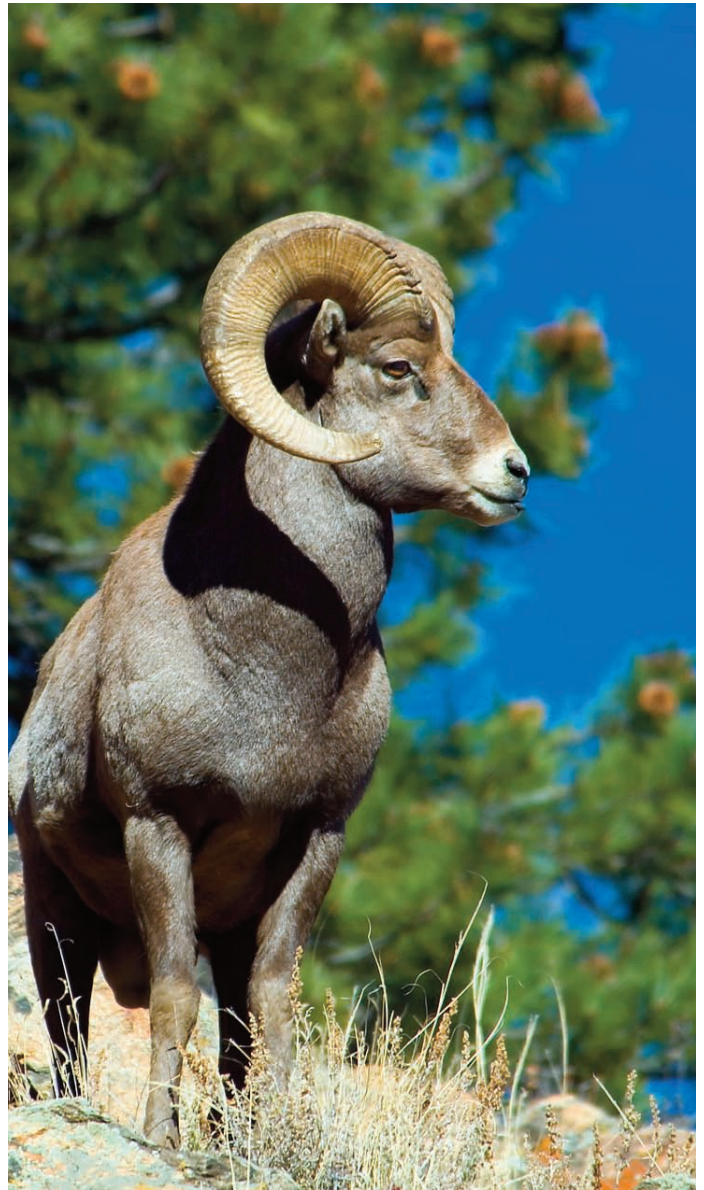

## WHAT'S NEW IN 2010:

- **Desert Bighorn Ram Licenses:** Unit S63 (Middle Dolores River) is now open for resident rifle hunters.
- **Nonresident Desert Bighorn Ram License:** A nonresident ram license is now available in unit S56 (Black Ridge).
- **Bighorn Sheep Ewe Licenses:** Ewe licenses are now available in units S57 (Big Thompson), S15, S16, S21, S28, S33 and S53 (San Juan Mountains).
- **Bighorn Sheep Ram Licenses:** Units S40 (Lone Pine), S39 (Mt. Silverheels) and S41 (Peru Creek) are now open for rifle hunters.
- **Female-Only Goat Licenses:** Female-only (nanny) goat licenses are now available in units G15 and G16. Please see hunt codes for further details.
- **GMU Boundaries:** Unit boundaries for sheep have been reviewed and may have been modified. Please see updated units maps and unit descriptions.

## HUNTER EDUCATION (SAFETY)

Hunters born on or after Jan. 1, 1949, must have completed an approved hunter education course or bowhunter education course (for archery licenses only) sanctioned by a state or province **before** applying for or purchasing a license. Colorado honors hunter education courses from other states and provinces. Hunters must enter the required information when applying by mail or online. When buying a license in person, hunters must present an original hunter education card. Hunters must carry their hunter education card when hunting in Colorado unless a "V" is printed on the license which indicates hunter education has been verified at a CDOW office.

## LICENSE INFORMATION

1. Bighorn sheep and mountain goat licenses are limited, available only by drawing for specific units.
2. Bighorn Sheep: If you harvest a Rocky Mountain bighorn ram (1/2 curl or larger), except with an auction, raffle or special sheep management license, you must wait 5 years (6th year after harvest) before applying for a Rocky Mountain bighorn ram license.
3. You can apply for 1 bighorn sheep license and 1 mountain goat license a year. However, you cannot apply for a Rocky Mountain bighorn and desert bighorn in the same year. If you apply for more than 1 bighorn sheep license, your applications become void.
4. Desert Bighorn Sheep: If you harvest a desert bighorn sheep, you cannot participate in future desert bighorn sheep drawings.
5. Mountain Goat: If you harvest a mountain goat, except with an auction, raffle or special goat management license, you must wait 5 years (6th year after harvest) before applying for a mountain goat license.
6. Youths 12-17 can hunt sheep and goats but must meet hunter education requirements. Youths under 16 must hunt with a mentor. A mentor must be 18 or older and have a hunter education card, if born on or after Jan. 1, 1949. A mentor is not required to hunt. Youths and mentors must be able to see and hear each other while hunting without binoculars, radios, other devices or aids. Youths may apply for a sheep or goat license at age 11 if they turn 12 before they go hunting.
7. Ten percent of limited licenses are allocated to nonresidents.
8. Licenses expire on the date printed on them and are not transferrable.
9. It is illegal to make false statements to obtain a license or alter a license, and doing so voids the license.
10. For information on raffle or auction licenses, call (303) 297-1192 or see the information on the bottom of Page 5. Licenses are available for any unit open to hunting sheep or goats this season. These licenses are valid in addition to sheep or goat licenses obtained in the DOW drawing.
11. Lost or destroyed licenses can be replaced by paying a replacement fee at any DOW office or license agent.

## AUCTION AND RAFFLE LICENSES

Special auction and raffle licenses are available for Rocky Mountain bighorn sheep and mountain goats, allowing you to hunt during extended seasons. These licenses are offered by participating wildlife organizations that return at least 75 percent of the proceeds to the DOW for research, management and education. # 2010 SHEEP & GOAT HUNTING

## HABITAT STAMP REQUIREMENTS

**For License Buyers:** A habitat stamp is required of people 18-64 who buy hunting or fishing licenses. With a license purchase, the stamp is \$5 and required with the first 2 licenses bought per year (\$10 total).

**Lifetime Stamp:** Anyone can buy a \$200 lifetime stamp to satisfy these requirements.

Licenses are **NOT** mailed until you meet your habitat stamp requirement.

## RESIDENCY REQUIREMENTS

These are the requirements to qualify as a Colorado resident to buy a hunting license:

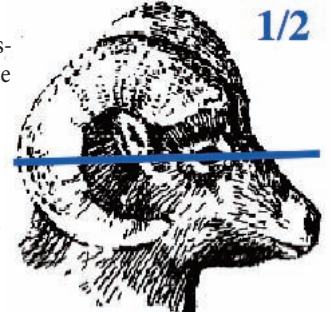
1. You must have lived continuously in Colorado at least six months immediately before applying for or buying a license, and must intend to make Colorado home (except #2 and 3 below.) The residence address you give when purchasing or applying for a license must be the same as on your Colorado income tax return.
2. U.S. military personnel and military personnel of U.S. allies on active duty in Colorado under permanent orders and their dependents. This includes people who were Colorado residents when they entered the military and keep Colorado as their home of record, and their dependents (unless they change their home of record to another state.) Also included are personnel of the U.S. Diplomatic Service or diplomatic services of nations recognized by the U.S. assigned here on permanent active duty orders and their dependents. Active duty does not include reserve status or National Guard.
3. Full-time students enrolled and attending a Colorado college, university or trade school at least six months immediately before applying for or buying a license. This includes students who are temporarily absent from Colorado but still enrolled. Colorado residents who attend school full time out of state and pay nonresident tuition still qualify for a resident license.
4. Children under 18 have the same residency status as their parent, legal guardian or person with whom they live most of the time per court order.
5. If you have a home in Colorado and another state, call (303) 297-1192 to make sure you comply with Colorado residency requirements before obtaining a hunting or fishing license.
6. Except as in #2 and 3 above, you lose your Colorado residency if you apply for, buy or accept hunting or fishing license as a resident of another state or country; register to vote outside Colorado or get a driver's license using an address in another state.

## OPERATION GAME THIEF

Operation Game Thief (OGT) is a nonprofit organization working with the DOW's law enforcement program. It pays rewards to citizens who report poachers or resource violations. Callers don't have to reveal their names, testify in court or sign a deposition. Rewards are paid if the information leads to the arrest of a poacher or a citation is issued. Rewards do not depend on a conviction but must be requested when a violation is reported. Call toll-free, 1-877-COLOOGT (265-6648). The number should not be used for information requests or emergencies.

## DEFINITIONS

1. One-half curl ram: Male bighorn with horn or horns having one or both tips grown at least through half or 180 degrees of a circle, measured by first establishing a reference line bisecting eye and base of the ear. A 1/2-curl ram has 1 or both horns grown at least as far as projection of reference line.
2. Ewe: A female sheep with horn or horns at least 5 inches long measured on outside curve.



## EVIDENCE OF SEX

1. Males: head, including antlers, horns, testicle, scrotum or penis. Females: head, udder (mammary), or vulva.
2. It is illegal to have or transport big game, or a considerable part of it, without evidence of sex *naturally attached*. Evidence of sex must be attached to carcass until it is cut into processed meat (commercially or otherwise), wrapped and frozen, or stored at licensee's home.
3. Head or intact skull of sheep and goats with horns *naturally attached* to skull plate must accompany the carcass.

## RANCHING FOR WILDLIFE

Public RFW licenses are available only to Colorado residents by drawing. Licenses are valid only for season and ranch on the license. RFW hunt codes are listed in this brochure. RFW landowners must provide free access to hunters who draw a public license for the ranch. By applying for a RFW license, hunters allow the DOW to provide applicant information to the ranch. RFW hunting rules are different on each ranch.

## SHEEP AND GOAT HUNTER ORIENTATION

A free course on sheep and goat hunting is sponsored by the DOW, Rocky Mtn. Bighorn Society, Colorado Bowhunters Assoc. and the International Order of Rocky Mtn. Goats. For information, call (303) 297-1192. Successful applicants will receive an agenda and information by mail.

## SPECIAL MANAGEMENT LICENSES

The DOW may issue special licenses to prevent spread of disease and unplanned expansion of sheep and goats. Licenses are offered to unsuccessful applicants from nearby units for the same species. Season dates to be determined. These licenses do not use or generate preference points.

# 2010 SHEEP & GOAT HUNTING

## LEGAL HUNTING METHODS

1. **HAND-HELD BOW:** a long bow, recurve bow or compound bow on which the string is not drawn mechanically or held mechanically under tension. String or mechanical releases are legal if they are hand-drawn or hand-held with no other attachments or connections to the bow (other than bowstring).
  - a. Hand-held bows, including compound bows, must use arrows with a broadhead having an outside diameter or min. width of 7/8 inch with min. 2 steel cutting edges. Each cutting edge must be in same plane for entire length of cutting surface.
  - b. Only legal hand-held bows allowed during archery seasons.
  - c. Min. draw weight: 35 lbs. Let-off max: 80 percent.
  - d. No part of bow's riser (handle) or track, trough, channel, arrow rest or other device (excluding cables and bowstring) that attaches to the riser can contact, support and/or guide the arrow from a point rearward of the bow's brace height behind the undrawn string.
  - e. Bows can propel only 1 arrow at a time. No mechanisms that automatically load arrows are allowed.
  - f. Scopes, electronic or battery-powered devices cannot be incorporated into or attached to a bow or arrow.
  - g. Hydraulic or pneumatic technology cannot be used to derive or store energy to propel arrows. Explosive arrows prohibited.
2. **CROSSBOWS:**
  - a. Min. draw weight: 125 lbs.
  - b. Min. draw length: 14 inches from front of bow to nocking point of drawstring.
  - c. Positive mechanical safety device required.
  - d. Bolts must be min. 16 inches long, have a broadhead min. 7/8 inch wide and min. of 2 steel cutting edges. Each cutting edge must be in same plane for entire length of cutting surface.
  - e. Illegal in archery seasons.
3. **MUZZLELOADING RIFLES & SMOOTHBORE MUSKETS:**
  - a. In-line muzzleloaders are legal.
  - b. Must have a single-barrel firing a single round-ball or conical projectile.
  - c. From .40 caliber to .50 caliber, bullets must weigh min. 170 grains.
  - d. If greater than .50 caliber, bullets must weigh min. 210 grains.
  - e. Shotgun primers are legal.
4. **RIFLES:** Must be min. .24 caliber (6 mm); have min. 16-inch barrel and be min. 26 inches long, fired from the shoulder. Must use expanding bullets that weigh min. 70 grains and have an impact energy (at 100 yards) of 1,000 ft. pounds, as rated by the manufacturer. Semi-automatic rifles cannot hold more than 6 rounds in the magazine and chamber combined. Fully automatic rifles prohibited.
5. **SHOTGUNS:** Min. 20 gauge and must fire a single slug. Barrel length: min. 18 inches. Overall length: min. 26 inches.
6. **HANDGUNS:** Barrel length: min. 4 inches. Must use a min. .24-caliber (6 mm) diameter expanding bullet, and with no shoulder stock or attachment. Must use only cartridge or load with min. energy of 550 ft. pounds at 50 yards.

## IT'S AGAINST THE LAW TO:

1. Have a loaded (in the chamber) rifle or shotgun in or on any motor vehicle. Muzzleloading rifles are considered unloaded if the percussion cap or shotgun primer is removed, or if the powder is removed from flashpan. It is illegal for anyone to have a loaded electronic-ignition muzzleloader in or on a motor vehicle unless the chamber is unloaded or the battery is disconnected and removed from its compartment.
2. Carry firearms (except handguns) on an OHV during deer, elk, pronghorn antelope and bear seasons unless they are unloaded in the chamber and magazine. Firearms (except handguns) and bows carried on an OHV must be fully enclosed in a hard or soft case. Scabbards or cases with open ends or sides are prohibited. This does not apply to landowners or their agents who carry a firearm on an OHV to take depredated wildlife on property they own or lease.
3. Hunt carelessly or discharge a firearm or release an arrow disregarding human life or property.
4. Operate or ride a snowmobile with a firearm unless it's completely unloaded and cased, or with a bow unless it's unstrung or cased. Compound bows must be cased, not unstrung.
5. Shoot from or use a motor vehicle, motorcycle, off-highway vehicle, snowmobile or aircraft to hunt, intercept, chase, harass or drive wildlife.
6. Use aircraft to hunt, to direct hunters on the ground or to hunt the same day or day after a flight was made to find wildlife.
7. Hunt under the influence of alcohol or controlled substances.
8. Use artificial light as an aid in hunting wildlife.
9. Use poison, drugs or explosives to hunt or harass wildlife.
10. Fail to extinguish a campfire.
11. Fail to make a reasonable attempt to track and kill animals you wound or may have wounded. It is against the law to pursue wounded wildlife that goes on private property without first obtaining permission from landowner or person in charge.
12. Fail to prepare edible wildlife meat for human consumption. At a minimum, the four quarters, tenderloins and backstraps are edible meat. Internal organs are not.
13. Shoot from, across or on a public road with a firearm, bow or crossbow. People firing a bow, rifle, handgun or shotgun with a single slug must be at least 50 feet from the centerline of the road.
14. Party hunt (kill someone else's game or let someone kill yours).
15. Interfere with hunters. This includes distracting or frightening prey; causing prey to flee by using light or noise; chasing prey on foot or by vehicle; throwing objects; making movements; harassing hunters by using threats or actions; erecting barriers to deny access to hunting areas and intentionally injecting yourself into the line of fire. Violators face prosecution and may have to pay victim's damages and court costs.
16. Kill and abandon big game. It is illegal to remove only the hide, antlers or other trophy parts and leave the carcass in the field. (Felony)
17. Sell, buy or offer to sell or buy big game. (Felony)
18. Solicit someone to illegally kill big game for commercial gain or provide outfitting services without required registration. (Felony)
19. If convicted of these felony violations, you can face a lifetime license suspension.
20. Use internet or other computer-assisted remote technology while hunting or fishing. Hunters and anglers must be physically present in the immediate vicinity while hunting and fishing.
21. For 2 or more people to use electronic equipment on the ground, in a vehicle or vessel while violating any wildlife law or regulation.

## LEGAL HUNTING HOURS

One-half hour before sunrise to one-half hour after sunset.

## GUIDE TO LEGAL HUNTING HOURS

The table below is valid for Denver, CO. SUBTRACT one minute from opening and closing time for each 12 1/2 miles east of Denver. ADD one minute to opening and closing time for each 12 1/2 miles west of Denver. The above changes assume each degree of longitude equals 50 miles and that a change of 1 degree of longitude equals 4 minutes change in sunrise and sunset times.

## CARCASS TAGS

You must attach a carcass tag to animals you kill per instructions on tag. Tags must stay on carcass until meat is processed and remain with meat until consumed. It is illegal to sign or tear the tag before a kill. If you lose, accidentally destroy or detach the tag, you must get a duplicate from the DOW before hunting and prove the loss, detachment or destruction was accidental. Do not remove other parts of a license except the carcass tag after a kill. Doing so voids the license and you must buy a duplicate.

## MANDATORY CHECK: BIGHORN SHEEP

1. All bighorns, including ewes and desert bighorns, must be inspected by a DOW officer or at a DOW office within 5 working days of harvest. License holder must personally present sheep with horns and skull intact. A harvest report is completed at that time. A permanent marker will be attached to the horn of bighorn rams.
2. All licensees (successful or not) must return completed questionnaire within 30 days after a season ends. If you don't, you become ineligible for future sheep licenses.
3. It is illegal to trade, transfer or sell ram heads or horns unless DOW inspects and permanently marks horns.
4. The DOW permanently marks only rams killed with a license. It is illegal to trade, transfer or sell bighorn capes and horns, or skulls with unmarked horns.

## MANDATORY CHECK: MOUNTAIN GOATS

1. Hunters must personally present goat carcasses with horns and skull intact to a DOW officer or office within 5 working days of the kill. You must complete a harvest report during inspection.
2. All licensees (successful or not) must return completed questionnaire within 30 days after a season ends. If you don't, you become ineligible for future goat licenses.

## LAND USE RESTRICTIONS

1. Mt. Evans Hwy. (units G4 and S3): Hunting prohibited within 1/2 mile either side of the centerline of Mt. Evans Hwy. (Colo. 5) from Echo Lake to the summit; all of Summit Lake Cirque and all of Summit Lake Flats above 11,600 feet. Mt. Evans Rd. beyond Summit Lake is closed after Labor Day. From Echo Lake to Summit Lake, road may be closed after Labor Day.
2. It is illegal to hunt or fish on State Land Board properties unless they are leased by the DOW or without permission of lessee.
3. It is illegal to hunt on private land without permission of owner or person in charge.

## CHANCELLOR RANCH STATE TRUST LAND (S61)

Access only by permit to hunters and 1 non-hunting companion. Permits and applications issued by DOW, 2500 S. Main, Lamar, 81052, (719) 336-6600, or on our website. Deadline for bighorn sheep season: July 1. Successful applicants notified by mail. Access permits issued for bighorn sheep: 1 ram permit.

## TRANSPORTING GAME

1. Sheep and goats must have carcass tags properly attached, except for 20 lbs. or less of meat with a donation certificate.
2. Sheep or goats shipped by common carrier must be accompanied by either the license, a photocopy of license or carcass tag and, if more than 20 lbs., a donation certificate.
3. Processed big game meat must be accompanied by carcass tag or, if donated, a certificate.
4. If you transport someone else's game, animals must be properly tagged, or you can be cited. The upper part of carcass tag must be kept by whoever killed the animal. Carry a list identifying each hunter and animal.

# 2010 SHEEP & GOAT HUNTING

## DONATING GAME MEAT

1. Donation certificates are required for all donations. Certificates must contain names, addresses and telephone numbers of donor and recipient; donor's hunting license number; species and amounts donated; date of kill; donor's signature. The certificate can be a simple note; no special form is required. Certificate must stay with the meat until completely consumed.
2. A "like license" is a license for exactly the same species, sex, season and method of take as a donor's license.
3. Donor and recipient are subject to all bag and possession limits.
4. Any amount of processed and packaged game meat can be donated to anyone, anywhere.
5. You can donate to someone without a "like license":
  - a. up to 20 lbs. of unprocessed meat, anywhere.
  - b. more than 20 lbs. of unprocessed meat, only at recipient's home.
6. You can donate to someone with a "like license":
  - a. up to 20 lbs. of unprocessed meat, anywhere.
  - b. more than 20 lbs. of unprocessed meat, anywhere, only if:
    - (1) recipient's license is unfilled, and
    - (2) recipient's carcass tag is on the meat. This establishes recipient's claim to his/her portion of meat and voids his/her license. Donor's tag must remain with his/her portion.
    - (3) If the entire carcass is donated, donor's carcass tag and recipient's "like license" must be attached to carcass.

## TIPs PROGRAM

TIPs rewards people who voluntarily provide information resulting in charging poachers. Awards can be a preference point for species of choice or an unlimited license for the species reported. Some limited licenses also may be available. TIPs licenses do not count toward annual bag and possession limits.

## WEAPONS RESTRICTIONS

Colorado and federal laws prohibit people convicted of certain crimes, such as domestic violence, from possessing weapons, even for hunting. Check with the appropriate law enforcement agency to learn how these laws apply to you.

## CHILD SUPPORT DELINQUENCY

The Colorado Child Support Enforcement Act requires your Social Security number to buy licenses. It is not displayed on licenses but is provided, when requested, to Child Support Enforcement authorities. Hunting and fishing licenses are not issued to those delinquent in child support.

## GROUPS

Group applications are accepted for Rocky Mountain bighorn sheep and mountain goat licenses. Max. 2 per group. Submit applications separately. Colorado residents and nonresidents cannot apply on the same group application. Group applications are not accepted for desert bighorn sheep.

## PREFERENCE POINTS

1. One preference point is awarded to hunters who apply properly and are unsuccessful in drawing a license for a first-choice hunt code. Priority goes to whoever has the most points. Hunters who make an application error, including on first-choice hunt codes, do not get a point.
2. Second, third and fourth-choices don't use or generate points.
3. The max. points you can accumulate for Rocky Mountain bighorn sheep or mountain goat are 3. If you have 3 preference points for bighorn sheep or mountain goat and you fail to draw a first-choice license, you will receive weighted preference for that species. Weighted preference increases your probability of drawing. If you are issued a first choice license or don't apply at least once during a five-year period, accumulated points are purged from your record.
4. Preference points don't apply to desert bighorn sheep.
5. Preference points are not transferable.
6. Group application priority based on member with fewest points.
7. If unsuccessful for a first choice, your accumulated points will be listed on your refund or other choice license.
8. If you are waiting 5 years to reapply for a bighorn ram license, you can apply for a bighorn ewe license. If you don't draw a ewe license, you won't get a point.
9. Active duty U.S. military stationed in Colorado but deployed outside Colorado are eligible, when they return here, to apply for a preference point for a limited license offered in this year's drawing.

## PREFERENCE POINT HUNT CODE

Rocky Mountain bighorn sheep and mountain goat hunters (not desert bighorn) can apply for a preference point without losing points they already have. A special hunt code is provided in the hunt code section for each species. Entering the preference point hunt code as a first choice on your application automatically awards you a point. You can apply for a license as your second, third or fourth choice. You must pay the full cost of a license and meet all license requirements even if you are applying only for a point. If you apply for a point only, your money, minus the \$3 application fee, is refunded.

## Auction & Raffle Licenses

Special auction and raffle licenses are available for moose, deer, elk, bighorn sheep, mountain goat and pronghorn. The licenses allow one to hunt during extended seasons in any unit open to hunting the specific species. These licenses are offered by participating wildlife conservation organizations that return at least 75 percent of the proceeds to the DOW for research, management and education.

# 2010 SHEEP & GOAT HUNTING

## FILLING OUT YOUR APPLICATION

1. Print in capital, block letters and stay within the boxes.
2. Do not cut or fold applications. Tear along perforations.
3. Use black ballpoint pen only. Photocopies not accepted.
4. If you were mailed this brochure, your CID number may be on the address label above your name. Starting from left to right, enter the number.
5. If you've never had a CID, leave that part blank. Fill out the rest of the form, including the shaded area. You will receive a CID number if you draw a license.
6. Enter a first choice. You can list up to three more choices.
7. Enter your name, using capital letters. Enter as many letters as fit. Enter your birth date with four digits for the year.
8. Fill in "Colorado Resident Since" boxes with the month (MM) and year (YYYY) you moved here. If you always have lived here, enter month and year of birth. Colorado military, enter 88 8888. One number per box.
9. You are encouraged to buy your annual habitat stamp before or when applying for a license. Licenses are **NOT** mailed until you meet the annual habitat stamp requirement. To avoid delays in receiving a license, buy your habitat stamp online or call 1-800-244-5613. You also can include \$5 for a stamp with your license fee when you apply. Put an X in this box if you are sending \$5 for a stamp.
10. Only applications with the same CID number in the group application box are entered as a group. Group leaders must complete this section. If the leader has no CID, the leader must call the DOW to get a number. All group members must fill out their applications the same, using the same person as leader. Members must mail applications separately.
11. If you have preference points, mark an X in this box.
12. If you were born on or after Jan. 1, 1949, and have completed hunter education, put "X" in the box.
13. Your Social Security number is required to buy or apply for hunting licenses. The SSN is not displayed on licenses. You can contact the DOW directly with your SSN. If you already gave us your SSN, leave this section blank.
14. The "permission to provide" box allows us to give information from applications to entities offering hunting information, services and products. If you check this box and change your mind, cancel by writing DOW, 6060 Broadway, Denver, CO 80216, Attn: Call Center; e-mail [wildlife.dowinfo@state.co.us](mailto:wildlife.dowinfo@state.co.us); call (303) 297-1192; or visit a DOW office.
15. Change your address online or use change of address form in this brochure. Mail the form separately by April 6 to the DOW. Don't mail it with the application.
16. Sign the application. Enter a daytime phone number.

## SUBMITTING YOUR APPLICATION

1. One application and check per envelope. Include cashier's check, personal check or money order made to **Colorado Division of Wildlife**. U.S. currency only. No cash. Applications and payments **NOT** accepted at DOW offices, including Denver. Applications are rejected if your check is returned by the bank. Prosecution may result.
2. Mail your check and application in a 4 1/2 by 9 1/2 inch envelope (standard commercial #10) to the address below. If you have a CID number, enter it on the check.
3. Mail application and payment, postmarked on or before **April 6, 2010**. Midnight postmark acceptable.

## REFUNDS

1. To get a refund, you must relinquish your license and carcass tag before opening day of that season. License must be accompanied by a completed request form obtained at a DOW office or on our website. Requests must be postmarked before the season starts. If there isn't enough time to request a form, mail your license and carcass tag with a letter to the DOW. The envelope must be postmarked before the season starts and mailed to DOW, 6060 Broadway, Denver, 80216, attn: Refund Office.
2. After a season starts, refund or preference point restorations are limited to extreme medical circumstances of licensee, death of the licensee or death of licensee's immediate family member.
3. Refunds and preference point restorations are not considered more than 30 days after a season starts. This limit is extended for members of the U.S. military whose service prevented requesting a refund on time.
4. Refunds for unsuccessful drawing applications are issued by **May 10, 2010**. The \$3 application fee is not refunded. Preference points used in applying are not restored to your record if you return your license and obtain a refund. Points may be restored in lieu of a refund at licensee's request if the license is returned before the season opens.

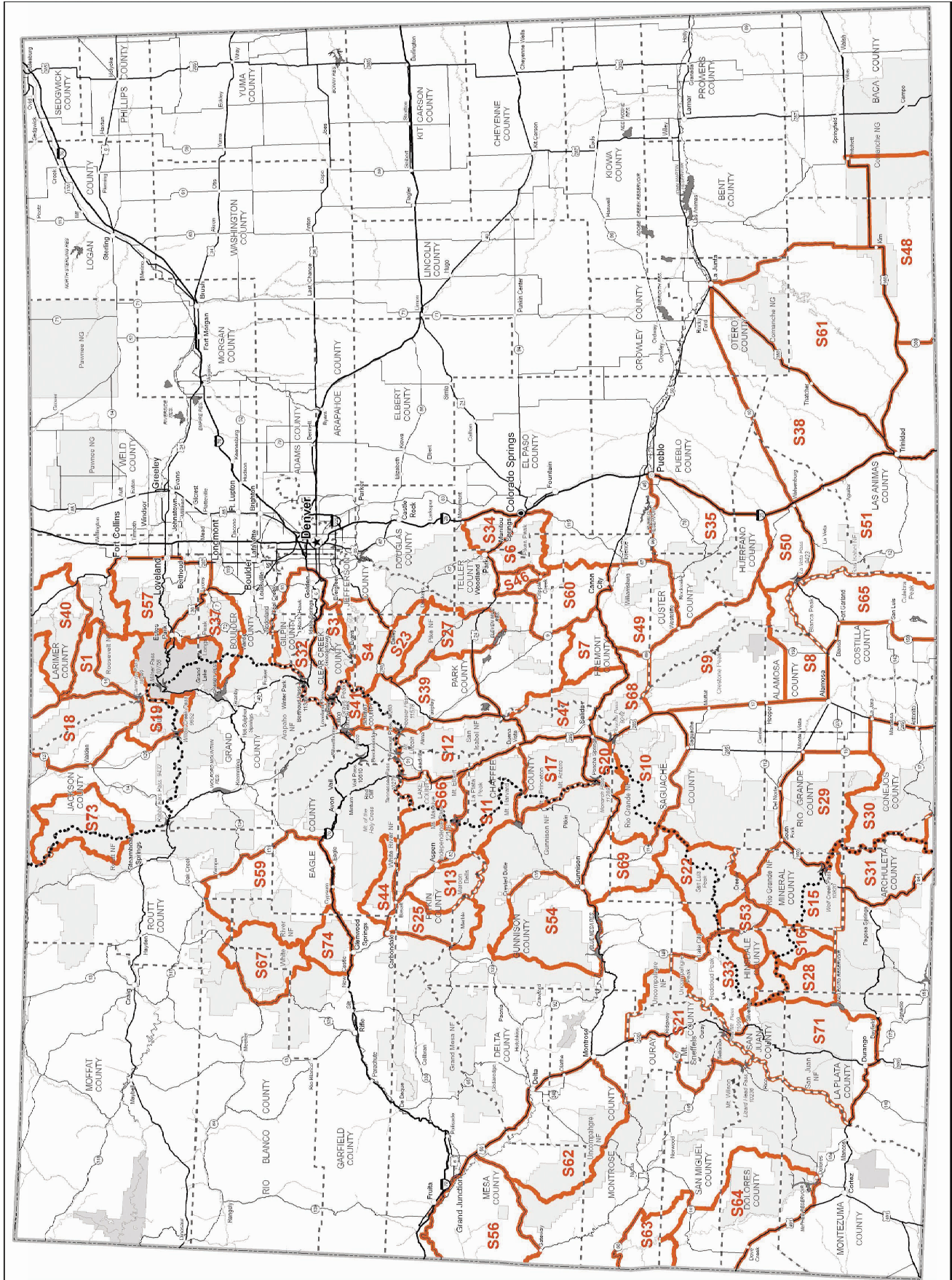

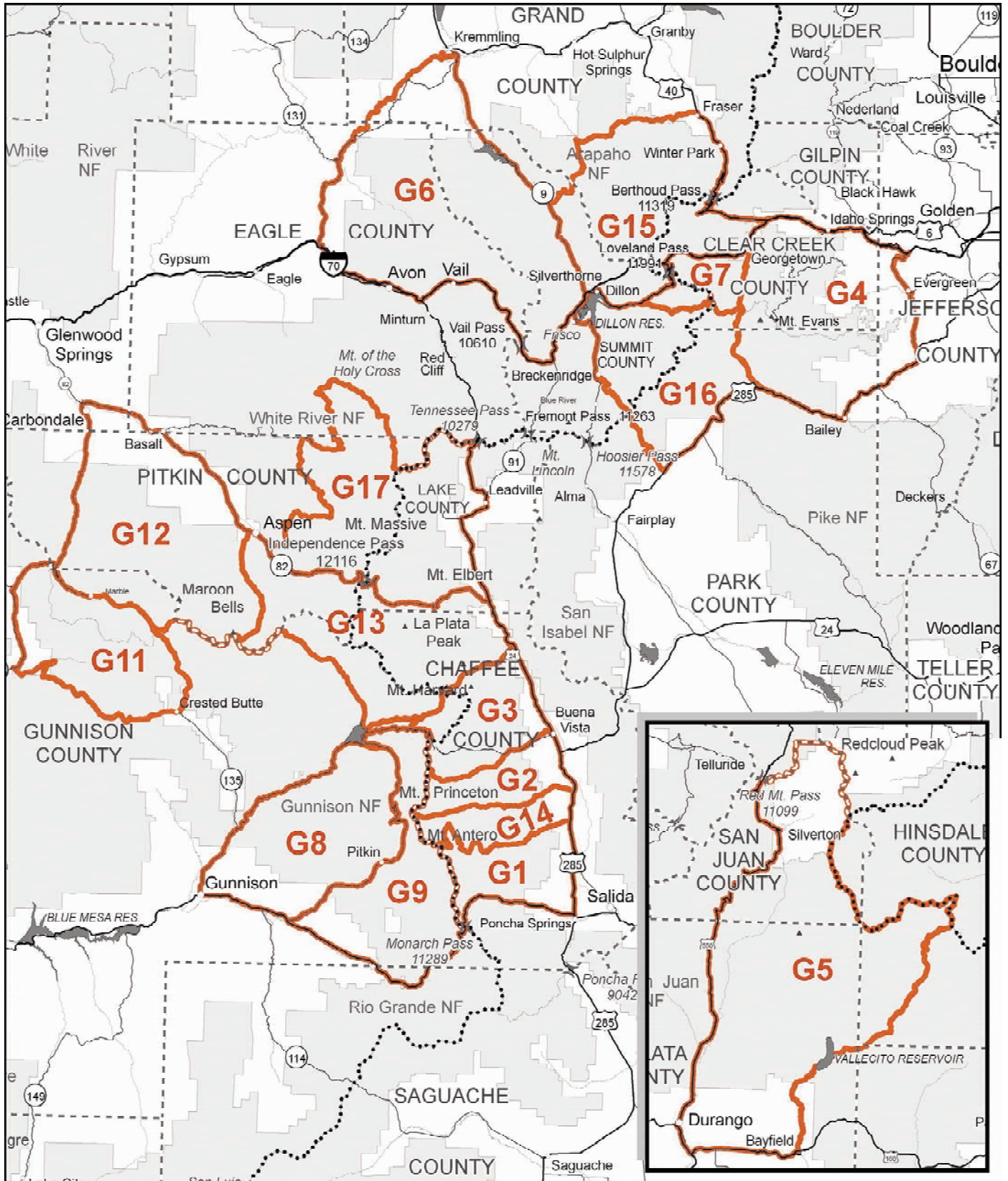

**G3** - (Chaffee, Lake, Gunnison) bounded on N by N Texas Ck and Pine Ck; on E by US 24; on S by Cottonwood Ck, S Cottonwood Ck, Continental Div and Cottonwood Pass Rd; and on W by timberline of Sawatch Range.

**G4** - (Clear Creek, Jefferson, Park) bounded on N by I-70; on E by Colo 74 and Jefferson CR 73; on S and SW by US 285; and on W by Guanella Pass Rd.

**G5** - (La Plata, San Juan, Hinsdale, Archuleta) bounded on N by San Juan-Hinsdale Co line and Continental Div; on E by Los Pinos Riv-Piedra Riv Div, East Ck and Los Pinos Riv; on S by US 160; and on W by US 550.

**G6** - (Grand, Eagle, Summit) bounded on N by Colorado Riv; on E by Colo 9; on S by I-70; and on W by Colo 131.

**G7** - (Summit, Clear Creek) bounded on N by US 6/I-70; on E by Guanella Pass Rd; on S by Pike-Arapahoe NF, Continental Div, Argentine Pass Tr, USFS Rds 260 and 5; and on W by US 6.
