- U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA) Disaster Declaration #14467 and #14468. Effective September 16, 2015, SBA loans for physical damage and economic injury are available in El Paso, Crowley, Fremont, Teller, Douglas, Lincoln, Elbert, and Pueblo Counties.
- The filing deadline to return applications for property damage was November 16, 2015. The deadline to return economic injury applications is June 16, 2016. (SBA Disaster Loans)



Program Update

The State is currently working five disasters that involve HMGP funding: DR 4067, 4133, 4134, 4145, and 4229. A breakdown of projects by disaster is below:

FEMA continues to review project applications. Only three projects remain in the initial FEMA review queue due to extended project analysis, technical feasibility, environmental, historical, cultural review/studies and/or project phasing deliverables. The majority of projects have been awarded and the state continues to coordinate projects still under review.



FEMA is hosting two webinars regarding procurement under FEMA awards and requirements for Recipients and subrecipients when procuring services and supplies with funding under Stafford Act grant programs (Hazard Mitigation Grant Program [HMGP] and Pre-Disaster Mitigation [PDM]). This information will also apply to Flood Mitigation Assistance (FMA) awards. Proper procurement compliance with federal awards is a major emphasis of the Office of Inspector General (OIG) and we strongly encourage your attendance to learn more on this important topic.

The webinar will cover requirements set forth in the Uniform Administrative Requirements, Cost Principles and Audit Requirements for Federal Awards (2 CFR 200) so that participants can identify and avoid potential violations of the Federal procurement requirements. Violations of the Federal procurement requirements can result in reduced Federal grant funding.

The goal of the webinar is to reduce applicant violations of the Federal procurement regulations by training participants on the Federal procurement requirements set forth at <u>2 CFR Sections 200.317 through 200.326</u>.

Program Update

PA 4145 (2013 Severe Storms, Flooding, Landslides and Mudslides)

In the last two weeks, 51 requests for reimbursements (RFRs) were submitted, and 47 RFRs have been recommended for payment. The total amount of RFRs is now at 2,070 of which 1,397 are recommended for payment and 267 were returned to the sub-grantees for additional information. The remaining 406 are in progress. The total amount requested is \$236 million, and \$208.3 million is considered initially eligible. \$137.7 million has been recommended for payment, \$26.6 million has been returned to sub-grantees for additional information, and \$43.9 million is still in progress.

Six requests for scope changes were submitted in the last two weeks, and seven were completed or deferred to closeout. The total amount of scope change requests is now 446 of which 332 are completed or deferred to closeout, and 66 were returned to the sub-grantees for additional information. The remaining 48 are in progress.

There have been no payments made in the last two weeks.

341 small projects have been closed by FEMA and another 16 have been submitted to FEMA for closeout review. 29 Large Projects have been closed by FEMA and another 14 have been submitted to FEMA for closeout review.

The next 4145 PA call will be April 29, 2016 at 9 a.m. Call in information and presentation will be sent out prior to the call.

PA 4229 (2015 Severe Storms, Tornadoes, Flooding, Landslides, and Mudslides)

To date, 120 RFRs have been submitted and 60 RFRs have been recommended for payment, seven were returned to the sub-grantees for additional information. The remaining 53 are in progress. The total amount requested is \$2.74 million, and \$2.64 million is considered initially eligible. \$288.9 thousand has been recommended for payment, \$696.1 thousand has been returned to sub-grantees for additional information, and \$1.65 million is still in progress.

To date, ten requests for scope changes have been submitted, and zero were completed or deferred to closeout. Seven Scope Change Requests have been forwarded to FEMA for review and the remaining ten are in progress.

There have been 209 payments made to date for a total of \$4,751,084.70.

The next 4229 PA call will be April 14, 2016 at 1:30 p.m. Call in information and presentation will be sent out prior to the call.


