

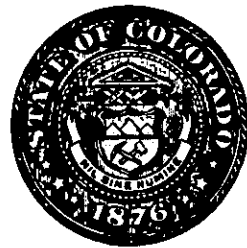

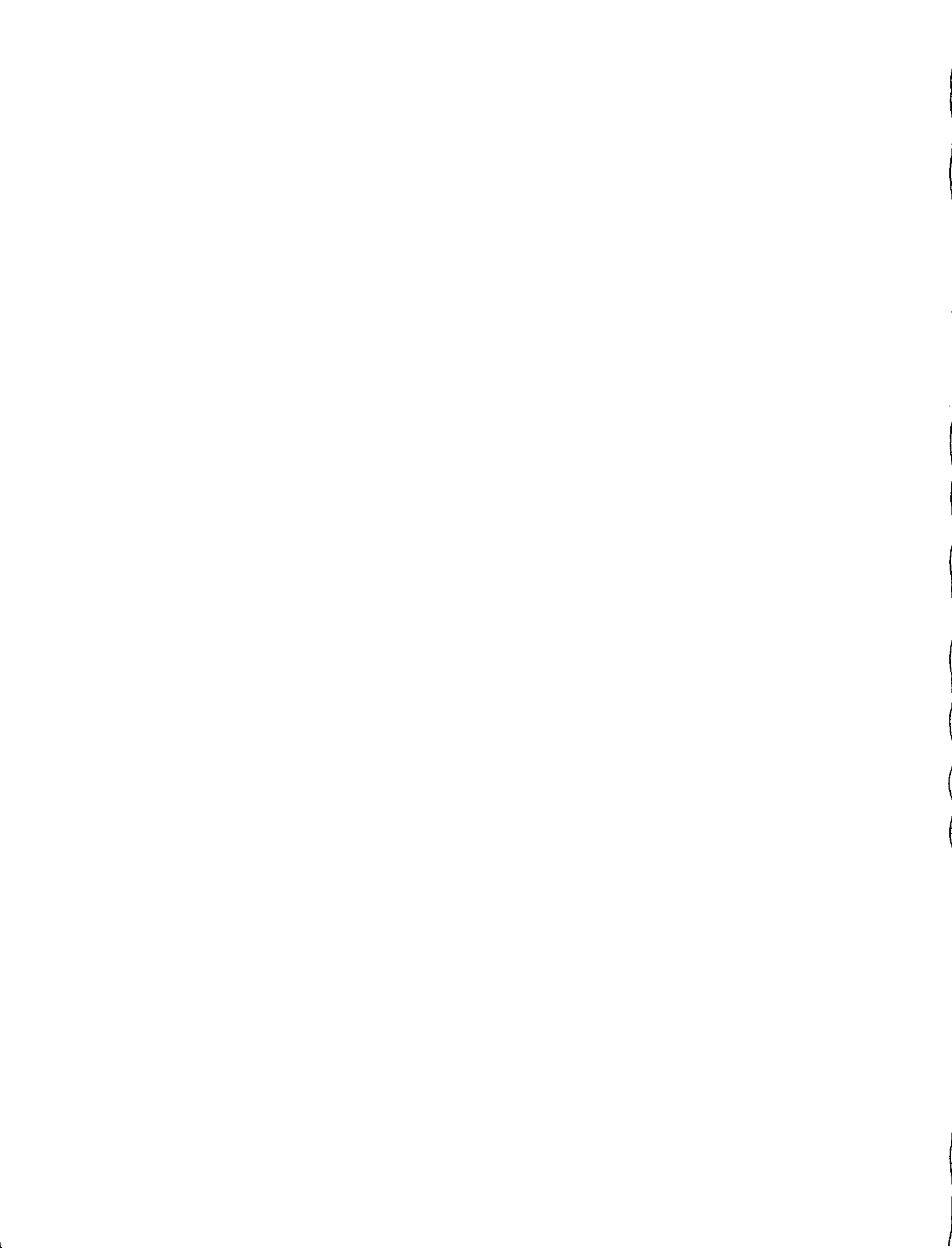

1963, C.R.S. 137-3-19, as amended, provides: "As soon after the end of the calendar year, as may be practicable, the Property Tax Administrator shall prepare a report covering the activities of the Division of Property Taxation during such calendar year. Such report shall set forth the aggregate valuation for assessment of all taxable property in the State and in each county thereof, by classes and subclasses, for the two latest calendar years, the levies imposed by each political subdivision during the preceding calendar year, and the aggregate amount of taxes produced by such levies in the State and each county thereof, together with such other information as the Administrator deems necessary. Such report shall be published in accordance with fiscal rules promulgated by the Controller pursuant to the provisions of Section 3-3-17, C.R.S., 1963. Copies of the report shall be furnished to the Governor and members of the General Assembly, and made available for distribution to the public."

SCHOOL BONDS

The 1972 Session Laws amended 1963, C.R.S. 123-11-5, to provide that "Each school district shall have a limit of bonded indebtedness of 20% of the latest valuation for assessment of the taxable property in such district as certified by the assessor to the Board of County Commissioners." This supposedly eliminated the requirement for permission to exceed a bonded indebtedness which would exceed 10% of the assessed value of the district. However, bond counsel has raised questions concerning the constitutionality of the 1972 enactment. The Attorney General has issued an opinion that if permission to exceed the 10% limitation is requested, the Property Tax Administrator and the Director of the Division of Local Government may approve such request purely as an accommodation to the school district without representation of legal authority, therefore, such applications to incur indebtedness in excess of 10% of the assessed value of the district were received and were approved as an accommodation to the district. The total amount thus approved was \$42,682,000.

PUBLIC UTILITIES

The Property Tax Administrator assessed 15 railroad companies, 1 miscellaneous transportation company, 99 private car lines, 16 air lines, 5 electric companies, 31 rural electric companies, 47 telephone companies, 1 telegraph company, 10 gas companies, 6 gas pipe line carrier companies, 15 pipe line companies, 8 domestic water companies and 2 irrigation water companies. These 256 utilities have a total assessed value of \$688,025,440. This is an increase of \$71,132,030, or an increase of 11.5% over 1972.

APPLICATIONS FOR ABATEMENT

1963, C.R.S. 137-3-16, as amended, provides: "The Property Tax Administrator shall review each application submitted by the Board of Equalization of any county for abatement or refund of taxes, and if such application is found to be in proper form and recommended in conformity with the law, the application shall be approved, otherwise it shall be disapproved." During the calendar period 1973, 1507 applications for abatement or refund of taxes totaling \$729,963,08 were approved and 13 applications for abatement or refund of taxes totaling \$15,111.25 were disapproved.

EXEMPT PROPERTY

The Administrator is required by C.R.S. 137-3-17 to determine the exemption from general taxation of property owned and used solely and exclusively for religious worship, for schools and for strictly charitable purposes. During the year the Division received 415 applications for the exemption of property from general taxation; 240 were for property claimed to be used for religious worship, 160 were for property claimed to be used for strictly charitable purposes, and 15 were for property claimed to be used for schools. The Division processed 426 applications for exemption; 311 were granted exemption, 26 were granted exemption in part, 72 were denied exemption and 17 were returned to the respective county assessors or to the claimant as not being subject to determination by the Administrator. Eleven appeals were heard by the Administrator; 2 were granted and 9 were denied. At year end there were 127 applications in various stages of processing. The Division also has the responsibility of examining the annual reports required to be filed by the owners of property which has previously been granted exemption as being owned

and used for religious worship, for schools and for strictly charitable purposes to determine if such property continues to qualify for such exemption.

The Division mailed 5,457 pre-printed reporting forms to owners of exempt property followed by 532 second notices to those who had failed to return the reports by the due date.

A total of 5,197 reports were returned by the owners and were reviewed by the Division. Field investigations were made in a number of instances where exemption of the property appeared questionable, and orders were issued revoking the exemption of 17 parcels of property having an estimated actual value of \$524,500.

The Division issued 55 notices declaring a forfeiture of the exemption of property for which the owner had failed to file a report for two or more years. Thirty two of these were rescinded upon adequate showing by the owner that the property was eligible for continued exemption.

C.R.S. 137-2-1 (8) (a) (iv) makes specific provisions for exemption of senior citizen apartment projects. The Division reviewed 37 such projects providing 3,942 apartments, the exemption of which is dependent upon the occupants meeting with the limitations provided as to age, income and assets. On the basis of certifications filed by the project owners, the Administrator determined that 45% of the units in such projects were entitled to exemption.

Forty-six counties have requested that the Division review on its behalf the continued exemption of property used as rectory, parsonage, manse, etc.

In mid-October a full-time field investigator was added to the exempt property section staff resulting in a substantial reduction to the backlog of pending applications. This will also enable the Division to increase the number of field investigations of presently exempt property and is expected to result in returning a considerable amount of presently exempt property to a taxable status.

Appeals were filed with the Board of Assessment Appeals relative to five applications for exemption which were denied by the Administrator. In three cases the Board sustained the action of the Administrator, one was dismissed at the request of the petitioner and one was dismissed on motion of the Administrator.

APPRAISAL SECTION

The Appraisal Section's efforts were devoted primarily to aid and assistance programs for assessors and employees of the assessor's office; research and development; the education and training of assessors and employees; and the equalization of values.

AID AND ASSISTANCE

The Appraisal Section assisted county assessors during 1973 in the valuation of both simple and complex properties, in training new staff members; in the installation of more efficient office systems, in improving mapping systems, and in property valuation reviews.

Many specific commercial and industrial real property appraisals were completed at the request of various assessors. All appraisals made by the Section were done in conjunction with assessors' staff personnel.

In addition numerous residential appraisals were made in Douglas, Lincoln, Park, and San Juan counties, and assistance in valuation of subdivision lands was rendered to ten counties.

Thirteen counties requested and received assistance in determining values of leased computer and electronic equipment. Assistance in the realm of improving existing or proposed mapping systems was given to 27 counties. More efficient record keeping and office systems were installed in 3 counties.

The Appraisal Section staff also conducted training programs for new employees of the assessors in 8 counties. Property valuation reviews were conducted in specific counties upon request.

RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT

The Appraisal Section issued updated manuals for the use of the assessor. These included updated improvement costs for the Residential Appraisal Manual, additional and updated costs for the Agricultural Equipment Manual, and new Cost Factoring Tables. In addition to these manuals, an updated supplement to the Mobile Equipment Manual has been provided to the County Clerks.

Area building cost factors were developed for Garfield and Pitkin Counties. Research has been conducted in Grand, Routt, Summit, and Kit Carson Counties so that building cost factors may also be developed for these areas. Numerous costs have been researched to aid the Appraisal Section staff in the valuation of specialized properties and to enable assessors to update their appraisal records.

Research was conducted throughout the state to determine grazing land carrying capacities, crop yields, commodity prices, and landlord income and expense figures to aid in the valuation of agricultural lands; livestock prices were also researched.

EDUCATION AND TRAINING

Area schools were conducted at several locations throughout the state for assessors and their employees. The proper valuation of residential properties was the subject of the first

area schools. Other schools were conducted on the valuation of subdivisions and commercial properties, with particular emphasis on condominiums and planned unit developments. A third school was held in Delta on valuation of orchard lands, and a mapping school was held at Southern Colorado State College in Pueblo.

The 14th Annual Colorado Assessors School was held October 1-5, 1973, at the University of Colorado in Boulder. Student attendance totaled 275. Five courses were offered consisting of Basic, Residential, Commercial, Personal Property, and one advanced course on the Valuation of Subdivision Lands.

Study and planning is presently being devoted to the possible restructuring and revision of these annual schools. Such action should allow for a more flexible curriculum, and utilize more efficiently the latest techniques and methods of instruction for continuing education.

EQUALIZATION

An equalization staff was created in September of 1973 for the purpose of making appraisal ratio studies to determine whether counties are in need of a reappraisal. Counties to be studied are selected on the basis of their degree of deviation from a 30 percent assessment ratio as shown by sales ratio indicators. In making the appraisal ratio studies, recent sales are selected, confirmed, and a physical inspection made of the properties. Using the six factors as provided in 137-1-3, the properties are valued and comparisons are then made to the assessor's valuations.

Appraisal ratio studies have been conducted in Crowley, Grand, Douglas, San Miguel, and San Juan Counties.

The Board of Assessment Appeals has ordered the Division of Property Taxation to conduct a study in Boulder County to determine whether a reappraisal is needed. It also ordered the Division to make a reappraisal of all selected properties in Summit County.

An annual audit was made in each county to determine procedures, techniques, and compliance with taxation statutes as they relate to selected subclasses of property. The results were analyzed and reported to the State Board of Equalization. In addition, sixteen county assessors were consulted by the Division regarding the annual audits and the Abstracts of Assessment of their counties.

During 1973, the Appraisal Section concluded the audit of 38 counties regarding the agricultural land formula as implemented by the State Board of Equalization. This concluded a two-year appraisal audit of the 63 counties and their utilization of the agricultural land formula.

SALES VALUATION REPORT

The seventh annual sales assessment analysis report was completed and released to local government and other interested agencies. This report is part of the ongoing request of the various state agencies involved in the study of equalization. The sales assessment analysis is also used by the Division of Property Taxation and the various county assessors as indicators of equalization factors portrayed by the sales data.

The sales information is processed through the Division of Automatic Data Processing with various levels of reports. The analysis reports are furnished to the counties as part of the cost sharing work programs of the Division of Property Taxation. The cumulative or annual report contains the current year's sales analysis, as well as the cumulative three-year sales analysis. The information is characterized by county, by property type, and by age groupings within classes of property. The data is presented in statistical and graphical means of portraying the sales information for interpretation by the interested groups. The 1973-1974 sales will further be subjected to analysis within each county by geographic areas known as City Area, Township Area, or Subdivision Area. This is a further attempt to portray the valuation information on a more meaningful level for the counties.

The continued inflation of the economy through the fiscal year 1972-1973 is reflected in all sales analysis reports. The majority of the sales indicate a continuation of the downward trend of the sales assessment ratios. Since the sales analysis is limited to residential and commercial properties, and most counties have not recently effected reappraisal programs of these properties, there still exists a wide disparity between the sales and the assessor's actual value. Commercial properties continue to reflect higher sales ratios than residential, and unimproved properties continue to reflect lower assessment ratios than corresponding improved properties.

DATA PROCESSING AND STATE-COUNTY COST SHARING

The State-County cost sharing consists primarily of a data bank concept for the storage of property record information and ADP programs designed to effect valuation data by property or groups of properties. The Division completed during the last year the cost calculation programs. These programs establish current cost information, both for manual application and machine application, and for the updating of improvement information. The Division of Property Taxation also has sales analysis

programs by property, which is an ongoing part of the ADP system and is covered in a special section of this report. The agency continued and established final ADP specifications for the data bank record aspects of the State-County data processing systems. The Division will complete in 1973-1974 the data bank programs

which will allow updating of property records on a cost basis and the beginning of a correlation program to relate this level of value to the sales level of value. The State agency and the county agency will then have access to automated techniques for value analysis work.

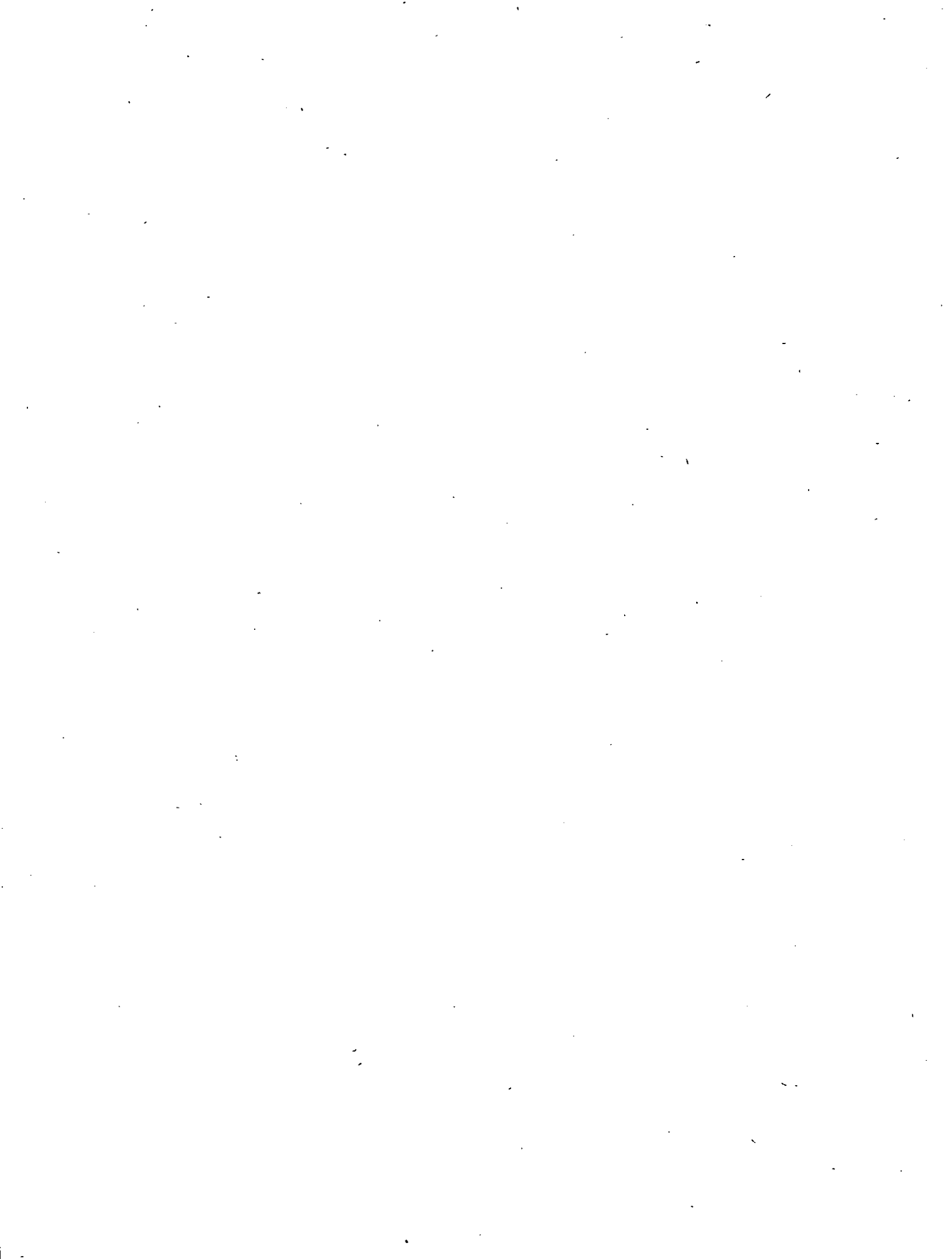

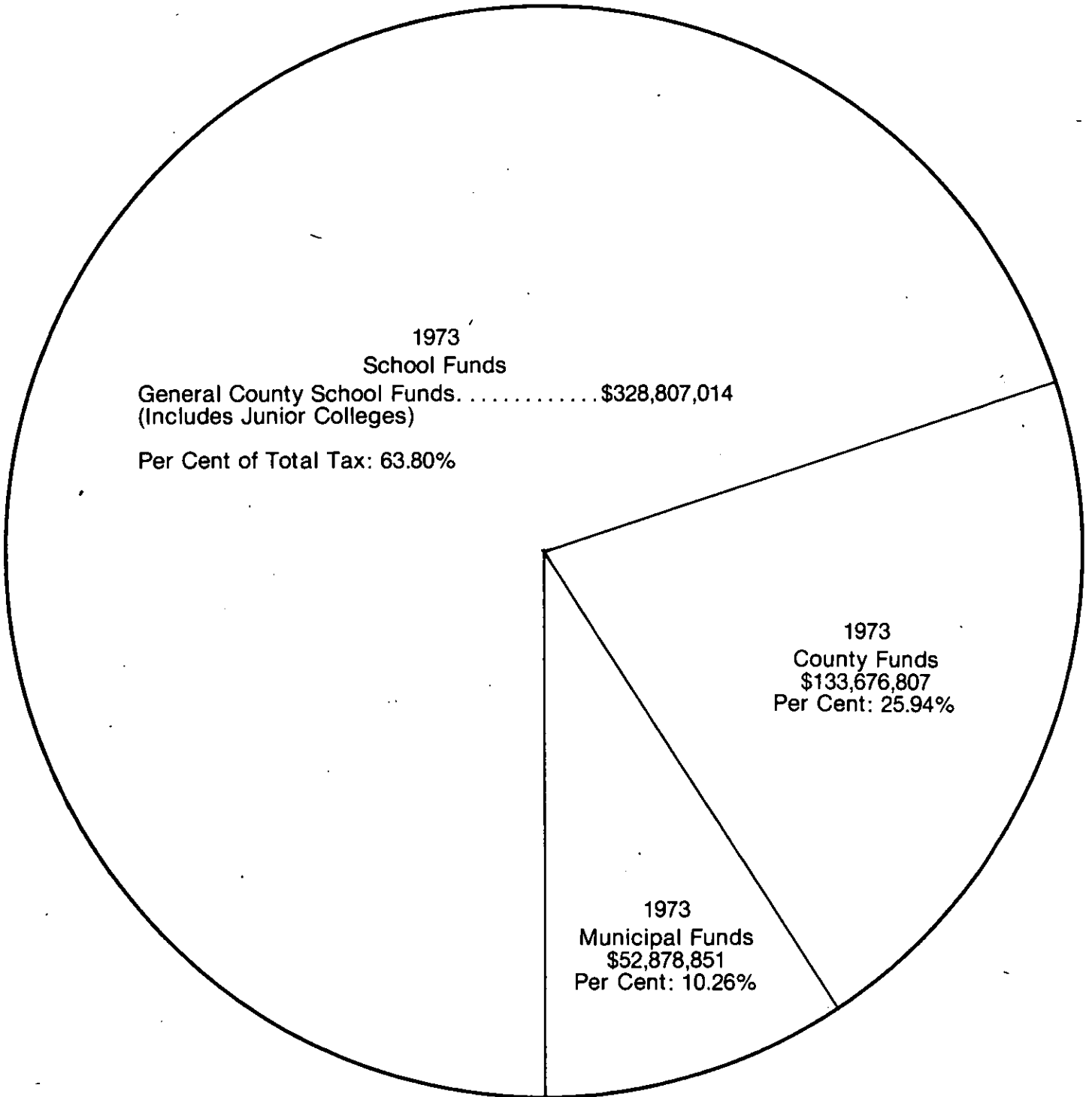
