Operation Game Thief (OGT) is a non-profit organization working with the DOW's law enforcement program. It pays rewards to citizens who report poachers or resource violations. Callers don't have to reveal their names, testify in court or sign a deposition. Rewards are paid if the information leads to the arrest of a poacher or a citation is issued. Rewards do not depend on a conviction but must be requested when a violation is reported. Call toll-free, 1-877-COLOOGT toll free. The number should not be used for information requests or emergencies.

ASK FIRST!!

to Hunt & Fish on Private Land

It is illegal to hunt on private land without permission from the landowner or person in charge. You also should *Ask First* before you or your dog retrieves game from the banks or bed of streams that flow through private land.

What's New For 2005

Closed Units: Units 89, 97, 99 and 100 are closed for turkey hunting.

New Turkey Units: Units 15, 27, 37, and parts of 36 are now open for limited spring turkey hunting due to a successful transplant in those areas.

New Spring Limited Hunts: Limited spring turkey licenses are now available by drawing in units 124, 125, 129 and 130 north of US 50 except on state wildlife areas.

Fall Unlimited Hunt: Unit 94 is open to unlimited fall hunting.

TOTAL LICENSING SYSTEM

The DOW and license agents are in their second year of using point-of-sale computer terminals to sell licenses. Agents sell licenses and offer services, such as replacing licenses. Licenses also are sold through the DOW's Web site or by calling, 1-800-244-5613. You can use a credit card for phone or internet purchases. You also may apply for limited turkey licenses on the internet. Learn more about the licensing system on our Web site, www.wildlife.state.co.us.

LICENSE INFORMATION

- 1. You must apply in the drawing for limited licenses, valid only for specific dates and units. See limited license list in this brochure.
- 2. You can apply for a limited spring turkey and a limited fall turkey license. You cannot hunt in fall turkey season with a spring turkey license. Fall applications are NOT accepted before June 1. Only 1 application is allowed per season.
- 3. You can buy unlimited licenses at license agents, DOW offices, via the internet or by phone. Unlimited licenses go on sale starting Dec. 1 for spring turkey and July 11 for fall turkey.
- 4. Small game licenses are not valid for turkeys.
- 5. Licenses expire on the date printed on them. Licenses are not transferrable.
- **6.** False statements made in buying licenses or altering licenses are illegal, and doing so voids licenses.

HUNTER EDUCATION (SAFETY)

Anyone born on or after Jan. 1, 1949, must have completed an approved hunter education course or bowhunter education course (for archery licenses only) sanctioned by a state or province before applying for or purchasing a license. Colorado honors hunter education courses from other states and provinces. A hunter safety card must be presented when buying a license over the counter at a license agency. You also must carry your hunter education card when hunting, unless "Verified" is printed by the DOW on your license. Out-of-state hunters are encouraged to bring their hunter education card with them when coming to Colorado to hunt.

RESIDENCY QUALIFICATIONS

Who qualifies as a Colorado resident for a hunting license:

- 1. Anyone who has lived here continuously at least six months immediately before applying for or buying a license and who intends to make Colorado home. (Except #2 & 3 below.)
- 2. U.S. armed services personnel, military personnel of U.S. allies, U.S. Diplomatic Service personnel and diplomatic services of nations recognized by U.S. military, personnel stationed here on permanent active duty orders or who were residents of Colorado when they entered the military (unless they changed their home of record to another state). Dependents of these groups also qualify. Active duty does not include personnel in reserve status or the National Guard. See "Filling Out Applications."
- 3. Full-time students enrolled and attending a Colorado college, university or trade school at least six months immediately before applying for or buying a license, including students temporarily absent from Colorado but still enrolled.
- 4. Children under 18 have the same residency status as their parent or legal guardian.

RANCHING FOR WILDLIFE

Public RFW licenses available only to Colorado residents by drawing. Licenses valid only for season and ranch on the license. RFW licenses are listed with hunt codes in this brochure. RFW landowners must provide free access to hunters who draw a public license for the ranch. By applying for a RFW license, hunters allow the DOW to provide applicant information to the ranch. RFW hunting rules are different for each ranch. Read ranch rules before applying. Rules are found on our Web site, wildlife.state.co.us/ranching/ranching.asp.

HARVEST INFORMATION PROGRAM

You **do not** need to register with the Harvest Information Program (HIP) to hunt turkeys.

HUNTING HOURS

One-half hour before sunrise to sunset. See Sunset/Sunrise chart.

BAG AND POSSESSION LIMITS

- 1. Annual bag and possession limit is 1 bearded turkey in spring season and 1 turkey of either sex in fall.
- 2. Hunters with a **limited** spring license can take 2 bearded turkeys. One must be harvested on the limited license in the limited area. The second must be harvested with an unlimited license in an unlimited area. If you take 2 turkeys in spring, you cannot take a turkey in fall.

LEGAL HUNTING METHODS

- 1. SHOTGUNS, including muzzleloading shotguns, cannot be larger than 10-gauge and must not be able to hold more than three shells in the magazine and chamber combined. Shotguns originally capable of holding more than three shells must be plugged. Shot must be size #2 (lead or steel) or smaller. Single slugs are illegal.
- 2. HAND-HELD BOWS
- 3. CROSSBOWS
- 4. RIFLES AND HANDGUNS:
- a. Spring Season: Rifles and handguns illegal in spring season.
- b. Fall Season Only: Except in units 91, 92, 94, 96 & 951, rifles and handguns can be muzzleloading, centerfire or rimfire, and bullets must be at least 38 grains with manufacturer's energy rating of at least 110 foot-pounds at 100 yards from muzzle.
- **6.** Turkeys can be taken over standing crops or feed scattered solely for agricultural purposes.
- 7. It is illegal to use bait while turkey hunting. Baiting is placing, or scattering salt, mineral, grain or other feed to attract wildlife.
- 8. Artificial decoys permitted. Recorded or electronically amplified calls are illegal. Manual calls are legal.

CONTESTS

It is illegal to promote, conduct, offer to conduct or participate in contests involving marked or tagged small game and upland game birds for money or valuable prizes. Valuable prizes do not include certificates of recognition or other tokens without significant monetary value. This does not apply to wildlife parks and field trials licensed by DOW.

TAGGING

 After killing a turkey, hunters must immediately detach, sign and date the carcass tag and attach it to the carcass. Tags must stay attached while the carcass is transported, in camp, in storage or in your possession.

2. If the carcass tag is accidentally detached from the license, or lost or destroyed, you must get a duplicate before hunting. You must give proof to the DOW that the tag was accidentally detached to get a duplicate.

EVIDENCE OF SEX

A turkey killed in the spring must have beard naturally attached while being transported.



PREFERENCE POINTS

- One preference point is awarded if you apply properly and are unsuccessful in drawing a license for your first-choice hunt code, or if you apply for a preference point hunt code as your first choice. You can only get 1 preference point per calendar year.
- 2. Second-, third- or fourth-choice hunt codes don't use or generate preference points.
- **3.** Preference points accumulate until you draw a license as a first choice. If you don't apply at least once in 5 consecutive years for any species, your file is purged. Applying for preference points keeps your file active.
- **4.** Priority goes to the hunter with the most points except for group applications. Group applications are processed based on whoever has the fewest points.
- 5. If unsuccessful, your refund stub will show your accumulated points. Keep stub for your records.
- **6. Preference Point Hunt Code:** To apply for a preference point only, enter hunt code **T-P-999-99-P** as the first choice on your application. You must pay the full license cost even if you're just applying for a preference point. Your license fee, minus the \$3 application fee, will be refunded.

LAND USE RULES

- 1. Union Tract of Elliott SWA: closed to turkey hunting.
- 2. Spanish Peaks SWA: hunting permitted only Sat., Sun., Mon. and Tues. in spring turkey seasons.
- 3. It is illegal to hunt on **private land** without permission from landowner or person in charge. It is illegal to post, sign or indicate that public lands (except those under an exclusive-control lease) are private. It is illegal to hunt on **State Trust Lands** without permission of lessee, except those open for wildlife recreation.
- 4. Field trials occur on some state wildlife areas where turkey

hunting is allowed, especially in Feb., March, Aug. and Sept. and at Banner Lakes, South Republican (Bonny Res.) and Tamarack.

5. Higel, Rio Grande SWAs: access permit required for spring season. Permits issued by drawing. Applications available at DOW, 0722 S. Road 1E, Monte Vista, CO 81144. Group applications accepted. No more than 2 per group. Application deadline: Jan. 31. Successful applicants notified by mail. Time, date, location of drawing is on application.

6. Within 1/2 mile of either side of Colorado River from Una bridge east of DeBeque to Utah: fall turkey hunting closed.

MOBILITY-IMPAIRED LICENSES

- 1. Turkey licenses available in specific units for qualified mobility-impaired hunters. Ten licenses available for spring season, valid only on private land in units 91, 92, 96, 102 and only for specified dates.
- 2. You must have a mobility impairment resulting from permanent medical conditions that make it physically impossible to hunt without attendant's help. Evidence may include (not limited to) prescribed wheelchair, shoulder or arm crutches, walker, two canes or other prescribed equipment.
- 3. Applications are available from and must be submitted with fee to DOW, Limited Licenses, 6060 Broadway, Denver. Hunters can apply from the Monday after the Wildlife Commission meeting in Nov. until spring turkey season ends.
 4. Applications must include statement from a licensed medical
- doctor, certified physical, occupational or recreational therapist, describing the impairment and permanent medical condition that makes it impossible to hunt without attendant's help.

 Additional documentation may be required.

WEAPONS RESTRICTIONS

Colorado and federal laws prohibit people convicted of certain crimes, such as domestic violence, from possessing weapons, even for hunting. If you were convicted of a crime, check with the appropriate law enforcement authority to learn how these laws apply to you.

CHILD SUPPORT DELINQUENCY

The Colorado Child Support Enforcement Act now requires your Social Security number to buy all licenses. It is not displayed on the license but is provided, if requested, to the Colorado Department of Human Services, Child Support Enforcement. Hunting and fishing licenses will not be issued to people delinquent in their child support.

WILDLIFE EDUCATION FUND

The Wildlife Management Public Education Advisory Council is charged with designing a media-based program to educate the public about the benefits of hunting and fishing as wildlife management tools. The council's goal is communicating the role hunting plays in wildlife management so voters can decide on issues affecting hunters and wildlife. CUSTOMER ID NUMBERS

- 1. If you bought a license after 2003, your Customer Identification Number (CID) is on the license. If you have a Conservation Certificate, you can still use that number to apply. The number is in the upper right corner of the CC. If you were mailed this brochure, your CC or CID number may be on the address label above your name.
- 2. If you don't have a CID, see "Filling Out Applications."
- 3. If your address changed, use change of address form in the application insert. Fill in all sections and mail the form separately to the DOW. Don't mail it with your application.

FILLING OUT APPLICATIONS

- 1. Print in capital, block letters and stay within the boxes. Be as neat as possible.
- 2. Do not cut or fold applications. Tear along perforations.
- 3. Use black ballpoint pen only. Photocopies not accepted.
- 4. CC/CID Number. Starting from left to right, enter your number. If you've never had a CID, don't get one from a license agent. Instead, leave that part of the form blank. Fill out the rest of the form, including the shaded area. You will receive a new CID with the first license you buy.
- 5. Enter a first-choice. Hunters now have the option of listing three more choices.
- **6.** Permission to provide information allows information from applications to be provided to organizations that provide hunting information, services and products, including guides and outfitters, Ranching for Wildlife participants and equipment manufacturers. If you check this box and decide you don't want your information released, you can cancel your permission by writing DOW, 6060 Broadway, Denver, CO 80216, Attn: Call Center; in person at DOW offices; email www.wildlife.dowinfo@state.co.us; or by phone, (303) 297-1192.
- 7. Enter your name as on your CID. Use capital letters. Enter as many letters as will fit. Enter your birth date as on your CID with all four digits of the year.
- 8. If you are a Colorado resident, fill in "Colorado Resident

Since" boxes with month (MM) and year (YYYY) you moved here (if you have always lived in Colorado, enter the month and year of your birth). If you're in the military in Colorado, enter "88 8888" - one number per box.

9. Only applications having the same CID number in the GROUP APPLICATION box will be entered as a group. Group leaders must also complete this section. If the leader has no CID, leader must call the DOW to get a number. 10. If you have preference points, mark an X in that box. To apply for a turkey preference point, enter hunt code T-P-

999-99-P as the First Choice on your application. Put "X" in the box to show you have a valid hunter education card, if you were born on or after Jan.1, 1949.

11. Social Security Number. Per the Colorado Child Support Enforcement Act, your Social Security number (SSN) is required to buy or apply for DOW licenses. Your SSN is not displayed on licenses. It is provided when requested to the Colorado Department of Human Services, Child Support Enforcement and is used to enforce the law.

12. Sign your application. Enter a day phone number.

13. To donate to Wildlife Management Education Fund, mark "X." Add donation amount to license fee payment.

GROUPS

To apply as a group, you must select a leader. See #9 above. All group members must fill out their applications the same. using the same person as leader. Members must mail their applications separately.




REFUNDS

GAME MANAGEMENT UNIT MAP






MAPS OF LIMITED LICENSE AREAS FOR TURKEY

TURKEY HUNTING SAFETY TIPS

- **1. Be Sure of Your Target.** Never shoot at sound or movement. Be certain of your target before you pull the trigger.
- 2. Be Alert when using a turkey call. Other hunters may mistake it for a real turkey.
- 3. Protect Your Back and Maintain Visibility. Your calling position should have a solid background as wide as your shoulders and higher than your head while providing you with 180-degree visibility. Don't hide so well that you can't see what's happening. Camouflage hides you but doesn't make you invisible. Sit perfectly still; turkeys and hunters both see even slight movement.
- 4. Colors and Blaze Orange. To alert other hunters to your presence, hang fluorescent material such as a cap or vest above your calling spot and wear fluorescent orange while going to and from your hunting spot. Eliminate red, white and blue from your clothes since mature male turkeys also sport these colors.
- 5. Don't Stalk: Never stalk a turkey in the spring. Chances of success are slim; accident chances are high. Birds are breeding then and are more wary and alert. Find a concealed location and let the bird come to you. Don't move, wave or use turkey calls to alert another hunter. A quick move may create a hazard. If necessary, yell or blow a whistle to alert another hunter of your presence.

GUIDE TO LEGAL HUNTING HOURS

The table below is valid for Denver, CO, through the year 2005. SUBTRACT one minute from opening and closing time for each 12 1/2 miles east of Denver. ADD one minute to opening and closing time for each 12 1/2 miles west of Denver. The above changes assume each degree of longitude equals 50 miles and that a change of 1 degree of longitude equals 4 minutes change in sunrise and sunset times. Daylight Saving Time begins April 4 and ends Oct. 31.
