WHAT'S NEW: 2017

REGULATION CHANGES & NEW INFORMATION

► **CPW LICENSING SYSTEM CHANGES:** We're in the process of transitioning to an upgraded licensing, pass, registration and reservation system in 2018. Please check our website for updates coming soon: cpw.state.co.us

► **SAN LUIS STATE PARK NOW PART OF SAN LUIS LAKES SWA:** The property that was formerly San Luis State Park is now part of San Luis Lakes State Wildlife Area as one large SWA. Visitors to San Luis Lakes SWA aged 18–64 will now need to have an annual \$36 access permit (called the Annual SWA Permit); those who hold a current and valid hunting or fishing license won't need to purchase this permit. Access permits are available anywhere you can buy CPW hunting and fishing licenses around the state. In addition, there is no camping outside of designated areas; from Memorial Day weekend through July 4th weekend, all camping is by reservation only. *See page 23.*

► **NEW PERMIT REQUIRED AT DEWESEE RESERVOIR SWA:** A \$36 annual permit (called the Annual SWA Permit) is now required for visitors aged 18–64 who do not have a current and valid fishing or hunting license. This permit is available anywhere you can purchase CPW hunting and fishing licenses around the state. *See page 10.*

► **LAND OPENINGS:** Cerro Summit SWA in Montrose Co. is a new SWA now open to the public for fishing, small-game and big-game hunting **ONLY**. Yarmony Ranch SWA, on the Illinois River in Jackson Co., is now open to the public for fishing **ONLY**. *See pages 8 and 28 for individual property rules and further details.*

► **NEW SEASONAL CLOSURE DATE AT ALMONT TRIANGLE SWA:** Almont Triangle SWA is open to the public from May 16 through Nov. 30, instead of from April 1 through Dec. 19.

► **NEW RESTRICTIONS AT GUNNISON RIVER, GUNNISON, LITTLE SNAKE, LOMA BOAT LAUNCH, SAN LUIS LAKES, SAPINERO & WEST RIFLE CREEK STATE WILDLIFE AREAS:** Gunnison River SWA allows waterfowl hunting with shotguns on the Van Tuyl tract **ONLY**; Gunnison SWA's new open hours from April 1 to Aug. 15 are 1 hour before sunrise to 1 hour after sunset, and camping is permitted from Aug. 16 to Nov. 30; fires are no longer permitted at Little Snake and Loma Boat Launch SWAs; camping is by reservation only from Memorial Day weekend through the July 4th weekend at San Luis Lakes SWA; snowmobiles and the like aren't allowed at Sapinero SWA, except as through traffic on the road surfaces of Forest Service roads Red Creek and Rainbow Lake; and the West Rifle Creek Shooting Range is open to the public between sunrise and sunset every day at West Rifle Creek SWA. *See inside for the rules and details for each SWA, pages 2–28.*

► **CPW'S FINANCIAL SUSTAINABILITY BILL (HB 17-1321) DID NOT PASS:** The bill would have allowed the Colorado Parks and Wildlife Commission to approve resident license fee increases, but it did not pass through the 2017 Colorado General Assembly. Resident license prices have not been raised for 2018. *See back cover for more information on financial sustainability.*

RESERVATIONS

CAMPING: CABINS, YURTS, CAMPSITES

THERE ARE MORE THAN 4,000 CAMPSITES and 58 cabins and yurts waiting for you on your next vacation at state parks across Colorado.

Campground amenities at many parks include restrooms, full electrical hookups and shower facilities. (*See pages 44–47.*) Many parks also offer campsites or cabins for large groups. Nearly 300 campsites are ADA accessible.

Yurts and cabins offer comfortable, year-round alternatives to traditional camping in a tent.

TO RESERVE A CAMPSITE, YURT OR CABIN, go online to use the reservation system at cpw.state.co.us. You also can call 303-470-1144, or 800-678-2267 from outside the Denver metro area. The reservation phone line is open 8 a.m.–5 p.m. Monday–Friday.

Reservations may be made anywhere from six months to three days in advance.

There is a \$10 nonrefundable reservation fee that applies when booking. Any site that isn't reserved is available on a first-come, first-served basis.

Park entrance fees also apply at all state parks, in addition to camping and reservation fees (*see page 44*).

HABITAT STAMP

► **HABITAT STAMPS ARE \$10** and only one is required per person per year for anyone 18–64. Stamps are valid April 1–March 31.

• You must purchase a stamp before buying or applying for a hunting or fishing license or a preference point.

• Anyone buying a one-day or additional-day license for fishing and/or small game is exempt from buying the Habitat Stamp with the first two of these licenses.

• Anyone who holds a free Lifetime Fishing license, a Veteran's Lifetime Combination Small-Game Hunting/Fishing license or who is approved for the Big Game Mobility Impaired Hunting Program is exempt from the Habitat Stamp requirement. STATE WILDLIFE AREAS

WHAT IS A STATE WILDLIFE AREA?

State Wildlife Areas (SWAs) are state- or privately-owned lands that offer state-managed, wildlife-related recreation to the public.

While most activities focus on hunting and fishing, each SWA has different allowed activities based on location and available resources.

These parcels of SWA land are paid for by sportsmen and sportswomen, and managed under state law by Colorado Parks and Wildlife employees for the benefit of wildlife.

Colorado Parks and Wildlife manages about 350 SWA lands around the state.

STATE WILDLIFE AREA ACCESS RULES

BOAT REGULATIONS

All vessels and floating devices, their contents, motors, trailers and equipment are subject to inspection by the CPW before being launched, operated on or leaving waters on SWAs. Any aquatic nuisance species found during inspection must be removed and disposed of according to CPW procedures before vessels are allowed to be launched, operate on, or leave the water.

YOUTH/MENTOR HUNTING

Youth/mentor hunting means hunting by youths under 18. Youth hunters under 16 must be accompanied by a mentor when hunting on youth/mentor properties. Mentors must be at least 18 and comply with hunter education requirements.

Except when specifically authorized, the following activities are **PROHIBITED** on lands, waters, frozen surfaces of waters, rights-of-way, buildings or devices under CPW control:

1. To possess the following types of ammunition and/or firearms: tracer rounds, armor-piercing rounds, military hardened rounds with explosive or radioactive substances, .50-caliber BMG rounds, or fully automatic firearms.
2. To enter, use or occupy an area when posted against entry, use or occupancy.
3. To engage in illegal activities.
4. To enter, use or occupy an area for commercial purposes or do land, water, oil, gas or mineral investigations, surveys or explorations.
5. To operate a vehicle (motorized or non-motorized) except on established roads or within designated camping or parking areas. Drivers must obey Colorado motor vehicle laws.
6. To drive faster than posted speed limits or faster than 25 mph if not posted.
7. To leave camp, tent, shelter, motor vehicle or trailer unattended more than 48 hours, to camp or to park travel trailers or campers on a SWA over 14 days in 45-day period.

8. To establish a permanent structure or plant vegetation. Only portable blinds and tree stands for big-game or waterfowl hunting can be erected on SWAs and no earlier than 30 days prior to the season for which they will be used. No nails can be driven into trees. Man-made materials for blinds or stands must be removed within 10 days after the season in which they are used ends. Any other portable blind or tree stand used for any other purpose must be removed at end of the day they are used.

The owner's Customer Identification number and dates of use must be visible on the outside of portable blinds or underside of tree stands. Placement of blinds or stands does not reserve them for personal use, they may be used by the public on first-come, first-served basis.

9. To remove, modify or destroy a building, water control device, fence, gate, sign, survey or section marker, vegetation or objects of archaeological, geological or historical value.
10. To litter, leave fish, fish entrails, human waste, waste water, containers or toxic substances; to bring household or commercial trash or toxic substances to an area for disposal; or to dump trailer waste in a sanitary facility.
11. To build fires without precautions to prevent spreading; to leave fires unattended.
12. To graze livestock. Horses, mules, llamas, burros may be used in wildlife activities.
13. To have or use fireworks, explosives, poisons, herbicides, pesticides or illegal substances.
14. To release wildlife or privately-owned game birds. Private game birds may be released for field trials, including group dog training on SWAs only where allowed. To allow dogs, cats or domestic pets to run at large (not on a leash), except dogs used while hunting, while training hunting dogs or at CPW-authorized field trials.
15. To dig trenches, holes or pits.
16. To leave boats, rafts or other floating craft beached, anchored, moored or docked unattended overnight except in designated areas.

17. To fish from or block any CPW boat ramps or docks in conflict with boaters or as posted.
18. To snorkel, scuba dive or spearfish with a diving mask, swim fins, snorkel or air tanks. The exception is where swimming is permitted, when location is identified by a "divers down flag" and when scuba diver has valid scuba certificate from recognized scuba training organization.
19. To use air or gas-inflated floating devices for transportation on the surface of the water unless the device has multi-compartments and a rigid motor mount when propelled by gasoline or electric motors. Single-compartment air or gas-filled flotation devices restricted to posted swimming areas.
20. To promote, sponsor, conduct or participate in boat regattas, paintball shooting, questing or non-wildlife oriented activities.
21. To launch or land aircraft.
22. To leave decoys or anything used as decoys in the field or on water overnight.
23. To swim, except in designated waters or during authorized water contact activities.
24. To discharge a firearm or bow in parking, camping or picnic areas.
25. To fish in fish-rearing ponds, raceways, holding areas or streams on CPW hatchery properties, except areas posted as open to fishing.
26. To conduct field trials or group dog training without a field-trial license.
27. To have, store or use hay, straw or mulch not certified as noxious-weed free. Certified materials must be clearly marked by certifying state or province. People who transport these materials on federal, state or county roads that cross CPW property are exempt. Also exempt is hay produced on State Trust Lands leased from CPW for wildlife recreation.
28. To trap unless done according to statutes, regulations and authorization.
29. To partake in Internet-based or computer-assisted remote hunting or fishing. Hunters and anglers must be present in the immediate vicinity of their activity.

STATE FISHING UNITS

► **WHAT IS AN SFU?** The term stands for **State Fishing Unit**. There are 15 of these around Colorado that offer limited wildlife recreation. They include fish hatcheries and rearing operations. All SWA access rules (*on page 2*) apply.

BELLVUE SFU - LARIMER CO.

DIRECTIONS: Go N of Fort Collins on Hwy. 287 to La Porte. Just N of La Porte go W on CR 28.
GMU/ACRES: 19 / 58 acres
RECREATION: limited public use and tours
RESTRICTIONS: hunting, dogs prohibited.

CHALK CLIFFS SFU - CHAFFEE CO.

DIRECTIONS: From Nathrop, go W 2.5 miles on CR 162, then go N 0.125 of a mile on CR 287.
GMU/ACRES: 56, 481 / 61 acres
RECREATION: limited public use, limited tours
RESTRICTIONS: dogs prohibited.

CRYSTAL RIVER SFU - GARFIELD CO.

DIRECTIONS: 1 mile S of Carbondale on Hwy. 33.
GMU/ACRES: 43 / 19 acres
RECREATION: limited public use, limited tours
RESTRICTIONS: camping, hunting, dogs, fishing equipment, waders prohibited.

DURANGO SFU - LA PLATA CO.

DIRECTIONS: In Durango, next to Animas River.
GMU/ACRES: 74, 75 / 14 acres
FISHING: coldwater stream on Animas River
RECREATION: visitors center open May 15–Sept. 15; limited tours available at other times, schedule by calling 970-375-6766
FACILITIES: restroom and drinking water available when visitor center is open
RESTRICTIONS: dogs prohibited.

FINGER ROCK SFU - ROUTT CO.

DIRECTIONS: From Yampa, go 3 miles S on Hwy. 131.
GMU/ACRES: 26 / 34 acres
RECREATION: wildlife viewing, limited tours
RESTRICTIONS:
a. Fishing, camping, fires, dogs prohibited.
b. Discharging firearms or bows prohibited in designated safety zones as posted.

GLENWOOD SPRINGS SFU - GARFIELD CO.

DIRECTIONS: From Glenwood Springs, go 2.2 miles N along Mitchell Creek.
GMU/ACRES: 34 / 2 acres
RECREATION: wildlife viewing, limited tours
RESTRICTIONS: camping, dogs prohibited.

LAS ANIMAS SFU - BENT CO.

DIRECTIONS: From Las Animas W on Hwy. 194, go 4 miles, then go N on CR 5.5.
GMU/ACRES: 125 / 69 acres
RECREATION: wildlife viewing, limited tours
RESTRICTIONS: camping, dogs prohibited.

MOUNT SHAVANO SFU - CHAFFEE CO.

DIRECTIONS: From Salida, go 0.5 of a mile NW on Hwy. 291 to CR 154, then go 0.5 of a mile W.
GMU/ACRES: 56 / 45 acres
FISHING: coldwater stream, coldwater lake

RECREATION: wildlife viewing, limited tours
FACILITIES: restroom, drinking water
RESTRICTIONS: dogs prohibited.

PITKIN SFU - GUNNISON CO.

DIRECTIONS: From Gunnison, go 14 miles E on Hwy. 50 to Quartz Creek Rd., then go 14 miles E to Parlin and turn N.
GMU/ACRES: 55, 551 / 48 acres
FISHING: coldwater stream
RECREATION: wildlife viewing, limited tours
RESTRICTIONS:
a. Fishing only in Quartz Creek.
b. Dogs prohibited.

POUDRE RIVER SFU - LARIMER CO.

DIRECTIONS: From La Porte, go 5 miles N on Hwy. 287 to Hwy. 14, then 38 miles W.
GMU/ACRES: 8, 19 / 460 acres
FISHING: coldwater stream
RECREATION: picnicking, hiking, wildlife viewing, limited tours
FACILITIES: restroom
RESTRICTIONS:
a. Camping, dogs, boat launching and boat takeouts prohibited.
b. Hunting prohibited in designated safety zone as posted.

PUEBLO SFU - PUEBLO CO.

DIRECTIONS: From Pueblo, go 6 miles W of Pueblo Blvd. on Hwy. 96.
GMU/ACRES: 84 / 105 acres
RECREATION: wildlife viewing, limited tours
FACILITIES: restroom, aquarium
RESTRICTIONS: dogs, hunting prohibited.

RIFLE FALLS SFU - GARFIELD CO.

DIRECTIONS: From Rifle, go 15 miles N on Hwy. 325.
GMU/ACRES: 33 / 600 acres
FISHING: coldwater stream
RECREATION: wildlife viewing, limited tours

RESTRICTIONS:

- a. Dogs, fires, rock climbing prohibited. Camping allowed only with hatchery manager's authorization.
- b. Hunting prohibited in designated safety areas.

ROARING JUDY SFU - GUNNISON CO.

DIRECTIONS: From Gunnison, go 15 miles NW on East River.
GMU/ACRES: 54, 55 / 778 acres
FISHING: coldwater stream, pond fishing
RECREATION: wildlife viewing, limited tours
FACILITIES: restroom
RESTRICTIONS:
a. Open for fishing from sunrise to sunset.
b. Camping, fires prohibited.
c. Target practice only in designated areas.
d. Discharging firearms prohibited in designated safety zone.

WATSON LAKE SFU - LARIMER CO.

DIRECTIONS: From Fort Collins, go 7 miles NW on Hwy. 287 to Rist Canyon Rd. (CR 28), then go 1 mile.
GMU/ACRES: 19 / 90 acres
FISHING: coldwater stream
RECREATION: limited tours
FACILITIES: restroom
RESTRICTIONS:
a. Hunting, dogs prohibited.
b. Closed along W bank of Poudre River next to employee housing.

WRAY SFU - YUMA CO.

DIRECTIONS: From Wray, go 2 miles W on Hwy. 34 to CR FF, then go 2 miles N.
GMU/ACRES: 98 / 355 acres
RECREATION: limited tours
RESTRICTIONS:
a. Camping, hunting, dogs prohibited.
b. Closed E of CR FF.

ADAMS SWA - ROUTT CO.

DIRECTIONS: From Steamboat Springs, go E on Hwy. 40, turn S on Hwy. 131. At CR 14, go S. SWA is 0.5 of a mile N of Stagecoach State Park.

DIRECTIONS: From Telluride, go 13 miles W on Hwy. 145 to USFS Rd. 618 in Fall Creek; then 9 miles S.

STATE TRUST LANDS

WHAT ARE TRUST LANDS? WHAT IS THE PUBLIC ACCESS PROGRAM?

► The Colorado State Board of Land Commissioners (the State Land Board) is a constitutionally-created agency that manages a \$4 billion endowment of assets for the intergenerational benefit of Colorado's K-12 schoolchildren and public institutions. They are the second-largest landowner in Colorado, and generate revenue on behalf of beneficiaries by leasing nearly three million surface acres and four million subsurface acres for agriculture, grazing, recreation, commercial real estate, rights-of-way, renewable energy, oil, gas and solid minerals. The State Land Board is entirely self-funded and receive no tax dollars.

► The State Trust Public Access Program includes 500,000 acres of land that is leased to Colorado Parks and Wildlife for the public to enjoy a variety of wildlife-related activities. The signs on each property will inform you of what is allowed at each location. Only trust lands listed in this brochure that are part of the Public Access Program are open to the public.

► Leases on state trust land generate more than \$100 million annually to help support eight trust beneficiaries, primarily K–12 schoolchildren in Colorado. They help fund the Building Excellent Schools Today (BEST) program, which provides competitive grants to school districts for the construction of new schools or the renovation of existing facilities. Nearly 150,000 schoolchildren are enrolled in schools that received a BEST grant. The majority of BEST grant recipients are located in rural areas of the state, and the construction projects have generated approximately 20,000 jobs in those communities.

STATE TRUST LANDS FAQs

► WHAT CAN I DO ON PUBLIC ACCESS LAND?

Lands enrolled in the Public Access Program are open to a variety of wildlife-related uses, including hunting, fishing and wildlife viewing. General recreation such as hiking, horseback riding and dog walking are not allowed under the program. Refer to the listings on the following pages for site-specific rules and timeframes for use. Most lands are not accessible by vehicle, ATVs or snowmobiles, and there may be additional restrictions on camping, parking and off-road driving. Unauthorized use or activity on these lands may be subject to enforcement from CPW officers or local authorities.

► WHEN ARE THEY OPEN?

Most properties are open for wildlife-related recreation from Sept. 1 through the end of February, unless listed otherwise in this brochure. Enrolled lands are closed to public access all other times of the year. Unauthorized use or entry during closed periods is considered trespassing and may be subject to prosecution.

► WHERE ARE THEY?

STATE TRUST LANDS ACCESS PROGRAM RULES

ACT RESPONSIBLY

Only State Trust Lands listed in this brochure are open to the public. Hunters and fishermen are reminded to respect the rights of other visitors and the owners or permit holders of State Trust Lands. Abide by state rules so the lands can remain open for future wildlife recreation. (Permission is required to access any State Trust Land not listed in this brochure.)

The following restrictions apply to all STL Public Access Program lands leased by Colorado Division of Parks and Wildlife. Additional property-specific restrictions are listed in this brochure.

1. PROPERTIES ARE:

- Open only to hunting, fishing and wildlife viewing. Target practice, nonhunting shooting, outfitting and nonwildlife related use prohibited.
- Closed 1/2 hour after sunset until 1/2 hour before sunrise, unless posted otherwise.

► Closed to the public from March 1–Aug. 31, unless posted otherwise. All newly enrolled properties are closed to the public until Sept. 1 of the year of enrollment, unless posted otherwise.

2. MOTOR VEHICLES are allowed only on designated roads.

3. ACCESS RESTRICTED to foot or horseback only, unless posted otherwise.

4. LITTERING PROHIBITED. All trash must be packed out by users.

5. CAMPING, FIRES PROHIBITED, unless posted otherwise.

6. ILLEGAL FIREARMS. It is illegal to possess the following types of ammunition or firearms: tracer rounds, armor-piercing rounds, military-hardened rounds with explosive or radioactive substances, .50-caliber BMG rounds, fully automatic firearms.

7. YOUTH MENTOR HUNTING applies to youths under 18. Youth hunters under 16 must be accompanied by a mentor when hunting on youth-mentor properties. Mentors must be 18 or older, comply with hunter education requirements and accompany youths while hunting.

8. CERTIFIED HAY, STRAW, MULCH ONLY. It is illegal to have, store or use hay, straw or mulch that has not been certified as noxious weed-free, according to the Weed Free Forage Crop Certification Act, or any state or province participating in the Regional Certified Weed Free Forage Program. Certified materials must be clearly marked by the certifying state. People who transport such materials on federal, state or county roads that cross State Trust Lands leased by CPW and hay produced on property where it's being used are exempt.

STATE PARK ACCESS RULES

The following information applies to all Colorado State Parks. Additional property-specific information is listed on the pages that follow.

PARK HOURS

- ▶ Most parks are open every day of the year, weather permitting, but please see individual park listings for exceptions.
- ▶ Day-use areas generally are open 5 a.m.–10 p.m. Some day-use parks have closed gates at night; contact the park for hours of operation.

HUNTING ON STATE PARKS

- ▶ Hunting is allowed only on some state parks. If it is allowed, it will be listed under "Recreation" in the parks information that starts on page 45.

STATE PARK FEES & PASSES

FEES AND ENTRANCE PASSES

- ▶ Entrance fees are charged at all state parks. They help offset operating costs.
 - ▶ Daily passes are \$7–\$9 per vehicle, depending on which park you visit.
 - ▶ Passes are available at the park and are valid until noon the following day after purchase. Typically, entrance fees cover all occupants of a vehicle, though some parks may charge a per-person fee (for walk-in or bicyclists).
- NOTE:** Cherry Creek State Park is subject to an additional fee for the Cherry Creek Basin Water Quality Authority.

ANNUAL PASS

- ▶ An annual pass allows you access to all state parks for 12 months from the date of purchase. Available at any state park, at CPW offices, <https://wildlifestore.state.co.us/p-355-annual-parks-pass.aspx> or by calling 303-866-3437.
- ▶ \$70 for one vehicle. Additional vehicle passes are \$35. An annual park pass is used in lieu of a daily entrance pass.

CAMPING & RESERVATIONS

- ▶ Reserve campsites, yurts and cabins from six months up to three days in advance by going to cpw.state.co.us, or call 303-470-1144, or 800-678-CAMP (2267) outside the Denver metro area.
- ▶ A non-refundable reservation fee applies when booking. Any site not reserved is available on a first-come, first-serve basis.
- ▶ Entrance fees apply at all parks in addition to camping and reservation fees.

- ▶ Discounted annual passes are available to Colorado residents who are 64 years and older, disabled or eligible because of income.

MILITARY PASS

- ▶ Active duty military and veterans are admitted free to state parks for the month of August and on Veteran's Day (Nov. 11).
- ▶ The military member or veteran must show proof of military service (photo ID, DD-214, VA medical card) and obtain the free pass from any Colorado state park or CPW office. The military member or veteran must be in the vehicle using the pass.

CHECK OUT COLORADO STATE PARKS PASS

- ▶ Stop by one of 300 public libraries across the state to check out the CPW adventure backpack and visit one of our 41 state parks for free! The backpack comes with a free state parks pass that's good for seven days, as well as binoculars, wildlife and tree/plant guides, and other items for learning and exploring.






