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## INTRODUCTORY REVIEW

This revised Annual Report for the combined years of 1941, 1942 and 1943 will replace the temporary form which was issued in 1944 under difficult circumstances, and therefore incomplete. Copies will be issued to permanent libraries of reference, and to the State Archivist to be microfilmed.

During this war period there was a yearly increase in production, the number of days worked and the daily production per miner. The decrease in the number of open lamps was noticeable as was the increase in the use of permissible explosives.

The accident rates in 1941 and 1943 were comparable with coal mines over the country; but the disaster in 1942 increased the fatalities to the greatest number since 1923.

### WADGE EXPLOSION

The explosion at the Wadge Mine on January 27, 1942, was responsible for the deaths of 34 men. The Coroner's verdict was that the gas explosion was "of undetermined cause or origin". In the opinion of the jurors, "gas found in the room neck or entry #19 should have been cleared before the men were allowed in this entry".

Rescue and recovery work by the State and U. S. Bureau of Mines Inspectors, and other trained men from mines throughout the State was prompt and efficient. Women's safety groups from Routt County immediately responded in caring for the families of the stricken, eliminating the usual hysteria so prevalent at such a time; and they assisted with the supplies of hot food and coffee for the rescue crews. The courtesy and assistance extended also by the Victor-American Fuel Company, the American Red Cross, and the United Mine Workers of America were gratefully acknowledged.

### RECOMMENDATIONS FOR SAFETY - DIRECTIVES BY CHIEF INSPECTOR

- 1942 - 1. Rock dust to be applied to all mines unless sloppily wet.  
2. Permanent stoppings to be installed up to 500 feet of faces.  
3. Overcasts to be used for ventilation - brattice cloth doors not acceptable.  
4. Rulings for proper installations on haulage roads.

5. Dry growths to be removed within 200 feet of fans.
  6. Iron fire doors at top of downcasts, to close automatically.
  7. Crosscuts between entries to be closed as new crosscuts are made.
  8. Additional timbering where abrupt changes in pitches are encountered.
  9. Cars on grades to be blocked and spragged.
  10. Man Trip Rules for safe transportation of men.
  11. Proof of good eyesight and hearing required for all coal mine officials.
  12. Metal sounding canes prohibited in electrically equipped mines.
  13. Compulsory first training before officials can be certified. (This includes Shot Firers.)
  14. Order to stay out of old workings unless with an official using safety lamp.
- 1943- 1. Timbering Agreements to be renewed each year in all large mines.  
2. Black powder prohibited in solid shooting. (10-13-43.)  
3. Face coal to be spragged when undercut.  
4. Officials required to read and write the English language.

#### NATIONAL DEFENSE

The operators, miners and families were active in the National Defense Program of Governor Ralph L. Carr during the World War II years. They responded to the appeal for scrap iron by shipping car loads salvaged from within their areas. Women did a tremendous job of boosting morale within their towns and camps, devoting time to war work, and working as members of the State Council of Defense.

#### FIRST AID TRAINING

First Aid courses under the 1941 revised U.S. Bureau of Mines standards marked the highest peak of training within this three-year period when over 5,000 miners and their families attended classes. Teams of men, women, boys and girls entered contests locally and throughout the State.

#### WINNERS - STATE FIRST AID CONTESTS

Winners in the State-wide First Aid Contests in Denver:

- 1941: Miners - Clayton Mine; Ladies - Routt County Minerettes - Hayden Mine; Girls - Frederick Mine.  
1942: Miners - Clayton Mines; Ladies - Robinson #4 Mine;  
Boys - Frederick Mine; Girls - Frederick Mine.

1943: Miners - Clayton Mines; Ladies - Frederick Mine; Boys and Girls of the Frederick Mine each winning first place.

Other contests were held throughout the State during each year. Judges problems and solutions were furnished by this department with full co-operation and assistance of the Bureau of Mines and the United Mine Workers of America.

#### ADULT EDUCATION - INSTRUCTORS TRAINED

Men from mines in the State were trained by the Bureau of Mines to conduct classes in Mine Rescue, and the instruction work was continuous. Local men and women also qualified as instructors in First Aid.

Instructors trained by representatives of the National Vocational Training Program for Defense Workers, held classes locally in the study of "Training Within Industry", "Job Instructor Training" and "Job Relations Training", which proved invaluable in the safe employment of new men for war production.

Chief Inspector, Thomas Allen, conducted a course for instructors in "Practical Coal Mining" for a group selected by the operators, who were provided with material for local classes in preparation for Officials' examinations.

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Mine Officials' Institutes sponsored by this department stressed the importance of knowledge as a safety factor in modern developments in coal mining operations, through management. Quiz Tests on the State Coal Mining Laws as amended, were used in review.

Holmes Safety Chapters were active throughout the coal mining areas.

The Monthly Safety Circular kept the industry informed of directives by the Chief Inspector as issued, important recommendations made by the Deputies, descriptions of accidents and other information pertinent to the industry.

Mines were first required in 1941 to report man-hours worked during each month, for the safety record of each mine.

Daily record books for Mine Foreman and Fire Boss were modernized and simplified in 1943.

The refund of unused license fees was discontinued in 1943, based on the opinion of Attorney General Gail L. Ireland that this former

practice was illegal. Such amounts to be credited to the account of the operator.

Federal Mine Inspection became effective on May 7, 1941, after which the Bureau of Mines Inspectors examined coal mines according to the provisions of the Federal Code.

Reciprocal agreement with New Mexico and Wyoming in 1943 was reached, for recognition of certified officials of equal rating.

The State Administrative Code of 1941 caused a complete change in the operational methods of this office. A unified system of accounts and controls to be through the newly created Department of Revenue, and all moneys received to be deposited through that office to the State Treasurer.

#### EXAMINATIONS FOR COAL MINE OFFICIALS

In 1941 there were 45 men who passed with Mine Foreman grades; 29 for Assistant Mine Foreman; and 62 for Fire Boss. In 1943, 30 Mine Foreman certificates were issued; 15 Assistant Mine Foreman; and 57 Fire Boss.
