***SBA Disaster Declaration:*** The U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA) declared a disaster at the request of Gov. John W. Hickenlooper, making low-interest federal disaster loans available to businesses, many private non-profits, homeowners and renters in response to April 2015 landslides. SBA Disaster Loans for property damage or economic injury are available in the following counties: Crowley, Douglas, Elbert, El Paso, Fremont, Lincoln, Pueblo, and Teller. SBA Representatives will operate a Disaster Loan Outreach Center at the Colorado Springs Fire Department (375 Printers Way, Colorado Springs, CO 80910) until October 1, 2015. The representatives will be present Mondays-Fridays, 8 am-5 pm, to answer questions, explain the application process, and help individuals complete their applications. The filing deadline to return applications for property damage is November 16, 2015. The deadline to return economic injury applications is June 16, 2016. 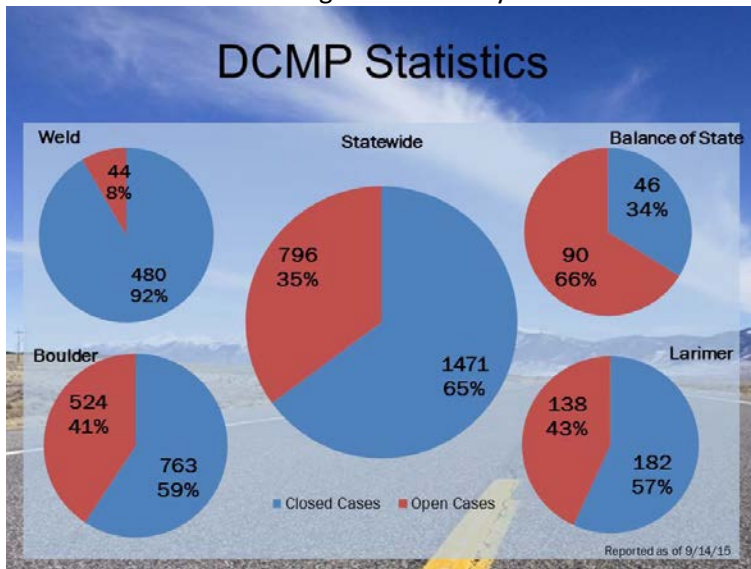

- Disaster Case Management Program (DCMP)
  - As of August 31, 2015, nearly two years after the record 2013 floods, nearly 800 flood survivor cases remain open. Over half of those cases are being managed by the State's Disaster Case Management Program (DCMP). Close to 400 clients are currently seeking assistance under several Community Development Block Grant-Disaster Recovery (CDBG-DR) housing programs, including home repairs and replacement, being administered by Colorado's Department of Local Affairs (DOLA).
  - On September 21, 2015, FEMA Region VIII approved a second 90-day, no-cost extension of the Disaster Case Management Program (DCMP) grant. The extension from December 12, 2015 to March 11, 2016 will enable case managers to continue helping survivors of the 2013 floods to connect with available resources vital to their long term recovery.



- On September 15, a statewide DCMP training session was held at Catholic Charities in Denver. There were several presenters offering a variety of information for the disaster case management staff.
- Jake Porter from the Disabled American Veterans National Disaster Relief Program provided information on disaster recovery grants available to veterans. Ben Mestas, Division Director of Veterans Affairs for the Colorado Department of Military and Veterans Affairs, discussed the many other programs and assistance that his office can provide to veterans.
- Kristy Judd, Executive Director of Metro Volunteers, updated the group on the work her organization is doing with Colorado's Department of Local Affairs (DOLA) to enable DCMP clients, primarily in the 8 Balance of State counties, to access the housing assistance programs available under the Community Development Block Grant for Disaster Relief (CDBG - DR) program. Kristy described the process being used to accept and process applications, and prioritize cases in light of funding restraints.
- Allison O'Kelly of DOLA followed up on some questions regarding the Metro Volunteers' Balance of State initiative. She also answered other case managers' questions concerning the various CDBG-DR assistance programs including issues related to home access costs, SBA loans, and home repairs and replacement.
- Diana Herrera, Senior Regional Insurance Specialist from FEMA Region VIII provided an overview of the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP). She explained how this federal program allows property owners in participating communities to purchase flood insurance. She further explained how the program has evolved over many years, and how natural disasters and resulting legislative initiatives have shaped the program into what it is today. Next, turning to the local level, Bobbie Baca, Colorado's Division of Insurance Director of Consumer Affairs, talked about how the 2013 flooding resulted in new

- state legislation that addressed the many issues identified as a result of that disaster. She also discussed how homeowners can prepare for any type of disaster with helpful tips about insurance.
- Jason Yancey, with Operation Hope, closed the session with a presentation on Disaster Financial Empowerment Response and Recovery. He explained how many people are facing a financial hardship before a disaster and how complex their situation can become afterwards. He discussed a variety of ways to help clients in recovery, including helping them ensure insurance policies are up to date, providing information on how to negotiate with mortgage lenders, and how to make sure credit information is current and dispute credit report discrepancies when necessary.



- On September 17, DCMP Program Manager Chuck Sullivan attended the Weld Recovers Long Term Recovery Group (LTFG) meeting in Greeley. Attendees were briefed on the status of the group’s finances, including remaining Unmet Needs funds, CDBG-DR cases, volunteer, and construction activities. The Weld Recovers office is closing October 30 and Kathy O’Day, Catholic Charities’ Supervisor briefed the group on the current status of cases and transition planning. On Friday, September 18, a joint Volunteer Coordination and Construction meeting was held at the Boulder Long Term Flood Recovery (LTFRG) office in Longmont. Chuck Sullivan represented the State DCMP office and case management attendees included Kathy O’Day (Weld County), Phyllis Kane (Larimer County), Chip Leckway and Katie Fisk (Balance of State). Metro Volunteers’ Executive Director Kristy Judd chaired the information sharing meeting that was also attended by individuals from the Boulder and Larimer County long term recovery groups and others involved in volunteer construction, debris removal and home access projects.

**Program Update**

- Joint Preliminary Damage Assessments (PDAs) for DR-4229
  - Joint Preliminary Damage Assessments were conducted in June and again in early August for infrastructure damages and impacts incurred as a result of the Spring 2015 severe storms and snowmelt runoff. Participants included staff from local governments, FEMA, and DHSEM.
  - President Obama issued a major disaster declaration for the State of Colorado on July 16, 2015. The declaration triggers the release of Federal funds to help our Colorado communities recover from the Severe Storms, Tornadoes, Flooding, Landslides, and Mudslides that occurred May 4 to June 16, 2015. The current declaration includes 11 counties: Baca, Elbert, El Paso, Fremont, Logan, Morgan, Pueblo, Saguache, Sedgwick, Washington and Yuma. The State has been awarded the Public Assistance and the Hazard Mitigation grant programs. The Public Assistance program is for emergency work and the repair or replacement of disaster-damaged facilities. The Hazard Mitigation program provides assistance for actions taken to prevent or reduce long-term risk to life and property from natural hazards.
  - The State submitted a request to the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) on August 7, 2015 for the designation of additional counties for Public Assistance under Major Disaster Declaration DR-4229 to include Adams, Boulder, and Park counties and the City and County of Denver. As of August 12, 2015, the request to designate the additional counties has been approved.
  - The State conducted Applicant Briefings and FEMA held Kick-Off Meetings in August and September for entities Requesting Public Assistance.

- The competitive FEMA Pre-Disaster Mitigation (PDM) Program is authorized under the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act, Public Law 93-288, as amended. This program makes federal funds available to State, Local and Tribal Governments to implement and sustain cost-effective measures designed to reduce the risk to individuals and property from natural hazards, while also reducing reliance on Federal funding from future disasters. FEMA has announced PDM program availability for this year. DHSEM is currently accepting notices of interest/intent from eligible potential sub-applicants. \$30 million is available nationally. A complete *State* application, including all sub-applications, was due to FEMA on August 28, 2015.

- The competitive FEMA Flood Mitigation Assistance (FMA) Program is authorized under the National Flood Insurance Reform Act of 1994. This program makes federal funds available to eligible applicants with the goal of reducing or eliminating claims under the NFIP. FEMA has announced program availability for this year. DHSEM is currently accepting notices of interest/intent from eligible potential sub-applicants. \$150 million is available nationally. A complete *State* application, including all sub-applications, was due to FEMA on August 28, 2015.

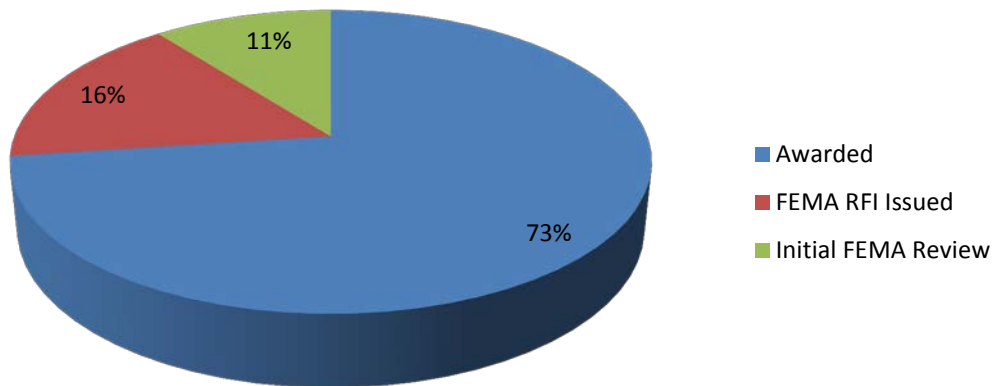
The State is currently working five disasters that involve HMGP funding: DR 4067, 4133, 4134, 4145, and 4229.

- A total of 98 HMGP applications have been submitted to FEMA for formal review. FEMA is working on reviewing the applications and providing the State with a FEMA request for information (RFI). The State is then forwarding the FEMA RFI to the sub-applicant and assisting them with questions and helping guide them through the RFI process. A breakdown of projects by disaster is shown below:

- **FEMA RFI response is mandatory.** Once a FEMA RFI is distributed, sub-applicants are highly advised to provide their FEMA RFI response to the state within 20 calendar days of receipt. This will allow for state review and comment prior to FEMA submission. Failure to provide responses to the state within the 20 day period will result in responses being sent to FEMA without review. Response to a FEMA RFI is mandatory within 30 days. Failure to respond to a FEMA RFI within this deadline will result in project removal from the HMGP. Projects can only be reinstated in the HMGP through an extended appeal process.
- The State has suspended all regular HMGP Conference Calls including 5%, Generator, Wildfire, and general information calls. Due to the different stages and timelines for the many project types, individual coordination is a more appropriate and effective use of time. Pertinent or general project information will be communicated via email or phone call as necessary.

- FEMA continues to review project applications. Only 9 projects remain in the initial FEMA review queue. Many projects have been awarded and many projects have been issued a FEMA Request for Information (RFI), which requires the sub-grantee to provide clarification to FEMA. The State is working to assist the sub-grantee through the RFI process.
- The Mitigation Team has submitted applications for the FY15 Hazard Mitigation Assistance Guidance grants, including the Pre-Disaster Mitigation Program (PDM) and Flood Mitigation Assistance Program (FMA). Further information about PDM & FMA can be found on the [DHSEM Grant Programs website](#).

### DR-4145

- In the last week, 13 requests for reimbursements (RFRs) were submitted, and 15 RFRs have been recommended for payment. The total amount of RFRs is now at 1,397 of which 974 are recommended for payment and 206 were returned to the sub-grantees for additional information. The remaining 217 are in progress. The total amount requested is \$167.1 million, and \$149.75 million is considered initially eligible. \$105.5 million has been recommended for payment, \$24.90 million has been returned to sub-grantees for additional information, and \$19.35 million is still in progress.
- Four requests for scope changes were submitted in the last week, and zero were completed or deferred to closeout. The total amount of scope change requests is now 366 of which 244 are completed or deferred to closeout, and 57 were returned to the sub-grantees for additional information. The remaining 65 are in progress.
- There have been 116 payments made in the last week for total of \$8,299,125.11 including federal and state share.



- Eighty-four small project closeout requests and two large project closeout requests have been submitted to FEMA.
- Announcements:
  - Next PA call will be September 25, 2015 at 9 a.m. Call in information and presentation will be sent out prior to the call.

**DR-4229**

- There is an expectation of +/- 160 total Project Worksheets (PWs) estimating \$30-\$40 million for DR-4229. The goal is to have 100% of PWs written and approved in the Federal grant management system by Thanksgiving.
- FEMA is still processing DHSEM’s request to extend the incident period to April 24 – July 9, 2015 (originally approved for May 4 – Jun 16, 2015).
- As of September 14, 2015, there is a total of 62 Requests for Public Assistance (54 Active, 5 Withdrawn/Closed, 2 Pending Review, 1 Ineligible/Closed) approved by FEMA. Monday, August 31<sup>st</sup> was the deadline for the initial designated counties to submit their Request for Public Assistance and Friday, September 11, 2015 was the deadline for the additional designated counties.
