- Disaster Case Management Quarterly Report Summary as of September 30th (most recent report):
 - o 1,948 DCM cases total
 - o 1,527 DCM cases currently open
 - o 421 DCM cases closed
 - o Figures based on eleven declared Individual Assistance eligible counties
- On November 18, DHSEM presented the first statewide training for disaster case managers/supervisors featuring speakers from DHSEM, Colorado Water Conservation Board, GreenPath, Inc (consumer credit counseling), HUD/FHA Denver Ownership Center, CDBG-DR, Division of Housing and a three-hour Resiliency workshop focusing on case manager self-care. The day was well attended at Catholic Charities, Denver Archdiocese with sixty-one total participants. The day was highlighted by a spirit of collaboration and cooperation including representatives from all 4 Disaster Case Management centers. Another training day was requested for 2015.

 - The Emotional Spiritual Care (ESC) Subcommittee of Colorado Voluntary Organizations Active in Disaster (COVOAD) is developing training qualifications to reach a level of credentialing. This guidance will be statewide and the committee is looking at the possibility of organizing strike teams of credentialed spiritual care providers. This effort is following the excellent National Voluntary Organizations Active in Disaster (NVOAD) points of consensus in the development of this qualifications and credentials. The initial training discussions and direction is that the following courses will be required: Incident Command System (ICS) training, spiritual care training and a Colorado orientation.
 - Crisis counseling grant for the September 2013 floods will end on December 31, 2014.

• Ten requests for reimbursements (RFRs) were submitted in the last week. Sixteen RFRs have been recommended for payment in the last week.

- The total amount of RFRs is now at five hundred eighty (580), of which two hundred forty-five (245) are complete and one hundred twenty-three (123) were returned to the sub-grantees for additional information.
- The total amount requested is \$87.3M, \$76.9M is considered initially eligible, \$30.2 has been recommended for payment.
- Nine requests for scope changes were submitted in the last week. Ten requests were completed in the last week. The total amount of scope change requests is now one hundred fifty-five (155), of which ninety-five are completed and thirty-three were returned to the sub-grantees for additional information.
- There have been forty-six payments made in the last week for a total of \$3.3M, including federal and state share.
- Announcements: The monthly PA Applicant's Assistance teleconference was held on November 21st. The next PA call is to be determined. We are considering starting the calls back in the New Year unless applicants want to cover specific topics. Notices for the PA Advisory Committee meeting will go out later this week.
- Important Dates: Time extensions for permanent work projects are due February 14, 2015.

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Program Update

- Gov. John Hickenlooper announced on November 12, 2014 that the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) approved Colorado's Community Development Block Grant - Disaster Recovery (CDBG-DR) Substantial Amendment to the Action Plan which outlines how Colorado will distribute \$199.3 million in grant dollars received from HUD for flood and fire recovery programs.
- Jamestown received two CDBG-DR Round One awards totaling \$627,897 during the past week. The following table summarizes program activity to date.
