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I. INTRODUCTION

The Colorado Water Resources and Power Development Authority, the Water Quality Control Division and the Division of Local Government (hereinafter collectively referred to as the "State") have prepared this annual report on Colorado's Water Pollution Control Revolving Fund (WPCRF). The fiscal year covered is January 1, 1997, to December 31, 1997. This report is intended to describe the activity of the WPCRF for this period, address the progress made on the goals of the program and present the annual audit for fiscal year 1997.

II. HISTORY

Colorado's WPCRF Program was established by legislation in April 1988. Also in April 1988, the Water Quality Control Commission (the "Commission") adopted Revolving Fund Regulation 5.2.0 which governs the Priority and Eligibility Lists and Administrative Procedures.

The Intended Use Plan which includes the state-wide project list and eligibility list are evaluated and brought before the Commission annually. Additions and modifications to the eligibility list are adopted by the Commission by December 31 of each year and approved by the Colorado General Assembly during the subsequent legislative session prior to April 1.

Changes since 1988:

The Commission amended the regulation to include Nonpoint Source projects and other program improvements on January 3, 1989.

WPCRF Rules 5.2.0 were amended again on October 11, 1990, to reduce delays in adopting the priority and eligibility lists.

The October 17, 1991, revisions to the WPCRF Rules allowed additional projects that are eligible under this program to receive funding priority. They also allowed assistance to communities that qualify under pollution prevention efforts rather than limiting priorities to compliance and enforcement projects.

Proactive changes were made to the Rules in October 1992. Small communities (under 5,000 population) are eligible for WPCRF assistance with an approved feasibility study rather than an extensive facility plan. The feasibility study will still have all the necessary requirements (such

as environmental information and public participation) and will help reduce costs to small communities. The Rules were also amended to include water conservation measures as an eligible project for participation in the WPCRF. Additional priority points are assigned for including water conservation measures as a part of the project.

No substantial changes were made in 1993, 1994 or 1995. However, the Commission directed staff to revisit the WPCRF Rules for possible changes to the priority point system. In June 1996 the Water Quality Control Division (WQCD) received a Funding Framework Grant from EPA to create a pilot priority system with expanded eligibilities. A critical review team was formed to address changes to the WPCRF Rules which were targeted for completion prior to the adoption of the FY1998 Intended Use Plan. An Interim Rule was drafted and a notice was published for a March 1997 public hearing with the Commission. After changes were made at a prehearing conference, the final proposed Interim Rules were adopted by the Commission on March 10, 1997. The Interim Rules will be reviewed in early 1998.

It was anticipated that the WPCRF Interim Rule would be reviewed after the 1998 Intended Use Plan and Eligible Project List was produced. The 1998 Intended Use Plan was finalized in November and the WQCD believes it would be beneficial to get the Critical Review Team's input before finalizing revisions to the Rules. The 1999 Intended Use Plan will more accurately reflect the interim regulation, due to the completion of the WQCD watershed-oriented organization. The Interim Rule is scheduled to become a final rule in January 1999.

Minor changes to the financial program were made in 1994, 1995 and 1996. The changes occurred in both the direct loan and leveraged loan programs. The leveraged loan program, through the Surplus Matching Account agreement, was modified in 1994 to include direct loan repayments as security for the Clean Water Revenue Bonds. These repayments are held for up to one year in the Surplus Matching Account as are any de-allocations from the Matching Account and the repayment of the State Match. On September 1 of each year, the Surplus Matching Account may be used to cure any default on any Clean Water Revenue Bonds. If there are no defaults, the funds are moved to the Re-loan Account on September 2. By pledging the direct loan repayments, the ability to make additional loans with this money will be delayed for a short time period.

An additional minor change occurred in 1995 to provide additional security for the Clean Water Revenue Bonds. This change involved another modification to the Surplus Matching Account agreement to require funds in each Matching Account to be the greater of: (a) the amount required to be on deposit in the Matching Account for such Bonds or (b) maximum annual debt service due in the current year or future years on the Bonds secured by such Matching Account. By keeping the Matching Account for each borrower at the maximum annual debt service level, the WPCRF will lose some loan capacity over the last four years of each loan. The Matching Account is generally larger than the maximum annual debt service, except for the last four years of each Bond issue.

The last minor change in 1995 involved the Authority's policy on direct loan amounts. The Authority's Board reviewed the current limitation of \$500,000 for each direct loan. Although this has not been a strict policy, it has been a guideline. Since the number and size of leveraged loans are uncertain for each year and the WPCRF had at that time in excess of \$24 million of unencumbered grant awards, the Board felt it was appropriate to change the policy guideline to allow direct loans with amounts of up to \$1.0 million. In reviewing direct loans of this size, the Board would favorably consider a shorter loan term.

In December 1996 the Board revised the closing fee on direct loans. The fee was reduced from 0.8 percent to 0.5 percent to offset increased legal expenses primarily associated with TABOR compliance.

No changes were made in 1997.

III. SUMMARY

The reporting period for this document is January 1, 1997, through December 31, 1997. The capitalization grant funds available for the 1997 loan cycle include approximately \$4,396,306 remaining from the federal fiscal year 1993 grant, \$9,441,001 from the FFY1994 grant, \$9,852,000 from the FFY1995 grant, \$16,138,618 from the FFY1996 grant and \$4,935,600 from the FFY1997 grant. Of these amounts, \$450,860 has been committed to cover administrative expenses.

The Water Quality Control Commission held a formal public hearing on October 7, 1996, to adopt the 1997 Intended Use Plan (IUP). At that meeting, two communities requested that they be added to the IUP; the Commission approved the changes on January 13, 1997. An emergency rulemaking hearing was also

held on January 13, 1997, to add the Town of Cheraw and the City of Fruita to the IUP and a noticed rulemaking hearing was conducted on April 14, 1997, to finalize the emergency action. In the 1997 IUP, projects totaling approximately \$52 million were identified for potential loans.

Twelve loans were executed during 1997 with a total principal amount of \$35,400,752.90. The communities receiving leveraged loans included: the Breckenridge Sanitation District, Town of Carbondale, Town of Eagle, Town of Erie, Parker Water and Sanitation District, City of Sterling, and the City of Westminster. The communities receiving direct loans included: the Town of Vona, Town of Manzanola, Pagosa Springs Sanitation District, Town of Erie, and the City of Holyoke.

The Clean Water Revenue Bonds issued to fund the leveraged loans maintained their "AA/Aa" ratings from Standard and Poor's Ratings Services and Moody's Investors Service, respectively.

IV. GOALS AND ACCOMPLISHMENTS

The following discussion addresses the progress toward meeting the goals and accomplishments that were made a part of the WPCRF program through the 1997 Intended Use Plan.

A. LONG TERM GOALS

(1) Maintain the economic viability of the WPCRF while meeting current and projected Water Quality needs in the State of Colorado.

Ensure that the WPCRF remains viable and is self perpetuating to meet the long range water quality needs of the State.

The program has been set up to be self perpetuating and will be leveraged to the maximum extent possible to meet the projected water quality needs of the State and to maintain the economic viability of the WPCRF.

The incentives used for loans include direct loan interest rates at 4.5 percent and leveraged loans at 80 percent of market rate.

(2) Provide technical assistance to governmental agencies for facilitating effective planning, design, financing and construction of facilities to meet water quality standards.

Customer service will be the focus while utilizing the team approach to create an atmosphere conducive to accomplishing the best practicable project.

Administrative fees are now adequate to fund State technical support to local governments. Preapplication and preplanning meetings are now being scheduled with communities to assist with planning, scheduling, financing and management. Additional engineering support has been added to the program to provide technical review as well as technical assistance to small communities.

A team approach to the construction of wastewater treatment facilities was utilized by the WQCD at the onset to assist communities with all program requirements to save time, money and create the relationships necessary to facilitate the best project for the community. However, with the WQCD's reorganization, the approach we are attempting to use is based on the coordination of the watershed teams.

An ongoing outreach program through the Division of Local Government (DLG) is assisting community officials in achieving compliance and helping them professionally manage their systems. Technical assistance is also provided by DLG through site visits, planning discussions, a plant operator training calendar and various other publications and activities.

(3) Maintain compliance with State and Federal Laws and the provisions of the State/EPA Operating Agreement.

The regulations are clear and the application packet includes the required instructions.

The standard operating procedures and policies are quite complex due to many Federal requirements; however, the State continues to work with EPA in refining these procedures and policies.

B. SHORT TERM GOALS

(1) Improve the procedures and checklists of the Handbook of Procedures on an as needed basis.

The WQCD continuously makes improvements to the Handbook of Procedures to allow the State to maintain a flexible program while ensuring that all projects meet the State and Federal requirements associated with the loan program.

(2) Initiate the process for identifying projects in the FY1998 Intended Use Plan ("IUP") by February 1997.

The process was not initiated until April 1997.

(3) Submit Annual Report to EPA by March 31, 1997.

The 1996 Annual Report was submitted to EPA by March 31, 1997.

(4) Make improvements to the WPCRF Rules as appropriate. Major revisions will be made once the Clean Water Act is reauthorized.

The WQCD was awarded a funding framework grant in June 1996 to revise the WPCRF Rules to incorporate a new priority system for expanded eligibilities. A critical review team, composed of varied interests, was assembled to discuss and make recommendations to the WQCD on a new system. After several meetings, the critical review team completed a new set of rules in November 1996 entitled "Interim Rules" for submission to the Commission. Upon holding a public hearing, the Commission adopted the Interim Rules on March 10, 1997.

The 1998 IUP was developed using the Interim Rules. The Interim Rules will continue through the development of the 1999 IUP, since the WQCD reorganization had not been fully implemented and the coordination efforts by the watershed teams to input projects on the eligibility list was not available for the 98 list. The Rules are scheduled to be adjusted and finalized in January 1999.

(5) Continue coordination with all funding agencies to complete water quality projects identified in the 1997 IUP.

The agencies involved in the WPCRF have diligently worked together and with other funding agencies to find the best funding sources for each individual community.

Greater effort has been expended to coordinate identification of projects and funding from all available sources including WQCD Construction Grants, Community Development Block Grants, Rural Development and Energy Impact programs. Meetings are held throughout the year to discuss upcoming projects and the resources available.

(6) Leverage funds in the WPCRF to accommodate the amount of eligible costs projected for loans in 1997 as described in Appendix B (of the IUP).

The fund was leveraged consistently on a scale of approximately 3 to 1 to ensure that there would be enough monies available for anticipated loans in 1997 and subsequent years. (See also WPCRF Financial Status.)

C. ACCOMPLISHMENTS

For the purposes of this report the State references the 1997 IUP. The Water Quality Control Commission held a formal public hearing on October 7, 1996, to adopt the 1997 Intended Use Plan (IUP). At that meeting, two communities requested that they be added to the IUP; the Commission approved the changes on January 13, 1997. An emergency rulemaking hearing was also held on January 13, 1997, to add the Town of Cheraw and the City of Fruita to the IUP and a noticed rulemaking hearing was conducted on April 14, 1997, to finalize the emergency action.

The 1997 IUP (included as **Attachment 1**) contains a list of projects that the State considered as projected commitments (**Appendix B to Attachment 1**). There were 17 projects listed in the IUP totaling approximately \$52 million; 12 loans were executed during 1997 with a total principal amount of \$35,400,752.90. Details of the loans can be found later in the Project Status portion of this report.

V. PROGRAM DETAILS

A. WPCRF FINANCIAL STATUS

The FFY1997 capitalization grant was awarded on April 29, 1997. The EPA share was \$4,935,600 and the State Match was \$987,120 for a total of \$5,922,720. With this grant, the State has received \$112,594,175 to date from EPA and has committed to provide a total of \$22,518,835 for State Match.

Exhibit A shows the capitalization grant payments, cumulative payments, binding commitments and percentage of binding commitments. **Exhibit B** presents a summary of project and administrative draws against the various grants. Other financial details are available in **Attachment 4** (audited financial statements) and **Exhibit G** (form 269A).

B. PROJECT STATUS

Exhibit C presents a summary of all loans as of December 31, 1997, and the status of those loans as of that date. **Exhibit D** is a report of all projects funded to date. The report breaks out the equivalency and nonequivalence projects; gives the interest rate on each loan; shows the construction start, initiation of operation and performance certification dates. **Exhibit E** classifies the twelve new loans by cost categories.

Twelve loan agreements were executed during the 1997 reporting period. Seven of the projects were leveraged loans and five were direct loans. Each of the twelve projects are briefly described below.

Breckenridge Sanitation District - A twenty-year loan in the amount of \$8,093,616.90 with an interest rate of 4.53% was executed on May 22, 1997. The scope of the project included the construction of a 1.5 mgd satellite activated sludge treatment facility with biological and precipitation removal of phosphorus and separate nitrification.

Town of Carbondale - A ten-year loan in the amount of \$2,327,490.20 with an interest rate of 4.22% was executed on May 22, 1997. The Town's facility will expand its capacity to 0.995 million gallons per day and construction will include a new administration building, a pretreatment building, a blower building and interceptor. The activated sludge processes will be retained. Construction is to begin in the spring of 1998.

Town of Eagle - A twenty-year loan in the amount of \$2,345,204.20 with an interest rate of 4.53% was executed on May 22, 1997. The project included construction of a new 0.546 mgd extended aeration activated sludge plant, new headworks, two aeration basins, two secondary clarifiers, a RAS/WAS pump vault, two aerated sludge storage basins and ultra-violet disinfection. The construction was completed on December 1, 1997, with a total project cost of \$3,719,965.

Parker Water and Sanitation District - A twenty-year loan in the amount of \$3,271,642.30 with an interest rate of 4.54% was executed on May 22, 1997. This phase of Parker's project involves the construction of sludge handling facilities which should be completed by August 1998.

City of Sterling - A twenty-year loan for \$2,499,524.10 with an interest rate of 4.53% was executed on May 22, 1997. The project involves the construction of a sanitary sewer relief line in north-central Sterling. The line will relieve capacity concerns in the existing collection system.

City of Westminster - A twenty-year loan in the amount of \$13,246,525 with an interest rate of 4.54% was executed on May 22, 1997. The City is constructing a reclaimed water system including pipeline, storage and advanced waste water treatment facilities. The project should be completed by January 1999.

Town of Erie - On May 22, 1997, the Town received a twenty-year leveraged loan in the amount of \$1,821,690.20 with an interest rate of 4.54%. The project consists of the construction of a 0.6 mgd activated sludge waste water treatment facility and interceptor. The Town is on a compliance schedule to meet its discharge permit limits and the interceptor will resolve inadequate collection system capacity.

Town of Erie - A twenty-year direct loan of \$500,000 was executed on November 3, 1997, to complete the Town's funding needs for the project listed above.

Town of Vona - A twenty-year direct loan of \$85,000 was executed on February 20, 1997. The project involved the construction of a new waste water treatment facility with two lined non-discharging stabilization cells. Construction was initiated in May and completed in September 1997.

Town of Manzanola - A twenty-year direct loan of \$80,360 was executed on June 5, 1997. The Town will convert its two cell lagoon to an aerated primary cell, stabilization pond and constructed wetlands. Construction is complete except for planting cattails in May 1998.

Pagosa Springs Sanitation District - A twenty-year direct loan of \$640,000 was executed on June 10, 1997. The project involves construction of a new waste water treatment plant and bio-remediation of the existing plant site. The project was completed in November 1997.

City of Holyoke - A twenty-year direct loan of \$489,700 was executed on December 30, 1997. The project consists of improvements to the waste water treatment facility and collection system. The targeted completion date is September 1998.

C. COMPLIANCE WITH PROVISIONS OF GRANT/OPERATING AGREEMENT

There are many requirements in the capitalization grant/operating agreement that the State must meet in order to maintain the WPCRF according to EPA standards. A letter from the WQCD (**Attachment 3**) certifies the State has met the following elements of the Operating Agreement's "Roles and Responsibilities of the State."

- a. Colorado has established an instrumentality of the State utilizing the specific expertise of three agencies via legislation adopted in 1988.
- b. The WQCD submitted a report to Region VIII regarding adequate 205(g) funds to closeout the grant program. The report was approved by Region VIII on November 30, 1989, and has been updated and approved annually. A final revision to the report was submitted to EPA in September 1997.
- c. In accordance with Federal regulations, State law and the WPCRF Rules, the IUP (which includes the project and eligibility lists) is presented at a public hearing through the Commission prior to December 31 of each year.

- d. ACH payment schedules are submitted annually to EPA Region VIII.
- e. The appropriate State Match is included with each capitalization grant and verified by audit.
- f. A binding commitment (loan agreement) is made after a thorough review of the sponsor's application and financial capability. Exhibit A reports the binding commitment percentage to be well over 120% because of the State's leveraged-loan program.
- g. As required, the State expends all funds in an expeditious and timely manner from the WPCRF for the improvement of water quality.
- h. There are no projects being tracked for the National Municipal Policy list in Colorado.
- 1. Verification of the State's compliance with project eligibility can be found in the project files.
- j. The State maintains extensive expenditure files (administrative and project) for the WPCRF. While conducting various compliance testing procedures, the auditors indicated that nothing came to their attention that caused them to believe that the Authority had not complied, in all material respects, with various laws, regulations, contracts or grants.
- k. Management of the WPCRF is monitored frequently by each of the three agencies. Improvements are continually made to the program with concurrence from EPA.
- The program's financial accounting structure is maintained by the Colorado Water Resources and Power Development Authority. The financial statements are audited annually by an independent accounting firm.
- m. The Colorado WPCRF Annual Report is submitted to EPA by March 31 of each year as required.

- n. The State has agreed to the 8% Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) goal. EPA has trained the State to monitor and evaluate DBE participation of loan recipients and their contractors. The State is currently utilizing a DBE for financial printing, investment brokering services, arbitrage rebate services, and underwriting. **Exhibit F** includes examples of how bid reviews are documented showing DBE participation. The exhibit provides the DBE information on the following projects: Roxborough Park Metropolitan District, Parker Water & Sanitation District, City of Sterling, Fountain Sanitation District, Town of Vona, and the Town of Lyons. The tracking system for all projects under construction is currently being revised to coordinate with EPA's tracking system.
- o. In accordance with the operating agreement, civil rights compliance forms are submitted to EPA for certification prior to executing loan agreements.
- p. During the 1997 reporting period, the State prepared Environmental Assessments and published 13 Findings of No Significant Impact (FNSI) or Categorical Exclusions for the Water Pollution Control Revolving Fund. The 13 communities included: Fountain Water & Sanitation District, Town of Erie, Winter Park Water & Sanitation District, Parker Water & Sanitation District, Byers Water & Sanitation District, City of Holyoke, Town of New Castle, City of Sterling, Breckenridge Sanitation District, City of Westminster, Town of Elizabeth, Town of Fruita and Buena Vista Sanitation District.

To further track projects for compliance with the Operating Agreement, the State utilizes the GICS data base.

The State utilizes a Time and Effort record keeping system for all staff that perform duties under the WPCRF. There are some discrepancies with the records kept by the WQCD and DLG; measures are being taken to correct them. In 1997, DLG was not reimbursed with Federal funds; therefore, OMB A-87 provisions do not apply. Beginning July 1, 1997, the WQCD technical staff and certain administrative staff working on the WPCRF were not reimbursed by the administrative set-asides of the federal capitalization grant. The provisions of OMB A-87 do not apply to

these positions. Three designated WQCD administrative staff, working only on the WPCRF and the Drinking Water Revolving Fund and funded by Federal funds, must follow OMB A-87 provisions.

VI. PROJECTIONS FOR 1998

A. APPROVED LOANS FIRST QUARTER 1998

The 1998 IUP (**Attachment 2**) includes a list of projects from the eligibility list that have submitted or are anticipated to submit loan applications. These projects are considered the State's projected commitments for the 1998 WPCRF loan program.

The State received a "AAA" programmatic rating from Standard and Poor's for the 1998 Series A Clean Water Revenue Bonds. This bond issue was initiated in March for the following entities:

City of Trinidad City of Westminster (increase to loan) Buena Vista Sanitation District City of Colorado Springs Eagle River Water and Sanitation District City of Evans

Entities with Approved Applications Ready for Funding:

East Alamosa Water and Sanitation District City of Las Animas Left Hand Water and Sanitation District

B. APPLICATIONS RECEIVED OR ANTICIPATED FOR 1998:

Colorado City Metropolitan District Town of New Castle Town of Fowler Garden Valley Water and Sanitation District Byers Water and Sanitation District

C. PROPOSED PROGRAM IMPROVEMENTS AND/OR MODIFICATIONS

As recommended by EPA's 1996 review, the State is continuing its efforts to implement a priority system that allows the WPCRF to fund expanded water quality projects. WPCRF Interim Rules will be used to develop the 1999 IUP. Short and Long Term Goals will be modified slightly to reflect the WPCRF improved program needs.

The Division has reorganized and will be utilizing a basin-wide team approach to meet all existing and anticipated water quality needs.

By statute, the Colorado Water Resources and Power Development Authority is prohibited from accepting applications for financial assistance after June 4, 1996, from any governmental entity which has a legal obligation to provide water at retail and which has a total annual demand of 2,000 acre-feet or more, unless the entity has included a copy of a water use efficiency plan adopted pursuant to Section 37-60-126, C.R.S. This 1991 statute (HB-1154) was intended to enhance the efficiency with which water is used to meet end uses, with the objective of making water available for all beneficial uses in Colorado.

In 1997, the Authority initiated a study to review policies and procedures associated with all direct and interim loans. As a result of this study, several loan-related recommendations (such as a direct loan procedures manual, default procedures, etc.) will be addressed in 1998. Some recommendations (loan covenant compliance, option to require more frequent financial reporting, etc.) were implemented in 1997.

In 1997, the State began planning to consolidate the waste water needs collection efforts of the WQCD and the DLG. The State decided to survey all 207 projects on the DLG's April 1998 Sewer Needs List (which includes all WPCRF eligibility list projects) in order to better identify local needs that may be financed through the WPCRF. This cooperative effort will replace the annual data collection effort the WQCD has previously conducted to develop the project and eligibility lists. The State is planning to use the information gathered in this effort to update the existing WPCRF project and eligibility lists for 1999.

The recommendation from EPA's 1996 review that the State consider incorporating new language into Colorado's State Environmental Review Process will be addressed and implemented in 1998.

In 1998, the Authority received legislative approval for certain statutory revisions. One revision changes the dates by which the Authority must submit its annual report. As a result, the State will be requesting, through the FFY1998 grant application process, to shift the reporting date for the WPCRF Annual Report from Mach 31 to April 30.

This regulation will be submitted to the Office of Legislative Legal Services within twenty (20) days after the date of the Attorney General's Opinion, pursuant to 24-4-103(8)(d), C.R.S., and to the Secretary of State in time for November, 1996 publication in the Colorado Register pursuant to 24-4-103(5) and (11)(d), C.R.S., and will become effective November 30, 1996.

STATE OF COLORADO FY 1997 WPCRF INTENDED USE PLAN

INTRODUCTION

This Intended Use Plan (IUP) will serve as the planning document for explaining how the fiscal year (FY) 1994, 1995, 1996 and 1997 appropriations for the WPCRF will be used. As currently developed, the IUP identifies the specific projects and activities associated with the federal appropriation. All of the funds allotted to the State for FY95 and 96 will be made available to the WPCRF.

The State agrees to submit to EPA, as part of its annual application for a Capitalization Grant under Title VI of the Water Quality Act of 1987 (the Federal Act), an IUP which meets the requirements of Section 606(c) of the Federal Act and S.B. 50 (1988).

The requirements of the Act are as follows:

- A list of those projects for construction of publicly owned treatment works on the State's priority list developed pursuant to section 216 of this Act and a list of activities eligible for assistance under sections 319 and 320 of the Federal Act;
- A description of the short and long-term goals of the State's Water Pollution Control Revolving Fund (WPCRF);
- Information on the activities to be supported, including a description of project categories, discharge requirements under titles III and IV of the Federal Act, terms of financial assistance, and communities served; and
- The criteria and method established for the distribution of funds.

The State will prepare and submit a Capitalization Grant application based on the FY 1997 allotment for the WPCRF.

To date, the WPCRF has issued 36 loans totalling \$158,674,653. From this total, \$65,862,775 has been utilized from the federal capitalization grants; the amount of grant awards through FY1996 is \$97,243,557.

1997 WPCRF IUP

LIST OF WATER POLLUTION CONTROL REVOLVING FUND PROJECTS

Attached to the 1997 IUP as Appendix A is the statewide project priority list showing the current construction needs for point source wastewater treatment. Also attached as Appendix A-1 is the Eligibility List with 1997 additions and modifications. The Eligibility List consists of projects from the priority list that have or will have approved facility plans or feasibility studies during the 1997 funding year.

LONG TERM GOALS

The State continues to develop long term goals that will insure the integrity of the WPCRF:

1. Maintain the economic viability of the WPCRF while meeting current and projected Water Quality needs in the State of Colorado.

Ensure that the WPCRF remains viable and is self perpetuating to meet the long range water quality needs of the State.

2. Provide technical assistance to governmental agencies for facilitating effective planning, design, financing, and construction of facilities to meet water quality standards.

Customer service will be the focus while utilizing the team approach to create an atmosphere conducive to accomplishing the best practicable project.

3. Maintain compliance with State and Federal Laws and the provisions of the State/EPA Operating Agreement.

SHORT TERM GOALS

In an effort to continually improve the WPCRF program, the State will pursue the following short term goals throughout the calendar year for 1997.

- 1. Improve the procedures and checklists of the Handbook of Procedures on an as needed basis.
- 2. Initiate the process for identifying projects in the FY1998 Intended Use Plan by February, 1997.

- 3. Submit Annual Report to EPA by March 31, 1997.
- Make improvements to the WPCRF Rules as appropriate. Major revisions will be made once the Clean Water Act is reauthorized.
 -Amend Rules to incorporate expanded eligibilities for the FY1998 IUP.
- 5. Continue coordination with all funding agencies to complete water quality projects identified in the 1997 IUP.
- 6. Leverage funds in the WPCRF to accommodate the amount of eligible costs projected for loans in 1997 as described in Appendix B.

INFORMATION ON ACTIVITIES TO BE SUPPORTED

Appendix B to the IUP is a table depicting projects that are ely to be funded with loans from the WPCRF during the remainder of calendar year 1996 and all of 1997. The total estimated eligible costs for the 20 projects listed is \$57,496,099. There is over \$25,000,000 available from federal capitalization grants which will be used in part along with state match funds and leveraged funds. The federal amount does not reflect any capitalization grant that may be made for FY1997.

The State intends to use an amount equal to 4% of the Capitalization Grant for Administration of the WPCRF. Additional administrative expenses are covered by a small loan surcharge. The State will also employ the reserve of 1% (or \$100,000, whichever is greater) from the Title VI allotment as provided by Section 604(b) to conduct water quality planning.

All funding agencies meet periodically to coordinate the financial demands of facilities out of compliance and that have a severity of pollution problem per WPCRF Rules (5.2.0.). These projects are listed on the FY 1997 Project Priority list (Appendix A).

The State will provide the necessary assurance and certifications as part of the Capitalization Grant Agreement and Operating Agreement between the State of Colorado and the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency.

The proposed payment schedule using FY 1997 WPCRF funds will be included in the application for the Capitalization Grant. The payment schedule identifies the anticipated amount of EPA Automated Clearinghouse (ACH) draws from the Capitalization Grant and State dollars to be deposited into the WPCRF.

1997 WPCRF JUP

Public Review and Comment:

The Commission held a formal public hearing on <u>October 7, 1996</u> at which time the State's FY 1997 IUP was adopted. The Water Quality Control Division contacted local governmental agencies on the State's Project Priority List regarding their potential for funding under the WPCRF. Each year, the IUP will be amended to include additional WPCRF projects and the Division will seek further public review and comment.

CRITERIA AND METHODS FOR DISTRIBUTING FUNDS

The WPCRF Rules (5.2.0), the IUP, the Project Priority List attached as Appendix A, and the Eligibility List attached as Appendix A-1 provide a clear, objective system for identifying priority of wastewater management systems. This system uses the following criteria:

- (1) Severity of Pollution
- (2) Quality of Receiving Waters
- (3) Financial Need
- (4) Regionalization
- (5) Water Conservation
- (6) Beneficial Use of Sludge

The rationale for funding projects from the WPCRF priority list in an order other than that shown shall be due to one of the following four reasons:

- (1) Governmental agencies do not wish to participate in the WPCRF or they have received funding from other sources.
- (2) Governmental agencies are not ready to proceed with the project.
- (3) Governmental agencies are not in compliance with requirements identified in the Federal Act.
- (4) Governmental agencies do not have the financial capability to repay a loan.

The WPCRF criteria for reviewing the financial capability of the applicant is included in the State/EPA Operating Agreement.

The State legislation S.B. 50 (1988) establishes a WPCRF as an enduring and viable fund. The WPCRF shall be maintained and be available in perpetuity for providing financial assistance as authorized and limited by the Federal Act.

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5.17.8.(4) FINDINGS REGARDING BASIS FOR EMERGENCY RULE: JANUARY 13, 1997

The Commission held this emergency rulemaking hearing to add two communities to the Water Pollution Control Revolving Fund (WPCRF) fiscal year 1997 Intended Use Plan.

The Town of Cheraw maintains and operates a non-discharging lagoon system. The water levels have risen to a point of topping the embankment, creating a surface discharge without a permit. It could potentially flow into the lake causing a public health hazard. The Town will need to start construction as soon as possible estimating the cost to be \$200,000.

The City of Fruita is negotiating agreements with the Downer Subdivision and the J Road/Fruita Monument High School to provide wastewater treatment. These areas are on individual sewage disposal systems in high ground water, some are failing and some leech fields are reportedly in the flood plain of Little Salt Wash. The potential for public health concerns is high and the cost for constructing sewer lines to both areas is estimated at \$210,000.

The Commission finds that the immediate adoption of the revised 1997 Intended Use Plan is necessary for the preservation of public health, safety or welfare and that compliance with normal notice requirements would be contrary to the public interest. If the two communities are not added to the Intended Use Plan's priority and eligibility lists at this time, funding would not be available to correct the public health issues until the spring of 1998.

5.17.8(3) STATEMENT OF BASIS, SPECIFIC STATUTORY AUTHORITY, AND PURPOSE(1996 REVISIONS)

The provisions of sections 25-8-202(1)(e) and (g); 25-8-308(1)(d); 37-95-107.6(4) C.R.S., provide the specific statutory authority for adoption of the attached regulatory amendments. The Commission also adopted, in compliance with sections 24-4-103(4) C.R.S., the following statement of basis and purpose.

BASIS AND PURPOSE:

The Intended Use Plan (IUP) is presented to the Water Quality Control Commission each year for agency action and public comment. The plan describes the intent of the Water Pollution Control Revolving Fund (WPCRF) for providing financial assistance to governmental agencies.

Attached to the 1997 IUP as Appendix A is the statewide project priority list showing the current construction needs for point source wastewater treatment. Also attached as Appendix A-1 is the 1997 Eligibility List additions and modifications. The Eligibility List consists of projects from the priority list that have or will have approved facility plans or feasibility studies during the 1997 funding year. Attachment B to the IUP is a chart depicting projects that are expected to be funded from the WPCRF and includes their target date for a binding commitment.

The Commission held a formal public meeting on October 7, 1996 to adopt the 1997 IUP. However, the Town of Berthoud and the City of Thornton requested that they be added to the IUP and the name of the "Erie Water and Sanitation District" was changed to the "Town of Erie." These changes were made for final approval on January 13, 1997.

REGULATION NO. 52 WPCRF INTENDED USE PLAN

52.1 INTRODUCTION

This Intended Use Plan (IUP) will serve as the planning document for explaining how the fiscal year (FY) 1995, 1996, 1997 and 1998 appropriations for the WPCRF will be used. This IUP will also identify projects that are potentially eligible for "Hardship Grants". As currently developed, the IUP identifies the specific projects and activities associated with the federal appropriation. Funds allotted to the State for FY94, 95, 96 and 97 will be made available to the WPCRF.

The State agrees to submit to EPA, as part of its annual application for a Hardship Grant and a Capitalization Grant under Title VI of the Water Quality Act of 1987 (the Federal Act), an IUP which meets the requirements of Section 606(c) of the Federal Act and S.B. 50 (1988).

The requirements of the Act are as follows:

- A list of those projects for construction of publicly owned treatment works on the State's priority list developed pursuant to section 216 of this Act and a list of activities eligible for assistance under sections 319 and 320 of the Federal Act;
- A description of the short and long-term goals of the State's Water Pollution Control Revolving Fund (WPCRF);
- Information on the activities to be supported, including a description of project categories, discharge requirements under titles III and IV of the Federal Act, terms of financial assistance, and communities served; and
- The criteria and method established for the distribution of funds.

The State will prepare and submit a Capitalization Grant application based on the FY 1998 allotment for the WPCRF. The State will also prepare an application for the 1997 appropriation for Hardship Grants which is \$478,400 for Colorado.

As of June 30, 1997 the WPCRF has issued 52 loans totaling \$203,065,362. The total amount of federal capitalization grant awards is \$112,594,175; of this amount, \$83,212,057 has been obligated.

52.2 LIST OF WATER POLLUTION CONTROL REVOLVING FUND PROJECTS

Attached to the 1998 IUP as Appendix A is the statewide project priority list showing the current construction needs for all eligible water quality projects including point source wastewater treatment, nonpoint source, ground water, storm water, etc. Also attached as Appendix A-1 is the Eligibility List with 1998 additions and modifications. The Eligibility List consists of projects from the priority list that have or will have approved planning documents during the 1998 funding year.

52.3 LONG TERM GOALS

The State continues to develop long term goals that will insure the integrity of the WPCRF:

1. Maintain the economic viability of the WPCRF while meeting current and projected Water Quality needs in the State of Colorado.

Ensure that the WPCRF remains viable and is self perpetuating to meet the long range water quality needs of the State.

2. Provide technical assistance to governmental agencies for facilitating effective planning, design, financing, and construction of facilities to meet water quality standards.

Customer service will be the focus while utilizing the team approach to create an atmosphere conducive to accomplishing the best practicable project.

3. Maintain compliance with State and Federal Laws and the provisions of the State/EPA Operating Agreement.

52.4 SHORT TERM GOALS

In an effort to continually improve the WPCRF program, the State will pursue the following short term goals throughout the calendar year for 1998.

- 1. Improve the procedures and checklists of the Handbook of Procedures on an as needed basis.
- 2. Initiate the process for identifying projects in the FY1999 Intended Use Plan by April, 1998.
- 3. Submit Annual Report to EPA by March 31, 1998.
- 4. Make improvements to the WPCRF Rules as appropriate. Major revisions will be made once the Clean Water Act is reauthorized.
 Interim Rules to incorporate expanded eligibilities for the FY1998 IUP will be reviewed along with the IUP at the October Water Quality Control Commission Hearing. The Interim Rules will either need revisions or will need to be finalized.
- 5. Continue coordination with all funding agencies to complete water quality projects identified in the 1998 IUP.
- 6. Leverage funds in the WPCRF to accommodate the amount of eligible costs projected for loans in 1998 as described in Appendix B.

52.5 INFORMATION ON ACTIVITIES TO BE SUPPORTED

Appendix B to the IUP is a table depicting projects that are likely to be funded with loans from the WPCRF during the remainder of calendar year 1997 and all of 1998. The total estimated eligible costs for the 11 projects listed is \$31,175,000. There is over \$29,000,000 available from federal capitalization grant awards which will be used in part along with state match funds and leveraged funds. The federal amount does not reflect any capitalization grant that may be made for FY1998.

The State intends to use an amount equal to 4% of the Capitalization Grant for Administration of the WPCRF. Additional administrative expenses are covered by a small loan surcharge. The State will also employ the reserve of 1% (or \$100,000, whichever is greater) from the Title VI allotment as provided by Section 604(b) to conduct water quality planning.

Appendix C to the IUP identifies the projects from the list that may be eligible for Hardship Grants provided by a federal grant to the State from the Environmental Protection Agency.

For FY1998, up to 33% of the Drinking Water Revolving Fund (DWRF) capitalization grants for FY97 and 98 which is estimated to be \$8,000,000 may be reserved from the WPCRF capitalization grant and dedicated to the DWRF.

All funding agencies meet periodically to coordinate the financial demands of facilities out of compliance and that have a water quality improvement project per the Interim WPCRF Rules (5.2.0.). These projects are listed on the FY 1998 Project Priority list (Appendix A).

The State will provide the necessary assurance and certifications as part of the Capitalization Grant Agreement and Operating Agreement between the State of Colorado and the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency.

The proposed payment schedule using FY 1998 WPCRF funds will be included in the application for the Capitalization Grant. The payment schedule identifies the anticipated amount of EPA Automated Cleaninghouse (ACH) draws from the Capitalization Grant and State dollars to be deposited into the WPCRF.

Public Review and Comment:

The Commission held a formal public hearing on October 6, 1997 at which time the State's FY 1998 IUP was given preliminary approval. The following comments were addressed at the public hearing:

There were no public comments received on the FY98 IUP which includes the new priority list for providing funds to expanded eligible projects. The Division requested that the Commission add Custer County/San Isabel to the project list during the approval process.

The Commission gave preliminary final approval to the revised version of the FY98 IUP which incorporates the addition of Custer County/San Isabel to the project list, the addition of Campo to Appendix C, the completion of the public comment section, the addition of section numbers to the document and the addition of a key to the letters used in the status column of the lists earlier in the document. The Commission will consider final action regarding this document at its November 3 and 4, 1997 regular meeting.

The Water Quality Control Division contacted local governmental agencies on the State's Project Priority List regarding their potential for funding under the WPCRF. Each year, the IUP will be amended to include additional WPCRF projects and the Division will seek further public review and comment.

52.6 CRITERIA AND METHODS FOR DISTRIBUTING FUNDS

The WPCRF Rules (5.2.0), the IUP, the Project Priority List attached as Appendix A, and the Eligibility List attached as Appendix A-1 provide a clear, objective system for identifying projects that will improve or benefit water quality in our state. A more detailed prioritization will be assembled if there is a shortage of funds available. This system uses the following criteria:

(1) The list shall include three categories. Category 1 includes those projects that improve or benefit public health. Category 2 includes those projects that will utilize proactive and long range planning of water quality approaches and/or pollution

prevention methods. Category 3 is the remainder of projects listed that will improve or benefit water quality.

(2) If it is determined that the WPCRF lacks sufficient funds to cover loans for all eligible projects that are ready to proceed, Category 1 projects will be funded prior to Category 2 projects, which will be funded prior to Category 3 projects. Within each category, the following criteria will be used to prioritize the projects:

> (i) Priority will be given to the project of any governmental agency that is under an enforcement action and/or compliance schedule relating to water quality standards as long as the enforcement action does not relate to administrative requirements of the program.

> (ii) If there are more projects of governmental agencies under enforcement actions than there are funds available, higher priority will be given to those entities that have a greater financial need as determined by procedures and recommendations of the Division of Local Government.

> (iii) Higher priority will also be given to any project serving a small community.

The rationale for funding projects from the WPCRF priority list in an order other than that shown shall be due to one of the following four reasons:

- (1) Governmental agencies do not wish to participate in the WPCRF.
- (2) Governmental agencies are not ready to proceed with the project.
- (3) Governmental agencies are not in compliance with requirements identified in the Federal Act.
- (4) Governmental agencies do not have the financial capability to repay a loan.

The WPCRF criteria for reviewing the financial capability of the applicant is included in the State/EPA Operating Agreement.

The State legislation S.B. 50 (1988) establishes a WPCRF as an enduring and viable fund. The WPCRF shall be maintained and be available in perpetuity for providing financial assistance as authorized and limited by the Federal Act.

The key used for "Funding Status" in the attached Project Eligibility Lists is as follows:

- S = Approved planning document; ready for funding
- T = Planning document submitted for review; ready for funding during current fiscal year
- U = Planning document is expected to be submitted and ready for funding during current fiscal year
- N = Not ready for funding during current fiscal year

52.22 STATEMENT OF BASIS. SPECIFIC STATUTORY AUTHORITY, AND PURPOSE (1997 REVISIONS)

The provisions of sections 25-8-202(1)(e) and (g); 25-8-308(1)(d); 37-95-107.6(4) C.R.S., provide the specific statutory authority for adoption of the attached regulatory amendments. The Commission also adopted, in compliance with sections 24-4-103(4) C.R.S., the following statement of basis and purpose.

BASIS AND PURPOSE:

The Intended Use Plan (IUP) is presented to the Water Quality Control Commission each year for agency action and public comment. The plan describes the intent of the Water Pollution Control Revolving Fund (WPCRF) for providing financial assistance to governmental agencies. This year, the IUP also describes the intent for providing hardship grants to eligible communities and how the program may utilize funds from the WPCRF to the Drinking Water Revolving Fund.

Attached to the 1998 IUP as Appendix A is the statewide project priority list showing the current construction needs for all eligible water quality projects including point source wastewater treatment, nonpoint source, ground water, storm water, etc. Also attached as Appendix A-1 is the 1998 Eligibility List additions and modifications. The Eligibility List consists of projects from the priority list that have or will have approved planning documents during the 1998 funding year. Attachment B to the IUP is a chart depicting projects that are expected to be funded from the WPCRF and includes their target date for a binding commitment. Attachment C is a list of projects that may be eligible for hardship grants.

The Commission held a formal public meeting on October 6, 1997 to adopt the 1998 IUP. There were no public comments received on the FY98 IUP which includes the new priority list for providing funds to expanded eligible projects. The Division requested that the Commission add Custer County/San Isabel to the project list during the approval process.

The Commission gave preliminary final approval to the revised version of the FY98 IUP which incorporates the addition of Custer County/San Isabel to the project list, the addition of Campo to Appendix C, the completion of the public comment section, the addition of section numbers to the document and the addition of a key to the letters used in the status column of the lists earlier in the document.

An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall financial statement presentation. We believe that our audit provides a reasonable basis for our opinion.

In our opinion, the financial statements referred to above present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of the Colorado Water Resources and Power Development Authority at December 31, 1997, and the results of its operations and cash flows of its proprietary fund for the year then ended, in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles.

Our audit was made for the purpose of forming an opinion on the financial statements taken as a whole. The combining fund financial statements and other schedules as listed in the Table of Contents as Supplemental Information are presented for purposes of legal compliance and additional analysis and are not a required part of the financial statements of the Colorado Water Resources and Power Development Authority. Such information has been subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the audit of the financial statements and, in our opinion, is fairly stated in all material respects in relation to the financial statements taken as a whole.

In accordance with *Government Auditing Standards*, we have also issued a report dated March 5, 1998, on our consideration of the Colorado Water Resources and Power Development Authority's internal control over financial reporting and our tests of its compliance with certain provisions of laws, regulations, contracts and grants.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

DECEMBER 31, 1997

NOTE 1) ORGANIZATION

The Colorado Water Resources and Power Development Authority (the Authority) is a political subdivision of the State of Colorado established pursuant to the Colorado Water Resources and Power Development Act, Title 37, Article 95 of the Colorado Revised Statutes, 1973, as amended.

Water Operations

The Authority was created to initiate, acquire, construct, maintain, repair and operate or cause to be operated projects for the protection, preservation, conservation, upgrading, development and utilization of the water resources of the State. The Authority is authorized to issue bonds, notes or other obligations which constitute its debt and not debt of the State of Colorado.

The primary activity of the Water Operations Fund is to administer the Small Water Resources Projects Program (SWRP) for which the Authority is authorized to finance water resources projects of \$10 million or less. All costs of project development (except water rights acquisitions, planning and environmental mitigation and documentation) may be financed through the SWRP.

Pursuant to the SWRP, proceeds of the bonds issued by the Authority are to be used to fund loans to local governments. Each local government evidences its obligations under its loan agreement by the issuance to the Authority of a governmental agency bond which is to be secured by a pledge of a specific revenue source or by a general obligation pledge. The repayments pursuant to the loan agreements by the local governments participating in the SWRP are structured, in the aggregate, to provide amounts sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on the bonds issued by the Authority. The SWRP Debt Service Reserve for the bonds issued by the Authority is funded by the Authority from available monies of the Authority. The principal of and interest on the bonds issued by the Authority have been insured as to repayment to the bondholders.

Water Pollution Control Revolving Fund

The Water Pollution Control Revolving Fund (WPCRF) was created by State statute (CRS 37-95-107.6) in response to the mandate from the Federal Clean Water Act of 1987 (Act). The Authority was authorized statutorily to implement the revolving loan portion of the Act. The WPCRF was established for the purpose of financing loans to local governments for the construction of publicly-owned wastewater treatment projects that meet specified eligibility requirements and that are placed on a project eligibility list established in accordance with the State statute.

Pursuant to statutes, with the written consent of the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment, the Authority is authorized, on behalf of the State, to execute all operating agreements and capitalization grant agreements with the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA). The Authority, the Water Quality Control Division of the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment and the Division of Local Government of the Colorado Department of Local Affairs have entered into a Memorandum of Understanding under which each has agreed to assume specified responsibilities in connection with the operation of the WPCRF. The statutes also authorize the Authority to issue bonds for such purposes and to designate assets in the WPCRF that may be pledged and assigned as security for payment of such bonds.

The WPCRF is capitalized through capitalization grants awarded by the EPA. Matching funds are provided by the Authority or its borrowers. In order to receive capitalization grants, matching funds must be provided in a ratio of \$1 of state match for every \$5 (20%) of capitalization grants. Administrative expense reimbursements funded by EPA capitalization grants are limited to a percentage (5/6th of 4%) of the capitalization grants.

The Authority issues bonds to provide loans to local governmental entities, either individually or in pools. Loans to borrowers may be provided from federal grants and/or from bond proceeds. The matching requirement is provided by cash contributions from borrowers or from the Authority in the form of cash.

When a loan to a local governmental entity is provided from the proceeds of bonds, the Authority allocates a portion of its federal capitalization grant to provide for a reserve. Earnings on such federal capitalization grant reserves are used to reduce the amounts payable by the borrower.

Each local government evidences its obligation to the Authority under its loan agreement by the issuance to the Authority of a governmental agency bond which is secured by a pledge of a specific revenue source or by a general obligation pledge. The repayments pursuant to the loan agreements by the local governments participating in the WPCRF are, in the aggregate: to provide amounts sufficient to repay the Authority principal and stated interest (including an administrative surcharge) on direct loans and to repay principal, premium (if any) and interest on the bonds issued by the Authority for the leveraged loans, as well as cash advances or bonds issued to provide the matching requirements, and an administrative surcharge.

Loans are made at or below market interest rates (at terms generally not exceeding 20 years) with principal and interest payments commencing not later than one year after completion of the borrowers' projects.

Drinking Water Revolving Fund

The Drinking Water Revolving Fund (DWRF) was created by State statute (CRS 37-95-107.8) in 1995, in anticipation of the reauthorization of the Federal Safe Drinking Water Act (SDWA). The SDWA was reauthorized in 1996 with a state revolving loan program. The DWRF was established to provide assistance to governmental agencies for projects that appear on the "Drinking Water Project Eligibility List" (List). The List, established in accordance with State statute,

consists of new or existing water management facilities that extend, protect, improve, or replace domestic drinking water supplies in the State of Colorado and for any other means specified in the SDWA.

Pursuant to statutes, with the written consent of the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment, the Authority is authorized, on behalf of the State, to execute all operating agreements and capitalization grant agreements with the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA). The Authority, the Water Quality Control Division of the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment and the Division of Local Government of the Colorado Department of Local Affairs have entered into a Memorandum of Understanding under which each has agreed to assume specified responsibilities in connection with the operation of the DWRF. The statutes also authorize the Authority to issue bonds for such purposes and to designate assets in the DWRF that may be pledged and assigned as security for payment of such bonds.

The DWRF is capitalized through capitalization grants awarded by the EPA. Matching funds are provided by the Authority or its borrowers. In order to receive capitalization grants, matching funds must be provided in a ratio of \$1 of state match for every \$5 (20%) of total capitalization grants before set asides. Administrative expense reimbursements funded by EPA capitalization grants are limited to a percentage (4%) of the capitalization grants.

The Authority issues bonds to provide loans to local governmental entities, either individually or in pools. Loans to borrowers may be provided from federal grants and/or from bond proceeds. The matching requirement is provided by State monies within the DWRF.

When a loan to a local governmental entity is provided from the proceeds of bonds, the Authority allocates a portion of its federal capitalization grant to provide for a reserve. Earnings on such federal capitalization grant reserves are used to reduce the amounts payable by the borrower.

Each local government evidences its obligation to the Authority under its loan agreement by the issuance to the Authority of a governmental agency bond which is secured by a pledge of a specific revenue source or by a general obligation pledge. The repayments pursuant to the loan agreements by the local governments participating in the DWRF are, in the aggregate: to provide amounts sufficient to repay the Authority principal and stated interest (including an administrative surcharge) on direct loans and to repay principal, premium (if any) and interest on the bonds issued by the Authority for the leveraged loans, as well as cash provided to meet the matching requirements, and an administrative surcharge.

Loans are made at or below market interest rates (at terms generally not exceeding 20 years) with principal and interest payments commencing not later than one year after completion of the borrowers' projects.

Prior to receiving the award of the federal capitalization grant, the DWRF loaned State funded monies directly to the borrowers.

Animas - La Plata Escrow Fund

Colorado, New Mexico, the Ute Mountain Ute and Southern Ute Indian Tribes entered into a cost-sharing agreement with the United States Secretary of Interior to construct a dam and reservoir and associated facilities in the Southwest part of Colorado. The United States Department of Interior is in the process of obtaining the applicable permits for the project.

The Authority has committed \$30 million to the project as a portion of the State's federal cost-sharing requirements. The \$30 million and any earnings from the \$30 million are to be held until \$42.4 million is available for the project, at which time additional earnings can be used for other Authority projects. During 1997, \$2,749,882 of earnings were transferred to the Proprietary Fund - Drinking Water Revolving Fund.

At December 31, 1997, the Authority had an accumulated fund balance of \$42,634,823 for this project.

Reporting Entity

The Authority follows the Governmental Accounting Standards Board (GASB) accounting pronouncements which provide guidance for determining which governmental activities, organizations and functions should be included within the financial reporting entity. GASB pronouncements set forth the financial accountability of a governmental organization's governing body as the basic criterion for including a possible component governmental organization in a primary government's legal entity. Financial accountability includes, but is not limited to, appointment of a voting majority of the organization's governing body, ability to impose its will on the organization, a potential for the organization to provide specific financial benefits or burdens and fiscal dependency.

The Authority is not financially accountable for any other organization. Under current GASB pronouncements, the Authority has been determined to be a component unit of the State of Colorado (the primary government). As such, the Authority's financial statements are included in the Comprehensive Annual Financial Statements issued by the State of Colorado.

NOTE 2) SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The more significant accounting policies of the Authority are described as follows:

a) Fund Accounting

The accounts of the Authority are organized on the basis of funds, each of which is considered a separate accounting entity. Fund types used by the Authority are described below.

Proprietary Fund Types

Enterprise Funds - The accounting policies of the Enterprise Funds (Water Operations, Water Pollution Control Revolving Fund and Drinking Water Revolving Fund) conform to generally accepted accounting principles as applicable to governmental units accounted for as proprietary enterprise funds. The enterprise fund is used since the Authority's powers are related to those operated in a manner similar to a financing institution where net income and capital maintenance are appropriate determinations of accountability.

The Authority has elected to follow Governmental Accounting Standards Board pronouncements. Therefore, statements issued by the Financial Accounting Standards Board after November 30, 1989 are not applied.

Fiduciary Fund Types

Expendable Trust Fund - The Expendable Trust Fund is used to account for assets held by the Authority in its trustee capacity (related to the Animas - La Plata Escrow Fund) on the original principal and accumulated income which may be expended in the course of designated operations.

Agency Funds - Agency Funds are used to account for assets held by the Authority as an agent for local governmental units. These assets consist primarily of unspent bond proceeds restricted for future construction. Agency funds are custodial in nature and do not involve measurement of results of operations.

b) Basis of Accounting

The accrual basis of accounting is utilized in the proprietary fund types. Revenue is recognized when earned, and expenses are recognized when the liability is incurred. Expenditures for loans and advances made and for furniture and fixtures are shown as increases in assets, and redemption of bonds and notes are recorded as a reduction in liabilities. Grants are recorded as contributed capital when earned.

The modified accrual basis of accounting is followed in the expendable trust fund and agency funds. Revenue is recorded when susceptible to accrual, i.e., both measurable and available. Available means collectible within the current period or soon enough thereafter to be used to pay liabilities of the current period. The major source of revenue which is susceptible to accrual is investment income. Expenditures are recorded when the liability is incurred.

c) Budgets

In accordance with the State Budget Law, the Authority's Board of Directors holds public hearings in the fall of each year to approve the budget and appropriate the funds for the ensuing year. The appropriation is at the total fund expenditures level and lapses at year end. The Authority's Board of Directors can modify the budget between spending categories, and the Authority's Executive Director can modify the budget within spending categories, within the total appropriation without notification. The total appropriation can only be amended upon completion of notification and publication requirements.

The budget includes each fund on its basis of accounting unless otherwise indicated.

Encumbrance accounting (open purchase orders, contracts in process and other commitments for the expenditures of funds in future periods) is not used by the Authority for budget or financial reporting purposes.

d) Cash Equivalents

For purposes of the statement of cash flows, the Authority considers cash deposits, money market mutual funds, investment pools, U.S. Government obligations, repurchase agreements and other highly liquid investments with a maturity of three months or less when purchased to be cash equivalents.

e) Furniture and Fixtures

Furniture and fixtures are recorded at cost. Depreciation expense has been computed using the straight-line method over the estimated economic useful lives.

f) Amortization

The deferred costs on bond refundings and original issue discounts are amortized using the interest method over the life of the outstanding bonds. The amortization amount is a component of interest expense, and the unamortized deferred costs and original issue discount costs are reflected as a reduction of bonds payable.

Reimbursements of original issue discount received from borrowers at closing is reflected as deferred revenue. The deferred revenue is being amortized using the interest method over the life of the loans receivable and is reflected as a component of interest income.

g) Accrual for Compensated Absences

The Authority has a policy which allows employees to accumulate unused vacation and sick leave benefits up to a certain maximum number of days. Compensated absences are recognized as current salary costs as accumulated.

h) Advance

The Water Operations Fund makes advances to the WPCRF for the purpose of financing the WPCRF's capitalization grant matching requirements. The advance is noninterest bearing. The advance is repaid based upon a usage formula related to administrative fees collected by the WPCRF from the borrowers.

i) Totals (Memorandum Only)

Total columns on the combined statements are captioned "(Memorandum Only)" because they do not represent consolidated financial information and are presented only to facilitate financial analysis. Data in these columns do not present financial position, in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles. Interfund eliminations have not been made in the aggregation of this data.

j) Comparative Data

Comparative total data for the prior year have been presented in the accompanying financial statements in order to provide an understanding of changes in the Authority's financial position, operations and cash flows. However, comparative data have not been presented in all statements because their inclusion would make certain statements unduly complex and difficult to understand.

NOTE 3) CASH AND INVESTMENTS

Cash Deposits

The Colorado Public Deposit Protection Act (PDPA) requires that all units of Colorado government deposit cash in eligible public depositories. Eligibility is determined by State regulators. Amounts on deposit in excess of federal insurance levels must be collateralized. The eligible collateral is determined by the PDPA. PDPA allows the institution to create a single collateral pool for all public funds. The pool for all the uninsured public deposits as a group is to be maintained by another institution or held in trust. The market value of the collateral must be at least equal to the aggregate uninsured deposits.

The State regulatory commissions for banks and financial services are required by statute to monitor the naming of eligible depositories and reporting of the uninsured deposits and assets maintained in the collateral pools.

At December 31, 1997, the Authority's cash deposits had a bank balance and a carrying balance as follows:

Investments

Colorado statutes specify investment instruments meeting defined rating and risk criteria in which Colorado governmental units may invest, which include:

- Obligations of the United States and certain U.S. government agency securities
- Certain international agency securities
- General obligation and revenue bonds of U.S. local government entities
- Bankers' acceptances of certain banks
- . Commercial paper
- Written repurchase agreements collateralized by certain authorized securities
- Certain money market mutual funds
- Guaranteed investment contracts
- . Local government investment pools

The Authority's investments are recorded at amortized cost and are categorized below to give an indication of the level of credit risk assumed by the Authority at year end. Category 1 includes investments that are insured or registered or for which the securities are held by the entity or its agent in the Authority's name. Category 2 includes uninsured and unregistered investments for which the securities are held by the broker's or dealer's trust department or agent in the Authority's name. Category 3 includes uninsured and unregistered investments for which the securities are held by the broker or dealer, or by its trust department or agent or agent but not in the Authority's name.

Category 3 investments include investments held by trustees pursuant to bond indentures. These investments were acquired by the trustees at the direction of the Authority. Investments of U.S. Treasury notes and bonds are held in the trustee's bank's account at the Federal Reserve in book entry form. Consequently, the trustees are considered to be the purchaser as well as the custodian of the investments.

Investments in local government investment pools or in money market mutual funds are not categorized because they are not evidenced by securities that exist in physical or book entry form.

Cash held by State Treasurer has been invested in the State Treasurer's cash pool. A detailed composition of the cash and investments in this pool is available in the annual State Treasurer's Report.

Colorado Local Government Liquid Asset Trust (the Trust), is an investment vehicle established for local government entities in Colorado to pool surplus funds. The Trust operates similarly to a money market fund and each share is equal in value to \$1.00. The Trust offers shares in two portfolios, COLOTRUST PRIME and COLOTRUST PLUS+. Both portfolios may invest in U.S. Treasury securities and repurchase agreements collateralized by U.S. Treasury securities. COLOTRUST PLUS+ may also invest in certain obligations of U.S. government agencies, highest rated commercial paper and repurchase agreements collateralized by certain obligations of U.S. government agencies. A designated custodial bank serves as custodian for the Trust's portfolios pursuant to a custodian agreement. The custodian acts as safekeeping agent for the Trust's investment portfolios and provides services as the depository in connection with direct investments and withdrawals. The custodian's internal records segregate investments owned by the Trust. As of December 31, 1997, the Authority had \$11,707,698 invested in COLOTRUST PRIME.

As of December 31, 1997, the Authority had invested \$18,681,643 in the Stagecoach Treasury Money Market Mutual Fund. The Stagecoach Treasury Money Market Mutual Fund is a money market mutual fund which may invest only in obligations issued or guaranteed by the U.S. Treasury such as bills, notes, bonds, strips and certificates of indebtedness and repurchase agreements and reverse repurchase agreements related to such U.S. Treasury obligations and STRIPS.

As of December 31, 1997, the Authority had invested \$1,981,354 in the Milestone Treasury Obligation Portfolio. This Fund is a money market mutual fund which may invest only in U.S. Treasury obligations and repurchase agreements fully collateralized by U.S. Treasury obligations.

The Water Pollution Control Revolving Fund direct loans receivable which had original amounts of \$11,124,334, have interest rates of 1.431% up to 5.17% and have maturity dates of 2000 to 2017. Leveraged loans receivable which had original amounts of \$193,477,039, have interest rates of 3.77% to 5.2% and have scheduled final maturity dates of 2009 to 2017.

Water Operations Fund - Small Water Resources Program loans receivable which had original amounts of \$76,980,000, have interest rates of 2.7% to 7.10% and have scheduled final maturity dates of October 2000 to October 2017.

All of the Authority Small Water Resources Program bonds and the Series 1989A and Series 1990A Clean Water Revenue Bonds and Series 1989A and Series 1990A State Match Revenue Bonds are insured as to payment of principal and interest by Financial Guaranty Insurance Company. The Clean Water Revenue Bonds, Series 1992A are insured as to payment of principal and interest by Financial Security Assurance, Inc. The Wastewater Revolving Fund Refunding Revenue Bonds, Series 1996A are insured as to payment of principal and interest by AMBAC Indemnity Corporation.

The outstanding bonds had original principal amounts of \$83,565,000 for Small Water Resources Program, \$179,730,000 of Clean Water Revenue Bonds, \$7,040,000 of State Match Revenue Bonds, \$28,950,000 of Wastewater Revolving Fund Refunding Revenue Bonds and \$24,095,000 for Drinking Water Revolving Fund Bonds, for a total of \$323,380,000. The bonds are payable semiannually with interest rates ranging from 2.7% to 7.4% and serial and term principal maturities, including mandatory call provisions, through the year 2018. All of the bonds, except the Small Water Resources Series 1996B and the Wastewater Revolving Fund Refunding Revenue Bonds Series 1996A, have optional initial call provisions through 2008, generally eight years from the issue date with maximum call premiums of 2% and decreasing to no premium.

The bond resolutions authorizing the various bond issues contain general provisions and provisions related to accounting and financial operations of the Authority. Management of the Authority believes they are in substantial compliance with these provisions. All Small Water Resources loan repayments which were due in 1997 were received as scheduled. The Small Water Resources Projects Fund received revenue from loan repayments which were due from November 1, 1996, to October 1, 1997, of \$5,998,637. Small Water Resources bond payments totaling \$5,998,637 were made on May 1, 1997, and November 1, 1997.

The Authority has provided a Debt Service Bond Reserve Fund at least equal to the debt service reserve requirement under the Small Water Resources Bond Resolution. At December 31, 1997, the Small Water Resources Debt Service Reserve Fund amounted to \$8,500,000 and was fully funded. The Authority can issue up to \$150,000,000 of Small Water Resources Revenue Bonds at the current funding level for the Small Water Debt Service Reserve Fund. At December 31, 1997, the Authority had \$64,770,000 of outstanding Small Water Resources Revenue Bonds.

NOTE 7) PUBLIC EMPLOYEES' RETIREMENT ASSOCIATION OF COLORADO

The Authority participates in the State Division Trust Fund, a cost-sharing multiple-employer defined benefit pension plan administered by the Public Employees' Retirement Association of Colorado (PERA). The Trust provides retirement and disability and death benefits for its members or their beneficiaries. All employees and board members are members of the Trust. Colorado State Statutes have assigned the Colorado Legislature the authority to establish benefit provisions of the trust. PERA issues a publicly available annual financial report that includes financial statements and required supplementary information for the Trust. A copy of PERA's annual report may be obtained by calling PERA'S Infoline at 1-800-759-PERA.

The financial statements of the Trust are prepared using the accrual basis of accounting. Plan member contributions are recognized in the period in which the contributions are due. Benefits and refunds are recognized when due and payable in accordance with the terms of the plan. Trust investments are presented at fair value except for short-term investments which are recorded at cost, which approximates market.

Plan members and the Authority are required to contribute at rates set by Colorado Statutes. The contribution rate for members is 8% and for the Authority is 11.5% of covered salary. The Authority's contributions to the Trust for the years ending December 31, 1997, 1996 and 1995 were \$47,174, \$41,684 and \$34,910, respectively, which was equal to the Authority's required contributions for each year.

Additionally, Trust members of the Authority may voluntarily contribute to the Voluntary Investment Program (VIP), an Internal Revenue Code Section 401(K) defined contribution plan administered by PERA. VIP participation is voluntary and contributions are separate from others made to PERA. State statutes have assigned the State Legislature the authority to establish VIP plan provisions.

The VIP is funded by voluntary member contributions of up to 18% of their covered salary. No employer contributions are required. Eight employees of the Authority participated in the VIP Plan and made contributions amounting to \$32,908 during the year ended December 31, 1997.

NOTE 8) COMMITMENTS AND CONTINGENCIES

Operating Leases

The Authority leases office facilities under an operating lease which expires on December 31, 2000. Total rental expense for the year ended December 31, 1997, was \$73,312. The future minimum annual rental commitments under this lease are \$82,380 for 1998, and \$85,729 annually for 1999 and 2000.

NOTE 9) TAX, SPENDING AND DEBT LIMITATIONS

In November 1992, the voters of Colorado approved Amendment 1, referred to as the Taxpayer's Bill of Rights (TABOR), which added a new Section 20 to Article X of the Colorado Constitution. TABOR contains tax, spending, revenue and debt limitations which apply to the State of Colorado and all local governments.

Enterprises, defined as government-owned businesses authorized to issue revenue bonds and receiving less than 10% of annual revenue in grants from all state and local governments combined, are excluded from the provisions of TABOR. The Authority's management believes that its operations qualify for this exclusion.

The Authority's management believes it is in compliance with the provisions of TABOR. However, TABOR is complex and subject to interpretation. Many of the provisions, including the qualification as an Enterprise, may require judicial interpretation.

NOTE 10) RISK MANAGEMENT

The Authority is exposed to various risks of loss related to torts; thefts of, damage to, or destruction of assets; errors or omissions; injuries to employees; or acts of God. The Authority maintains commercial insurance for most all risks of loss. Settled claims have not exceeded this commercial coverage in any of the past three fiscal years.

NOTE 11) SUBSEQUENT EVENT

Refunding

On January 7, 1998, the Authority advance refunded and defeased (debt legally satisfied) portions of the following issues

with the issuance of 12,500,000 Small Water Resources Revenue Bonds 1997 Series B dated January 1, 1998, with an average interest rate of 4.9%. After the closing on January 7, 1998, the defeased bonds are not considered a liability of the Authority since sufficient funds (12,155,325) were deposited with a trustee and invested in U.S. government securities for the purpose of paying the principal and interest of the defeased bonds when due.

The Authority reduced its aggregate debt service payments by approximately \$940,000 over the next 15 years and obtained an economic gain (difference between the present values of the old and new debt service payments) of approximately \$656,000.
