Area.

**COVERED EMPLOYER.** A covered employer is an employer who is required to pay unemployment insurance because they meet any of the following criteria:

1. Employs one worker at any time.
2. Acquires all or a substantial portion of a covered employer.
3. Is subject to Federal Unemployment Tax Act.
4. Is a non-profit organization and has four or more employees for 20 weeks during the calendar year.
5. Is a State agency, State operated hospital, or school of higher education, or a political subdivision of the State.
6. Is an employer of agricultural labor and pays \$20,000 or more in any one quarter of a calendar year, or employs 10 workers for 20 weeks during the year.
7. Pays cash wages of \$1,000 or more in any calendar year for domestic help in a private home.

The following are specific exclusions from the coverage:

1. Agricultural employment not defined above.
2. Sole proprietors.
3. Railroad workers.
4. Children under 21 in the employ of a parent.
5. Elected officials.
6. Students or inmate workers.
7. Commissioned real estate, insurance and direct seller salespeople.
8. Church employees.
9. Work relief program participants.

**DISCLOSURE RESTRICTIONS.** Publication of employment and wage data is withheld for any 2-digit subsection which consists of fewer than three reporting units or in which a single establishment accounts for 80 percent or more of an industry's employment. In the event that only one 2-digit subsection is restricted, the next smallest 2-digit subsection (by number of establishments) will also be restricted to allow disclosure of total industry information.

**EMPLOYMENT.** The number of covered workers who earned wages during the pay period that includes the 12th of the month. Workers on the payroll of more than one firm during the period are counted each time they are reported.

**ENTERPRISE.** An enterprise is the employer and legal entity of the Unemployment Insurance tax account. An enterprise may consist of one or more units.

**ESTABLISHMENTS.** A unit is an establishment, generally at a single physical location, where business is conducted or where services or industrial operations are performed.

**ES202.** The ES202 is a statistical report summarizing employment, total wages, taxable wages and contribution information for employers subject to State unemployment insurance laws under the Colorado Employment Security Act. The report also includes employment and wage information for federal civilian workers covered by UCFE.

## COLORADO EMPLOYMENT AND WAGES BY STANDARD INDUSTRIAL CLASSIFICATION FOR 2000

FIPS. Federal Information Processing Standards. Standards for information processing issued by the National Bureau of Standards in the US Department of Commerce. Includes a numeric designation for geographic areas such as States, counties, and MA's.

GROSS WAGES. As reported on the Unemployment Insurance Tax Report, gross wages are the total amount of compensation paid by the employer during the quarter.

METRO DENVER. The Metropolitan Denver Area consists of the following counties: Adams, Arapahoe, Denver, Douglas and Jefferson.

SIC (STANDARD INDUSTRIAL CLASSIFICATION). Each business is assigned a 4 digit SIC code that describes the nature of the business in accordance with the Standard Industrial Classification Manual, 1987.

SIZE CLASS. Establishments and enterprises are categorized by the number of employees working in the month of March.

TOTAL WAGES. Total Wages are the sum of wages for the four quarters of the year.
