What's New For 2006

Fee Increase: The Colorado Legislature has approved a license fee increase, starting Jan. 1.

Habitat Stamp: As of Jan. 1, hunters, anglers and visitors to state wildlife areas must buy a Habitat Stamp. See "Habitat Stamp."

Education Surcharge: The fee bill included a 75-cent surcharge for the Wildlife Management Public Education Fund.

Preference Point Hunt Codes: Hunters can now apply for preference points for Rocky Mountain bighorn sheep and mountain goats. See "Preference Point Hunt Code."

Unit Re-opened: Unit S33 is now open to sheep hunting after being closed for 15 years. See "Sheep and Goat Licenses."

New Sheep Unit: Unit S70 has been created for sheep hunting in southwest Colorado. See "Sheep and Goat Licenses."

LICENSE INFORMATION

1. All sheep and mountain goat licenses are limited, available only by drawing for specific units.
2. Bighorn Sheep: If you harvest a Rocky Mountain bighorn ram (1/2 curl or larger), except on an auction, raffle or special sheep management license, you must wait 5 years (6th year after harvest) before you can apply for another Rocky Mountain bighorn ram license. You cannot apply for a Rocky Mountain bighorn and desert bighorn in the same year.
3. Desert Bighorn Sheep: If you harvest a desert bighorn sheep, you cannot participate in future desert bighorn sheep drawings.
4. Mountain Goat: If you harvest a mountain goat, except on an auction, raffle or special goat management license, you must wait 5 years (6th year after harvest) before you can apply for another mountain goat license.

5. You must be at least 12 years old to hunt sheep and goats. Youths 12-15 can hunt sheep and goats but must meet hunter education requirements and hunt with a mentor. A mentor must be 18 or older and have a hunter education card, if born on or after Jan. 1, 1949. The mentor is not required to hunt. Youths and mentors must be able to see and hear each other while hunting without binoculars, radios, other devices or aids. Youths may apply for a sheep or goat license at age 11 if they turn 12 before they go hunting. At age 16, youths must buy an adult license and can hunt alone.

6. Ten percent of limited licenses are allocated to nonresidents.

7. Licenses expire on the date printed on them. Licenses are not transferrable.

8. It is illegal to make false statements to obtain a license and alter a license, and doing so voids the license.

9. For information on raffle or auction licenses, call (303) 297-1192. Raffle and auction licenses are valid through Oct. 31 in units closing before Oct. 31. Licenses are for any open hunting area in 2006 sheep or goat hunting seasons. Licenses are valid in addition to sheep or goat licenses obtained in the DOW drawing.

10. Lost or destroyed licenses can be replaced by paying a replacement fee at any DOW office or license agent.

TOTAL LICENSING SYSTEM

Colorado residents now can apply online for sheep and goat licenses. Instead of filling out the applications in this brochure and mailing them to the DOW by the April 4 deadline, residents can go to our Web site and use an automated system to apply for licenses. The online application process is easier, faster, saves postage and has automated features that help cut down on many simple and obvious mistakes, thereby reducing the chances of your application being rejected due to errors. Applying online is just one of the features of the DOW's Total Licensing System. DOW offices and license agents now use computer terminals to sell unlimited licenses and provide other services, such as replacing licenses and verifying hunter education cards issued by the

RESIDENCY QUALIFICATIONS

Who qualifies as a Colorado resident for a hunting license:

1. Anyone who has lived in Colorado continuously at least six months immediately before applying for or buying a license and who intends to make Colorado home. (Except #2 & 3 below.)
2. U.S. armed services personnel; military personnel of U.S. allies; U.S. diplomatic service personnel and diplomatic services of nations recognized by the U.S. military; personnel stationed here on permanent active duty orders or who were residents of Colorado when they entered the military (unless they changed their home of record to another state). Dependents of these groups also qualify. Active duty does not include reserve status or the National Guard.
3. Full-time students enrolled and attending a Colorado college, university or trade school at least six months immediately before applying for or buying a license, including students temporarily absent from Colorado but still enrolled.
4. Children under 18 have the same residency status as their parent or legal guardian.

HABITAT STAMP

New For 2006: Sportsmen and conservationists have joined to develop the habitat stamp, which Colorado lawmakers approved starting Jan. 1. Money from stamp sales goes to acquire and manage habitat for hunting, fishing and wildlife viewing. For people 19-64, the stamp is \$5 and is required on the first 2 licenses bought in a calendar year. The stamp is \$10 if bought without a license and is required of people 19-64 who use a state wildlife area. Lifetime stamps are \$200. People younger than 19 and older than 64 are not required to buy the stamp. The \$5 isn't collected when hunters apply for limited licenses in the drawing. Instead, limited licenses will read "Habitat Stamp Required" and hunters must comply with these requirements.

HUNTER EDUCATION (SAFETY)

Anyone born on or after Jan. 1, 1949, must have **completed** an approved hunter education course or bowhunter education course (for archery licenses only) sanctioned by a state or province before applying for or purchasing a license. Colorado honors hunter education courses from other states and provinces. A hunter safety card must be presented when buying a license over the counter at a license agency. All hunters must carry their hunter education card when hunting unless "Verified" is printed by the DOW on their license.

RANCHING FOR WILDLIFE

Public RFW licenses are available only to Colorado residents by drawing. Licenses are valid only for season and ranch on the license. RFW licenses are listed with hunt codes in this brochure. RFW landowners must provide free access to hunters who draw a public license for the ranch. By applying for a RFW license, hunters allow the DOW to provide applicant information to the ranch. RFW hunting rules are different for each ranch. Read ranch rules before applying, found on our Web site, www.wildlife.state.co.us/ranching/ranching.asp.

SHEEP AND GOAT HUNTER ORIENTATION

Hunters are invited to attend a free course on sheep and goat hunting sponsored by the DOW, Rocky Mtn. Bighorn Society,

Colorado Bowhunters Assoc. and the International Order of Rocky Mtn. Goats. To find out when and where the course will be, call (303) 297-1192. Successful applicants will receive agenda and information by mail.

SPECIAL MANAGEMENT LICENSES

Special licenses may be issued to prevent spread of disease and unplanned expansion of sheep and goat populations. Licenses are offered to unsuccessful applicants from nearby units for the same species, in the order in which they would have drawn if successful. Season dates to be determined. These licenses do not use or generate preference points.

DEFINITIONS

1. One-half curl ram: Male bighorn sheep with horn or horns with one or both tips grown at least through half or 180 degrees of a circle, measured by first establishing a reference line bisecting eye and base of the ear. A 1/2-curl ram has 1 or both horns grown at least as far as projection of reference line.



2. Ewe: A female sheep with horn or horns at least 5 inches long measured on outside curve.
3. Mature Goat: A mountain goat at least 1 year old.

HUNTING HOURS

One-half hour before sunrise to one-half hour after sunset. See "Guide to Legal Hunting Hours."

BAG AND POSSESSION LIMITS

1. Bighorn sheep - See "License Information."
2. Mountain goat - See "License Information."
3. You can apply for 1 bighorn sheep license and 1 mountain goat license a year. You cannot apply for a Rocky Mountain bighorn sheep license and a desert bighorn sheep license in the same year.
4. If you apply for more than one bighorn sheep license, your applications will be void, including group applications.

LEGAL HUNTING METHODS

1. **HAND-HELD BOW:** a long bow, recurved bow or compound bow on which the string is not drawn mechanically or held mechanically under tension. String or mechanical releases are legal if they are hand-drawn or hand-held with no other attachments or connections to the bow (other than bowstring).
 - a. Hand-held bows, including compound bows, must use arrows with a broadhead having an outside diameter or min. width of 7/8 inch with min. 2 steel cutting edges. Each cutting edge must be in same plane for entire length of cutting surface.
 - b. Only legal hand-held bows allowed during archery seasons.
 - c. Min. draw weight: 35 lbs. Let-off max: 80%.
 - d. No part of bow's riser (handle) or track, trough, channel, arrow rest or other device (excluding cables and bowstring) that attaches to the riser can contact, support and/or guide the arrow from a point rear-

ward of the bow's brace height behind the undrawn string.

e. Bows can propel only a single arrow at a time. Mechanisms for automatically loading arrows are allowed.

f. Scopes, electronic or battery-powered devices cannot be incorporated into or attached to a bow.

g. Hydraulic or pneumatic technology cannot be used to derive or store energy to propel arrows. Explosive arrows prohibited.

2. CROSSBOWS:

a. Min. draw weight: 125 lbs.

b. Min. draw length: 14 inches from front of bow to nocking point of drawstring.

c. Positive mechanical safety device required.

d. Bolts must be min. 16 inches long, have a broadhead min. 7/8 inch wide and min. of 2 steel cutting edges. Each cutting edge must be in same plane for entire length of cutting surface.

e. Illegal in archery seasons.

3. MUZZLELOADING RIFLES

& SMOOTHBORE MUSKETS

a. In-line muzzleloaders are legal.

b. Must have a single-barrel firing a single round-ball or conical projectile with max. length of twice the diameter.

c. To hunt deer, pronghorn or bear, they must be min. .40 caliber.

d. To hunt elk or moose, they must be min. .50 caliber.

e. From .40 caliber to .50 caliber, bullets must weigh min. 170 grains.

f. If greater than .50 caliber, bullets must weigh min. 210 grains.

g. Shotshell primers are legal.

4. **RIFLES** must be min. .24 caliber (6 mm); have min. 16-inch barrel and be min. 26 inches long, fired from the shoulder. Rifles must use expanding bullets that weigh min. 70 grains and have an impact energy (at 100 yards) of 1,000 ft. pounds, as rated by the manufacturer. Semi-automatic rifles cannot hold more than 6 rounds in the magazine and chamber combined. Fully automatic rifles are prohibited.

5. **SHOTGUNS:** Min. 20 gauge and must fire a single slug. Barrel length: min. 18 inches. Overall length: min. 26 inches.

6. **HANDGUNS:** Barrel length: min. 4 inches. Must use a min. .24-caliber (6 mm) diameter expanding bullet, and with no shoulder stock or attachment. Must use only cartridge or load with min. energy of 550 ft. pounds at 50 yards.

IT'S AGAINST THE LAW TO:

1. Have a loaded (in the chamber) rifle or shotgun in or on a motor vehicle, including motorcycles. Muzzleloading rifles are considered unloaded if the percussion cap or shotshell primer is removed or if the powder is removed from flashpan.

2. Carry firearms (except handguns) on an OHV during deer, elk, pronghorn antelope and bear seasons unless they are unloaded in the chamber and magazine. Firearms (except handguns) and bows carried on an OHV must be fully enclosed in a hard or soft case. Scabbards or cases with open ends or sides are prohibited. This does not apply to landowners or their agents who carry a firearm on an OHV to take depredating wildlife on property they own or lease.

3. Hunt carelessly or discharge a firearm or release an arrow disregarding human life or property.

4. Operate or ride a snowmobile with a firearm unless it's completely unloaded and cased, or with a bow unless it's unstrung or cased. Compound bows must be cased, not unstrung.

5. Shoot from or use a motor vehicle, motorcycle, off-highway vehicle, snowmobile or aircraft to hunt, intercept, chase, harass or drive wildlife.

6. Use aircraft to hunt, to direct hunters on the ground or to hunt the same day or day after a flight was made to find wildlife.

7. Hunt under the influence of alcohol or controlled substances.

8. Use electronic night vision equipment, electronically enhanced light-gathering optics or thermal imaging devices as an aid in hunting or taking wildlife. Having a firearm with cartridges in the chamber or magazine, or loaded with powder or ball, or a strung, uncased bow while trying to project artificial light into area where wildlife can be found is prima facie evidence of a violation.

9. Use poison, drugs or explosives to hunt or harass wildlife.

10. Fail to completely extinguish a campfire.

11. Fail to make a reasonable attempt to track and kill animals you wound or may have wounded. It is also against the law to pursue wounded wildlife that goes on private property without first obtaining permission from the landowner or person in charge of the property.

12. Fail to prepare edible wildlife meat for human consumption. At a minimum, the four quarters, tenderloins and backstraps are edible meat. Internal organs are not considered edible meat.

13. Shoot from, across or on a public road with a firearm, bow or crossbow. People firing a bow, rifle, handgun or shotgun with a single slug must be at least 50 feet from the centerline of the road.

14. Party hunt (kill someone else's game or let someone kill yours).

15. Interfere with hunters. That includes alarming, distracting or frightening prey; causing prey to flee by using light or noise; chasing prey on foot or by vehicle; throwing objects; making movements; harassing hunters by using threats or actions; erecting barriers to deny access to hunting areas and intentionally injecting yourself into the line of fire. Violators face criminal prosecution and may have to pay damages to the victim, as well as court costs.

16. Kill and abandon big game. Taking big game, removing only the hide, antlers or other trophy parts and leaving the carcass in the field are illegal. (Felony)

17. Sell, purchase or offer to sell or purchase big game. (Felony)

18. Solicit someone to illegally take big game for commercial gain or providing outfitting services without required registration. (Felony)

19. If convicted of these felony violations, you may face a lifetime license suspension in Colorado.

EVIDENCE OF SEX

1. These are considered evidence of sex: Males: head, including antlers or horns, testicle, scrotum or penis. Females: head, udder (mammary) or vulva.

2. It is illegal to have or transport a big game carcass, or considerable part of it, without evidence of sex *naturally attached*. Evidence of sex must remain attached to the carcass until it is cut into processed meat (commercially or otherwise), wrapped and frozen, or stored at licensee's home.

3. The head or intact skull of sheep and goats with horns *naturally attached* to skull plate must accompany the carcass.

CARCASS TAGS

You must attach the carcass tag to big game you kill. The tag must stay on meat until processing. Instructions are on carcass tag. If you lose, accidentally destroy or inadvertently detach the tag, you must get a duplicate from the DOW before hunting. You must prove the loss, detachment or destruction was accidental.

MANDATORY CHECK: BIGHORN SHEEP

1. All bighorns, including ewes and desert bighorns, must be inspected by a DOW officer or at a DOW office within 5 working days of harvest. You must personally present sheep with horns and skull intact. Harvest report is completed at that time. A permanent marker will be attached to the horn of bighorn rams.
2. All licensees (successful or not) must return completed questionnaire within 30 days after a season ends, or they are ineligible for future sheep licenses.
3. It is illegal to trade, transfer or sell bighorn ram heads or horns unless DOW inspects and permanently marks horns.
4. The DOW permanently marks only bighorn rams killed with a license, not horns found in the field. It is illegal to trade, transfer or sell bighorn capes and horns, or skulls with unmarked horns.

MANDATORY CHECK: MOUNTAIN GOATS

1. Hunters must personally present goat carcasses with horns and skull intact to a DOW officer or office within 5 working days of the kill. You must complete a harvest report during inspection.
2. All licensees (successful or not) must return completed questionnaire within 30 days after a season ends, or they are ineligible for future goat licenses.

TRANSPORTING GAME

1. Sheep and goats must have carcass tags properly attached, except for 20 lbs. or less of meat with a donation certificate.
2. Sheep or goats shipped by common carrier must be accompanied by either the license, a photocopy of license or carcass tag and, if more than 20 lbs., a donation certificate.
3. Processed big game meat must be accompanied by carcass tag or, if donated, a certificate.
4. Be sure animals are properly tagged if you transport big game for other hunters. The upper part of carcass tag must be kept by the hunter who harvested the animal. Carry a list identifying each hunter and animal. If you transport improperly tagged or illegal big game, you can be cited.

DONATING GAME MEAT

A "like license" is a license for exactly the same species, sex, season and method of hunting as a donor's license.

1. You can donate to a person without a "like license":
 - a. up to 20 lbs. of unprocessed meat, at any location.
 - b. more than 20 lbs. of unprocessed meat, only at recipient's home.
2. You can donate to a person with a "like license":
 - a. up to 20 lbs. of unprocessed meat, at any location.
 - b. more than 20 lbs. of unprocessed meat, at any location, only if:
 - (1) recipient's license is unfilled and,
 - (2) recipient puts his own carcass tag on the meat. This establishes the recipient's claim to his portion of the meat and voids his license. Donor's tag must remain with his portion.
 - (3) If the entire carcass is donated, the donor's carcass tag and the recipient's "like license" must be attached to the carcass.
3. Any amount of processed and packaged game meat can be donated to anyone, anywhere.

4. Donations require donation certificates with names, addresses, telephone numbers of donor and recipient; hunting license number of donor; species and amounts donated; date of kill; donor's signature. Certificates can be simple notes. Certificates must be kept with meat until it's completely consumed.

5. Donor and recipient are subject to all bag and possession limits.

CLOSURES

1. **Mt. Evans Hwy.** (units G4 and S3): Hunting prohibited within 1/2 mile either side of the centerline of the Mt. Evans Hwy. (Colo. 5) from Echo Lake to the summit; all of Summit Lake Cirque and all of Summit Lake Flats above 11,600 feet. Also, the Mt. Evans Rd. beyond Summit Lake is closed after Labor Day. From Echo Lake to Summit Lake, road may be closed after Labor Day.
2. It is illegal to hunt or fish on State Land Board properties unless they are leased by the DOW or without permission of lessee.
3. It is illegal to hunt on private land without permission of owner or person in charge.

CHANCELLOR RANCH STATE TRUST LAND (\$61)

Access only by permit to hunters and 1 non-hunting companion. Permits and applications are issued by DOW, 2500 S. Main, Lamar, 81052, (719) 336-6600, or on our Web site. Deadline for bighorn sheep season: July 1. Successful applicants notified by mail. Access permits issued for bighorn sheep: 1 ram permit.

TIPs PROGRAM

The new TIPs program rewards people who voluntarily provide information resulting in charging a poacher with illegal take or possession of big game or turkey. Awards can be a preference point for the species of choice or an unlimited license for the species being reported. Some limited licenses may be available as a third option. Reward licenses do not count toward annual bag and possession limits. Applications and more information about TIPs are available from the DOW.

WEAPONS RESTRICTIONS

Colorado and federal laws prohibit people convicted of certain crimes, such as domestic violence, from possessing weapons, even for hunting. If you were convicted of a crime, check with the appropriate law enforcement authority to learn how these laws apply to you.

CHILD SUPPORT DELINQUENCY

The Colorado Child Support Enforcement Act requires your Social Security number to buy licenses. It is not displayed on the license but is provided, when requested, to Child Support Enforcement authorities. Hunting and fishing licenses are not issued to people delinquent in child support.

Our automated online application process can help cut down on simple mistakes that may disqualify you from the drawing. Plus, hunters will find applying for limited licenses much faster and easier by doing it online. Only Colorado residents can apply for sheep and goat licenses online. Go to: www.wildlife.state.co.us and follow the simple steps to apply.

APPLYING FOR LICENSES

GROUPS

Group applications are not accepted for desert bighorn sheep. Group applications are accepted for Rocky Mountain bighorn sheep and mountain goat licenses. Max. 2 per group. Applications must be sent separately. Colorado residents and nonresidents cannot apply for sheep and goat licenses on the same group application.

PREFERENCE POINTS

1. One preference point is awarded to hunters who apply properly and are unsuccessful in drawing a license for a first-choice hunt code. Priority goes to whoever has the most points. **NOTE:** Hunters who make any error on their application, including on first-choice hunt codes, will not get a preference point.
2. Second, third and fourth-choice hunt codes don't use or generate points.
3. The most points you can accumulate for Rocky Mountain bighorn sheep or mountain goat are 3. If you already have 3 preference points for bighorn sheep or mountain goat and you fail to draw a first-choice license, you will be awarded weighted preference for that species. Weighted preference increases your probability of drawing a license. If you draw a license or don't apply at least once during a five-year period, all accumulated points (weighted or otherwise) become void.
4. Preference points don't apply to desert bighorn sheep.
5. Preference points are not transferable.
6. Incorrect applications do not receive preference points.
7. Group application priority is based on member with fewest points.
8. If unsuccessful for your first choice, you will be notified of accumulated points on your refund stub or on your other choice license.
9. If you are waiting 5 years to reapply for a bighorn ram license, you can apply for a bighorn ewe license. However, if you don't draw a ewe license, you will not get a preference point. See "License Information."

NEW FOR 2006: PREFERENCE POINT HUNT CODE

Rocky Mountain bighorn sheep and mountain goat applicants (not desert bighorn) can apply for a preference point without losing points they already have. A special hunt code is provided in the hunt code sections for each species. Entering the preference point hunt code as a first choice on your application automatically awards you a point. You can then apply for a license as your second, third or fourth choice. You must pay the full cost of a license even if you are applying only for a point. If you apply for a point only, your money, minus the \$3 application fee, is refunded.

FILLING OUT YOUR APPLICATION

1. Print in capital, block letters and stay within the boxes.
2. Do not cut or fold applications. Tear along perforations.
3. Use black ballpoint pen only. Photocopies are not accepted.
4. If you bought a license after 2003, your Customer Identification Number (CID) is on the license. If you have a CC, you can use that number to apply. If you were mailed this brochure, your CID number may be on the address label above your name. Starting from left to right, enter your number.
5. If you've never had a CID/CC, leave that part blank. Fill out the rest of the form, including the shaded area. You will receive a CID number if you draw a license.
6. Enter a first choice. You can list up to three more choices.
7. Enter your name as on your CID. Use capital letters. Enter as many letters as will fit. Enter your birth date as on your CID with four digits for the year.
8. Colorado residents: Fill in "Colorado Resident Since" boxes with month (MM) and year (YYYY) you moved here. If you have always lived in Colorado, enter month and year of your birth. If you're in the military in Colorado, enter "88 8888." One number per box.
9. Only applications with the same CID/CC number in the GROUP APPLICATION box are entered as a group. Group leaders must complete this section. If the leader has no CID, the leader must call the DOW to get a number. All group members must fill out their applications the same, using the same person as leader. Members must mail applications separately.
10. If you have preference points, mark an X in this box.
11. If you were born on or after Jan. 1, 1949, and have completed hunter education, put "X" in the box.
12. Your Social Security number is required to buy or apply for DOW licenses. The SSN is not displayed on licenses. You can contact the DOW directly with your SSN. If you already gave us your SSN, leave this section blank.
13. The "permission to provide" box allows us to give information from applications to entities offering hunting information, services and products, including guides and outfitters. If you check this box and later change your mind, you can cancel by writing DOW, 6060 Broadway, Denver, CO 80216, Attn: Call Center; e-mail www.wildlife.dowinfo@state.co.us; call (303) 297-1192; or visit any DOW office.
14. **NEW FOR 2006:** If your address changed, you can go to our Web site and enter your new address online. If you don't have internet access, you can use the change of address form in this brochure. Mail the form separately by April 4 to the DOW. Don't mail it with your application.
15. Sign the application. Enter a daytime phone number.

SUBMITTING YOUR APPLICATION

1. One application and one check per envelope. Include cashier's check, personal check or money order made to **Colorado Division of Wildlife**. U.S. currency only. No cash. Applications and payments are **NOT** accepted at DOW offices, including Denver. Applications are rejected if your check is returned by the bank. Prosecution may result.
2. Mail your check and application in a 4 1/2 by 9 1/2 inch envelope (standard commercial #10) to the address below. If you have a CC or CID number, enter it on the check.

3. Mail application and payment, postmarked on or before April 4, 2006. Midnight postmark acceptable.

REFUNDS

1. To get a refund, you must relinquish your license and carcass tag before the opening day of the season for which it is valid. The license should be accompanied by a completed request form obtained at a DOW office. Requests must be postmarked before the season starts. If there isn't enough time to request a form, mail your license and carcass tag with a letter to the DOW. The envelope must be postmarked before the season starts.

2. Requests made after a season starts must be submitted to the DOW license review officer. **NEW FOR 2006:** After a season starts, refunds are limited to extreme medical circumstances of the licensee, death of the licensee or death of licensee's immediate family member.

3. Refunds aren't considered more than 30 days after a season starts. The 30-day limit is extended for members of the U.S. military whose military service prevented them from applying for a refund within the required time limits.

4. The \$3 application fee is not refunded. **NEW FOR 2006:** Preference points used in applying are not restored to your record if you return your license. Except, points may be restored in cases of extreme medical circumstances of the licensee, death of the licensee or death of licensee's immediate family member.

PREFERENCE POINT HUNT CODE ROCKY MTN. BIGHORN SHEEP

You can gain a preference point as your first choice on your application to use another year. You can use your second choice to apply for a 2006 license. You must pay the full license cost even if just applying for a point. If you only apply for a point, your cost, minus the \$3 application fee, is refunded. To apply for a Rocky Mountain bighorn sheep preference point, enter hunt code S-P-999-99-P as a First Choice.
