
Overview



Economic Highlights

Jobs

The region had 10,555 jobs in 2009. The largest portion of jobs were in local government (1,746 or 16.5 percent), health services and social assistance (1,089 jobs or 10.3 percent), retail trade (1,041 or 9.9 percent), and other services (951 jobs, 9.0 percent).

Region 14 lost 1,011 jobs in 2009 from 2008 (-8.7 percent), which put its annual average growth from 2001 to 2009 at 0.4 percent. Construction shed the most jobs from 2008 to 2009, decreasing by 308 (-28.8 percent). Mining and utilities lost another 205 jobs (-36.0 percent), and transportation and warehousing dropped 75 jobs (-20.9 percent). Local government added 45 jobs (2.6 percent).

From 2001 to 2008, per capita personal income increased 4.3 percent per year while that of the nation increased 3.2 percent. Thus, the region's ratio (of per capita income) to that of the nation increased from 0.686 to 0.714 during the eight-year period. Of the personal income of the region in 2008, 53.4 percent was from earnings, 9.4 percent from retirement and disability, 15.1 percent from Medicare, Medicaid and Veteran's benefits, and 16.4 percent from dividends, interest and rent.

Base Analysis


The three largest components of the region's economic base are retirees (,1354 jobs, 22.1 percent), government (1,010 jobs, 16.5 percent) – including Trinidad Junior College - and health and education (877 jobs, 14.3 percent) which account for just about half of the region's economic base of 6,126 jobs. Other important components of its base are agribusiness (778 jobs or

12.7 percent of the base), tourism (643 jobs or 10.5 percent) and mining (311 jobs or 5.1 percent).

Forecasts

Population Highlights

From 2010 to 2015 the region's economy is expected to grow 1,182 total jobs at an annual average rate of 2.1 percent. Over this time 755 direct basic jobs should be created. From 2015 to 2025 total job growth should stay the same at 2.1 percent annually. The growth is driven by equally by **National and Regional Services** (health care related) and **Tourism**, and to a smaller extent, jobs related to income -- from Social Security and pensions -- and savings of **retirees**, and the **investment income and wealth** of others. **Traditional Basic Job** growth is expected to be a smaller share of the growth. Job growth is expected to slow after 2025 as the rate of increase in the number of retirees slows as well.

The population of the region in 2009 was 23,501. This represents only a small increase of 432, or 0.2 percent annually since 2000. Virtually all of the growth during the 2000 to 2009 period has been in Las Animas County (0.9 percent annually). Huerfano had a -1.4 percent annual change between 2000 and 2009, which includes the closure of the penitentiary in Walsenberg in the 2008 to 2009 period.

Of the region's 23,501 people, 1,280 live in group quarters, the remaining 22,221 in households. Of those living in group quarters, 471 are prisoners in the Las Animas correctional facility. The region averages 2.36 persons per household (occupied housing units), with Las Animas County having a higher ratio (of 2.40) relative to Huerfano County (2.26). The region's 29.8 percent vacancy rate includes houses used for seasonal recreation purposes.

The region is expected to grow again after 2010 at annual rates of about 1.7 percent. Most of this expected growth is related to the aging and retiring of baby-boomers. The region's warmer climate, scenic areas and lower costs will serve to attract a growing number of tourists and retirees.

The median age of the region on July 1, 2009 was 41.5 as compared to the state's median age of 35.1. This is mainly due to somewhat larger proportions of the population over 45 – 44.0 percent for the region versus 39.8 percent for the state. The median age of the region is expected to decline somewhat to 40.9 by 2030 while that of the state's is expected to rise to 36.6 with the aging of the baby boomers age during this period.

Labor Market Highlights

Forecasts

Integrating the Economic and Population Forecasts by way of Analysis of the Labor Market
The separate forecasts of the economy (jobs) and the population are *integrated* -- or made consistent with each other -- by way of an analysis of the labor market. The analysis reviews whether the population forecast in the demographic models and the workforce they are expected to provide (supply) will be sufficient (or too great) to meet the demands of the economy. If not, the population forecast – migration – may have to be adjusted so that the jobs supplied by the population is more in line with the jobs

forecast. South Central—Region 14

Working from the bottom of upper table, the labor force participation rates are applied to noninstitutional populations over 16 - by age and gender to produce a forecast of the labor force for an existing or projected population. When the forecasted number unemployed persons are subtracted from the labor force, a forecast of the number of employed persons results. This num-

ber + the number of 2nd and 3rd jobs supplied by multiple job holders + those provided by commuters living outside the region – those who will work outside equals the number of jobs supplied by the population.

Note that the number of jobs supplied by the population and their rates of growth are not the same as the growth (rates) of the population. Hence this analysis is essential to establishing an appropriate relationship between jobs and population.

Changes in the overall or total labor force participation rate(s) (LFPR) are really a function of changes LFPR by age and gender and changes in the relative proportions in each. In general, LFPR for each age-gender group are expected to rise slightly to 2025. Those of women - especially those in upper age groups -are expected to increase more substantially, as the result of greater women's participation in younger age groups in past decades. Changes in the overall or total LFPR of a region, if it's declining, are due to increases in the number of people in younger or older age groups where participation rates are expected to remain relatively low.

The forecasting worksheets attempt to integrate and / or reconcile the economic forecast of total jobs with the population forecast. The rates of growth of these two key variables can differ somewhat because of changes in the labor market, i.e., labor force participation rates, unemployment rates, multiple job holding, and/or commuting. For example, between 2015 and 2025 job growth in the region is expected to be 2.1 percent per year while population growth will be 2.0 percent. This faster growth in jobs relative to the population is the result of slightly higher labor force participation rates, and a lower unemployment rate.
