


Program Update

The State is currently working four disasters that involve HMGP funding: DR-4067, DR-4133, DR-4134 and DR-4145

A total of ninety-eight HMGP applications have been submitted to FEMA for formal review. FEMA is working on
reviewing the applications and providing the State with a FEMA request for information (RFI). The State is then
forwarding the FEMA RFI to the sub-applicant and assisting them with questions and helping guide them
through the RFI process. A breakdown of projects by disaster is shown below:

- **FEMA RFI response is mandatory**. If a FEMA RFI is generated, it will be communicated to the sub-applicant via DHSEM email. Sub-applicants are highly advised to provide their FEMA RFI response to the State within twenty calendar days of receipt. This will allow for State review and comment prior to FEMA submission. Failure to provide responses to the State within the twenty-day period will result in responses being sent to FEMA without review. Response to a FEMA RFI within thirty days is mandatory. Failure to respond to a FEMA RFI within the thirty-day deadline will result in project removal from the HMGP. Projects can only be reinstated in the HMGP through an extended appeal process.
- The graph below is for Disaster 4145 only. The State RFI process has been completed for all other open disasters.



- The State has suspended the monthly HMGP Conference Call that occurs on the second Friday of each month and the bi-weekly 5% & Generator conference call on Tuesdays at 10 a.m. Due to the different stages and timelines for the many project types, individual coordination is a more appropriate and effective use of time. Coordination calls may be hosted again in the future as projects move further into the implementation and reimbursement phase. In the meantime any pertinent or general project information will be communicated via email or phone call as necessary.
- A bi-weekly conference call will be hosted for all HMGP Wildfire Mitigation sub-applicants on Tuesdays at 10
 a.m. The call will discuss the current status of Wildfire Mitigation applications and other important information.
 This call is for general questions only and project specific questions will be answered on a one-to-one basis. The
 conference call information has been emailed and all wildfire sub-applicants and supporting staff are highly
 encouraged to attend.
- A total of 39 projects have been awarded for HMGP DR-4145 with a combined sum of \$3,205,766 of federal funds to date.
- The FEMA Disaster Procurement Assistance Team (DPAT) will be conducting procurement training the afternoon of May 27th and the morning of May 28th. Based on Office of Inspector General (OIG) audit findings to date, not following federal procurement regulation is one of the key issues identified.
- The training on Wednesday May 27, 2015 from 1 p.m. to 5 p.m. will focus on Hazard Mitigation Grant Program HMGP.
- The training on Thursday May 28, 2015 from 8 a.m. to 12 p.m. and will focus on Public Assistance (PA).

Program Update

- In the last week, 22 requests for reimbursements (RFRs) were submitted, and 0 RFRs have been recommended for payment. The total amount of RFRs is now at 1,064 of which 738 are recommended for payment and 165 were returned to the sub-grantees for additional information. The remaining 161 are in progress. The total amount requested is \$140.9 million, and \$122.5 million is considered initially eligible. \$79.5 million has been recommended for payment, \$17.77 million has been returned to sub-grantees for additional information, and \$25.2 million is still in progress.
- Three requests for scope changes were submitted in the last week, and two were completed or deferred to closeout. The total amount of scope change requests is now 291 of which 219 are completed or deferred to closeout, and 43 were returned to the sub-grantees for additional information. The remaining 29 are in progress.
- There have been zero payments made in the last week for total of \$0.00, including federal and state share.



- G288 Course: Donations and Volunteer Management
 - O Robyn Knappe, Colorado VAL, and Stephanie Sanchez, United Way-211, presented G288: Donations and Volunteer Management training as part of the Colorado Emergency Management Academy program. Attendees were new and existing emergency management professionals from across the State of Colorado. The course covered general donation and volunteer management best practices, as well as covering specific problem areas, such as effective tools for managing spontaneous volunteers and unsolicited donations. Throughout the day, participants were asked to work together to complete the framework for a Donations and Volunteer Annex that could eventually be used in their community's Emergency Operations Plan. The presenters received a great deal of positive feedback, and will present the course again in Leadville, CO in July.





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
