Prairie Chicken Harvest Report (2001)

Twenty-five individuals drew permits for the 2001 greater prairie chicken season. Three of the permits were for falconry hunting and twenty-two were for shotgun/archery hunting.

Of the 25 hunters contacted for a post-season harvest survey, 13 (52%) did not hunt and 12 (48%) did. None of the 3 falconry permittees hunted. One of the permittees responded to the survey by email. The remaining 24 were contacted by phone or in person.

The reported harvest for the 12 hunters was 2 birds (adult females). Accordingly, 2 wings were received for age and sex determination. None of the hunters reported having hit birds that were not recovered. Two of the hunters each harvested 1 prairie chicken. The remaining 10 hunters were unsuccessful. Hunter success rate was 17% or 0.2 bird/hunter.

Four (33%) of the 12 hunters reported hunting during weekends and 8 (66%) had hunted during the week. All of the hunters reported being either strongly or somewhat satisfied with their hunting experience.
