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## INTRODUCTORY REVIEW

The years of 1947, 1948 and 1949 continue to show a decrease in production over the previous years, which reduced the income of this department to the uncertainty of meeting the necessary expenses of maintenance and operation.

Dependent upon the collection of license fees and a four-mill tonnage tax to meet the entire expenses of the department, it is to be noted that there has been no increase in mill levy since 1925, despite the rising costs of operation.

During these years there were only two full-time office employees, temporary or part-time stenographers being employed as necessary and funds available. The Monthly Safety Circular and educational material were discontinued in 1947, and directives by the Chief Inspector only issued intermittently, or as an emergency arose.

The National Convention of the Mine Inspectors' Institute of America was held in Denver in June, 1947. Preparations for the convention in the solicitation of contributions and the arrangements for entertainment, were made by persons outside of the department which was fully appreciated.

The State Industrial Commission administering the State Compensation Insurance Fund, discontinued making safety inspections of the 115 coal mines insured by them, and on August 25, 1948, an agreement was made between the Members of the Commission and Chief Inspector Thomas Allen, that reports of inspection made by this department of the State-insured coal mines, be filed with the State Compensation Fund; and that they would pay to the State Coal Mine Inspection Department the sum of \$30.00 per mine, or a total of \$3,450.00. This agreement was approved by Governor Lee Knous and State Controller James A. Noonan.

WESTERN STATES - COAL MINE INSPECTORS. An association of the heads of the State Coal Mine Inspection Departments of the Western States was formed for the first time, in Salt Lake City, Utah, on April 12, 1949. The ten States west of the Mississippi River that were represented were: Arkansas, Colorado, Kansas, Missouri, Montana, New Mexico, Oklahoma, Utah, Washington and Wyoming. Thomas Allen, Chief Inspector of Colorado was elected Chairman of the Western Division.

OPINION BY ATTORNEY GENERAL H. LAWRENCE HINKLEY - RE: CORONER-INQUEST. Upon the request of Coroner Dan Unfug of Huerfano County, for an opinion as to persons responsible for compensation of a Coroner in event of any injury while in a coal mine, the Attorney General stated that "it shall be the duty of each Coroner in his respective county to hold inquests in all cases of death from any accident in or about a coal mine" according to Section 154 of the State Coal Mining Laws, but that "no law requires a Coroner to go to the scene of a fatal accident, nor to make an investigation for which the State Coal Mine Inspection Department is held responsible. If any Coroner chooses to enter a coal mine, it is at his own risk." Opinion rendered on February 27, 1947.

#### MINE FIRES

Boncarbo fan house, Las Animas County: Mine was closed and sealed on May 17, 1947; a small portion reopened by Higinio Cordova, isolated by concrete seals. On November 18, 1947, two persons not employed at this mine entered through the bolted doors of the fan house, where there was an accumulation of Methane. In attempting to light a cigarette, there was instant ignition and both men were severely burned.

Russell Mine, Weld County: In September, 1947, a fire very close to the shaft bottom, burned out the timbers, leaving the shaft with practically no support. The mine was sealed to control the fire, by order of the Inspectors of this department.

Butte Valley Mine, Huerfano County on May 25, 1948: Smoke seen coming up the return of the 2nd dip off the 5th right, men were sent out of mine by Mine Foreman Hayden Bodycomb, who found fire in 6th X-cut in chain pillar, caused by fall of top coal onto power wires. Water used at each end of the X-cut, the fire was extinguished before it spread. Work was resumed on May 27.

South Canon Mine, Garfield County on October 4, 1948: New fire seals were constructed to isolate old fire area from the working section of the mine. Mine safe for operation on October 9.

Moore Mine, Jackson County, February 28, 1949: Fire in #1 pit apparently originated by spontaneous combustion in one of the abandoned rooms. Coal face of the pit, including the openings to rooms driven from the face, were covered with loose dirt to

smother the fire, which was unsuccessful due to shallow overburden above the coal bed. A trench was cut around the fire area and filled with inert materials, which was completed on October 25, 1949.

Sterling Mine, Weld County, April 2, 1949: Smoke was found at foot of shaft on pre-shift examination by Fire Boss, who notified State and Federal Inspectors. Fire was located in a chain pillar between 11 and 12 South entries in-by 11 and 12 West entries. Temporary fire seals were erected approximately 500 feet out-by the fire area. Brattice cloth seals were erected in intake entry and in return air-way with more substantial seals erected about 15 feet out-by the brattice cloth seals. Ventilation restored on Sunday, April 3, the mine resumed operations on April 4 in the unaffected north side.

Somerset Mine, Gunnison County - August 16, 1949: Workings in the B Seam, temporarily abandoned, a squeeze occurred due to heavy cover and soft bottom. Temporary seals completed next day and permanent seals erected by August 25. Fire believed to be caused by spontaneous combustion. More frequent inspection recommended in idle and abandoned parts of coal mines.

#### Recommendations for Safety - Directives by Chief Inspector Allen

- 8-1-47 - Add to the Mechanical Loading Rules. "The face of any place must be examined for explosive gas at frequent intervals of not less than 30 minutes during the operation of any electrically-driven machine."
- 1-12-48 - All cross cuts and all chutes must be blocked, except the last one.
- 1-12-48 - No gas-driven fan shall be used to force ventilation in any mine.
- 1-29-48 - No man will be allowed to handle a safety lamp underground, unless he has at least a Shot Firer's certificate.
- 4-23-48 - A thorough search of underground employees is the duty of every mine official, in all closed-light mines, before such employees enter the mine.
- 4-23-48 - Operations will be stopped at once, in any district where there is insufficient rock dusting.

- 4-23-48 - Operations will be stopped at once, where insufficient air is circulating at the faces.
- 1-14-49 - The possession of small magnets which can be carried into the mine in a pocket, that could be used for the purpose of opening a flame safety lamp is hereby absolutely prohibited.
- 1-14-49 - The use of gasoline engine drives on ventilating fans, which are forcing air into a coal mine, will not be allowed in the State of Colorado.
- 1-14-49 - Cartridge drills may be used on intake airways, under the proper supervision of certified officials.
- 2-14-49 - All fire extinguishers used in and around coal mines, should be of a type which will not conduct electricity thru the stream of extinguishing chemical, to the person using the appliance.
- 8-4-49 - Platforms shall be installed in the escapeways which are driven in highly inclined coal seams. These platforms should be at intervals of not more than 30 feet apart, and so constructed that they will not impede the passage of the air current, and shall be of sufficient strength to support one or two men at any time.
- 2-25-49 - All strip pits or surface mines are under the jurisdiction of this department, and are subject to all and any parts of the State Coal Mining Laws which may apply to them. This ruling is based on an opinion of the Attorney General of Colorado.

Examinations for Coal Mine Officials were held in 1948. From a total of 131 candidates, 31 passed with a grade of 80% or over, required for Mine Foreman; 39 for Assistant Mine Foreman with a grade of 75%; and 38 for Fire Boss only, with a grade of 70%. There were 20 unsuccessful candidates. Three Mine Foreman certificates were issued upon our reciprocal agreement with the State of Wyoming.

Thirty certificates were held for first aid training. There was very little activity in safety work or first aid training at the mines during this period, with the exception of the C.F. & I. mines. The State-wide first aid contests held since 1938, open to all industry, were discontinued indefinitely by the State Industrial Commission in 1948. The only coal mining teams entering the contests during the last few years were from the Frederick Mine in Las Animas County.
