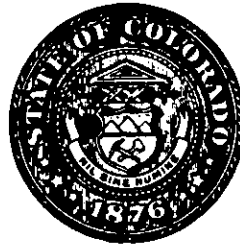

**FIFTH ANNUAL REPORT**  
of the  
**PROPERTY TAX ADMINISTRATOR**  
to the  
**GOVERNOR AND THE LEGISLATURE**

1973 C.R.S. 39-2-119 provides: "As soon after the end of the calendar year as may be practicable, the Property Tax Administrator shall prepare a report covering the activities of the Division of Property Taxation during such calendar year. Such report shall set forth the aggregate valuation for assessment of all taxable property in the State and in each county thereof, by classes and subclasses, for the two latest calendar years, the levies imposed by each political subdivision during the preceding calendar year, and the aggregate amount of taxes produced by such levies in the State and each county thereof, together with such other information as the Administrator deems necessary. Such report shall be published in accordance with fiscal rules promulgated by the Controller pursuant to Section 24-30-208, C.R.S. 1973. Copies of the report shall be furnished to the Governor and members of General Assembly, and made available for distribution to the public."

### **PUBLIC UTILITIES**

For the tax year 1975 the Property Tax Administrator assessed 16 railroad companies, 112 private car lines, 19 air lines, 5 electric companies, 37 rural electric companies, 50 telephone companies, 1 telegraph company, 9 gas companies, 8 gas pipe line carrier companies, 14 pipe line companies, 9 domestic water companies, and 2 irrigation water companies. These 282 utilities have a total assessed value of \$841,453,910. This is an increase of \$68,118,980, or an increase of 8.8% over 1974.

### **APPLICATIONS FOR ABATEMENT**

1973 C.R.S. 39-2-116 provides: "The Property Tax Administrator shall review each application submitted by the Board of County Commissioners or the Board of Equalization of any county for abatement or refund of taxes, and if such application is found to be in proper form and recommended in conformity with the law, the application shall be approved; otherwise, it shall be disapproved." During the calendar period 1975, 1,928 applications for abatement or refund of taxes totaling \$1,162,246 were approved; and 9 applications for abatement or refund of taxes totaling \$7,369 were disapproved.

### **EXEMPT PROPERTY**

The Administrator is required by 1973 C.R.S. 39-2-117 to determine the exemption from general taxation

of property owned and used solely and exclusively for religious worship, for schools and for strictly charitable purposes.

During the year the Division received 528 applications for the exemption of property from general taxation, 329 were for property claimed to be used for religious worship, 170 were for property claimed to be used for strictly charitable purposes, and 29 were for property claimed to be used for schools.

The Division processed 530 applications for exemption; 359 were granted, 55 were granted in part, 102 were denied, 14 were returned to the respective county assessors or to the claimant as not being subject to determination by the Administrator, and at year end there were 86 applications in various stages of processing.

The Division also has the responsibility of examining the annual reports required to be filed by the owners of property which has previously been granted exemption as being owned and used for religious worship, for schools and for strictly charitable purposes to determine if such property continues to qualify for such exemption.

The Division mailed 5,669 pre-printed reporting forms to owners of exempt property followed by 403 second notices to those who had failed to return the reports by the due date. Field investigations were made in a number of instances where exemption of the property appeared questionable and orders were issued revoking the exemption of 58 parcels of property having an estimated actual value of \$3,034,700.

The Division issued 197 notices declaring a forfeiture of the exemption of property for which the owner had failed to file a report. Of these 169 were rescinded upon adequate showing by the owner that the property was eligible for continued exemption. The remaining 28 representing property which was returned to the tax roll had an estimated value of \$1,187,100.

1973 C.R.S. 39-3-101 (1) (g) (1) (c) makes specific provisions for exemption of certain senior citizen apartment projects. The Division reviewed 44 such projects having 4,894 apartments and found that 61% of such apartment units were entitled to exemption.

Hearings were held by the Administrator on twenty petitions for reconsideration and four appeals were heard by the Board of Assessment Appeals relative to applications for exemption which had been denied. In

three cases the denial was sustained and in the fourth a partial exemption was allowed.

The Denver District Court affirmed the action of the Administrator and Board of Assessment Appeals in two cases wherein the application for exemption had been denied and the Supreme Court upheld the revocation of the exemption of land leased to a charitable organization, holding that such property must be owned by the person or entity using it for charitable purposes in order to qualify for exemption.

## APPRAISAL SECTION

The Appraisal Section's efforts were devoted primarily to aid and assistance programs for assessors and their employees; research and development; education and training of assessors and their employees; and the equalization of values.

### RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT

The Appraisal Section revised and updated the annual "Appraisal Procedures and Instructions for 1976." This circular provides guidelines for the valuation of all classification of property. Updated supplements were issued for the Agricultural Equipment Manual, Cost Factoring Tables, and the Property Classification and Identification Handbook.

New manuals were developed on mapping specifications and on oil and gas equipment. The Oil and Gas Equipment Manual is the first manual to be released with current replacement costs for this type of property.

A new form was designed and published for use of taxpayers who have solar energy-heated and cooled homes. This was occasioned by a 1975 amendment of the property tax laws.

The manual for valuation of mobile machinery and self-propelled construction equipment was updated and published. This manual, though published by the Division of Property Taxation, is used by the Department of Revenue and the county clerks.

Numerous costs have been researched to aid in the valuation of specialized property and to enable assessors to update their appraisal records. Research has been conducted for the residential replacement cost manual, and this manual has been issued to all assessors based on costs developed for their area. A time factor was developed in July 1975 to be applied to the commercial and industrial replacement cost manual to assist assessors during this inflationary period. Research was conducted throughout the state to determine agricultural commodity prices, crop yields, landlord income and expense figures to aid in the

evaluation of agricultural lands. Livestock prices were developed from statistics provided by the Colorado Crop and Livestock Reporting Service. Research was conducted in those areas where statistics were unavailable from the Colorado Crop and Livestock Reporting Service.

A publication, "Guidelines for Reappraisal" was prepared and distributed to all counties. It sets forth recommendations as to how reappraisal programs can be initiated, conducted, and implemented.

### EDUCATION AND TRAINING

Area schools were conducted at several locations throughout the state for assessors and their employees. Schools were conducted on mapping and natural resources, agricultural, commercial, residential, and oil and gas equipment assessments.

A special area school was conducted for assessors and their staffs on methods and procedures for appraising land of all types. This school was held in different areas of the state during the month of November. Several seminars were held on administrative remedies and of taxpayer reviews, and on the statutes that govern during these times.

During 1975 the Division completed several packaged programs through the use of slide and cassette audio visual equipment. "Guidelines to Classification" and "Orientation for new Assessors" were completed for assessors, their employees, and groups of interested citizens. These programs present methods and application in appraisal of property for ad valorem purposes and general knowledge of all forms, manuals and documents as utilized by the Division of Property Taxation.

The 16th Annual Colorado Assessors School was held during the weeks of October 6 through 10, 1975, and October 13 through 17, 1975, at the University of Colorado in Boulder. Increased enrollment caused two separate weekly sessions. Student attendance totaled 291. The school offered seven courses consisting of Basic, Residential, Commercial, Personal Property II, Personal Property III, General Office, and Assessor's Administration.

In preparation for the annual school, members of the Appraisal Section staff took part in the special three-day teaching seminar. This provides staff instructors with new techniques, procedures, and knowledge in conducting an effective school.

### AID AND ASSISTANCE

1975 C.R.S. 39-2-109 (1) (b) provides: It is the duty of the property tax administrator, and he shall have



and exercise authority: To assist and cooperate in the administration of all laws concerning the valuing of taxable property, the assessment of same, and the levying of property taxes.

The aid and assistance staff completed work in all sixty-three assessors' offices during the calendar year 1975. Some of the assistance given was in the fields of: training assessment personnel; installation of more efficient office systems; individual property valuation reviews; personal property audit procedures; mapping and parcel identification systems; leased equipment and computer assessments and cable TV assessments.

Many individual property appraisals of all types were made at the request of the various assessors. In seven counties staff assistance resulted in the complete inventorying and valuation of all oil and gas equipment.

In connection with these appraisals, appearances and testimony were made at hearings of the State Board of Assessment Appeals. Three counties were involved with the Division in the appraisal and assessment of oil and gas equipment. This case was appealed to the State Board of Assessment Appeals, and Division personnel presented the case jointly with county representation.

Presently 28 counties are in various stages of implementing the state recommended system of mapping and parcel identification. In 1975, Alamosa, Moffat, Montezuma, Otero, and Ouray counties began mapping programs.

Subsequent to the State Board of Equalization orders on September 22, 1975, the aid and assistance staff has coordinated a program of preparing sales/assessment ratio data and local assistance to all counties.

## EQUALIZATION

The equalization staff that was created in 1973 continued in 1975 to conduct audits, prepare progress reports on counties that had made reappraisal commitments the prior year, prepare feasibility studies as to manpower and budgetary requirements for reappraisal, conduct studies of sales in relation to assessments, and give assistance and instructions to assessors and their personnel.

The equalization program consisted of reviewing the work done by counties which appear to have the lowest assessment ratios or which are deviating from the statutes and guidelines set down by the Division of Property Taxation and approved by the State Board of Equalization. The following eleven (11) counties were summoned before the Property Tax Administrator:

Arapahoe, Bent, Cheyenne, Clear Creek, Conejos, Lake, La Plata, Larimer, Montezuma, Prowers, and Summit. Of these counties six (6) counties agreed to do a complete reappraisal, one to do a limited appraisal and four (4) made no commitments. Counties with new assessors were contacted and the following counties committed to a complete reappraisal or to continue the reappraisal that had been started: Chaffee, Crowley, Custer, Grand, Gunnison, Kit Carson, Montrose, Rio Blanco, and Routt. The Phillips County Assessor, although not a new assessor, stated that she would conduct a reappraisal.

The equalization staff completed appraisal studies of all classes of property in Cheyenne, Clear Creek, Delta, and Fremont counties, and petitions for reappraisal were filed with the Board of Assessment Appeals.

Audits of reappraisals were conducted in Douglas, Grand, Hinsdale, Lake, Park, Rio Grande, and San Juan counties. Of these counties, Douglas and Lake counties would not agree to adjust the inequities that appeared in their appraisals; therefore, petitions for reappraisal were filed with the Board of Assessment Appeals.

The Division presented its annual report to the State Board of Equalization on September 8, 1975. The State Board on September 22, 1975, issued orders to all county assessors requiring them to complete reappraisal of all property within their counties by June 1, 1977, and issued supplemental orders to accomplish this objective. It also ordered that the level of assessment on residential, commercial, and industrial properties, both improved and unimproved—be at least 20 percent of actual value for 1976.

Due to the State Board of Equalization order of September 22, 1975, all of the above-named counties that were cited before the Board of Assessment Appeals, except Douglas County, agreed by stipulation that they would complete reappraisals by June 1, 1977.

In the Douglas County case, the Board of Assessment Appeals ordered that Douglas County complete its reappraisal by June 1, 1977, and that it reexamine its valuation of residential tracts that do not qualify as agricultural land.

The equalization staff conducted a feedlot cattle audit in 16 counties, feasibility studies of manpower and costs of reappraisal in five counties, and a study in one county in which the assessor requested a budget review to obtain additional personnel under the powers of the Property Tax Administrator. An audit of the assessment of oil and gas equipment was also made.

Boulder County, which is under a Board of Assessment Appeals' order to be reappraised by June 1, 1975, indicated that it could not be completed by that date; therefore, a study was made to determine the status of its reappraisal. This resulted in a hearing in the office of the Property Tax Administrator with all members of the Board of Assessment Appeals and the Assessor of Boulder County present. The county was granted a one-year extension of time. Other counties granted an extension of time on their committed reappraisal were Jefferson and Saguache.

Subsequent to the State Board of Equalization's order of September 22, 1975, the equalization staff is engaged in preparing sales ratio data in all counties. An appraisal ratio study to supplement the sales ratio study is also planned.

### SALES VALUATION REPORT

The ninth annual sales/assessment analysis report was completed and released to local government and other interested agencies. This report is part of the ongoing request of the various state agencies involved in the study of equalization. The sales assessment analysis is used by the Division of Property Taxation, the various county assessors, and the State Board of Equalization as indicators of equalization factors portrayed by the sales.

The sales information is processed through the Division of Automatic Data Processing with various levels of reports. The analysis reports are furnished to the counties as part of the cost sharing work programs of the Division of Property Taxation. The cumulative or annual report contains the current year's sales analysis, as well as the cumulative three-year sales analysis. The information is characterized by county, by property type, and by age groupings within classes of property. The Data is presented in statistical and graphical means of portraying the sales information for interpretation of the interested groups. The 1974-75 sales were again subjected to analysis within each county by geographic areas known as City Area, Township Area, or Subdivision Area. This is an attempt to portray the valuation information on a more meaningful level for the counties. The analysis by subdivision was supplied directly to the counties for analysis without being included in a formal report.

The continued inflation of the economy through the fiscal year 1974-75 is reflected in all sales analysis

reports. The majority of the sales indicate a downward trend of the sales assessment ratios. Since the sales analysis is limited to residential and commercial properties, and most counties have not recently effected reappraisal programs of these properties, there still exists a wide disparity between the sales and the assessor's actual value. Commercial properties continue to reflect higher sales ratios than residential, and unimproved properties continue to reflect lower assessment ratios than corresponding improved properties.

### DATA PROCESSING AND STATE-COUNTY COST SHARING

The State-County (STACO) cost sharing consists primarily of a data bank concept for the storage of property record information and data processing application programs designed to effect valuations by property or properties. The STACO valuation system provides current cost information for both manual and machine application and for the updating of property information.

Current replacement cost manuals for residential property, by area were provided to Colorado counties in 1976 by the computer for the first time in Colorado history. The Division will be able to provide updated manuals annually by area in accordance with increases or decreases in cost of material, labor, profit and overhead.

Arapahoe, Boulder, Mesa, and Weld counties are implementing the STACO valuation system for storing and updating property characteristics and maintaining current cost on all property within their jurisdiction. This will enable these counties to keep current actual value information on each residential property annually. All property record information remains the property of the individual county involved, to be used only by that county.

Future data processing specifications call for the completion of the data bank record system which will enable the Division to utilize retrieval programs and provide management report for valuation analysis worth. Expected completion in 1976 of multiple regression application programs will enable assessors to value property through the market data approach in compliance with Colorado statutes. This program is presently in its testing stage and will be implemented during the year.

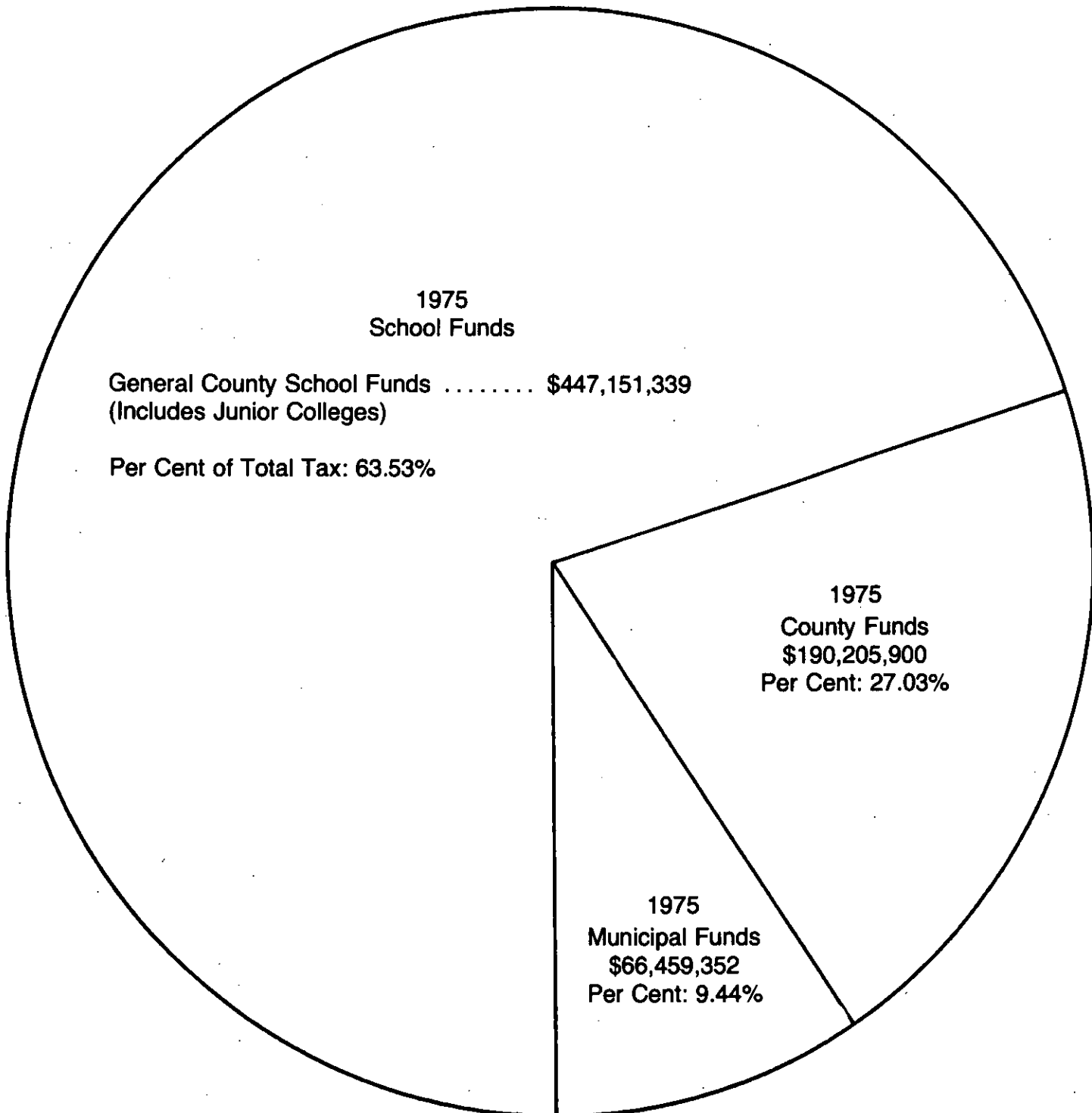
