"Exempt from the State Personnel System" includes the Judicial Branch, the Legislative Branch (except for most employees of the State Auditor's Office), Governor's cabinet and office staff, over half of the employees of the Department of Law, Department of Education, faculty and other higher education employees as defined in CRS 24-50-135.

"Part-Time" means employees working less than a full-time schedule and includes hourly and others such as work-study students. Part-Time employees cannot be equated to a Full-Time Equivalent position from this report. The number of part-time employees is only the number of individuals paid for work.

"Gross Pay" is regular salary and work-study earnings. "Employee Count" represents the number of employees who received a paycheck during the reporting month. An employee holding both a State Personnel System position and a part-time exempt position would be counted twice.

Prior to July 2006, the Council on the Arts was reported under the Department of Higher Education. Due to a change in statute, it is now being reported as part of the Governor's Office.
