**BIENNIAL REPORT**  
**OF**  
**State Board of Land Commissioners**

His Excellency,  
HONORABLE RALPH L. CARR,  
Governor of the State of Colorado.

Sir :

In compliance with Section 45 of Chapter 134, Colorado Statutes Annotated, 1935, we are transmitting to you herewith a report of the State Board of Land Commissioners for the biennial period ending June 30th, 1942, showing by tables the lands belonging to the several funds of the State, the lands sold, the amount leased, and the receipts of said Board from all sources, as provided by statute.

A review of this biennial report reveals a general improvement over the prior biennium. This is disclosed in several instances: Transmittals direct from this department to the Treasurer's office were \$129,156.27 greater than during the biennium from July 1st, 1938 to June 30th, 1940; total applications from all sources to the income funds of the various accounts were \$56,258.56 greater than in the previous biennium; during the biennium 138,000 more acres of State land were placed under lease than the total leased at the beginning of the biennium; and outstanding balances on Certificates of Purchase were reduced \$92,641.69 during the biennial period, such reduction resulting primarily from payments received, not from cancellations.

With the cooperation of the Board some 28,000 acres of State land have been made available to the War Department in furtherance of the war need, and the Board, at the instance of the War Department, has instituted negotiations for the transfer to the State, in lieu thereof, Federal lands of a similar acreage and of equal income producing value.

In addition to the investments shown above, 123,866.79 acres of land which have been sold, are now outstanding under certificates of purchase upon which there are due future payments amounting to \$926,183.52, which constitute an investment belonging to these funds.

The State still owns 2,948,029.67 acres of the original grant which constitutes a tremendous asset to the School Fund, both as to yearly income and future possibilities of sale.
