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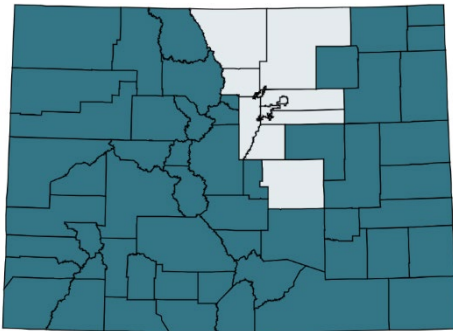
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# Introduction

Each year the Colorado Balance of State (BoS) Continuum of Care (CoC) conducts a Point-in-Time (PIT) study on homelessness in Colorado's non-metro and rural counties. This year the PIT count was held on the night of Tuesday, January 24<sup>th</sup>, 2023. The PIT count has two major goals:

- Conducting an unduplicated count of individuals and families meeting the HUD definition of homelessness
- Capturing information about demographic characteristics, disabling conditions, and sub-populations related to homelessness



**The CO BoS CoC covers 54 counties across Colorado.**

The Balance of State CoC covers Colorado's 54 non-metro and rural counties. This includes all counties outside of metro Denver, El Paso County, and Northern Colorado. During the unsheltered PIT count in 2019, Northern Colorado, which includes Larimer and Weld County, was a part of the Balance of State CoC. In 2020, they were designated by HUD as a separate CoC<sup>1</sup>. Twenty-seven counties participated in the 2023 PIT count.

PIT counts are required to be conducted at least biennially by the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) as a condition of applying for HUD homeless assistance funds. PIT counts are important because

they are the only count conducted nationally each year, they provide data to quantify the scope of homelessness, and they help national, state, and local policymakers track progress towards the goal of ending homelessness. Ultimately, PIT data are used to help determine federal funding that goes toward fighting homelessness. The Annual Homeless Assessment Report (AHAR)<sup>2</sup> is prepared by HUD for the U.S. Congress, providing estimates and information about people experiencing homelessness across the country by reporting on those who have experienced homelessness and on the availability of shelter and other support systems. The AHAR also includes a nationwide bed inventory that is informed by PIT data. PIT count data are also used to estimate how different populations of people experience homelessness, such as those with severe mental illness, veterans, unaccompanied youth, people living with HIV/AIDs, or those who are chronically homeless.

## Impact of COVID-19

Though the COVID-19 pandemic has lessened over the years, in 2023 the COVID-19 pandemic still has lasting impacts. Some shelters continued to have reduced capacity because of public health requirements, and some individuals experiencing homelessness likely did not seek shelter due to fears of proximity to others. Additionally, given the vast geographic distances between counties in the Balance of State Continuum of Care, these impacts may look different across counties. In addition to changes from

HUD and potential unforeseen impacts, COVID-19 has resulted in trainings taking place online and fewer volunteers for the count than in pre-COVID-19 years. Many coordinators and agency staff members were overburdened due to the pandemic and subsequent staffing shortages and the time and effort they dedicated to the 2023 count is appreciated.

## Methodology

During even numbered years, the CoC conducts a sheltered PIT count. During odd numbered years, the CoC conducts both a sheltered and unsheltered PIT count. In 2023, the CoC conducted a sheltered and unsheltered PIT count of individuals and families across the state. The PIT count was conducted in accordance with the HUD methodology guide<sup>3</sup> and the HUD data collection notice<sup>4</sup> for the 2023 count. The survey instrument was developed by the Colorado Coalition for the Homeless (CCH), in consultation with their research partner, OMNI Institute.

For the **sheltered count**, the CoC counted all individuals and families “living in a supervised publicly or privately operated shelter designated to provide temporary living arrangements (including congregate shelters, transitional housing, and hotels and motels paid for by charitable organizations or by federal, state, or local government programs for low-income individuals)” on the night designated for the count.

For the **unsheltered count**, the CoC counted all individuals and families “with a primary nighttime residence that is a public or private place not designed for or ordinarily used as a regular sleeping accommodation for human beings, including a car, park, abandoned buildings, bus or train station, airport, or camping ground” on the night designated for the count.

Regional PIT Coordinators throughout the state were responsible for planning and conducting the PIT count in their regions. CCH and the PIT Work Group provided training to all staff and volunteers, and Coordinators tailored additional trainings to meet their regions' specific needs. On January 24th service provider staff and volunteers administered the PIT survey to sheltered and unsheltered people experiencing homelessness in seventeen counties within the Balance of State region.

In addition to the paper survey, an online survey was developed for the sheltered and unsheltered survey. The online survey was hosted on Survey123 and followed the same format as the paper survey. All participating agencies were provided with a link to the online surveys. Agencies independently input their sheltered and unsheltered data into the survey form using this link. Some volunteers used only paper surveys that were collected and reviewed by CCH, then entered for data processing by OMNI data specialists.

OMNI then carried out a thorough review of the PIT survey data. The research team performed numerous checks to identify data entry errors, logic errors, and duplicate surveys. A total of 81 people were removed in the data cleaning process – 54 people were removed due to data quality issues (missing

name, unclear household type, unclear age, test data, etc.)<sup>5</sup> and 27 people were identified as duplicates and removed.

Homeless Management Information System (HMIS) data from agencies in Delta County and two agencies in Mesa County were used rather than the survey. The HMIS data did not include all the same data points as the survey, therefore throughout the report HMIS data is included unless otherwise noted.

## Observational Data

In some instances, volunteers completed a visual count of an unsheltered individual if they felt it was the best option not to disturb the individual or family. The observational survey included the following fields – county, city, day of observation, time of observation, exact location, number of people observed in household, description of person (e.g., physical appearance, clothing, unique identifiers, etc.), explanation for why the individual is thought to be homeless, and any known demographic information about the person. Observational surveys are not included in the data presented in this report because of the increased probability of duplication in the count and because not all PIT questions could be answered by observing an individual or family.

There were a total of 11 observed households with a total of 13 individuals in those households from Mesa county.

- Of those with reported ages, 6 were 25-55 and 3 people were over the age of 55
- Of those with reported gender, 1 was reported as female and 6 as male
- Of those with reported race, 5 were reported as White and 3 as Multiple Races
- Of those with reported ethnicity, 6 people were reported as non-Hispanic

## Data Definitions

To create this report, the HUD-provided definitions were used to create several variables during the cleaning process. Table 1 contains a list of all variables that were created and their HUD definitions.

**TABLE 1. VARIABLES CREATED**

Variable	HUD-Provided Definitions
<b>Household Types</b>	
Households without children	Households with adults only. This includes households composed of unaccompanied adults (including unaccompanied youth ages 8 to 24) and multiple adults (including households with multiple youth ages 18 to 24).
Household with at least one adult and one child	Households with (at least) one adult (including youth ages 18 to 24) and one child.
Household with only children	Households composed exclusively of persons under age 18, including one-child households, multiple-child households, or other household configurations composed only of children.
<b>Youth</b>	
Parenting youth	A youth who identifies as the parent or legal guardian of one or more children who are present with or sleeping in the same place as that youth parent, where there is no person over age 24 in the household.
Unaccompanied youth	Persons under age 25 who are not presenting or sleeping in the same place as their parent or legal guardian or their own children.
<b>Chronically Homeless</b>	
Chronically homeless person	A person who: Is homeless and lives in a place not meant for human habitation, a safe haven, or in an emergency shelter; and Has been homeless and living or residing in a place not meant for human habitation, a safe haven, or in an emergency shelter continuously for at least 1 year or on at least four separate occasions in the last 3 years where the combined length of time homeless in those occasions is at least 12 months; and Has a disability.
Chronically homeless household	A household with at least one adult or minor head of household who is identified as chronically homeless. For households with more than one person, if one household member qualifies as chronically homeless, all members of that household should be counted as chronically homeless.

## Interpreting PIT Data

The PIT count provides a snapshot of homelessness on a single night in January. Due to the transient nature of the population and the large geographic area of the Balance of State region, it is extremely difficult to capture all individuals and families experiencing homelessness. In addition, there are likely unforeseen impacts on populations experiencing homelessness due in part to the COVID-19 pandemic itself and due to the response to the COVID-19 pandemic by Federal, State, and local entities. Because of this, the 2023 PIT count should be considered an underrepresentation of homelessness in the Balance of State region.

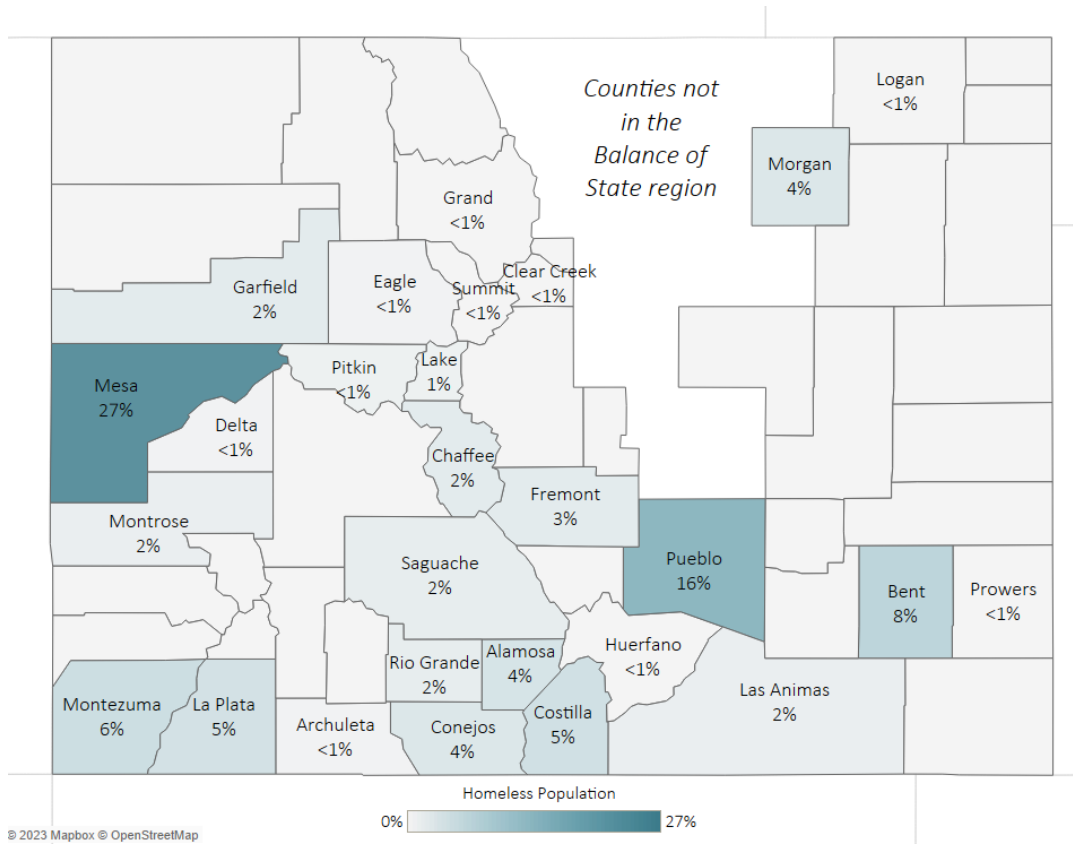
The PIT survey relies on self-reporting which may impact the data. Individuals may be unwilling to disclose certain information or may not realize that they meet the criteria for a specific condition. Many of the disabling conditions included on the PIT survey are stigmatized which may lead to underreporting. Moreover, certain disabling conditions, such as mental health issues, brain injuries, or other socially and/or systemically stigmatized health factors may be especially under reported among minority populations, which tend to be over represented among people experiencing homelessness.

Finally, changes in the homeless population year-to-year cannot be solely determined by examining PIT data. Each year, changes are made to the PIT methodology, primarily because of changes by HUD in data collection and recognition of more equitable ways to collect data. Subsequently, survey forms are changed to match these changing data standards. Additionally, local conditions such as the number of participating agencies, the number of volunteers, public health emergencies, and unseasonably warm or cool weather can impact both the number of individuals who seek shelter and the number of individuals included in the PIT count. Because of this, caution is recommended when comparing PIT count data over time. Increases or decreases in the homeless population may be due to methodology or changes in local conditions instead of true changes in the number of people experiencing homelessness.

# Snapshot of 2023 PIT Data

**2,210** Adults and children were experiencing homelessness in the Balance of State region in 2023

This map shows all the counties in the Balance of State region. The labeled counties represent where the 2,210 people experiencing homelessness were living during the 2023 PIT Count. **The counties with the largest share of people experiencing homelessness were Mesa (27%), Pueblo (16%), and Bent (8%).**



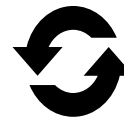
**16%** of households were families with children



**65%** of adults had at least one disabling condition

## Findings

All data reported in this section are based on completed surveys. Given the limitations of the PIT count and the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic this data likely does not represent the entire population of people experiencing homelessness in the Balance of State (BoS) region. The true number of people experiencing homelessness is likely greater than what is reported here.

Across the BoS region, there were 2,210 people experiencing homelessness in 2023. Of these people, 1,342 were unsheltered and 868 were staying in emergency shelters and transitional housing programs. HUD groups individuals into one of three “household types” – households without children; households with at least one adult and one child; and households with only children. Children are defined as persons under 18. In 2023, the majority of households did not include children.

## Demographics

This section contains demographic information about people experiencing homelessness the night of the 2023 PIT count and provides comparison data from the Colorado BoS region. The BoS region data are from the 2019 Colorado Census. Throughout this section, only the demographic categories that matched between the Census and the PIT survey are included.

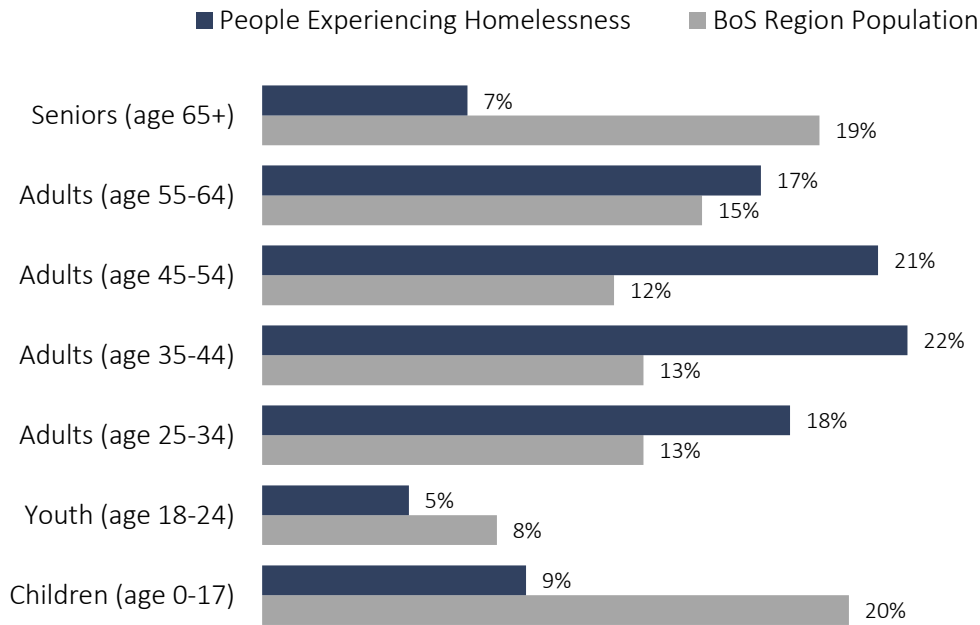
For the PIT survey, the head of household reported the age range for each household member - seniors age 65 and older, adults age 25-34, 35-44, 45-54, 55-64, youth age 18-24, or children under 18. Because exact ages were not reported, average age cannot be reported. The majority of the people counted were adults age 35-44 and age 45-54.

The following graph compares the percentage of people surveyed who were seniors age 65 and older, adults age 25-34, 35-44, 45-54, 55-64, youth age 18-24, or children under 18 in the BoS region and among people experiencing homelessness. Compared to the population in the BoS region, people experiencing homelessness on the night of the count were more likely to be adults age 25 to 64. For example, adults age 35-44 represent 13% of the region population but represent 22% of those experiencing homelessness based on the completed surveys.

**Homelessness disproportionately impacts adults age 25-64**

Compared to the general population of the BoS region, seniors, youth and children are under-represented in the homeless population while adults ages 25-64 are over-represented



People surveyed who identified as male outnumbered the people surveyed who identified as female approximately two to one among those experiencing homelessness the night of the count.

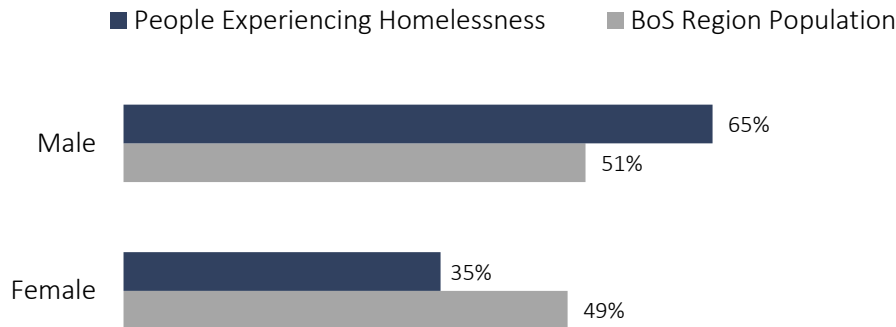

The following graph compares the percentage of people surveyed who identified as male or female in the BoS region and among people experiencing homelessness. Please note that the Census does not provide data on individuals who identify as transgender or gender non-conforming. Because comparison data for the general population was not available, these gender identities are not included in the figure below.

**Homelessness disproportionately impacts men**

Compared to the general population in the BoS region, people experiencing homelessness were more likely to identify as male.



Approximately seventy-one percent of those counted reported their race as White and twenty-eight percent reported their ethnicity as Hispanic/Latino.

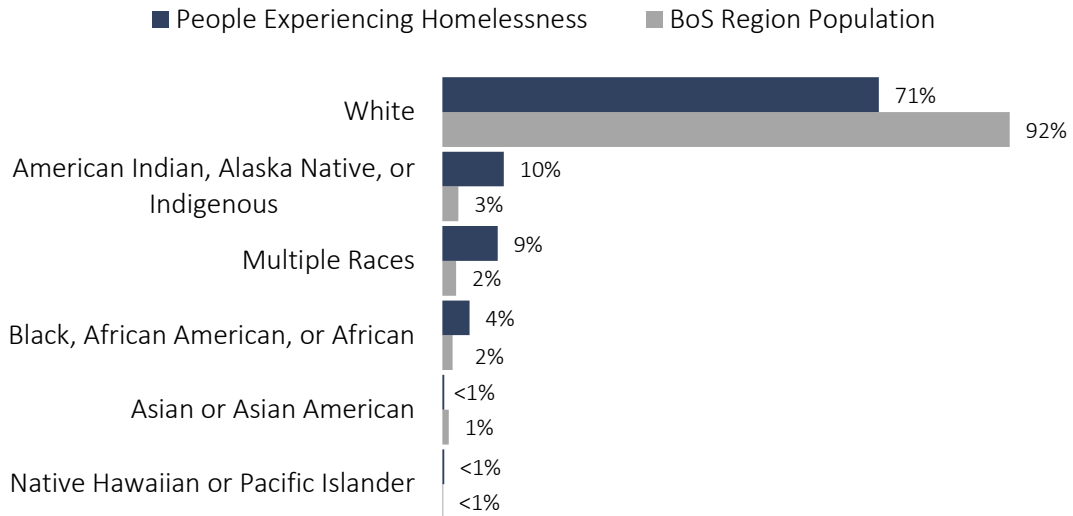

**Homelessness disproportionately impacts people of color**

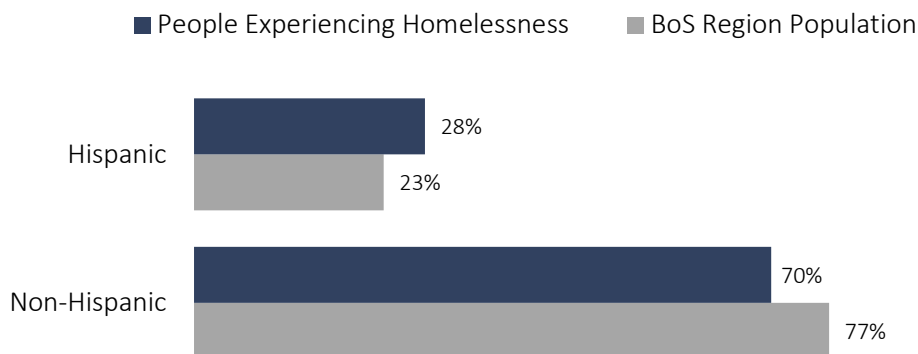
Compared to the general population in the BoS region, people experiencing homelessness were more likely to be American Indian or Alaskan Natives, multiracial, or Black or African Americans.

**Homelessness disproportionately impacts Hispanic people**

The percentage of Hispanic people experiencing homelessness was greater than the percentage of Hispanic people in the BoS region.



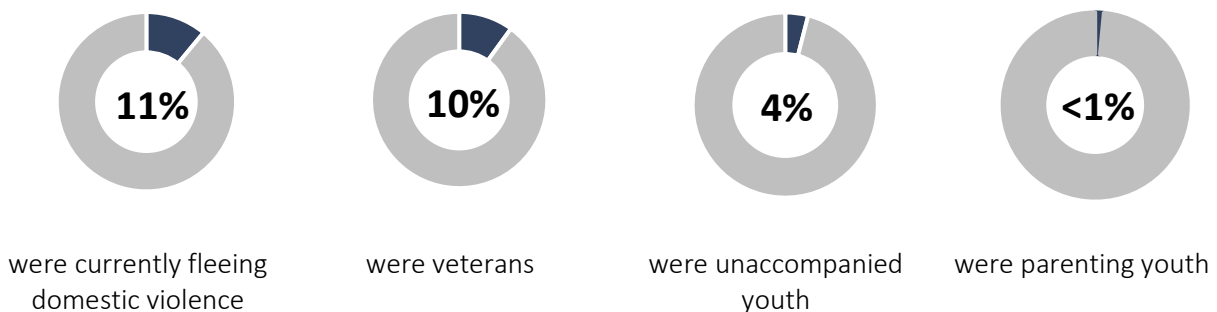
## Disabling Conditions and Sub-Populations

For each household member older than 18, the head of household reported the presence of serious mental illness, developmental disability, substance use disorder, HIV/AIDS, PTSD, brain injury, or chronic physical illness or disability. Sixty-five percent of the adults experiencing homelessness had one or more disabling conditions. The most commonly reported disabling conditions were substance use disorder and Chronic Physical Illness/Disability.

Among the people counted the night of the PIT count, there were several small but significant sub-populations. Approximately one out of ten adults were currently fleeing domestic violence and about one in ten were veterans.

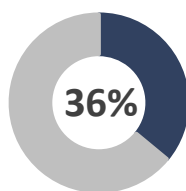

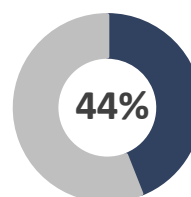

# Conclusion

The 2023 Point-in-Time (PIT) count was a success due to the hard work and dedication of staff and volunteers across Colorado. It is extremely difficult to gather PIT data due to the large geographic area of the Balance of State region and the transient nature of people experiencing homelessness.

While the 2023 PIT count should be considered a conservative estimate of the extent of homelessness in the region, the count provides valuable information about the people experiencing homelessness on the night of the count. There are many takeaways from the data contained in this report including:

- 2,210 homeless adults and children
- 16% were families with children
- 14% were under the age of 25
- 65% reported at least one disabling condition
- 36% were chronically homeless
- 11% were currently fleeing domestic violence
- 10% were veterans

The 2023 PIT Report also highlighted racial, age, and gender inequalities among those experiencing homelessness. American Indian/Alaskan Native people, Black or African American people, and Multiracial people make up a disproportionate amount of those experiencing homelessness compared to the population in the Balance of State region. People who identify as male and adults aged 25-64 were also overrepresented among those experiencing homelessness.

Additional data is included in the appendices. Appendix A includes information on household type, veteran status, disabling conditions, and chronic homelessness for each county and entitlement city. Appendix B provides a summary of the PIT data for each county. Appendix C provides a summary of the PIT data for each entitlement city. There are two entitlement cities in the BoS region, Grand Junction and Pueblo. For the 2023 PIT Count, all data that was collected in Mesa County was collected in the city of Grand Junction and all data that was collected in Pueblo County was collected in the city of Pueblo. Because of this, the data reported for these counties and entitlement cities are identical throughout the appendices.

The 2023 PIT count provides required data for federal funding through the HUD Continuum of Care program. The data included in this report will be used by the Colorado Balance of State Continuum of Care and other stakeholders to inform additional outreach, service and program planning, and policy decision making as they work to address homelessness.
