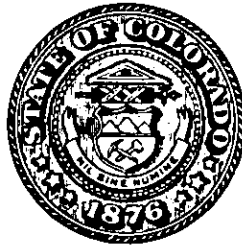

II. ADMINISTRATION

Property Tax Legislation

The Colorado Statutes pertaining to ad valorem taxation had important changes that effected not only future years, but were effective for the 1976 tax year. The more important legislation is summarized:

Advisory Committee to Property Tax Administrator (C.R.S. 39-2-129).

Equalization ratios to be used by State Board of Equalization in 1976 (C.R.S. 39-9-103).

Base year (C.R.S. 39-1-104 (9) and (10)).

Rehabilitation and Modernization (C.R.S. 39-5-105 (2) (a) and (b)).

Recording of Instruments (C.R.S. 30-10-406 (2)).

Inventory of Livestock Assessment Ratio (C.R.S. 39-5-109).

Definition of Public Utilities (C.R.S. 39-4-101 (3)).

Exemption of Disabled and Aged and Limited Income (C.R.S. 39-3-101 (1) (g)).

State assessed properties must identify locally assessed property (C.R.S. 39-4-103 (1) (b)).

Assessment of Public Utilities

The Tax Administrator, under Chapter 38 of Colorado Revised Statutes, is required to annually value and assess for ad valorem tax purposes" . . . Public Utility . . . which does business in this state as a railroad company, airline company, electric company, rural electric company, telephone company, telegraph company, gas company, gas pipeline carrier company, domestic water company, pipeline company, coal slurry pipeline, or private car line company."

Each year the Administrator develops a series of valuation indicators, for the various classes of property. The utilization of these indicators, as directed by statute, establish a "unit" valuation for each property. The actual value factors within the statutes provide for tangible property consisting of the plant; specific intangibles; gross and net operating revenues, capitalized; average market values of outstanding securities, and in the judgment of the Tax Administrator, any other operating financial data needed to determine the entire value of the property.

In 1976 the Tax Administrator valued, assessed, and allocated to the counties the ad valorem taxes for 275 companies. They consisted of:

The 1976 assessment for Public Utilities of \$964,498,250 represents an actual value of \$3,214,994,000, at the required statutory assessment ratio of 30%. A comparison to the prior year reflects an increase of 14.6%. The increase for 1975 reflected an 8.8% increase over the prior year. A summary of the past three years is:

After the Administrator has fixed the total assessed value of the unitary properties, the Division allocates the valuation to the respective counties. The assessees furnish the counties the necessary taxation data for their allocation to respective taxing jurisdictions.

State assessees, as well as local governmental jurisdictions, have the right to protest the assessments as determined by the Tax Administrator. There were ten (10) protests filed with the Administrator in 1976. There were no 1976 protests by the utilities (assessees) to the Board of Assessment Appeals, and no known court actions were filed by assessees.

Applications for Abatement or Refund of Taxes

The statutes provide that any taxpayer may file for refund or abatement of taxes if they have been levied erroneously or illegally. The original petition must be filed with the board of county commissioners, who shall conduct a hearing, at which time the assessor shall have the opportunity to be present. Any abatement or refund recommended by the county board shall be submitted to the administrator for approval, denial, or modification.

During the year 1976 the Administrator received 2,127 applications for abatement or refund of taxes. Twelve (12) applications were denied by the Administrator. The 1976 refunds or abatements totaled \$1,450,871, and the denials involved \$10,537 of taxes.

Property Tax Exemptions

The Administrator is required by 1973 C.R.S. 39-2-117 to determine the exemption from general taxation of property owned and used solely and exclusively for religious worship, for schools, and for strictly charitable purposes.

During the year 1976 the Division received 533 applications for exemption from general taxation, 268 were for property claimed to be used for religious worship, 240 were for property claimed to be used for strictly charitable purposes, and 25 were for property claimed to be used for schools.

The Division processed 542 applications for exemption; 405 were granted, 56 were granted in part, 81 were denied, 12 were returned to the respective county assessors or to the claimant as not being subject to determination by the Administrator, and at year end there were 65 applications in various stages of processing.

The Division also has the responsibility of examining the annual reports required to be filed by the owners of property which have previously been granted exemption as being owned and used for religious worship, for schools, and for strictly charitable purposes to determine if such property continues to qualify for such exemption.

The Division mailed 5,865 pre-printed reporting forms to owners of exempt property followed by 365 second notices to those who had failed to return the reports by the due date. Field investigations were made in a number of instances where exemption of the property appeared questionable. Orders were issued revoking the exemption of 63 parcels of property having an estimated actual value of \$1,934,900.

The Division issued 146 notices declaring a forfeiture of the exemption of property for which the owner had failed to file a report. Of these 112 were rescinded upon adequate showing by the owner that the property was eligible for continued exemption. The remaining 34, representing property which was returned to the tax roll, had an estimated value of \$727,400.

1973 C.R.S. 39-3-101 (1) (g) (1) (c) makes specific provisions for exemption of certain senior citizen apartment projects. The Division reviewed 54 such projects, having 6,267 apartments. It was determined that in the aggregate 61% of such apartment units were entitled to exemption.

Hearings were held by the Administrator on eleven petitions for reconsideration. Ten appeals were heard by the Board of Assessment Appeals relative to applications for exemption which had been denied; in seven cases the denial was sustained; in two cases the exemption was granted, and one was resolved by stipulation.

Technical Services to Counties

It is the duty of the Property Tax Administrator to assist and cooperate in the administration of all laws concerning the valuing of taxable property, the assessment of the same, and the levying of property taxes. The exercise of this authority is contained in C.R.S. 39-2-109 (1) (b).

The various assessors requested assistance on many individual property appraisals, of all types. In several of these cases, personnel of the Division made appearances and gave testimony before the State Board of Assessment Appeals. Some of the types of appraisals made for assessors were: subdivision-lands; producing non-metallic properties; industrial plants; commercial lands; commercial buildings; leased equipment; gas plants; and, improved residential properties. Some of the assistance given was in the fields of: mapping and parcel identification systems; training of assessment personnel; personal property audit procedures; leased equipment assessments; and, individual property appraisals and/or reviews.

The State Board of Equalization order of September 22, 1975, and passage of HB-1025 in June of 1976, restricted the personnel of the Division as to the amount of aid and assistance given counties for the tax year 1976.

Training and Certification

Special schools were conducted for assessors and their staffs on methods and procedures for appraising residential, commercial and personal property. These schools were held January 19-23, 1976 at the University of Colorado in Boulder. Approximately 100 students attended these schools. Area seminars were conducted statewide on administrative remedies, assessment and property tax laws, and taxpayer reviews.

In July of 1976 the Division of Property Taxation sponsored a two-day professional seminar for assessors and staff members who were desirous of furthering their education and obtaining a professional designa-

tion. This two-day seminar was sponsored in conjunction with the International Association of Assessing Officers (I.A.A.O.). An examination and certification of passing was required for completion of the course.

The Annual Assessors School previously scheduled for October, 1976 was postponed to February 23 - March 4, 1977. Circumstances pertaining to enforcement and implementation of State Board of Equalization orders and increased assessors' responsibilities during the fall of 1976 necessitated this postponement. During the February 28 - March 4, 1977 Assessors' School, the Division will sponsor two additional I.A.A.O. courses for those intending to make application for a professional designation. The courses will be "Fundamentals of Real Property Appraisal" and "The Valuation of Income Producing Properties." Completion of an examination and certification of passing must be made by all students to further their achievement towards a professional designation.

Valuation Guidelines and Publications

The Appraisal Section revised and updated the annual "Appraisals Procedures and Instructions for 1977." This circular provides guidelines for the valuation of all classifications of property. Updated supplements were issued for the oil and gas equipment replacement cost manual, cost factoring tables and the property classification and identification handbook. These instructions and assessor's handbooks were approved by the Advisory Committee to the Property Tax Administrator in accordance with 1973 C.R.S. 39-2-131.

All declaration schedules, notices of value and property review forms for taxpayer administrative remedies were redesigned and published for the current year to reflect those changes incorporated in HB-1025 passed by the 1976 State Legislature.

The manual for valuation of mobile machinery and self-propelled construction equipment was updated and published. This manual, though published by the Division of Property Taxation is used by the Department of Revenue and the county clerks.

Numerous costs have been researched to aid in the valuation of specified property and to enable assessors to update their appraisal records consistent with the criteria established in C.R.S. 39-1-103. Research has been conducted for the commercial and industrial replacement cost manual, and this manual has been issued to all assessors. Research data collected during the year of 1975 was utilized in the development of this

manual. In accordance with HB-1025, 1975 has been established as the base year concept for all valuation manuals for commercial and industrial property. Research was also conducted throughout the State to determine agricultural commodity prices, crop yields, landlord income and expense figures to aid in the valuation of agricultural lands. Livestock prices were developed from statistics provided by the Colorado Crop and Livestock Reporting Service. Research was conducted throughout the State in those areas where statistics were unavailable from the Colorado Crop and Livestock Reporting Service.

Intercounty Equalization Surveys

The Appraisal Section conducted detailed county audits, prepared feasibility studies for assessors relating to their manpower and budgetary requirements, analyzed sales in relation to assessments, prepared appraisals, investigated special equalization requests, conducted audits of specific classes or subclasses of property, and gave assistance and instructions to assessors and their personnel.

The State Board of Equalization order of September 22, 1975 — which stated that the level of assessment on residential, commercial, and industrial properties, both improved and unimproved, be at least 20 percent of actual value for 1976 — resulted in the Legislature passing HB-1025. Section 29 of this bill required the State Board of Equalization to order increases or decreases in classes and subclasses that were lower than, or exceeded, the acceptable ranges and to adjust aggregate values to 22%.

Passage of HB-1025 established the main work program for equalization. To establish data for the State Board of Equalization, the following programs were conducted:

1. The Division made recommendations to the State Board using market data studies and appraisals when the market data was limited. The State Board of Equalization made abstract adjustments in 45 counties.
2. Appraisals were made of a representative sample of agricultural building improvements. The State Board of Equalization chose not to make adjustments with this subclass of property.
3. In the subclass of industrial improved properties, a statistical sample was selected, using as a base the 1976 listing of this sub-class of property as furnished by the assessors. The companies were asked to furnish

data. From the information furnished, an actual value determination was made by the Division. Since many companies refused to supply the necessary data, the validity of the sample was in question. Therefore, no adjustments were made by the State Board of Equalization.

A ski property audit, as requested by the State Board of Equalization, was conducted, and a report was made to them on the valuation and assessment procedures used by assessors for this class of property. The audit indicated that although some counties were doing a good job of appraising this type of property, a complete reappraisal should be made of all ski areas. The audit concluded that ski areas should be valued as other commercial and industrial properties, using the same value indicators.

A mining audit to determine the valuation and assessment procedures used by assessors was conducted. A random sample was selected of mining properties which included nonmetallic, coal and metalliferous mines.

The audit of nonmetallic and coal lands indicated that many counties are not classifying and valuing these lands properly. The counties should use the approved guidelines to produce proper actual value.

The audit of metalliferous mines indicated that mine operators do not determine the gross value of the ore in the same manner when filing property declarations. Mining companies should be requested to furnish to the counties a copy of the production report filed with the Colorado Division of Mines.

An agricultural land audit was conducted to determine if the agricultural land formulas were being applied and to determine the 1976 assessment level of each type of agricultural land. A report was made to the State Board of Equalization on each subclass of land in every county, except Denver and San Juan, which have no agricultural land. The audit indicated that proper classification has been completed in only 31 of the 61 counties, and that the agricultural land formula is only being applied adequately in 25 of the 61 counties.

Assistance in implementing the State Board of Equalization order was given in 22 of the 45 counties which received an increase of value to their abstract of assessment.

Sales Valuation Programs

The tenth annual Sales-Assessment Analysis Report was completed and made a part of the Division's report

to the State Board of Equalization. The Board, in implementing HB-1025, used this analysis to determine compliance or noncompliance with the statutes as they pertain to assessment ratios.

Sales information is processed through the Division of Automated Data Processing with various levels of reports. The analysis reports are furnished to the counties. This tenth annual report contained sales occurring during calendar year 1975 compared to 1976 assessments. The information is classified by county, by subclass, and by tax area. The analysis by tax area was supplied directly to the counties for analysis without being included in a formal report.

County Maps of Parcels of Land

The 1973 C.R.S. 39-5-103 (5) provides that "Prior to January 1, 1981, each assessor shall maintain full, accurate, and complete maps showing the parcels of land in his county. A further provision is that "Guidelines shall be established by the Administrator to produce uniformity throughout the state." These guidelines required of the Administrator are contained in publication AH 302, REAL ESTATE PARCEL IDENTIFICATION AND MAPPING SPECIFICATION. Presently 30 counties are in various stages of implementing this section of the law under the prescribed guidelines.

Data Processing By the Division

The State Division of ADP provides central services for four (4) subsystems of processing information. These systems include the Sales Ratio Studies; the Annual Public Utility Reports; the analysis and reports for the Abstract of Assessment from the counties; and the Exempt Properties records and reports for the State.

These ADP programs have been ongoing for several years, and central services has made no substantial changes in the original application programs. The Division plans to install remote entry equipment during the 1977-78 fiscal year. This installation will provide a means for substantial modification and improvement of the various subsystems.

During 1976, the State relinquished effective control of the STACO system and established a private contractor for all State and county joint systems development and operations.

State-County Cost Sharing Association

The State-County (STACO) System is a cooperative effort whereby the State and individual counties wish to obtain and implement specified data processing pro-

grams and share the cost. During the year, 1976, the STACO board of directors voted to change the STACO service center from the State Data Processing Service Center to a commercial contractor, Electron Information Systems Company.

Arapahoe, Boulder, Grand, Mesa, Summit and Weld Counties are implementing the STACO valuation system for storing, updating property classifications, and maintaining current costs on all property within the taxing jurisdiction. In Weld County the system is being used for housing and planning development grants which necessitated property characteristic studies on all residential structures within the county.

Current replacement cost manuals for residential property have been provided to all Colorado counties on a 1975 base year concept. These manuals were developed through the use of computers and the STACO programs provided by EIS. The Division will be able to provide updated manuals annually or at required statutory dates by area in accordance with increases or decreases in costs of material, labor, profit and overhead. Future data processing specifications call for the completion of data base management system, terminals, commercial, personal and agricultural property programs. The expected utilization by county will include the use of all six statutory criteria for valuing properties in each county in the State of Colorado.

III. BOARD OF ASSESSMENT APPEALS

Authority and Duties

The Board of Assessment Appeals was created within the Department of Local Affairs on July 1, 1971. This board is comprised of three members, appointed by the Governor for six year terms; any vacancies that occur are filled by gubernatorial appointment for the unexpired portion of the term. Board members are required to be qualified in property valuation and taxation, with one member required to be or have been (within five years immediately preceding the date of his appointment) actively engaged in agriculture.

The duties of the Board of Assessment Appeals include:

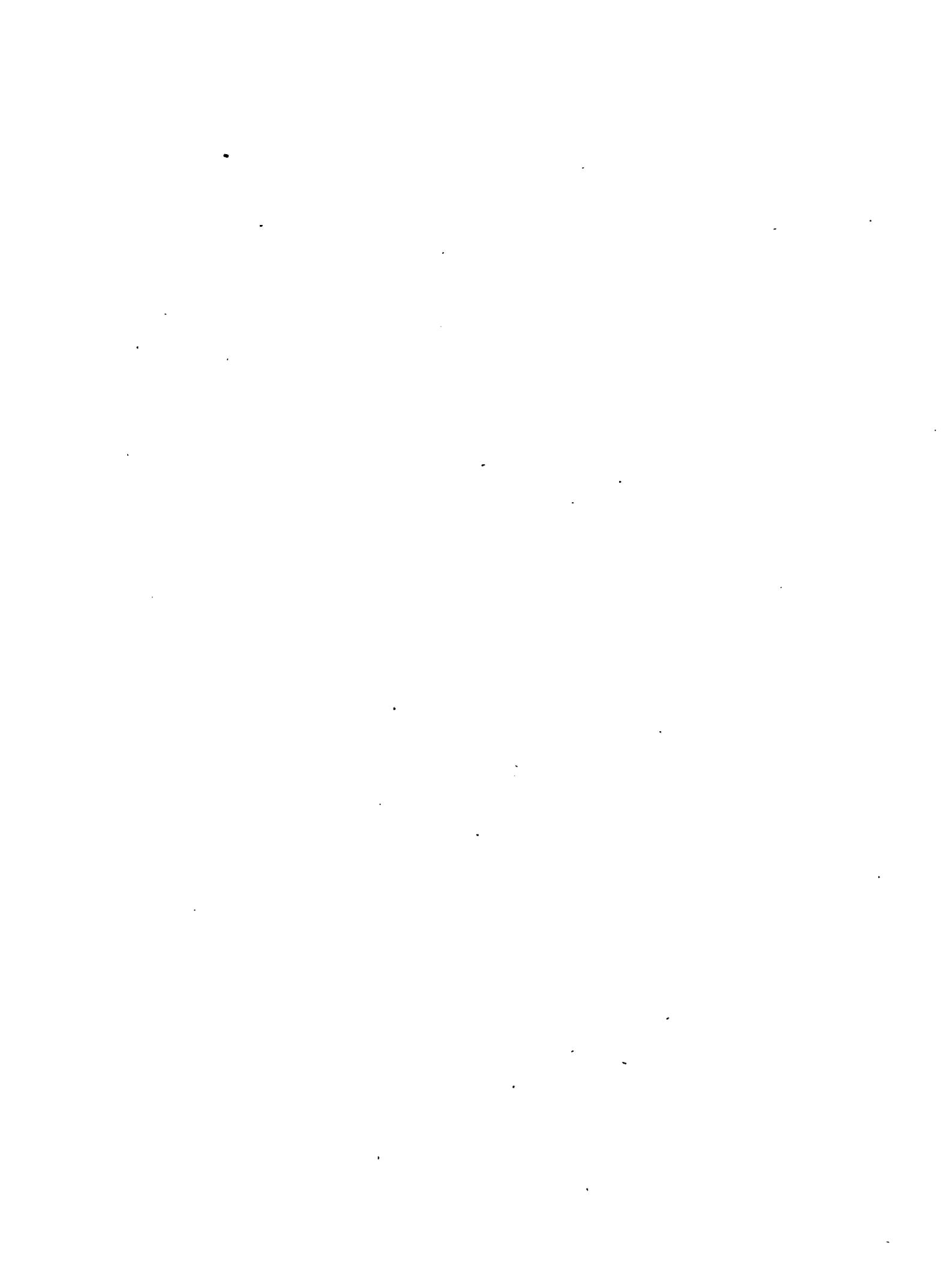
1. Adoption of procedures of practice and procedures of review;
2. Hearing appeals from decisions of the Property Tax Administrator, county boards of equalization, county assessors when a county board of equalization fails to respond within the statutory time limit, and county commissioners when a claim for an abatement or refund is denied in full or in part; and
3. Conduct of hearings upon complaints filed by the Property Tax Administrator concerning either valuations on classes and/or subclasses of property if a reappraisal has not been conducted, or alleged dereliction of duty on the part of a county assessor.

The Board of Assessment Appeals, during 1976-77 fiscal year, heard 360 cases. Of this total, 162 petitions were denied, 156 were granted, and 41 were withdrawn by the petitioner; the Board lacked jurisdiction in 1 case.
